During the presentation, Chairwoman of the ACBL Good Will Committee Ailene Osofsky and Unit 172 President Roxana Tom praised Cisse for her years of service to the San Antonio Unit and District 16. Osofsky also honored our District President, Dewitt Hudson, for the work he has done in our District. District 16 was given $\$ 20,000.00$ by the ACBL Charity Foundation to be donated to local Texas charities of our choice in 2006. At the Dallas NABC it was announced by Marsha Bernstein (A National Charity Foundation Trustee from Texas) that $\$ 4000.00$ would be given to the following five charities: Volunteer Services Council for Lubbock State Schools, Midland Rape Crisis and Children's Advocacy Center, Habit for Humanity International, South Plains Food Bank and Star of Hope.

The definition of a Unit in good standing was defined and will be available on the web site under units \& districts soon. Units it's good to go over your by-laws and if you have any questions you can send a copy to the ACBL attention Jim Miller and he will review them for you.
Every 5 years the Board goes over masterpoint awards and now is the time. So if you have any suggestions about changes in the present Master Point awards you can send your suggestions to the BOD@acbl.org and write attention Master point committee.
The Board was shown a product being used in Europe and the WBF called Bridgemate. This device is wireless and transmits the scores from each table to a computer after each hand is played. The result is then ready after the last board is played. Players going to the open World Championships in Verona will get a chance to try out these Bridgemate devices. They are a little pricey but definitely have advantages over the current system.
The ACBL is currently offering a 6 month amnesty program that runs thru June 30, 2006. If someone you know has not paid there dues or service fees they can get credit for any masterpoints won if they renew during this period.
Changes to the ACBL Disciplinary Regulations were approved. You can review or download the changes from the ACBL website if interested. A rewrite of the ACBL election regulations was approved, effective this year. A copy is available from Memphis if interested.

5 year Strategic Plan. This year I am Chairman of the Governance Committee, on the International Events Committee, Marketing Committee, and Board Operations Committee and also serve as a WBF delegate, ACBL 401 K serve as a BF delegate, ACBL

## Dallas Spring 2006 NABC: Deutsch Wins Vanderbilt Hamman Wins Open Swiss Teams Breed \& Quinn Win Women's Swiss

By the second Friday of the Dallas nationals, your faithful NABC correspondent was getting nervous. No District 16 player had won a nationally-rated event, and the tournament was almost over. What would I write about-the weather? Not to worry! District 16 players captured all three major crowns up for grabs on the final weekend.
Seymon Deutsch of Laredo won the prestigious Vanderbilt Teams. His team, originally seeded number 44, was truly international, comprising two Americans, two players from the People's Republic of China, and one Swede living in London. Seymon, who won the World Team Olympiad in 1988 and the Rosenblum Cup in 1994, took several years off from bridge, but he's back in a BIG way! Way to go, Seymon!
Dallas denizen Bob Hamman won the Open Swiss Teams in convincing fashion. His team had the event won before the last round even started! Bob won this event back in 1990, the year it switched from men's to open status. That probably makes him two-for-two in this event. Let's face it: he doesn't often get to play in the Open Swiss since he's usually in the Vanderbilt finals! (Bob was $5 / 8$ in the Vanderbilt this year).

On the distaff side, Mildred Breed
of Austin and Shawn Quinn of Richmond won the Women's Swiss Teams. Their margin of victory was more than a full match. It doesn't get much better than that! Congratulations!
In terms of sheer numbers, District 16's best showing was in the NABC 49'er Pairs, a one-day event for players with-you guessed it-49 masterpoints or less. Except for the winners, the leaderboard was practically all District 16: second, Nadine Barker and Suzie Herman, Fort Worth; tied for 3/4, Quin Rainbolt and Susan Pratt, Fort Worth, and Lyn and Mike David, Richardson; fifth, Joe and Gaylene Jewell, Houston. Congratulations one and all!
Lots of District 16 players had topten finishes in national events. Joan Jackson, Dallas, finished third in the Women's Pairs. Joe Quinn, Richmond, was third in the Silver Ribbon Pairs, while Herbert Wilton, Fredericksburg, finished ninth. Peggy Sutherlin, Dallas, was third in the Women's Swiss, and Lynn Baker, Austin, was fourth, Jeff Olson, Dallas, and Derrell Childs, Garland, were fifth in the Open Pairs. Eric and Toni Snow, Houston, wound up ninth in the Mixed Pairs. John Sutherlin, Dallas, was ninth in the IMP Pairs; John Zilic, Houston, and Michael Dalton, Carrollton, were tenth. Jeff Ford and Nicholas Jong,

