No one has done more to enhance the bridge experience of Houston area players in recent years than Arlene Weingarten. She has created two newsletters, one for Unit 174 in general and the other for bridge at the community centers, which have had increasingly wide distribution via email. She also maintains a website which updates the results from 13 area bridge clubs and has links to two others. Both the newsletters and the website are informative, accurate, user-friendly, and very professional.

Arlene is extremely knowledgeable about computer usage, and uses her publications to enlighten all of her subscribers on how to enhance their computer experience.

As if this wasn't enough, Arlene serves as Chair of the Unit's Nomination Committee. She has to recruit a committee and then find candidates to run for the Unit Board of Directors. Arlene and her committee have consistently come up with a slate of candidates who are qualified to serve on

Many times we hear the phase "Everyone loves Dorsey". Dorsey's contribution to bridge started in a small Wyoming town where, at the tender age of 25, she gave her first bridge lesson. They loved her the and, here many year's later, she still has a devoted following. And why not? Each year she continues

to take an active role in whatever is called for to further this marvelous game that she loves. Her list of involvement for the betterment of bridge goes on and on. Over the past 15 years, she has been the featured speaker at Sectional and Regional tournaments where the primary focus was the novice player. She has served, many times, at the Partnership Desk. At three Dallas Regional tournaments she has been the Hospitality Chairperson where she prepared and served food for some 200-250 persons per day. She has served as Unit Education Coordinator. She has coordinated the novice players' activities at many tournaments. Her Unit participation covers service on Ethics and Nomination Committees. Perhaps one of her greatest challenges and accomplishments took place at the 1997 Dallas National Tournament. As Hospitality Chairperson, she personally prepared and served food for some 50 volunteers, and this was for 10 consecutive days. Peggy Sutherlin Wins Women's Swiss at 2004 Reno NABC

Performance of District 16 players was, for the most part, not the stuff of which history is made. Maybe it was the late nights in the casinos, maybe it was the altitude-who knows? Whatever the reason, District 16 had its most disappointing showing in many an NABC.

Although there were several close calls, District 16's lone NABC winner was Dallasite Peggy Sutherlin, who captured the Women's Swiss Teams. This was Peggy's seventh NABC championship, and her second in this event. She also won the World Women's Olympiad in 2000. Mildred Breed of Austin and Shawn Quinn of Richmond, the defending champions and Peggy's teammates in the Olympiad win, were second. District 16 women have been first and second in the last five NABC women's team events, stretching back to the Fall 2002 NABC. An impressive run indeed!

Peggy also had a third-place finish in the Mixed Pairs, playing with Nagy Kamel of Plano. Nagy, you may recall, won his first NABC last fall in New Orleans. Nice going! Kudos, too, to Chris Compton and Bart Bramley of Dallas, who were third in the Open Swiss Teams on the final day of the

tournament. How do you spell heartbreak? Dave Hadden of San Antonio and Alex Kolesnik of Austin spell it N-A-P-A-I-R-S. When the results of the North American Pairs Flight A were posted, Dave and Alex were second, less than half a matchpoint behind the leaders. It doesn't get any worse than that. Oh, no? After a series of appeals involving several pairs, they were still less than half a matchpoint out of first-only now they were in third place! Please offer them your sympathy (and a stiff drink) when you see them at the Austin

Regional in July.

Ditto for Bob Hamman of Dallas, who finished 3/4 in the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams. Hamman's team was up 53 IMPs with just one quarter to play, but the match ended in a dead tie! In an 8board playoff, Hamman's opponents prevailed. The margin of victory? One undertrick in a non-vulnerable 3 NT (2 IMPs). Although Bob has had his share of nail-biting victories (witness his thrilling come-from behind victory in the Bermuda Bowl last November), losing a close match in overtime has still got to

Congratulations are in order for Kay and Cary Jennings of Fort Worth, who finished second in the NABC 49'er Pairs. They were less than two matchpoints behind the winners. Do we detect a theme here?

