
The Superflight was won by Bobby Wolff, Dan Morse, Jim Griffin and Ken Schutze who won by 27 over Bob

While many Districts only have 2 or 3 teams enter the Superflight, District 16 had seven teams. For the 2nd time since the Superflight was introduced in 2001, there was a team, one this year, two last year, that did not have any National champions on it. And that team made it through the Round Robin. The other 6 teams were loaded with multiple National Champions. One



team that was sadly missing for the first time that I can remember was the perennial favorite led by Malcolm Brachman, who passed away late last year. His team, usually spearheaded by Passell and Eddie Wold, was sorely missed. Still the field was loaded with players who regularly make late rounds of National Team Championships which makes this event truly worthy of playing in regardless of how you finish.

Each Flight had a 2-session qualifying stage and then went to 28 board KO's to determine their winner. The winners of each of the 4 Flights will receive funds to help supplement their expenses to compete in Atlanta at the National Final this summer. SOCHADEAL.

I kibitzed the final and was treated to very tight bridge-most of the swings came from sound bidding judgment. Hamman and Wolff have won many National and World championships together. They always impressed me with thoughtful card play and no nonsense bidding and this final was no different except that they were now opponents. There were no double digit swings in this final. The Griffin-Schutze partnership bid no slams during the 106 hands that they playeda rarity indeed. One major swing occurred when Morse had to play Jx of C's opposite K10x for 1 trick with 1 loser at 5Hs. They went bait at 4Ss the other way in the closed room. Dan did not disappoint as this deal provided almost 1/2 their margin of victory-8 won instead of 4 lost. I can still here the first lines of "After the Gold Rush" that leads this article. Peggy Sutherlin Venice Cup USA II

Dallas District 16 member Peggy Sutherlin, playing with long-time partner Karen Allison, finished second in the United States Women's Bridge Championships Venice Cup. Peggy has won 9 National Championships in ACBL land while at the world level she won the Women's Olympiad in 2000, was 2nd in the World Mixed Pairs, and had two fourths in World pair events, one mixed and one women's. Over the years Peggy has given much of her time serving the ACBL in various capacities including the Laws Commission, Ethical Oversight, and National Appeals.

The Cinderella story of the Women's trials was the performance of Cindy Bernstein (previously of Bryan) playing with Sally Wheeler (Houston) and Georgiana Gates (Houston) playing with Patricia Griffin (Austin). Originally seeded 11th out of 13 teams, the Bernstein team survived a pair of two day round robins just to make it into the semi-finals which lasted another 1.5 days. Once into the semi-finals of the winner's bracket, Gates upset Sutherlin and her above mentioned teammates before losing to the original #2 seed Narasimhan (Irina Letvina- Hansa Narisimhan, Debbie Rosenberg-JoAnna Stansby, and Jill Levin-Sue Picus) in the finals of the winner's bracket. Narasimhan thereby became the first team to qualify to represent the United States in the Venice Cup. Returning to pay Sutherlin a second time, Bernstein put up a valiant fight in before losing. Gates has previously represented the United States in

the Montreal McConnell Cup playing with Wheeler and together Gates and Wheeler won a national Women's Pair in 1988. Additionally, Gates won the Women's Knockout in 1994 In addition to the Women's Pair with Gates, Wheeler won the Women's Knockout in 1986, represented the United States in the 1988 Venice Cup and has numerous national seconds. Pat Griffin together with Wheeler won the Flight A GNT, but previously Pat had only ever entered one women's event at the national level or higher. All in all, it was an amazing performance by a four-handed team over 8 days of top level women's bridge. We are certain that this team will be heard from in the future!

played June 4-12 in Las Vegas. Peggy's teammates were Kathy Sulgrove-JoAnn Spung and Rene Mancuso-Pam Wittes. Finishing second in the double elimination tournament was virtually as good as winning because both the first and second place teams qualified to represent the United States in the Venice Cup later this fall in Estoril, Portugal. Peggy's team was the #1 seed in the event based on her team's performance in last year's national women's team events; as such, her team earned a bye to the semi-finals where they promptly lost their first match to Bernstein before returning with vengeance from the "loser's" bracket to defeat Bernstein in the play-off to be the second US representative to the Other District notables included Mildred Breed and Shawn Quinn who were on the original #3 seed and finished fourth.

