## Youth World

 Championship!Justin Lall

District 16's newest and youngest in ternational star, Justin Lall of Dallas, brought home the Gold Medal as a member of United States Junior I at the World Youth Team Championships held the first two weeks of August in Sydney, Australia. Justin and his partner, Ari Greenberg, were selected to join the 2001 US World Youth Team Champions Joe Grue-John Kranyak and John Hurd-Joel Wooldridge for the competition. USI defeated Poland 209-194 in a 104 board match the match was decided in an 8 board overtime when the regulation 96 board final ended in an exact tie. The US team originally qualified out of a week-long 18 -team 20 -board match round robin before defeating Canada 181-115 in the 64 board semi-finals.
Justin shone brilliantly on the below deal which occurred on the first board of the second half (fourth segment) with the USI trailing Poland by 45 imps (including carryover from Poland's round robin defeat of the USI) when this deal came up:

Board 49: Dealer North, None Vul


Holding 4 Spades himself and hearing the opponents bid and raise spades in the auction, Justin reasoned that partner would be short in Spades. If partner had an Ace, two or three trumps, and one other useful card for his negative double, then Justin could visualize taking 8 tricks in his hand and four in partner's hand. Additionally, it seemed extremely likely that partner had 2 or 3 trumps since he seemed marked with only one Spade. So, when partner showed one Ace over Blackwood, Justin bid the slam.
As expected, West led a Spade which Justin won in hand and immediately led a Club towards dummy. West made the best play of ducking smoothly because if West takes the Club, Justin can either cross ruff if West returns a Heart, or set up dummy's Clubs if West returns a trump.
Since Poland bid to 3NT at the other table in the match, twenty-one imps were riding on a successful Club guess as Justin would either win 11 imps or lose 10 imps . What were the clues and what is the right play? Well, the 1 S overcall by West is not much of a clue as the East-West Heart honors are not well known. However, if the King of Clubs wins, Justin has a clear route to 12 tricks by ruffing two spades in the dummy, whereas even if the Club Jack successfully drives out the Ace of Clubs, Justin must still find Clubs 3-3 on the expected trump return. Justin rose to the task, playing correctly to go up with the King-and scrambling home for 12 tricks. Well bid and well played! This hand changed the momentum of the match as USA1 went on to win the fourth segment by 40 Imps and cut Poland's lead to a very manageable 5.5 Imps with 32 boards to go.

Says teammate Joe Grue, "We couldn't have won this match without you, Justin!"

Congratulations to Justin and his teammates for winning the World Youth Team Championship.

Like the Union forces back in 1863, District 16 players took Atlanta by storm at the Summer NABC. Four players won nationally-rated events while six others were runners-up (one of 'em twice!). Was it the $10 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. and 3 p.m. start times? Memories of "Gone with the Wind"? Those juicy Georgia peaches? Who cares! Whatever it was, it worked like a charm for District 16's best.
In what must surely be one of the most "stomach-in-a-knot" finishes of all time, Nagy Kamil of Plano won the Open Pairs. When the final scores were first posted, Nagy was declared the winner. Then, after two appeals (neither involving the top two pairs), Nagy dropped to second by . 05 masterpoint (that's right-five onehundredths of a point!). Fortunately, a scoring error put Nagy back on top by the whopping margin of almost half a matchpoint. Give Nagy an alka selzer and a hand!

Reprising their victory of 2003, Hemant Lall of Plano and Petra Hamman of Dallas won the Mixed Board-a-Match Teams, with Tobi Sokolow of Austin and John Sutherlin of Dallas second. Tobi and John's score would have been good enough to win most years, but this year, they had to settle for second. Hemant and Petra's team had "a mountain" in each final session to put the victory away. Congrats!
Austinite Lynn Baker won the Wagar Women's Knockout for the second time. Brava! Lynn seems to be on the same cycle as Hemant and Petra: she first won this event two years ago. I bet the three of them are looking forward to the summer 2007 nationals in Nashville!
Grace Hunt of Dallas, John Zilic of Houston, Tom Peters of Grapeland, Nancy Passell of Plano, and John Sutherlin were second in the Senior Swiss Teams. As astute readers of this column will note, this was John's second second of the tournament, and