Austin, finished fifth in the Red Ribbon Pairs. Finally, Weishu Wu, Plano, and Wanfeng Mou, Sugar Land, were fifth in the Open Swiss; Ira Hessel, San Antonio, and Steve Shirey, Fort Worth, ended up seventh.
Thanks to everyone who came and played in Dallas. The turnout was in line with expectations ( $10,318.5$ tables), and the fun quotient was high. Special thanks to all those who worked so hard to ensure the tournament's success, especially chairman Gerrie Owen. Last but not least, kudos to Cisse Horton of San Antonio, who was named the ACBL's Goodwill Member of the Year for 2006. (The way she kicked my butt the last time I played her demonstrates that her "goodwill" only goes so far!). A well-deserved honor, to be sure

## Making Beautiful Music at the Bridge Table

Bridge players smile at the Dallas duo of Gloria Stroud and Peter Grenier. They're a congenial duo, both Life Masters, but they would probably prefer to have musical instruments rather than cards in their hands.

Gloria played violin in the famous Dallas Symphony Orchestra, retiring in 1991 after 42 years, one of the longest reigns in DSO history. Peter is currently a bassoonist with the DSO in his 22nd season.


Gloria Stroud
Gloria, a child prodigy, was born in Cisco, Texas, a town near Abilene, where she began studying violin at the age of five. At seventeen, she won a scholarship to New York City's Julliliard School of Music. She also studied in France.

In 1945, the highly accomplished violinist left Julliard to form a string quartet, join the USO and perform for soldiers injured during World War II. She owned a Petrus Guanerius violin made in Italy in 1740. It was not practical to take that valuable
instrument on such a trip and so she located a dealer who stored it in a vault and loaned her a much less precious one. Shirley Mesmer, the other violinist, was from New York City; the violist was Margaret Purvis from Vancouver, British Columbia; and the cellist was Genevieve Kniese from Milton, Indiana.

Most music written for string quartets is classical, but the young ladies knew that the convalescing soldiers would prefer popular or well known semi-classical. Margaret knew a young composition major, Elmer Bernstein, who wrote special arrangements for the group. Elmer later became a famous composer of motion picture music in Hollywood.

They did not know where they were headed due to wartime secrecy. Then orders came to take a train to Seattle en route to the Pacific theater. They stopped in Chicago on the way, enjoying dinner at the Palmer House, still a favorite of Gloria's. The Matsonia, a cruise ship transformed to a troop ship, was crowded but the girls had a tiny room with bunk beds. They wore evening gowns when performing, giving a taste of elegance in sorrowful days of war.

They made it to the Hawaiian Islands and beyond, mainly sleeping in Quonset huts or tents on other islands. Their contract called for their playing three shows a day of $30-40$ minutes and then visiting patients for 20 minutes. However, on the first day they simply played all day, performing for ten hours.
"We were young, energetic and saw no reason to stop," Gloria recalls. "We usually played around 10 shows a day. The 'Symphony of Strings,' as we were called, sometimes stretched to twelve performances a day," she noted. (no pun intended).
"In eight months of practically

living on top of another and dozens of performances, we never had an argument," Gloria smiled. "That doesn't mean we agreed on everything, but we had absolutely no problem getting along. It was wonderful!" she said.
"It was not easy to be upbeat in hospital wards where multiple amputations had been necessary," she recalled. "The smell in those wards was overpowering and my heartbreak was at an all-time high. Several times after we left wards I found a private corner and cried. You never get used to seeing young men who had lost several limbs," she said.
"We began collecting money from each island or country and had friends sign their name and address. A hospital corpsman named Layden Louis Stroud Jr., from Dallas, signed one of my bills," she sighed.
"During a break in Okinawa, I located $n$ empty operating room in a Quonset hut and crawled on the operating table to lie down. In a few minutes I sensed someone else in the room- Layden. He signed a dollar and went into the next ward where we performed. I winked at him- very brazen of me- and he rode back in the ambulance that returned the girls to their tent. We said goodbye and I thought that it would be all but it wasn't," she continued.
"I returned to Julliard and transferred to Southern Methodist University, where Layden coincidentally was attending school," she said.

