## Nine Pairs Take Home Court at the Dallas NABC NAP Finals

The 2006 District 16 National Open Pairs finals were held in San Antonio on the second weekend of the New Year to qualify 3 pairs from flights A, B and C to represent District 16 at the national finals to be held at the Dallas Nationals in March.
This year Houston pairs swept the top spots in each Flight. After 4 sessions the qualifiers were Flight A 1. Joe Quinn-Shawn Quinn, Richmond 2. Justin Lall-Hemant Lall, Dallas 3. Mildred Breed-Clint Schuhmacher, Austin. Flight B 1. Anton (Tony) Haddad-Mike Doyle, Houston 2. Inger Lise Blount, Horseshoe Bay-Jeanette Hughes, Marble Falls 3. Bob Scallan, Dallas-Suresh Agrawal, Rowlett TX. Flight C 1. Brett Elliott-Harry Elliott, Houston 2. Robert Arnett, HoustonSandra Parker, Sugar Land 3. Charles Gibson Jr-Mickey Tryon, Arlington TX.

Players qualified in specially designated games at the club level and then competed in a 2 session Unit Final to determine who would go on to

compete at the District level. The leading (usually 3-4) pairs in each flight from each ACBL District go on to compete in the National Finals at the Spring Nationals in Dallas in March This year the 122 pairs that competed in the District finals were the highest since we had 134 in 1995. The lowest was 74 in 2000 but the total has increased steadily since then. The top pair in each Flight get their hotel and airfare. The 2nd pairs get just airfare. While the ACBL provides nothing for the third place pairs there is a rumor that the Dallas Unit might provide gas money to any of their members who took third.
While the Quinn's are not the first married couple to win a spot from our District, I believe that the Lall's may be the first father and son. Justin won the flight B last year with Patty Lozano and after winning the World Junior championships, he was compelled to try his luck in A. He was the third place finisher in A in 2004. For Mike Doyle, the winner of Flight B, this is at leas his sixth trip to the Nationals via this
event. He admits he has lost count. He qualified twice in Flight C and has qualified 4 times in Flight B with 4 different partners! Inger Lise Blount, and Jeanette Hughes, 2nd in B this year, qualified from our district in flight C last year and finished 2nd at the National finals in Pittsburgh.
The action in Flight A was, as usual, way tougher than typical Regional pair games. Eleven of the original 29 pairs contained National Champions and 4 pairs contained world champions including all three qualifying pairs Against my pair all three qualifying pairs in A demonstrated that aggressive bidding proved to be a winning strategy. Paul Soloway once told me that he never goes for averages at matchpoints and the winning pairs adopted this strategy well. Good luck in Dallas!! The Quinn's won the last National event in 2005 and are primed to win the first of 2006 In "The "Year of The Horns" there is good reason to believe Texas players will continue to thrive at the Nationals. Hook 'em qualifiers and I don't mean finesses.

The District 16 Board of Directors elected new Officers for 2006 during the breakfast meeting at the Houston Regional in February. ## Bart Bramley Wins Silver Medal in

 World Transnational Open Teams in Estoril, Portugal

District 16 player Bart Bramley won the Silver Medal in the Transnational Open Team event held at the World Championships in Estoril, Portugal last October. Bramley was joined by his partner Mark Feldman and teammates Bjorn Fallenius, Chip Martel, Warren Spector and Roy Welland. It is easy to see why Bramley had such great success when you look at the following deal which won the Best Defended Hand of the Year.

Bart Bramley led the diamond jack, promising the queen. Let us look at the deal and speculate about how many tricks you expect declarer to come to. Well, there are clearly nine tricks available by dislodging the spade ace before playing on hearts, but let us see what happened at the table.
Roy Welland ducked the opening lead, won the next diamond, pitching a spade from dummy, and led to his heart
ace - he could see the danger in taking the heart finesse. Now he planned to duck a club to West, win the return, and drive out the spade ace. But, when he led a low club from dummy, Mark Feldman played the Queen!
It was not safe to duck this, so Welland won and crossed to the heart king (hoping that the fall of the ten or queen would make his life easy). No luck there; so he played a spade to his king - and Bramley ducked!

Now declarer played two more rounds of clubs and committed the very slight error of leaving his own hand with the re-entry when he saw that West was about to win the third club (it seemed irrelevant to him, since he knew East had the spade ace.) This was the position:

The defense had two tricks in, and Bramley now led a heart to his partner's queen for the diamond switch. When declarer won and played a second spade, Bramley had the rest.

