## Tobi Sokolow Wins Generali World Women's Individual in Verona, Italy

By David Simon Sokolow Tobi Sokolow of Austin made history when she became the first American, man or woman, to win the Generali World Master Individual, held in September in Verona, Italy. This event, sponsored by an Italian insurer, is held every two years (though the 2002 edition was cancelled after 9/11). Here's how it works: The World Bridge Federation invites 52 of the world's top men and 28 of the world's top women to participate in an "individual" competition. Every man plays two hands with every other man, and each woman plays three hands with every other women. Everyone uses the same convention card ("French standard"), the same leads (fourth best), and the same carding. No private agreements are allowed. This uniformity places a premium on bidding judgment (should I bid game?), defense, and declarer play. The key to winning an individual is getting the best game from your various partners. Why? Because your scores are identical for the boards you play together. If your partner plays well for those two or three hands, you benefit, too. If not.
Unlike Norberto Bocchi of Italy, who overtook the leader on the last board to win the men's event, Tobi led the women's from the start. She won the first session with a $65 \%$ game, won the second with close to $60 \%$, and was sixth in the final session with a $55 \%$. Tobi gave two reasons for her success: she had some luck and she got the best out of her 27 partners.
Tobi's favorite hand in Verona was not from the individual, but from a pair game, playing with her regular partner:

Born in South Africa, he went through high school in Pretoria and then had the opportunity to come to the States and attend Abilene Christian University where he earned a B.A. in theology. He went back to South Africa to East London on the East Coast of Cape Province where he preached for a few years before deciding that the political upheaval in South Africa was not ideally suited for his family. They packed up and sailed to the land of opportunities even though he had a damn accent. He went to work for the NCH corporation for whom he still works. Ivan has little accent now although he speaks five languages plus has a working knowledge of Greek.
His introduction to bridge came during the voyage from South Africa to South Hampton and then to New York on the QEII: A table needed a fourth and I could not finesse my way
out of it. For two and a half weeks a very patient lady taught me to bid or not to bid, that is the question! He patience left when we got to South Hampton. By the time I got to New York on the QEII, I was ready to take on the real bridge world and bid and finesse my way to Goren and Sharif Well, what a rude awakening! I had so very much to learn.