Grace's second second in a row in this event. Whoever said "Consistency is the hobgoblin of small minds" obviously never had much success at the bridge table! Special kudos to John and Grace for their repeated successes. In the Grand National Teams, only our Flight A team reached the round of eight. Indeed, they made it all the way to the semifinals. Mark Bumgardner of Carrollton, Bill Staats of Southlake, Mike Bukala of Waco, Charles Price of Sherman, Justin Lall of Plano, and Greg Hinze of San Antonio finished thirdfourth.
Many District 16 players had topten finishes in national events. Chris Compton, Dallas, was $5 / 8$ in the Spingold; Mike Passell, Plano, and Eddie Wold, Houston, were 5/8, too, but on a different team. Justin Lall, Plano, was $3 / 4$ in the Mini-Spingold (0-5000), while Michael and Barbara Estep, Hurst, finished $5 / 8$ in the 0 1500 event. Petra Hamman and Joan Jackson, Dallas, were $5 / 8$ in the Women's KO. Greg Hinze and Ira Hessel, San Antonio, were fifth in the Open Pairs. Nagy Kamel ended up eighth in the Fast Open Pairs (he obviously excels in Open Pair eventsfast or slow!). Robert Morris, Tom and Carolyn Peters, Grapeland, Joan Jackson and Norman Beck, Dallas, were eighth in the Mixed BAM Teams. Bob

Hamman, Dallas, was fifth in the Open Swiss Teams, while Chris Compton finished tenth.

Congratulations to the Atlanta Bridge volunteers for a wonderful tournament. Attendance was 13,464 tables which were about $2 \%$ more than predicted. The starting times were the controversial issue of the tournament. For the first time all events began at 10:00 a.m. and 3:00/4:00 p.m.
The game times were well received by some, however, if you were playing a two session event starting at 10:00 a.m. and finishing at 2:30 or 3:00 p.m. one had very little time to eat and get ready to play again at $4: 00$ p.m. The initial intention for the time changes was to finish about 7:30 p.m. so players would have time for a nice dinner and have some evening time off. Every straw test showed about $50 \%$ in favor and 50\% against. The players that were anti-time change made the most vocal complaints. For the Anti players they will be glad to hear that the times are set by the local sponsors of the tournaments and for the next three Nationals the local sponsors have opted to return to the $1 \& 7: 30$ starting times.
VISITOR The tournament had a nice surprise when Bill Gates dropped in to visit the Junior Reception and have his picture taken with the young players. He seemed to enjoy his visit with the young stars. We really appreciate his visit and thank him for coming. VENDORS It was pointed out that any tournament sponsors allowing vendors to sell products should be sure that both the sponsor and the vendor carry insurance. As a result of an accident at a vendors space the sponsor, the vendor, and the ACBL are being sued.
MEMBERSHIP Membership is up 773 persons from June 2004 to June 2005, as we all know the average age of the players is gradually going up and now the average age is 67.28 . We also know that the game of bridge is healthy for those that are already retired or the ones nearing retirement. The ACBL is looking for a Firm or a Consultant to assist in trying to market over 50 yrs players to join our Bridge world. DISTRICT 16 MEMBERSHIP We have gone from being the ACBL District with the second most players to the District with the fourth most players. I am asking all of you in our District and Units to make an effort to increase our membership. If we can increase the membership to 9000 members from the present 8235 members
we would be eligible for a bonus Regional. After discussing membership is sues with other ACBL District Directors, I feel that this is a doable goal and that a good slogan is 9000 by 09 . JUNIORS AND YOUNG PLAYERS The ACBL has hired a consultant to help market young people (elementary age through 26). The big news is that a web site www.bridgeiscool.com will debut about the middle of August. I hope everyone will check out this website and if they like it recommend it
to young people.
The ACBL has embarked upon a minibridge camp program and if anyone knows of an ongoing camp that could incorporate Bridge please let me or the ACBL know.
PLAYING PENALTIES The penalty for a fouled board in sectional and regional events was reduced from a full board to a quarter board. In NABC events the full board penalty will still apply.
HALL OF FAME The proposal from the Hall of Fame Committee was wel received and approved. The main changes were to require $50 \%$ minimum percentage of ballets cast for a candi date to be elected and the number of electors was increased from about 200 to 400 .
NAP FINALISTS Funding for NAP finalists was changed and now each player eligible for money will receive a subsidy equal to three nights lodging at the Host Hotel. Players will no longe be required to stay at the Host Hote nor will they be required to provid proof of where they stayed. This will simplify the accounting for both players and the ACBL.
There has been a problem for some time about residency with the GNT There have been cases where players chose to play in a District in which they wished to play instead of the Distric in which they lived. During the nex ACBL National the BOD will legislate clear rules for determining residency a well as penalties for violation.
CLUBS The current ACBLScore can be downloaded free from the ACBL Website. Outdated versions of the ACBLScore do not provide for elec tronic submission of accurate monthly reports. Effective January 2, 2006 an additional $\$ 2.00$ per game fee will be charged to those clubs using the out dated ACBLScore. A minority of clubs usually very small clubs) do not ye use ACBL score. These clubs will re ceive a free version and will pay an additional $\$ 2.00$ per game sanction fee if not using it after January 1, 2007.

