45 teams gathered in Dallas over the Memorial Day weekend to decide which 4 teams, one in each Flight, will represent District 16 at the National Finals this July in Chicago. Three of the four Flights were won by Dallas area teams, one less than last year. Was that Mark Cuban checking out the talent?
The Superflight was won by two of the most eminent married pairs in the ACBL, Bob and Petra Hamman and John and Peggy Sutherlin. They defeated a team that contained 3 of Bob's teammates from last year, Hemant and Justin Lall and Ira Chorush. Bart Bramley and Sidney Lazard were also on the second place team. Flights A and B were mostly turnabouts from last year. The team of Marcus Poe, Stan Kohan, Tom Edwards and Charlie Price defeated Mark Bumgardner, Bill Staats, Mike Bukala and Merri-Jo Hillaker.

Marcus and Stan lost in the finals last year to Mark, Bill, Mike and Charlie. Good switch Charlie.
Buddy Bass of Austin and Mike Doyle, Tony Haddad, all of Houston stopped a Dallas sweep by beating last year's winners, Shaun Chooi, Joe Clark, Bob Scallan, and Suresh Agrawal. Mike and Tony also won the 2006 District 16 Flight B National Open Pairs. [Editor's note: At press time, there is a question of whether the Bass team is eligible for the event. Therefore, the Chooi team may represent District 16 in Chicago.]

The Flight C winners were Jeff Dater, Kevin Pheiffer, Tom Pearce and Joseph Gill who beat David Warner, Stan Kurtzer, Terry Richardson and Larry Smith.
While many Districts only have 2 or 3 (or less!) teams enter the Superflight, District 16 had six teams, one fewer than last year. The lower Flights are also doing well. We had 53 teams last year with 69 being the all time high. One player in the Superflight thought
that we had a low turnout but I had to point out that in District 10 only 2 teams showed up. One of teams had many more MP's than the other and were considered a big favorite. They had to talk the lower ranked team into not withdrawing and, as you can guess "the rest of the storey" the lower ranked team beat the favored team. Although our Superflight was loaded with multiple National Champions, it seamed oddly strange to have a Grand National in Texas without Malcolm Brachman, who passed away in 2004, and. Mike Passell, Eddie Wold and Bobby Wolff, all of who now live in Nevada as Texas was not hot enough.. We are always fortunate in Texas to have such an event where we can compete against World Class players who make this event truly worthy of playing in regardless of how you finish.
In all of the top 3 Flights the finalists were also the leaders after the 2 -session round robin to determine the teams for the KO rounds. The competition in the
top Flight was very keen. Lall won the bracket with 70 VP 's out of a possible 100. The next 4 teams had 52, 5149 and 49 with the fifth place team losing on a tie breaker despite being only 1 VP below average
Just before the final Justin pointed out that if he lost it would be 3 seconds in a row and wondered if it had been done before. Sadly, the answer was yes but now Justin, Ira Chorush and Hemant join that fated player.

## Tobi Sokolow Wins McConnell Cup In Verona



Tobi Sokolow of Austin won the McConnell Cup at the World Bridge Championships in Verona, Italy, in June. This is Tobi's fourth world championship: she has won the Venice Cup twice and the Generali World Women's Individual. Tobi's husband, David, also won a gold medal as nonplaying captain of her team. The team was "transnational," comprising four Americans and two Russians. The Russians were members of the Cinderella squad that beat Tobi's team in the final of the 2004 Women's Olympiad. As the saying goes, "If you can't beat 'em, join 'em!'
Tobi had good vibes about Verona, the site of her Generali win in 2004. Winning the gold, however, was no easy task. Thirty-nine teams entered the event; they were divided into four groups of nine or ten teams, with four from each group to qualify for the KOs. Her first match was not auspicious; Tobi's team got blitzed. Ultimately, her team finished second in their group.


For the KO phase, they were seeded \#10. As a result, they drew \#7, which included Shawn Quinn of Richmond and Mildred Breed of Austin. The match was close, but Tobi's team prevailed by 28 IMPS.
Tobi's draw in the quarterfinals was upstart Venezuela, who stunned everyone by eliminating the world champion Dutch team in the round of 16. Even the Venezuelans were shocked-two of the players had booked return flights for the day after the round robin ended, never expecting to qualify for the KO phase! They didn't miss much. The match was so lopsided the Venezuelans withdrew before the fourth quarter.
In the semis, the team faced China, a long-time power in women's bridge. Tobi had beaten China twice in the Venice Cup finals, and again in the semifinals of the 2004 Olympiad. Would the fourth time be the charm for China? The match was a nail-biter. With one board to go, the Chinese led 88-81.

$\mathrm{N}-\mathrm{S}$ reached 4 S after a 1 H opening by East and a raise by West. Tobi led a heart. Her partner, Janice SeamonMolson, took the ace and switched to the queen of clubs for a one-trick set. You'd expect the same defense at the other table, but the Chinese East returned a diamond, allowing declarer to pitch a club from her hand on the good heart. Out of nowhere, 10 IMPS and victory!