In the United States Bridge Championship held May 13-21 in Houston, Bart Bramley finished 3/ 4th playing with Mark Feldman, Kit Woolsey-Fred Stewart, and Steve Robinson-Peter Boyd. Thanks to Unit 174 and the District for their excellent support of the USBC. Special kudos go to Jim McInvale of Gallery Furniture, Marsha Bernstein, Bert Onstott, and Shawn Quinn for all their contributions.



North American Pairs Announcement

District Level Qualifying Sessions January 14-15, 2006 in San Antonio

(1) Sanctions for Unit NAP finals are due in a minimum of 90 days prior to the event. Our district has a deadline of August 1st for submission to the ACBL. Unit coordinators should verify that there is no conflict with nearby tournaments, religious holidays or any other special events that could impact bridge players and file request online. A copy will be forwarded to the district coordinator for confirmation. Mail forms to John Zilic ONLY if unable to file online.

(2) Dates and locations for all timely filed unit finals will appear in the September/October Scorecard.

> IMPORTANT CHANGES TO CONDITIONS OF CONTEST:

(6) Players that qualify at any club in the district may play with any other qualified player at ANY unit final. No more residency requirements. Each player is still allowed. ONLY ONE UNIT FINAL ATTEMPT PER FLIGHT to qualify for District.

(7) All unit finals may be one or two session events. Two session events must be scheduled for the same day or back-to-back afternoons or evenings.

FOR COORDINATORS AND CLUB MANAGERS:

(8) Strat levels remain the same: A unlimited; B 0-2000; C non LM less than 500 MPs. The June MP cycle (run between May 1-15) determines eligibility.

usually increases MPs for all players. (10) Individual qualifying slips need not be created for players. An ACBL Score list of qualified players may be generated at the end of the qualifying period and sent to the unit coordinator. Players intending to play outside the unit may ask for a slip or copy of the page of qualified players.

(11) Game reports should not be sent to the District Coordinator unless that is the only game the club will run during the entire period. The same list sent to the unit coordinator should be forwarded to John Zilic with a note of the dates games were held.

(12) Contact district coordinator by phone or email with any questions about these conditions or using ACBL Score to provide proper reports.

Gates Shines in USWBC

Georgiana Gates declarer play shone brightly on this hand from the semifinals of the United States Women's Bridge Championship (see story p.1).

Obviously, a heart lead would have reduced Gates' chances to the losing club finesse and led to down one. Note that East's failure to double Wheeler's 4H cue bid, resulted in West's leading his normal DK. On an aside, if East did double North's 4H cue, could you and your regular partner differentiate North's actual HK from the more useful Ace? Note that unless playing 1430

responses, Roman Key Card will not help South as a one keycard response of 5D will carry North-South past 5C. Returning to the hand as bid, Gates

won the CK in hand with her singleton Ace and considered her options. Obviously, one approach was to cross to dummy's SK and finesse the CK. This play is essentially a 50% line, depending solely upon the club layout. Gates found the successful alternative play of combining her chances in spades and clubs by first crossing to the SK, but then rising with the CA when East failed to cover dummy's CQ at trick three. Gates plan was to cash the Ace and Queen of spades, discarding hearts from the dummy. Assuming the Jack of spades had not fallen as it did on the above lay-out, Gates would then lead her fourth spade towards dummy. If East held the outstanding Spade Gates would be cold as West could not effectively ruff in because Gates would discard dummy's last heart. If west followed with the 13th spade, Gates would ruff and hope that the CK was also with

West, then cross back to her hand with a diamond ruff to play the now good 13th Spade to discard dummy's final Heart. Gates' play wins whenever the CK is singleton with West or when Spades are 4-3 with the jack in the short hand or with the SJ os fourth with East or when the SJ is fourth with West who then most also hold the CK. The statisticians in the District will enjoy the challenge of comparing Gates' actual line to 50% Club finesse. However, if you believe that East would occasionally error by covering the CQ when from dummy then her play is clearly superior.



Pat Griffin Stars in Women's Trials

1) Artificial game force, start of relay

began with three rounds of diamonds. South winning the third diamond in dummy with the DQ. At first glance, the hand seems simple, cross to hand with a club to South's Ace, return to dummy with a heart to North's King, ruff a club back to hand, return to the North hand with a spade to ruff the last club with declarer's remaining lone Ace of Spades. 11 tricks if the second heart cashes and South survives ruffing a third heart to dummy to hopefully draw the remaining trump. 10 tricks if the second heart goes gets ruffed or the spades go 4-1 and South suffers an uppercut trying to return to dummy to draw trumps.

