In the final session, Eddie and Bob had a whopping $67 \%$ game to vault from 28th place to the top spot. Although each had won NABC events with other partners (Eddie had 11 wins, and Bob one), this was their first NABC win as a pair. Congratulations to this popular duo! Eddie's victory in the Open Pairs also helped him capture the MottSmith Trophy (his second!), awarded to the player who wins the most masterpoints at the Spring NABC. Kudos to Eddie as the ACBL's top dog in P'burgh!

Chris Compton of Dallas had an amazing run in the Vanderbilt. His team, originally seeded \#23, made it all the way to the finals, before falling to the original \#4 seed. Along the way, Chris's team dispatched four higherseeded teams, including the illustrious Nickell squad. As the immediate past president of the United State Bridge Federation (the organization in charge of international competition for the United States), Chris deserves both our thanks AND our congratulations. Mike Passell, Plano, and Eddie Wold had a fine showing in the Vanderbilt, too,
finishing tied for third-fourth.
John Zilic of Houston and Tom Peters of Grapeland finished second in the Silver Ribbon Pairs. (Bit o'trivia: the winner was my high school English teacher, with whom I played bridge 40 years ago!) John and Tom have had success as a pair before at the nationals-they won the Open Pairs II in 1994.

Dallas denizen Peggy Sutherlin finished second in the Women's Swiss Teams. Peggy is on a roll: she has finished first or second in the last four NABC women's team events. As a result, Peggy's team has a bye to the semifinals of the Women's International Team Trials in Las Vegas this June. The winners and runners-up will represent the United States in the Venice Cup, to be held in Estoril, Portugal, in October. Good luck, Peggy!

Success in NABC events was not confined to District 16 luminaries. Inger Lise Blount of Horseshoe Bay and Jeanette Hughes of Marble Falls finished second the North American Pairs- Flight C. Congratulations on a fine showing!
A number of District 16 players had top-ten finishes in national events. Dan Morse, Houston, and Bobby Wolff, were third in the Open Swiss Teams, and $5 / 8$ in the Vanderbilt. Bob Hamman, Dallas, was $5 / 8$ in the Vanderbilt on another team. Sidney

Lazard and Bart Bramley of Dallas finished fourth in the North American Pairs-Flight A. Hemant Lall, Plano, was eighth, in the Open Pairs. Lynn Baker of Austin was ninth in the Women's Swiss Teams. In the Women's Pairs, Shawn Quinn, Richmond, and Grace Hunt, Dallas, were fifth, and Peggy Sutherlin was eighth. Petra Hamman, Dallas, and Hemant Lall finished sixth in the Mixed Pairs. Finally, Patricia Lozano, San Antonio, and Justin, Lall, Plano, were ninth in the North American Pairs- Flight B, while Wanwan Ren and Jeff Ford of Austin were fifth in Flight C.

Tournaments: The ACBL had a record setting year in 2004 with the highest number of tournament tables of all time. $(463,409)$. Member numbers are rising and retention of first year members has increased to a record $66 \%$. I think we can do even better on membership numbers if we all recommend Duplicate Bridge to our non-bridge playing friends.

Clubs: Club participation was up $66 \%$ in the North American Pairs for 2004. Starting on January 1, 2005, any Club Official or Teacher recruiting 25 new members during a calendar year will receive a $\$ 100.00$ Gift Certificate to the ACBL Product store.
If any of the Unit, Clubs, or
individuals would like to promote Bridge in an event such as Senior Games, Health Fairs, etc. the ACBL will send a variety of promotional items including an ACBL display.
Membership: The ACBL Board of Directors approved an increase in the quarterly rebate that Units receive for their members. The new rate is $11 \%$ of full dues payments and Life Master Service fees.
ACBL membership is the sum of all PAID Members and active UNPAID Life Members.