In the final, Tobi's team faced the team that blitzed them in their opening match. The final started out the same way: after the first set of 15 boards, Tobi's team was stuck 42 IMPS. Was I worried? No way! In the remaining three sets, Tobi's team gained 37, 33,
and 27 IMPs to win going away, 14090. Here's the next-to-last hand of the event: All vul.

Tobi opened the North hand with a 20-22 point 2NT (the good five-card club suit is worth an extra point), and Janice bid 4S, showing 4-4 in the minors with slam interest. Tobi bid 5C to show at least four clubs, and Janice bid 6 C ending the auction. The 4-0 break meant that 6 C was the limit of the hand (the five of clubs sets up as a winnertry it!). At the other table, the opponents bid to 7 C , which went down one. Had clubs broken 3-1 or 22, the opponents would have gained 13 IMPs instead of losing 16, a 29 IMP swing! That would not have changed the result of the match, but it would have made the match a lot closer. Still, it does teach us a very important lesson: when it's your day to win, it is indeed your day!

## TRANS-ATLANTIC <br> BRIDGE CHALLENGE

WILL MIRROR RYDER CUP

It will be held in Dublin, Ireland, in mid-September. It will pit a team of top North American professionals against a squad from Europe, with the format changing from day to day.
Oh, and one other thing: It isn't the Ryder Cup. It is the Trans-Atlantic Bridge Challenge, and it will make its debut in Dublin September 18-21. immediately before golf's Ryder Cup begins at Dublin's K Club. Any similarities between the two events are purely intentional.
Take the format for example. The golfers compete in foursome, fourball and head-to-head matches. The bridge players will compete in pairs and teams of four, as is the norm in Major World Class Tournaments, and as individuals, which is a rarity in modern times.

The event is the brainchild of England's Paul Hackett, long a prominent figure in European bridge circles. Hackett proposed the challenge to Bob Hamman of Dallas, who for two decades was the world's top ranked player.
"Our plan is to hold the TransAtlantic Challenge every two years in the days leading up to the Ryder Cup in the Ryder Cup city," Hamman said. "I hope people will watch both events and root for their teams."
When it comes to hardware, the bridge players will have the advantage. Samuel Ryder, an obscure British seed salesman, put up the cup that goes to the winning squad in the golf competition. The winning bridge team will walk away with the Buffett Trophy, endowed by Warren Buffett, founder of Berkshire Hathaway, a serious bridge player who is widely
regarded as the world's most astute investor.
"I spend 12 hours a week - a little over 10 percent of my waking hours playing the game," Buffet said from his office in Omaha. "Now I'm trying to figure out how to get by on less sleep in order to work in a few more hands. It's an honor to be associated with the Trans-Atlantic Challenge, featuring 24 of the best players in the world.'

In addition to Hamman, the North American team will include Paul Soloway of Bothell, WA; Steve Weinstein of Andes, NY; David Berkowitz and Larry Cohen of Boca Raton, FL; Fred Gitelman and Geoff Hampson of Las Vegas, NV; Jill Meyers of Los Angeles; and Zia Mahmood, Roy Welland and Bob and Jill Levin, all of New York City. Donna Compton of Dallas will serve as the squad's nonplaying captain.

Hackett will captain the European team, which will include his twin sons, Justin and Jason; Ireland's Tom Hanlon and Hugh McGann; Norway's Geir Helgemo and Tor Hellness; Germany's Sabine Auken and Daniela Von Armin; Poland's Cezary Balicki and Adam Zmudzinski, and the Italian world champions Norberto Bocchi and Georgio DuBoin.

Like the Ryder Cup matches, the Trans-Atlantic Challenge will be broadcast throughout the world. Bridge Base Online (http:// www.bridgebaseonline.com) will carry the matches, with commentary provided by expert analysts

James LaFountain: I just want to say that Dewitt is the most active President I have ever seen. The way that he and his wife travel around to all of the tournaments and getting the Mayors involved. It is remarkable the goodwill that he is spreading throughout our District.
Dewitt Hudson: Is there a volunteer
of the year award presented by the Membership \& Education ACBL President.
Dan Morse: Yes. Bruce Reeve started that award and it is an ongoing program. Charity (Carol Schoenhals)