Gloria got a bachelor's and master's degrees at SMU, where she was voted the most outstanding music student. The year 1949 was historic. She married Layden and began playing in the Dallas Symphony Orchestra.

She began activity in the recording industry in the 1950's, recording thousands of TV and radio commercials and playing in hundreds of pop phonograph records with such artists as Doc Severinsen, Ray Price, Benji Albumn and John Gary.

The Strouds have two children, Sharon and Gloria, plus two grandchildren, Austin and Rachael. They have visited 92 countries.
"But bridge became my passion," she said. Gloria is an excellent player and is very courteous to all at her table

She performed as a volunteer for seniors in rest homes until 2002 when she became ill with chronic fatigue syndrome. "Now my life is considerably slower, but I still enjoy participating in many events," she added.


## Peter Grenier

Peter Grenier grew up in the Chicago suburb of Palos Park but spent a good deal of time in Western New York. He received a bachelor's degree from the famed Eastman School of Music in Rochester, then he got a master's degree at Northwestern University. Peter learned to play all of the woodwind instruments - flute, clarinet, saxophone and oboe - with the bassoon being his primary focus. He then spent several years as a freelance player in the Chicago area playing everything from symphonic music to touring Broadway musicals to hamburger commercials, including a tour as the baritone saxophonist in the well-known Buddy Rich band. His first full time orchestral position was in the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra in 1981-82, and during that season he won the position of bassoonist/ contrabassoonist in the Dallas Symphony. He can still be spotted
occasionally playing the baritone saxophone on DSO pops concerts as well. He is in a rare breed in that he also repairs the instruments he plays, and is well known in the southwest as a specialist in bassoon repair.
One of his early bridge successes was winning Flight B Swiss Teams at the Dallas Nationals in 1997. "I was still a C player, having been playing duplicate only a few years," he says. "My partner was a friend of mine from Chicago, Frank Bischoff. We hadn't been playing much together, obviously, because of the distance, but we had been using e-mail quite a bit to get our card together. Our teammates were my now longtime bridge partner Lynne Wood and Wanda Blankenship. We had bought an entry into the flight C swiss, but when that didn't make we were rolled into the flight B game, which we then won! I'll always remember the exhilaration of that first big win."

Of the similarities between music and bridge, he says, "Both pursuits require individual study and lots of 'seat time.' Music requires years and years of individual practice, which is hard to come by with bridge, since it's a partnership game. But to be accomplished at either one requires discipline, imagination and experience. You learn to be part of a team, whether it's pairs or team of four at bridge, or a team of two, thirty, sixty, ninety or more with music. Believe it or not, your partner really is on your side!"

Peter married Ft. Worth native Barbara Banner, a now retired data processor for Mobil Oil Corp., in 1984. Like Gloria, he is very congenial at the bridge table.
There are well known Dallas musical conductors. Anshel Brusilow, who conducted the DSO and now conducts the Richardson Symphony, generally plays bridge Tuesdays at Valley View Bridge Club. Hector Guzman, maestro of the Plano Symphony Orchestra, is also a frequent player:

If you didn't go to Big D, you missed a great Spring NABC. The weather was just wonderful and the hospitality was Texas style. Chairperson Gerrie Owen and her many volunteers did an outstanding job. Congratulations Unit 176. The table count for the 2006 Spring NABC was 10,318 .
This is 783 less than the 1997 Spring NABC with 11,101 . Possibly the increased entry fee, parking and tournament schedule before and after might have been a serious factor However, I played eight of the ten days and had a wonderful time.

## Rebates:

District 16 will receive $\$ 24,807$ for calendar year 2005 rebates. This fund is based on the number of new members generated for the year 2006. District 7, 9 and 17 are the only districts receiving a greater rebate.
Bid Box Alerts and Announcemnts: When using bid boxes, ACBL requires that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time. When making an announcement, use the announcement word - such as "transfer" - and tap the Alert strip at the same time. A player who alerts or announces a bid should make sure the opponents are aware that an alert or announcement has been made.