## OSWALD \& JAMES JACOBY SERVICE AWARD

Description of the Award Guidelines for Nominations, Selection Committee and Presentation Ceremony 1. The Oswald \& James Jacoby Service Award ("the Award") shall be presented once annually at the Dallas-Fort Worth Regional Tournament held in the fall.
2. The Award shall be presented by Judy Jacoby. If for any reason she is unable to make the presentation, the Jacoby Service Award Committee ("the Committee") shall select a person to make the presentation.
3. The Award shall be presented just prior to the commencement of play of the second session of the game held on Saturday. If play is held in more than one location, a presentation ceremony shall be held in each location. Presentation of the Award shall be shown on the printed schedule of the tournament. Sufficient time for the presentation(s) shall be allowed by the Director in charge of the tournament.
4. The identity of the recipient of the Award shall be kept secret until that person's name is announced by the presenter during the presentation ceremony. Members of the Committee shall take every precaution to insure confidentiality from commencement of the selection process until the presentation of the Award.
5. Each Unit within District 16 may, but need not, nominate a person whom it considers to be a suitable recipient of the Award. Only persons nominated by a Unit may be considered by the Committee. A Unit may nominate only one person, who need not be member of that of that Unit, and who shall be a member in good standing of the ACBL, resident within District 16. A Unit may nominate a person for more than one year. A person who has received the Award in a prior year is not eligible for nomination. No member of the Committee shall participate in the nomination process at the Unit level; one who inadvertently does so shall be disqualified to participate in the screening and selection process of the Committee 6. The Committee and its Chair shall be appointed by the President of the District at the annual meeting held during the Lone Star Regional tournament in Houston at the beginning of each calendar year. Each member of the Committee shall be a recipient of the Award for a prior year. The Committee shall meet at a time of its own choosing to review nominations currently received and nominations on file, and select one nominee as recipient of the Award. Normally the Committee will choose to meet during the July Regional tournament. The Committee may screen nominees by a process which it deems appropriate in order to determine that each nominee is in fact qualified to receive the Award. The method, screening and selection process shall not be discussed by members of the Committee except among themselves. The Committee shall retain nominations on file for a reasonable time, normally not more than five years.
7. A recipient of the Award shall be a volunteer who has worked diligently at the Unit level and who has risen to recognition at the District level after many years of outstanding service. Receipt of nominal compensation for burdensome tasks does not automatically classify a person as a non-volunteer. The Committee shall determine the volunteer status of each nominee during its screening process.
8. The Chair of the Committee shall notify each Unit each March of the opportunity to nominate a recipient of the Award for that year. Such notification may be by letter or by publishing the notice in the Scorecard. The notice to the Units should outline the qualifications which the Unit should keep in mind in making its nomination and should stress the need for confidentiality. Nomination by the Unit must be received by the Committee by July 1 of each year. 9. The Committee shall maintain a record of all recipients of the Award.

How many bridge deals do you think are possible? I will tell you - there are 53,644,737,765,488,792,839,237,440,000 possible bridge deals. You do not have enough time to learn how to play everyone of them. What you do have time to learn is a problem solving process. A process that you can apply to every bridge hand that you encounter. You must have a plan. After the auction is over and while your left hand opponent is considering the opening lead, you should begin the following four step planning process. You should do it on every hand that you play. Continue with the process after dummy is tabled and do not play the first card from dummy until you are at the last step.


Spring NABC: We nervously waited and planned; then we planned and waited. At last, Dallas, the City of Champions, hosts one of three gigantic annual ACBL international tournaments. The eyes and ears of the bridge world are on us. I better spend a little more time picking and brushing my hairpiece! Sure, it can be a little windy in March and April. Need a little extra glue or tape.

Wednesday, March 29 through Sunday, April 9- 11 days of non-stop bridge. You're going to have fun at the Hyatt Regency Dallas at Reunion. After a game you might go up to the top of Reunion Tower for a meal or beverage and a rotating view of one of the world's greatest cities.
"City of Champions" has been the tourney slogan for a long time. As we near press time the Mavericks (basketball) and Stars (hockey) are playing like champions and leading the field. With the UT Longhorns' Rose Bowl, National Championship win on Jan. 4, perhaps we should widen it to

Step One your objective. How many tricks do you need in order to make your contract? It is critical that you convert the contract into a number of tricks. Don't think 3NT. Think 9 tricks. Don't think 4 hearts. Think 10 tricks and no more than 3 losers. The contract by itself is too abstract for your mind to focus on, however a number of tricks or a number of losers is more easily grasped. Put your goal in terms with which you can work.

## Step Two

Count your winners and losers. It is usually best to count winners at no trump contracts and losers at suit contracts. You know your objective. How many tricks do you have? These are SURE tricks. Tricks that you could cash right now. If you don't own the ace then you don't have any SURE tricks in that suit.

## "State of Champions.

Courtesy is \#1: Not everyone who leaves North American Bridge Championships will leave with new double digit Masterpoints. But we want every guest to feel very welcome and glad to be in Big D. Of course, courtesy is something for us to observe at all games, but we really want to show our Southern polished manners and respect. Let's be extra polite even if something goes wrong at the table. Practice indulgence. Go especially out of your way to be nice to our many international players.
How about introducing yourself to

Step Three
Identify all the places that offer the possibility of trick development. Do not select any alternative until you have identified all the possibilities. Choices would include the use of promotion, length, finesse, trumping in the dummy, discarding losers, or any combination of these
Step Four
Play the first card from dummy. You wouldn't get on an airplane without knowing it's destination would you? Don't start playing cards to the hand until you know where you intend to develop your tricks.

Remember that if you're a morning person games start at 9 am almost every day. If you've got to make a run for the pass, keep in mind the Stratified Fast Open Pairs.

In 4 H your objective is to limit your losers to 3. You have no losers in any suit outside of hearts (trumps).
Holding 8 hearts leaves 5 for the opponents. When missing 5 cards in a suit you expect them to be distributed 3-2 more than half of the time. If you lead hearts 3 times and the suit breaks as we expect, you will have only 3 losers on this hand.
Your 10 winners will be 2 spades, 1 heart, 4 diamonds, and 3 clubs.

The idea is to keep east from gaining the lead and playing a small heart through the south hand. Lead a small spade and watch what west plays. If west plays the k , then play low from the north hand. If west plays low, then win the a and play a spade which west is forced to win. In either case west must allow you to take three tricks by leading spades or hearts.