Several other District 16 players had top-ten finishes in national events. Malcolm Brachman of Dallas, Mike Passell Plano, and Eddie Wold, Houston were 5/8 in the Vanderbilt, as were Bobby Wolff, Sidney Lazard and John Sutherlin, of Dallas, and Dan Morse of Houston, playing on another team. Lynn Baker of Austin, was sixth in the Women's Pairs. Petra Hamman of Dallas, and Nancy Passell of Plano, finished fourth in the Women's Swiss Teams, while Donna Compton of Dallas, was sixth in the same event.

Don't miss the excitement of the Summer NABC in New York this July. You can expect the competition to be tough, the nightlife to be exciting, and the shopping to be awful (at least that's what I'm telling Mrs. S!). He has had articles published in the Bridge World and has been playing professionally and teaching private and group lessons for the past 20 years. As usual, she approached the game with great competence and dedication, and is now a Diamond Life Master.

Marilou was elected to a 3-year term on our unit board, and the president during these years. She ushered our unit into the computer age, single handedly entering the names and addresses of all 700 of us into disks. This really facilitated the production of our annual directory as well as the processing of other documents. Another huge responsibility she took upon herself was moving our unit storage facility from an unsatisfactory location to better, more convenient quarters. Marilou was also co-chairman of our 1995 Regional, and her hard work and efficiency was a major factor in establishing our unit's solvency.

Even after the expiration of her term on the board, Marilou continues in her service to our unit. Currently she is our recorder. Annually she chairs the committee to nominate the slate of prospective board members. Moreover, she will chair the hospitality committee for our next Regional. Terri has taught bridge lessons and directed in Odessa, as well as direct on several bridge cruises. She formed a novice bridge group that meets every Friday, which she directs, whereby a novice plays with a life master. She has brought several new players into ACBL through these efforts. She is a member of ACBL. At this particular time, she is serving her second year as president of Unit 209.

All of the above and a lot of things she does above and beyond the call of duty. She is a good partner to have at the bridge table as well.

Dottie Pirkle – Unit 225

Dottie Pirkle cut her "bridge teeth" playing as a young girl at her stepmother's studio in Dennison, Texas. She got her first boost in bridge teaching from Harry Weiss in 1965. He was teaching beginning bridge at Sanger-Harris and asked Dottie to teach the intermediate class at Valley View Studio which he and his wife, Claire, owned

This started a 40 year career of teaching bridge that crossed Dallas and East Texas that has touched over 6100 lives of players.

In addition to Valley View Classes, Dottie taught basic bridge at Highland Park Methodist Church for 10 years; Highland Park Presbyterian Church for 5 years; The Jewish Community Center for 5 years; The Dallas Women's Club for 7 years; the Dallas County Club for 5 years; Northwood Hills County Club for 5 years and Richland Jr. College in addition to numerous private lessons.

When Bud Creed took over Valley View Studio in Dallas, Dottie started a novice game of 9 to 23 tables for him and continued giving lesson sometimes in 3 to 4 places a week.

In 1990 she moved to East Texas (Athens) and rented the studio she still runs and has continued teaching classes. It is remarkable that a small town of 10,000 has its own studio. She treats her beginning students to the first 5 lessons free. She has taught over 1100 students in the area including classes at the Athens Country Club, St Jude's Church and the Cedar Creek County

She is beloved by her students – every year is feted with a very well attended birthday party; this year there were 10 ½ tables. She has the reputation of being a fair by-the-book director as well. In July, 1990, Dottie was presented a Certificate of Appreciation for Outstanding Contribution to the Novice Program by ACBL.

The Novices are her first love. She holds a limited game for them weekly prior to which she holds a question and answer session for half an hour helping reinforce bridge rules, convention applications, understanding of the play of the game, bidding procedures and a number of other bridge actions and reactions.

On June 30, 1993 Dottie was recognized by ACBL as a Registered Bridge Teacher. She reached Silver Life Master in November, 1997. She is considered a very capable player in her own right.

As a teacher, she is excellent; easily holding the attention of her students and encouraging them to continue increasing their skills at the bridge table.