Notice to Players:

1NT Range Announcement: Announcing your 1NT range remains a requirement in ACBL sanctioned tournament play. Failure to annouce your 1NT range, while rarely penalized, remains a procedural infraction. Please make life easy for your opponents and your tournament directors by Announcing the high card point range of your 1NT opening bids.

2. Badgering, rudeness, insinuations, profanity, threats or violence.
3. Negative comments concerning opponents' or partner's play or bidding.
4. Gloating over good results. A simple "nice play partner" is sufficient.
5. Objecting to a call for the director or disputing or arguing with a directors ruling.

Tomorrow's Champion Today ... Justin Lall


Justin Lall

Who would pay to play bridge with a youngster of 19 ? Lots of people if your name happens to be Justin Lall. In a nation of players with mega Masterpoints, the measure of bridge success and prowess, this Dallas player holds more Masterpoints than any other 19 or younger player in the country and is an international champion as well. It may not be surprising that Justin has been such an achiever (over 3,100 Masterpoints): - His father, Hemant, who was born in India, has been recognized as an outstanding player since the early 1970s.

- His mother, Jan, who is divorced and lives in Houston, is a fine player in her own right.
- Justin began playing in ACBL sanctioned games when he was only 11-years-old.
- Justin's fascination with the game led to his rapidly devouring over 200 bridge books.
- His life-long ambition is to be the best bridge player in the world.
- World champion Bob Hamman, of Dallas, says, "Justin is as good a talent as I have ever seen in bridge."
- Justin's major achievement was winning the 2005 World Junior Team Championship with his USA teammates in Sydney, Australia. Eighteen teams, including two from the US, competed from Aug. 7-17, 2005. - The World Junior Championship win put Justin and his teammates on the cover of the ACBL Bridge Bulletin (Nov. 2005).

Hemant was born October 28, 1951. Justin arrived on September 27, 1986. Hemant is close to having a PhD is computer science. Most top players are scholars. However, Justin admits to have being a poor student. Instead of finishing high school he just got a GED. Neither Justin nor his parents recommend dropping out of high school to concentrate on bridge. Justin simply wasn't motivated to be in school. "It was completely monotonous." You might say that bridge gave Justin a
direction in life and he chose to follow
Justin loves to compete. Internet poker and other computer games intrigue him, but bridge is his life. "It doesn't matter if you are my best friend or a family member, when I sit down against you I am hoping to soundly defeat you. I expect the same from my opponents," Justin said. In late January he made an outstanding showing in a Dallas sectional tournament.
In addition to playing, Justin enjoys teaching bridge, including instructing many ladies old enough to be his grandmother. Bridge great Bob Hamman said that Justin has helped to teach bridge with Bob's wife, Petra. "Justin did exceptionally well and all of the students like him," he added. Justin wants to attract more pre-teens and teenagers to the game. He also likes to write about bridge. He started an interesting bridge blog. It's called http:/ /squeezingthedummy.blogspot.com
Justin's favorite partner is his dad. "We're on the same wave length," he says. "In bidding and defensive play we are almost always in sync. Our mutual love of the game has led to strong bonding," he added. David Grainger, of Toronto, is another favorite partner and they often play as teammates in on-line bridge. Bob Hamman is one of his top idols along with Jeff Meckstroth.

Justin wishes that schools would offer bridge as a regular extra-curricular activity. His sister, Jessica, is a student at USC. She is student body president and, like Justin, has very high aspirations. She hopes to be elected president of the United States one day. The Dallas Unit has an annual "Mini McKenney" race for Masterpoint winners. Nagy Kamel was first in 2005 with 916 points, Bob Hamman second with 832 , and Justin was third with 680, narrowly beating out his father.
"Justin has become a top-notch expert- one incredible player," Bob stated. "Young, good players are frequently intense competitors," Bob added. "Sometimes they get overwhelmed and their temperament may not be what we'd prefer to see. We have to forgive and forget and move on to the next hand. Look forward and think about tomorrow," the highly successful entrepreneur concluded.

Justin isn't money motivated but clients frequently pay him \$200-\$250 or more per session (that's about $31 / 2$ hours of bridge). He charges more for national tournaments.