For example if the first number of your player number is 2 , then the letter $K$ is directly underneith the number 2 . Therefore, if your player number currently begins with the number 2 , the number 2 will be changed to the letter K when you become a Life Master. All of the other numbers remain the same

## TEXAS STAR AWARDS <br> Description of the Award \& Guidelines for Selection and Presentation Ceremony

1. The Texas Star Service Awards ("the Awards") shall be presented once annually at the Lone Star Regional Tournament held in Houston in the winter.
2. The Awards shall be presented by the President of District 16. If for any reason that officer is unable to make the Presentations, the Texas Star Service Awards Committee ("the Committee") shall select a person to make the presentation.
3. The Awards shall be presented just prior to commencement of play of the second session of the game held on Saturday. If play is held in more than one location, a presentation ceremony shall be held in each location. Presentation of the Awards shall be shown on the printed schedule of the tournament. Sufficient time for the presentation(s) shall be allowed by the Director in charge of that tournament.
4. Identity of the recipients of the Award shall be kept secret until their names are announced by the presenter during the presentation ceremony. All persons involved in the selection process at both the Unit and Committee levels shall take every precaution to insure confidentiality from commencement of the selection process until after presentation of the Awards. The method, screening and selection process shall not be discussed by any person involved except among themselves.
5. Each Unit within District 16 may, but need not, select one person to receive the Award annually. A married couple may be selected. Each person selected shall be a member of the selecting Unit in good standing, resident within District 16. A person who has received the Award in a prior year is not eligible for selection.
6. A recipient of the Award shall be a volunteer who has worked diligently at the Unit level. Receipt of a nominal compensation for burdensome tasks shall not automatically classify a person as a non-volunteer. A unit may ask the Committee to determine the classification of a potential recipient of the Award. The Committee's determination of classification of a potential recipient shall be final.
7. The Committee and its Chair shall be appointed by the President of District 16 at the annual meeting held during the Lone Star Regional Tournament in Houston at the beginning of each calendar year. The President may appoint the Jacoby Award Committee and its Chair to form the Texas Star Awards Committee ex officio. The Committee shall receive the selection from the Units annually, and arrange for a suitable commemorative pin for each recipient of this Award.
8. The Chair of the Committee shall notify each Unit each September of the opportunity to name a recipient of the Award. Such notification may be by letter or by publishing the notice in the Scorecard. The notice to the Units should outline the qualifications which the Unit should keep in mind in making its selection and should stress the need for confidentiality. Selections by the Unit must be received by the Committee by January 1 of each year. 9. The Committee shall maintain a record of all recipients of the Award.

Being faultfinding, which causes stress to one's partner, creates negative emotions that have a peril for the rest of the session. That is, your partner's distress from the criticism can be a factor in his/her not playing up to par the rest of the day. Push the right buttons that will help motivate partner to bring out the best. Like my daddy use to say, "If you can't say something nice, don't say anything at all."
HOW HAPPY ARE YOU? Please draw a circle on a piece of paper. Divide that circle into pieces of a pie, as to what feelings and percentages you feel
about your present life. For instance, are you $50 \%$ depressed (like when you've had a poor game), $30 \%$ anxious, $95 \%$ content (like when you've mad an impossible contract), $70 \%$ stressed (like when you made a stupid mistake), $85 \%$ ecstatic (1st Overall!), 10\% lonely...? Tuck your answers into you subconscious, then put the paper away and redo the exercise in a few months Compare the two. Did anything change? Are you still blaming or giving credit to others for the feelings that you have? How much responsibility are you taking (or not) for your OWN feelings and own life? WE are the authors of our lives! Think of each life experience as an episode in our own story that becomes the raw material for the next episode. What we write next depends on how we PERCEIVE the previous chapters. If we don't claim ownership, then we will always be leading lives that have been scripted by OTHER authors. Not a good thing...for them or for you. Let's empower ourselves by taking ownership of our own biographies.
Applying that life lesson more to bridge, let's say that you like playing bridge with a particular partner However, he/she is frequently overly critical. YOU be in the driver's seat You can control your reaction and emotions. We won't even tell him/her how many mistakes they've made! I wish I could take credit for the above lesson but I've adapted it from Jo-Ann Saunders, a friend. To learn more, go to hereforashorttime@sbcglobal.net

## Stay with the hand

One of the toughest things to do as declarer is to look at a bad dummy, realize how hopeless the contract is, yet maintain full concentration to minimize the damage.