ACBL Committees: District 16 members 2005 National Committee appointments: Bob Hamman to Competitions \& Convention Committee; Mildred Breed to Ethical Oversight Committee; Tom Peters to ACBL Disciplinary Committee and Dan Morse to Real Estate Committee A strategic Five-Year Plan for the ACBL was approved.

An Insurance Committee was appointed to study all liability insurance policies of the ACBL, Districts, Units, \& Clubs and make a report in July.

A Real Estate Committee was appointed to study the Real Estate needs of the ACBL Home Office.
A Century Club will be established for our members that reach 100 years of age and an appropriate mention will be made in the Bulletin.
A sub-committee will be appointed to review the Regional Tournament Allocations.
The Board of Directors recommended to the Hall of Fame Committee that it increase the number of members who will be allowed to vote.

World Bridge: The ACBL will request our member countries (USA Mexico, and Canada) to establish an appropriate dress code for teams representing us in International competition.
U.S. Junior Fund will limit its contribution to $\$ 50,000$ annually to support International Junior Bridge.

The following are just a few of these ideas which you may want to consider for your unit.
Charity Unit Grant Rebate: San Antonio Unit 172 tops ACBL's Charity Rebate with $\$ 852.00$. We currently have four other units - 201, 204, 209 and 224 - due for a charity rebate if they initiate the request prior to November 31, 2005. Call Kelly McQuire at 901.332 .5586 for the required form. Unit 172 schedule four charity games per year and the unit pays the difference between what is due to the ACBL charity and the normal cost of an entry. This means more masterpoints at no increase to the members. This is a winning situation for the players, club owners and units!
Volunteer Recognition: We have so many individuals who are doing everything possible to better bridge in our District and they are not being recognized. District-9 Unit presidents
(Florida) are currently awarding two deserving individuals per year District9 Goodwill Pins. I think this is a great idea and I would like to hear your comments prior to the San Antonio District Board meeting. You may also meet one of our most successful newer players (he won the Mini-Mckenney the last 3 years and the Ace of Clubs the last 2 years in his category) who is an absolute delight to know. He has a big grin that crinkles his eyes almost shut except for the twinkles that emerge bringing a smile to everyone. ## Gary King <br> 299er Editor

In bridge, as in life, there are generally good and bad aspects about any subject you choose. The subject of this column is mentoring. Mentoring is a process through which a player of greater experience takes on the teaching role for a player with lesser experience. Many 299er players live in areas that have active and organized mentoring programs. In other areas mentoring is kind of a hit or miss thing that often just occurs when a more experienced player decides to take on the task of "passing on the wisdom" that he or she has gained over the years. In broad terms mentoring is a good thing. I think that anyone that gives of their time to the benefit of others should be applauded.
If you are reading this and you are a 299 er that has a mentor I think you should cut it out and make sure your mentor gets a copy. You can do it personally or anonymously, that is up to you. If you are reading this and you perform as a mentor to a lesser experienced player then please read on and think about my suggestions

I have taught a fair number of students over the years and I have heard many stories about what they have been told about this game we love. What I would like to achieve is to improve your results so that the time you invest is better spent and the outcome is a valuable one for your student and for the game as a whole. As a mentor, what is your job when
you play with your protégé? If you answered that is it to win the game or event, I would submit that your priorities are wrong. I think your job is to provide a solid and steady platform by which your student can learn. You are not a professional bridge player. Your job is not to win. Your job is to instruct.

At times, the required attitude can be difficult or even contrary to your natural instincts. Everyone wants to win, that is just normal. But when you are playing with a student your job is to play your side of table and let partner play theirs.

First Rule: Always make the proper bid and resist the temptation to "take charge."

If you have every just leaped to game or slam instead of making the correct bid, then you are not helping.

and will do the wrong thing. Need I point out, that is why you are there? You should bid $2 S$ and let the chips fall where they may. If partner does that right thing over 2 S then you should note it and give positive reinforcement. If partner looks quizzical and leaps to 4 S getting you to a $3-3$ fit, then you look upon this as a learning opportunity to discuss (later, of course, not at the table) responder's job and the use of fourth suit forcing.