However, on the actual lie of the cards, West void of hearts, complicated matters greatly by ruffing the first heart led toward dummy's king and returning the CJ through dummy. South could ruff this in her hand, return to dummy with a spade and ruff the third round of clubs with the now lone SA. However, South would then be stuck in her hand with only hearts to lead toward dummy allowing West a second ruff for the setting trick.

They must stop. Never say what you mean. Let me put that another way: Always say what you don't mean. A lack of clarity could cause unclearness. This confused player is now banned for three months. Is that clear enough? Resume play. And remember: lighten up and have fun...otherwise, you could go home and have nightmares about his game!"

Disciplinary Hearing Results in Expulsion for World Champion Pair from European Championship Open Swiss

The 2nd Open European Lead: HA Championships were held in Tenerife. Spain June 18-July 2, 2005. During the Open Qualifying Swiss Team event the following Disciplinary Hearing arose which resulted in a World Champion Pair being expelled from the event. The following is the Official Committee Report of the event.

The Facts: At the end of the play, East called the Director to explain what he had seen

The Director: Told the facts to the Chief Tournament Director, who decided to call upon the Appeal Committee to hold a Disciplinary Hearing

Present: All players, the Captain of East/West, and the Coach of North/ South

The Players: The Chief Tournament Director explained to the Committee what the East player had told him. Dummy, North, had leaned across to take a look into East's cards. East had then noticed that North had held his arms crossed, and had signalled with three fingers on his arm. East had seen a signal with three fingers three times. Declarer had then played the DJ at trick three, and had let it run, thus making his contract.

East then told the same story in his own words. He had not shown his cards, but North had taken a look into them anyway. East had seen three fingers on three occasions, and he had called the Director after Declarer had successfully finessed in diamonds.

East complained that he had been so shaken about the whole thing, that he could no longer play to his full capacity.

They had lost the match 2-25.

- West related the play to the first three tricks:

- West led the HA, East contributing the H8:

- West then asked a number of questions, particularly about the HK, which South confirmed having shown in the auction;

- West switched to the C9, taken by the King

- After some thought, South called for the DJ, East contributing the D6 in tempo;

- South thought for some more time and let the DJ run.

East once more showed what he had seen North do: the left arm lay before him on the table, the right hand lay across it, with the middle three fingers pointing downwards. East showed that he had seen the three fingers once across the wrist, once across the forearm and once free on the table in front of the arm.

South was asked to confirm the play as described above, which he did.

South was then asked to explain why he played the diamonds in the manner he did. He gave the following responses:

- The lead of the HA was curious because dummy had not made a cuebid in hearts;

- After all the questions he decided to play diamonds 1-3:

- The first two boards were bad for him and he needed 20VP to qualify for the next round:

- Diamonds are always badly divided in this tournament. He had also found the DO on board 24 (West commented that he had made lots of bids on that board, so finding that Queen was clearcut)

North explained that all through the

) pm

day, when dummy, he had laid both arms on the table and rested his head on them. This could not be confirmed by East/West since this was the third board of the match and he had not been dummy on the first two.

North told the Committee he had only 20% vision in his left eye, and the red honours were all the same to him from that side.

When confronted with East's statement. North denied that he had looked at East's cards.

The Coach of North/South, in name of their Captain (who was absent). explained that he had told his team to win the match by at least 19 or 20VP. He had never heard allegations of this kind in 30 years' work for the federation and this particular team.

West finally added that South had also put his head on his arms while thinking about running the DJ.

The Committee's Deliberation:

The Committee addressed the issue of their jurisdiction under the Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge. Under law 91B:

Right to Disqualify, The Director (and on a reference, the Committee) is specifically empowered to disqualify a contestant for cause.

- The Committee also addressed certain technical issues raised by North/ South:

- The Committee rejected the argument that "Diamonds are always badly divided in this Tournament.'

- The Committee noted that bidding and making Six Diamonds by normal play was quite likely to win the board as the slam was not straightforward to bid.

- The Committee noted that tackling diamonds (trumps) by leading the Jack was singularly against the odds; except in the specific circumstances when declarer knows that East has exactly three diamonds.

In this case the odds are 3-1 in favour of leading the Jack.

- The Committee noted that East's duck of the Jack of Diamonds was correct technique. South could have had five diamonds, in which case it is a normal gambit to lead the Jack to induce a cover with O10x.