Let's look at this deal from the national BAM teams at the fall nationals in Phoenix 3 years ago.
South was dealer and held: $\mathrm{xxx}, \mathrm{xxx}$, $\mathrm{Kxx}, \mathrm{AQJx}$ and the bidding went:
$\begin{array}{llcc}\text { South } & \text { West } & \text { North } & \text { East } \\ \text { Pass } & \text { pass } & \text { ID } & \text { IH }\end{array}$
South didn't like his choices, negative double with only three spades, 2D shows 6-9 points with 4D or 1 NT without a heart stopper. Also north/south played a weak NT system, so opening one of a minor is often a $15-17$ NT hand. So trying to keep game in the picture, South bid 2C to show 10+ points and supposedly $5+$ clubs, the bidding abruptly ended with all pass.
Dummy came down not to south's liking, here's the full deal:

BD7:
VUL: both
Dealer: south


South could stop to wonder why did his partner open this sub minimum hand
with a bad suit vulnerable or to regret his own decision to bid 2C, but that was not a good time, the east/west pair was an expert pair and things did not look good-on a bad day this contract can go down a lot. Optimistically south can see at least one spade, two hearts, probably two diamonds losers and whatever trumps he is about to loose since he is playing in the opponents eight-card fit.

West led the ace of hearts, switched to a diamond, east thought for a while and won his ace to switch to his stiff spade.

Declarer won the queen in dummy, played a club to the queen, then cashed the DK \& DQ and played the 13th diamond.
East convinced that he is the one with trump length didn't rough, declarer pitched a spade while west roughed. Now west returned a high spade forcing the ace, roughed by east, who returned a heart that west roughed for the book and this position.

West played a high spade that east erred by roughing, south over roughed, pulled the remaining trumps and claimed eight tricks and a win on the board.
The fact that an expert pair misdefended the hand is not the point here; we've all misdefended hands more than we care to remember. And although this hand is not your typical example of playing hopeless contracts, since we rarely play a two level contract in the opponents eight card fit, with the HCP's almost evenly divided, let alone make it. However, it emphasizes the point that good things can happen, and that we need to stay upbeat to give ourselves the best chance.
Remember the defenders don't always

know how much trouble you're in, unless you tell them with body language or worse comments to your partner. Good defenders can read declarer's emotions, realize if declarer is in trouble, and even use this information to locate missing high cards and direct the defense accordingly.
A typical hand when it is particularly hard to control our emotions and stay focused is, when we find ourselves in 5 H doubled, after partner pulls our penalty double of 4 S , we look at dummy and figure, we were on our way to +500 but instead we are about to go -500. All we can think of is why did partner pull, what was he thinking, and before we know it, we loose control of the hand and end up -1100 .
Defense is hard, and there are usually options for the defenders to choose from, don't make it easy for them by giving it away. Control your emotions and try to minimize the damage. Discuss how you got there later but for now stay with the hand; you will be pleasantly surprised with the rewards.

Let's speak about defense. It is by far the most difficult aspect of the game. Bidding is a numbers and shapes task, and there are pretty well established guidelines to help you. Play of the Hand is a solitary activity and also more closely defined. You know exactly the assets with which you have to work. Defensive play, on the other hand, is a team activity. You know or control only one-half of the assets owned by your side. These extra dimensions are what make defensive play so hard.
I am going to attempt to discuss this subject without a single example hand. I want to keep the discussion on a thinking, mind set, and problem solving level.
There is some good news about defense. Your objective in terms of number of tricks you need for success is always less than that of declarer. Secondly, you get to fire the first shot with the opening lead.

Your approach is completely different when defending a no trump contract from when defending a trump contract. In the balance of this column I will cover the philosophy of no trump defense. The next column will deal with trump contract defense.
As long as you are playing against competent opponents then the first assumption you can make is that they have the appropriate values for the contract they have reached. If they end in 1NT or 2NT then the combined strength of the opponents is usually 21 to $24 / 25$ points. If they reach 3 NT , then the combined value is $25 / 26$ to 32 points. If hey reach 6 NT then the combined value is 33 to 36 points. The slower that the opponents bid to a game then the closer they hold to 26 . Actions like 1NT-3NT are 26 to 32 , while Auctions like 1NT-2NT-3NT are very likely to show right at 25 or 26 points. Why is this important?
It is important because the first step in a proper defensive strategy is to estimate the combined strength that you and partner are likely to be able to deploy against the contract in question. As you will see later it may well alter your opening strategy.