Dottie has inspired many people to take up this marvelous game we are so addicted to with a book to back up every lesson. She will probably be remembered for her request at the beginning of each game by saying "Let's all play good bridge."

David Pennington - Unit 233

As executive director of the Cultural Activities Center in Temple, David made room rent rates affordable for three weekly sanctioned duplicate bridge clubs beginning with the 300 Bridge Club 10 years ago, and he has actively supported bridge in Central Texas since.

He was elected to Unit board of directors in 1997 for a three-year term and was elected by the board as 1st vice president from 1997 to 1998 and president from 1998 to 1999. He was again elected to the board for a three-year term in 2001 and again elected by the board as president from 2001-2002 when he resigned from the board to become club manager/director of the 500 Bridge Club on December 23, 2002. He has also been conducting bridge classes since that time, resulting in recruitment of a number of new ACBL

As Unit president he effectively proposed an amendment to the by-laws to provide for more equitable representation of the board of directors from the three major areas in the Unit. The amendment also provided for absentee voting by unit members who



There is a term used to describe bridge players that is often heard. A competent player is said to possess or exhibit good "technique". The definition is not listed in The Encyclopedia of Bridge. In Webster's Dictionary "technique" is defined as, "The systematic procedure by which a complex problem or scientific task is accomplished." Just how does that translate into this game we play?

My favorite bridge author, Victor Mollo, published the only good reference I could find. In his The Compleat Bridge Player he observes that the technician knows just what to do, though not always what makes him do it. It does not involve psychology, ego, greed, cunning, or daring. Mollo concludes that "technique" comes in three parts. A true student of the game needs to master these three accomplishments. To become a "compleat" bridge player, one marked by high proficiency, you must develop good "technique."

The first element consists of simple mechanics. This is the easiest of the three. Here is a simple test to rate you with regard to mechanics. As South in a Swiss Team match, you are in 6S. Plan the play with the ten of hearts lead. North

CAK62 The answer is to focus only on your goal. Your goal is twelve tricks. With no losers outside of trumps your objective should be to minimize the chance of losing more than one spade trick. If you decided to take two finesses then your chances of success are about 75% but you failed the mechanics quiz. The proper play is to cash the ace then return to the South hand and lead towards

the Q103. Your chances are significantly better, in fact 83%. An 8% better line is not to be trifled with. Good mechanics can be achieved through basic study of card combinations.

The second element consists of intelligent anticipation. Each decision you make with regard to bidding, play, or defense must be analyzed with regard to the bids or plays that may follow it. Do you ask yourself what the opponents will do in response to your plays? How about your bids? Often I have seen students pause at the wrong time. If you use Blackwood and then pause to think only after hearing the response you are not doing things in the proper order. The time to think is before using Blackwood. What responses can partner make and what will you do in each case? Mollo presents this hand as an example of intelligent anticipation. You are in 6NT in a matchpoint game with a

You win the heart in the North. Using good mechanic skills you realize the best play in spades is to finesse East, not West, for the spade queen (Qxxx can be picked off with East after first cashing a top honor to protect against singleton Q with West, while the reverse is not true). You cash the spade ace and run the spade ten. All follow low to both plays. What now? With the contract assured how do you play?

If you cashed the remaining spade tricks you might have a problem. Did you assume that the clubs were running and discard two low diamonds? If so you will be surprised when the hand is as follows:

Only the diamond finesse will get you the thirteenth trick. How would a player with good "technique" play this hand? After winning the spade ten, stop and test clubs. If the club suit is 3-2 you have thirteen tricks. If not, then you can safely discard clubs on the spades and try the diamond finesse. Learn not to play without thinking ahead. In a hand such as the example, before cashing spades, decide on the discards you will make. Then consider what effect that might have on future play.

The third element is simple experience. You must learn from past experience and see the proper play without having to review and apply basic fundamentals. The proper approach should become second nature, virtually automatic. Again I rely on Mollo for an example. South is in 4S with the king of diamonds lead.

An inexperienced novice would see only three potential losers (1 heart, 1 diamond, and 1 club). As a result he would win the first trick and begin on trumps. When East immediately shows out, the novice cashes a second top spade and plays the king of clubs. East wins the ace and leads the nine of hearts to dummy's jack.