The Committee's reasons:

In the play of the hand, East/West believed that Declarer had acted upon improper information conveyed from dummy.

They suggested how this information was possibly passed.

When asked to explain his reasons for playing the hand in such a fashion declarer gave a number of reasons which the Committee found unconvincing. It was adjudged that the nature of these explanations by a competent player was self-incriminating.

The Committee's decision:

Lanzarotti-Buratti to be disqualified from the teams event - Law 91B.

Match Score adjusted to 18-0 in favour of the team of East/West.

Matter to be referred to the Credentials' Committee with reference to the Pairs' event in these Championships.

Editor's Note: This pair has been very successful in recent months competing in North American events. Specifically, they were on the winning 2005 Vanderbilt Team at the Pittsburgh Spring NABCs and took the top position at the 2005 Cavendish Pairs held in Las Vegas each year.

The human mind is an interesting thing. When we learn fundamentals, we also develop a tendency to not consider alternative approaches. The alternatives simply do not occur to us. To become an accomplished declarer you must realize this fact and learn to overcome this fact of human nature.

What do I mean by this? Consider a holding like this:

Dummy KQ4

Declarer AJ32

It is drilled into beginning students to establish or cash tricks by playing the equal honors from the short side first. As a teacher of beginning students I have repeated this line over and over again. Why? Because for beginning students the "common sense" approach is begin with the ace, then the king, then the queen, and so on. The concept of equal honors is new to them so they fall back on their own paradigm of ace first. As a teacher I have to first break that mold and then remold their thought process to play the suit so as to avoid blocking their tricks. Blocking is new and therefore not part of the beginner's analysis. This is the starting point for training because, more often than not, keeping a suit unblocked is the proper approach. Good technique includes keeping suits unblocked so that all tricks can be cashed easily.

But what occurs next is the interesting thing. Once the new paradigm is established, the student generally never even considers cashing the suit in any other order. You might think of it as a blind spot. As a result, alternative lines of play are not seen and the player's success rate suffers. Take a look at this hand, declarer is in 3NT:

The defense cashes the first 4 club tricks. The suit divides 4-3. You discard a low spade out of both hands on trick four. You have eight top tricks. The defense next leads a heart. The position at trick five:

You have two possibilities for a ninth trick, the simple spade finesse or a 3-3 break in diamonds. You have the other problems of the blocked heart tricks and the shortage of entries to declarer's hand. How can you try both possibilities to maximize your chances?

If you try cashing the hearts and then

Your paradigms have placed you in a predicament. This is your last chance to cash the heart jack but what will you discard from dummy? You can no longer try both possibilities. You have to either discard the spade queen and rely on the diamonds breaking or



discard a diamond and rely on the spade finesse.

You needed to know if the diamonds were breaking 3-3 before cashing the heart jack. After clearing the hearts from dummy try cashing THREE rounds of diamonds ending in declarer's hand:

You have stranded the last diamond in the dummy, but the spade ace provides an entry. If the diamonds were 3-3, then discard the spade queen when you cash the heart jack and dummy is all good. If the diamonds were not 3-3 then discard the diamond and take the spade finesse. Win or lose you have tried all possibilities.

The normal paradigm of playing to avoid blocking a suit got you in trouble. In some cases you must take a road less traveled.

Try this easy five card double dummy problem.

With spades as trump and South on lead, how can you play to take four of the five remaining tricks? It easy to set up the diamond suit by



trumping a low diamond in the North hand, but then how do you get back to the South hand to cash the good diamond?

If you trump a diamond and lead a low club, East can win and put you back in the North hand with the now bare club ace (you will now have to lead a heart to West). If you cash the club ace then lead a low club, East can cash two club tricks.

Consciously think past your paradigms.

Do you see the solution? Throw away your club ace on the diamond ace before trumping a diamond!

If you win the heart king at trick one you can make only twelve tricks. Win the heart king, diamond ace, diamond king, spade finesse, diamond to the South, spade finesse, and cash the spade ace discarding a club. Since spades are 4-2 you now just lose a club and make 12 tricks.

Preserving entries to the North is more important than simply taking heart tricks with top honors. Try winning the heart ace at trick one, spade finesse, diamond ace, diamond king, spade finesse, trump a spade low, trump a heart, and discard both clubs on the two good spades taking all thirteen tricks. Try thinking outside the box! Let me hear from you.

Lead a low club and you will get to the South hand losing only one trick.