Second Rule: Be careful with your descriptions when discussing any element of the game.

Please just remove the words "always" and "never" from your vocabulary. I cannot tell you how many students have ask a question, "I was playing with Billy Bob last weekend and he told me that I should ALWAYS return the opening lead." Think about what you are saying. It is much better to patiently explain that returning partner's opening lead is frequently or often the correct defense, but that there is no substitute for thinking and considering all the possibilities before deciding what to do. You didn't really mean always, so please do not say so. Students respect your opinion and will take your advice to heart. Be careful with your words.

Third Rule: Do not feel compelled to point out or discuss every error on any hand or during any session.

Pointing out every mistake just works to demoralize your partner. Pick three or four things at most to discuss
after the game (or after the hand if you must). A case in point:

The opening lead is a spade which partner ducks. The defenders continue spade and partner ducks again. The opponents now cash the diamond ace and lead another diamond. Partner manages to come home with the rest of the tricks, making 630.
You have so many choices...

1) With a game going hand bid the suits naturally by starting with the longest (2C as an initial response).
(2) With two suited hands you should strive to explore both suits and the value of a trump fit.
(3) Hand evaluation and pointing out the unused bidding space between 2D and 3NT.
(4) The proper use of the hold-up play.
(5) Counting tricks and making a plan for the play.
(6) Suit breaks and the fact that hearts are $>50 \%$ to produce five tricks.
(7) The proper slam is 6C and your partnership never even bid the suit.

Should you discuss all of these with partner? Not a chance. Pick ONE and talk about it. Let the others go. It is of little value to try to correct all the issues. Work on whichever you feel is important. If bidding has already come up on a previous hand, then pick one of the play issues.
As a mentor your best results will come from a slow and methodical process, one of continuous improvement. Don't try to make super star of your partner over night A number of $35 \%$ games early on wil produce better and more consistent results in the long-term.
In closing, thank you for taking the time. Make it as effective as possible Let me hear from you.

## TIPS THAT WILL RECRUIT NEW PLAYERS

A steady stream of new players coming into your club is a necessity if the club is to prosper and grow. Here are some ideas other club owners have found successful in helping to attract new players.

1. Start an Easybridge! game. Easybridge! is a marketing device designed to attract new players to the club and get them playing in a game.
2. Advertise your bridge games with appealing names. Games advertised as "Not so serious duplicate" and "No stress, no frills bridge" have a lot of appeal for newer players.
3. Recognize that you need newcomer games to be successful. $60 \%$ of all ACBL members have under 300 masterpoints. $40 \%$ have under 100 points. 4. Offer a variety of newcomer games. Students, new players, and players new-to-duplicate need venues to play in that are NOT the open game Offer a variety of games such as Bridge Plus+ and Supervised Play.
4. Host an end-of-classes party. Invite the teachers in your area to an end-of-classes party at your club. Offer an introductory game for masterpoints. 6. "Mixers" captialize on the social interests of your players. Advertise a mixer for new players who want to meet more new players. A good tag line is, "Meet new people AND have fun!"
5. Run a promotional game at the mall. Run a game in a store that is temporarily empty. Invite the new players to visit your club.
6. Help your students discover and enjoy duplicate bridge. Run a game for your students that provides a protected enviornment.
7. Have the eighth lesson at the club. Contact teachers who are not teaching at your club and arrange to have them teach the last lesson in their series at your club. Consider giving the students a future free play.
8. Introduce students to duplicate at graduation parties. End of a lesson series with a graduation party. The students will play duplicate, have refreshments, compete for lucky draws and prizes, and masterpoints!
9. Offer a full duplicate game as one of your course lessons. Make your students eager to play the game by staging a duplicate sesson as one of your lessons. The students play and the game is scored and masterpoints are awarded.
10. Offer supervised play sessions for students. Offer supervised play sessions for students between regular classes. Involve the teacher in these games to make the students more comfortable.