Our novice declarer cashes the two club winners and then puts West on lead with the trump queen. West wins and leads a diamond over to East. Another heart now produces the fourth winner for the defense.

The complete hand:

To avoid this, all our declarer had to do was duck the first diamond. It is now impossible for East to gain the lead twice and lead hearts each time.

Does the expert duck the opening diamond lead because he can see the end position at trick one? The answer is no.

The expert ducks the opening lead because experience has taught him a lesson. The expert sees that a diamond loser is inevitable. To duck the opening lead removes from the defenders the ability to choose which one wins the second diamond later in the hand. He ducks in case that becomes important or is of value to the defense. To remove this option cuts the defenders' communication and there is no reason to leave them this ability.

Work on your mechanics and intelligent anticipation. The experience will come. Watch carefully how expert players play when at your table and learn to emulate their "technique." You will be better for it.





Justin Lall on the Way to Bridge Stardom!

District 16 is full of world-class players and our results in recent world championships reflect this fact. Most of the world-class players are at least 50 years old and so the District, like the rest of the ACBL, faces a shortage of young players marked for greatness. One San Antonio Unit member, Justin Lall is well on his way to stardom while still a teenager. The child of long-time District members Jan and Hemant Lall, Justin got his start at bridge at the age of 10 playing with mom and dad.

Justin accomplished Life Master at age 12, winning the Flight A Open Pairs at the 1999 Dallas Regional with Nancy Passell. In the same year Justin was awarded the J. Homer Shoop Memorial Scholarship in by the ACBL. The Shoop Award is a \$5,000 scholarship for college or career training awarded annually to a pre-teen administered through the auspices of the ACBL. Now, if only we can get him to college!

Justin has read every bridge book he could lay his hands on and taken every opportunity to play with the best players available. Many District 16 players have contributed to his success, including Bob and Petra Hamman, Mark Lair, Ira Chorush, Mike and Nancy Passell, Chris Compton, Greg Hinze, and of course Hemant and Jan Lall. After a recent rubber bridge game partnered by Bob Hamman, Bob Hamman remarked that Justin is "a clear thinker, with unlimited potential." Justin lists his favorite partners as Patricia Lozano of San Antonio and dad, Hemant Lall.

In 2003 Justin began to fully come of age as he exploded to win 672 master points despite attending school full time.

This accomplishment displaced Babu Koneru as San Antonio's top Masterpoint winner and represented a second place finish nationally in the ACBL's Youth Masterpoint category for players under 20, as well as placing 154th on the Crane Top 500. At the Fall NABC Justin played in four NABC events and garnered 150 Platinum points.

Justin and Hemant reached 3N on the north south cards after beginning with a strong club and a negative diamond response. The opening lead by west was a low diamond won by east with the Ace and the lowest diamond was

returned which Justin won in hand with the King. Justin began his attack by driving out the heart ace and east continued the diamond attack by driving out Justin's queen. Justin ran the hearts when they broke 3-3, west pitched a spade on the fourth heart as Justin let go a spade from the dummy and east pitched a club.

Justin reasoned that since west had let from a 3-card diamond suit, as evidenced by the fourth best return from east, that west must have 4 spades. As west had shed a spade on the fourth heart, Justin now made the key play of Ace and another spade.

At this point west, a many time national champion, went into a tank. If he played a low spade, west would be endplayed into leading a club into dummy's KJx. If west went up with the spade king (which is what he did), and played a club, then Justin could play low from dummy and make the hand as long as west had either the club queen or the club 10. On the actual layout, exiting in spades allowed Justin to make a hand he would otherwise have gone down in by losing a club finesse.

Let's challenge Justin to find some more talent from within his own agegroup.





Convention Card Reminder: Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.


If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations **Senior Events:** The minimum age for senior events, currently at age 55, is increased in one-year increments starting January 2005 until the age of 60 on January 1, 2009, and remains at age 60 thereafter. Motion failed.

