

In the three-card ending, Tobi threw him in with the spade A, and he had to lead a heart into dummy's AQ! Piece of cake!

For her victory, Tobi won a gold medal, a beautiful Venetian glass platter, and a fistful of cash in the form of crisp, new \$50 bills! (I felt like I was laundering money depositing it in the bank). Best of all, Tobi automatically gets invited back to all Generali events in the future. Now if only I can get them to invite spouses....







# New in 2005 Special Games in Clubs

Major changes to "special games" allowed in the clubs will take effect January 1, 2005. Junior Fund, Charity and International Fund Games will now be awarding equal master points.

This new regulation will maintain February as Junior Fund Month and will establish April as Charity Month.

All of these games will be treated in the same manner as Junior Fund Games.

In months other than February, April and September, clubs may hold as many or as few of these special games as they desire for \$1. per player

# Intermediate/Newcomer Corner







**Answers:** 



[The Scorecard Editors would like to recognize Gary King's 5th year of writing the Intermediate/Newcomer's Column. Thank you, Gary, for your devotion to the newer player!]

I am amazed at the number of partnerships that agree to play a complicated signaling system yet fully fail to grasp the fundamentals. This is a pet peeve of mine.

How can you possibly gain the small technical advantage that most (note I said most, not all) of the signaling systems offer when you do not know what message to send?

You and partner should both take the following quiz and then compare notes. By my standards, you should play only standard signals if you and partner get all of the following correct.



They packed up and sailed to the land of opportunities even though he had a damn accent. He went to work for the NCH corporation for whom he still works. Ivan has little accent now although he speaks five languages plus has a working knowledge of Greek.

His introduction to bridge came during the voyage from South Africa to South Hampton and then to New York on the QEII: A table needed a fourth and I could not finesse my way

out of it. For two and a half weeks a very patient lady taught me to bid or not to bid, that is the question! Her patience left when we got to South Hampton. By the time I got to New York on the QEII, I was ready to take on the real bridge world and bid and finesse my way to Goren and Sharif. Well, what a rude awakening! I had so very much to learn. When I landed in New York, my tail was between the last hand that I played and those crumpled dreams I had earlier. I never touched another card for twenty years.

Ivan got back into bridge in March, 1999, when his friend, Verd McGuire, found him playing on the internet. He introduced Ivan to the bridge studio and he was hooked again. Lillian Wyly gave him lessons and then Carol Melin and Olive Wood refined him (somewhat.) He has played with Peggy McCormick, Brian Morgan, Shirley Prewitt, Bob Hodges, Jack O-Brien, Virginia Reinier, Dianne Washabaugh and Margot Hirsch. He is especially grateful to Darlene Shirey, J=neane Huey, and Mary Hoger. Then, Ivan says, there is Mary Jane Orock. Never enough can be said about this remarkable person and her dedication to others in the furtherance of the game of bridge. Her dedication (along with that look ) have helped many of us to grow and become better bridge

He met his wife, Annie (his rock), by accident - literally. He was in an accident and she was his nurse. She still offers a soft shoulder in commiseration after a tiring and profitless tournament. He always volunteers at tournaments and other bridge functions and is a remarkable addition to our club.