If the opponents hold the values required for the contract that they are in, then the mathematics tells us that are simply more likely than not to be successful. That means if the suits are breaking as expected and if roughly half of the available finesses are favorable then declarer will prevail.
That is all true if you only plan to take tricks with your honor cards. Now, if your honor cards are well placed for your side, then perhaps that strategy is the proper one. If RHO (right hand opponent) opens 1NT, the opponents subsequently reach 3 NT , and you hold 14 high card points then your points are well placed behind declarer. Since declarer holds the balance of power you are well placed. Half of the finesses are not likely to succeed.
Similarly, if one or more suits bid by the opponents are not breaking well (you hold a void, singleton, or four or more) then again you may have a surprise for declarer. It is in these situations when a passive defensive strategy might be the correct one. In a passive strategy you lead and play in a style designed to give to declarer what she has coming and be very careful not to provide any help in terms of a free finesse or leading away from honors. Better to lead from nothing (if you finesse partner that is something declarer could do on her own) than lead away from an honor. Lead strong suits held by declarer (she owns those tricks already), avoid leading a suit not previously played, and wait for declarer to play tricks to you. Good passive leads include suits of three or four small cards (no tens and preferably no nines either), three card suits headed by the 109, J10, or QJ10.
None of those things are true if you hold the holy grail of no trump defenses, the long suit headed by a sequence. The best example is a suit that is headed by a complete sequence like 1098xxx, J109xx, QJ10xx, or KQJxx. Following closely behind is a suit headed by an incomplete sequence like 1097xx, J108xx, QJ9xx, or KQ10xx. Less appealing, but still strong is a suit headed by an interior sequence like

A hand when you hold all or most of values for your side should probably be approached passively unless you hold a suit with good attacking potential such as those described in the last paragraph. Remember that when partner holds few or no honor cards it can be very dangerous to lead away from your honors
The other side of the coin are hands where your side's values are roughly evenly divided between your and partner's hands or where most of your side's values are poorly placed in front of declarer (when you play before declarer and she is in a position of capturing your honors). In these cases an active defense is likely to be the best choice.
In an active defense you set out to establish small cards from the longest suit in your and partner's hand combined. You are just not going to defeat declarer if you wait around, so some risk is appropriate. There is little to lose because you know, even if declarer does not, that she is odds on

Doris Allen
Doris Allen, Harlingen, was the 2005 recipient of the Fred Friendly Award. The honor was announced at the Atlanta NABC in July. The Fred Friendly Award was named in honor of the late TD Paul Stehly of Minneapolis. Stehly's nickname was Fred Friendly because of the way he related to players.
Doris has been a tournament director since 1997 , jumping right in after only about 18 months as a club director. She was a hairdresser for 38 years, starting at age 17 , but decided to change careers when she suspected chemicals at the salon gave her a lung infection.
She started playing bridge in 1991 and gravitated to directing at the suggestion of another TD. Tom Whitesides is the ACBL's Texas field representative. He had high praise for Doris. "Everyone loves Doris," he said. "She is always positive and upbeat, always going at 110 percent. She's had a rough (health reasons) time but you would never know it from her."
Said Doris, "I love the people I work with and I love being around player. I love all of it!"
A fellow bridge player recalls a ruling made by Doris: I don't know if you had
the occasion to meet Doris Allen. In case you have not, let me place her in Texas bridge. She is tournament director from Harlingen, Texas. I first met her during the Dallas Labor Day Regional of 1998. I would like to share the fact that not only she is the nicest but she also one of the wittiest directors I have ever met. To illustrate, here is what actually happened on Labor Day.
I was playing with Jim Barrow on that last day and facing Charlie Price and his partner. Charlie and I have been friends for over thirty years. We chatted while waiting for things to start. At one point, he matter-of-factly asked me how many times I had been married. I immediately called "Director, Please!" having seen Doris walking nearby. She came over and very professionally asked "What seems to be the problem?". I responded that my right hand opponent wanted to know how many wives I had had.
She turned directly to Charlie without a smile in her face and said: "Sir, you are asking for "UI," that is unauthorized information, therefore not available to you. Please proceed!" and she nonchalantly walked away as if not a thing had happened.