Ann Whiteside Carb 1926 - 2004

Ann Carb, a silver life master and popular director for the Fort Worth Bridge Studio, died March 1, 2004 at her home while talking with one of her beloved grandchildren on the telephone.

Her contributions to bridge in Fort Worth cannot be adequately measured.

After Ann's parents died when she was 16 years of age, she raised her younger siblings. She married M.R. Carb and they had three daughters, Rita, Kimberly and Meredith. When Mr. Carb died in 1976, Ann took over and ran his development investments business. A driving force in everything in which she was involved, she was a past member of the Women's Club of Fort Worth, past president of the Homebuilders Auxiliary, and a member of the Child Study Center Auxiliary. She was also past president and treasurer of the Horseshoe Club of Fort Worth, a longtime member of St. Stephen Presbyterian Church, the Fort Worth Club, and the Colonial Country

We, of course, admired Ann for her passion for bridge. She almost singlehandedly started the Fort Worth Bridge Studio and contributed her time and managerial skills in making it one of the most successful bridge clubs in the state. She served on the ACBL national board of directors and its Goodwill Committee. She received the James and Oswald Jacoby Award and was given the "Key to the City" in appreciation for her bringing the ACBL National Tournament to Fort Worth in 1990.She served for many years and in many capacities on the Board of Directors of Unit 183 and was director of three games per week. She would play with novices, professionals, and anyone who asked her. She was the backbone of Unit 183 and will be missed by all her friends and bridge players.

This month we are paying a tribute to a truly wonderful bridge icon - Ann Carb.

Around thirty five years ago, Ann Carb borrowed money with which to start the Fort Worth Bridge Studio. She, along with a few other bridge players, slowly but surely built the studio into one of the most successful bridge units in the country. How and why did she do this? Because her heart and mind loved bridge and whatever she loved she gave it her all. On March 1, 2004, her heart stopped and the bridge world lost a true leader.

Many of her bridge peers have told of Ann taking bridge players to and from bridge because she was going and she knew others often needed transportation. One player said Ann called her every time she was going to the studio long after the player had recovered from surgery and could drive herself. Another visually impaired player often caught the bus right across from Ann's home and if Ann saw her, she would stop, pick up her and take her wherever she was going. She visited bridge players if they were in the hospital and took food if someone died in a player's family. These and other thoughtful actions were an everyday occurrence with Ann but few people heard of them because Ann just quietly did what was needed and moved on. In her life, she belonged to many organizations and in all of them she served in a leadership capacity. She truly believed that if you belonged to

an organization of any kind, then believe in it and work to make it a

Everyone knew Ann Carb in the community. She was Tournament Coordinator and very successful because she knew the people who ran the city, its hotels and convention centers. They all respected and admired Ann. And it wasn't- just the leaders of the city. One day when a bridge tournament was being held at the Tarrant County Convention Center, Ann drove into the executive parking lot followed by a bridge player in another car. The guard waved Ann on through but stopped the second car. The guard indicated the second car would need a special sticker or pass to park in that particular parking area. The player said that she was the Symphony Director's wife and the guard said that he was sorry but no pass, no park. The player said "But you let in that lady right in front of me." The guard said, "Yes, but THAT was ANN CARB!" (We think perhaps Saint Peter may have said the same thing when Ann passed through the gates.)

Ann ran three successful games at the studio - Wednesday afternoon, Friday afternoon and a 0-500 game on Thursday evening. All bridge players, whether professional or novice, admired Ann-s work and bridge ethics. She also had strongly-held family values with which she raised her family. Over the years there have been several instances where her children or grandchildren needed her and she would drop what she was doing (including a long-planned bridge trip one time) and go help. She prioritized her life and as such, accomplished more than the average

person. She was such a strong leader (I called her The Boss!) that many people may have thought she merely delegated but she also worked. She worked at her bridge game, she worked on personal and family relationships and she worked to make the bridge studio the best place for everyone who came to play. After all, who else would take the dish towels home to wash and dry every week except Ann Carb? For many, many reasons, both big and small, we will truly miss this great lady.