her free time. Laura is a writing teache and freelances on the side. Here is he take on bridge rules
RULES OF DUPLICATE BRIDGE
Rule of One: Simply put, my partner would be better off playing by herself. Rule of Two: A Komodo Dragon Blend mocha caramel latte with extra cream followed by a top shelf Jose Cuervo margarita can affect your ability to announce and alert.
Rule of Three: The maximum number of times you may say to your opponents, "Alert, my partner's unbalanced.'
Rule of Four: Count your cards. If you have four of every suit, open one notrump.
Rule of Five: If you sort your cards and find five suits, by all means open because of fifth suit advantage.
Rule of Six: This is the age all male partners act when female partners start talking about cute outfits during bidding.
Rule of Seven: Count your cards. Then subtract all the red ones. If that leaves seven, open one club. This tells your partner you are thirsty.
Rule of Eight: Count your cards adding eight tells everyone how old you wish you were.
Rule of Nine: Sorry, just too complicated for lay readers.
Rule of Ten: If your diamonds and spades equal ten, then pass because partner has clubs and hearts Rule of Eleven: Blah, blah, boring. Rule of Twelve: When your spades and high-card points equal twelve, you may open in fourth seat...but I wouldn't.
Rule of Thirteen: Add the number of your cards and high-card points. If they equal thirteen, open something.
Rule of Twenty: This opening is good for missing game when partner has sixteen high-card points and six hearts. Trust me.
Rule of Twenty-Six: If partner opened with the Rule of Thirteen, add your cards. Twenty-six between you equals game! !

If I were to ask you, "What is the most important and valuable thing you need to learn to become an accomplished bridge player?" What would you answer?

Some might answer, "Bidding!" Without a fundamental understanding of the auction and your role in it you cannot hope to be successful. Most players work hard on the bidding to the exclusion of all else. They add all kinds of conventions and tools to the bidding structure in an effort to be better. Glance at the average convention card and you will find Stayman, transfers of all varieties, Jacoby 2NT, splinters, inverted minors, weak two bids, numerous variations of Blackwood and Gerber, negative doubles, Lebensohl, Forcing 1NT, Michaels cue bids, and Drury just to name the more common. I challenge you with, "Are these all really necessary and is bidding the most important?"

Some might answer, "Play of the hand!" Without an understanding of at least the more common card combinations you clearly cannot squeeze every trick that you are due out of each hand. Additionally you must understand how the cards relate to one another as you use the five methods of trick generation or loser elimination to your maximum benefit (all play of the hand techniques involve promotion, length, finesse, trumping losers, or discarding losers either singularly or in combination). I
challenge you with, "These techniques are important, but is simply memorizing or knowing them the most important?"

Some might answer, "Defense!" Making the proper opening lead and collecting all the tricks you have coming is vital to scoring well. Looking at the convention card again you can find many carding agreements including Journalist leads, odd-even discards, upside-down count and attitude, Lavinthal discards, MUD, and likely many more. Communicating with partner during the defense is critical to a solid defensive plan. I challenge you with, "Are these agreements all really necessary and is defense the most important?"
Some might answer, "Partnership!" Having a solid partner with whom you have experience can be very valuable. Everyone knows the comfortable feeling of having a predictable partner. Knowing if he or she is conservative or aggressive, knowing how he or she will react when confronted with common occurrences, and just knowing tendencies and preferences is definitely helpful. I challenge you with, "Is the comfort of a familiar partner the most important?"
Well? What do you think? Which one of the items above do you think is the most important?

The readers that know me have probably have already guessed at my answer. While all of the areas listed

above are important aspects of the game I do not think any of them are the most important. In my opinion, the most important thing that you need to learn to become an accomplished bridge player is judgment that comes from a fundamental understanding of the game. Let me explain what I mean. Adding a convention to your bidding arsenal is kind of like buying a helicopter. Just because you buy a helicopter does not mean that you can fly one. Similarly, adding a convention to your bidding system does not automatically make you an improved bidder. Nor does adopting Lavinthal discards automatically improve your defensive play.
I can already hear some you, "So you think I shouldn't play all those conventions or defensive carding agreements?" My answer is no, well maybe. I am not opposed to conventions and carding agreements. Ask anyone that has been my partner and they will tell you I love gadgets. If anything I am much more of a scientist than a naturalist.

What I am opposed to is playing conventions or agreements when you do not know specifically why you play them, specifically how they should be used, and specifically what they contribute to providing you better judgment. Way too many players use these conventions and agreements as a crutch and it actually impairs their game because it clouds rather than clarifies

their judgment.
Take defensive carding agreements as an example. Hundreds of times I have met opponents at the table you sat down and announced (usually with a prideful voice), "We play upside-down inverted revolving Lavinthal discards," or some other such nonsense. They then proceed to demonstrate a fundamental problem. They are at the controls of a helicopter and have no idea how to fly. I do not care how powerful your carding system is on a technical basis, it will not help if you do not fundamentally know what message you should be sending, i.e., if you have not developed the judgment to know what to communicate. I could say the same thing about a wide variety of conventions.
I challenge you to try an experiment at one of the next visits to your favorite club game. First, invest one game towards a discovery play about you and your judgment. Play one session with an absolutely clean convention card. I will allow a small concession. You can play Stayman and you can choose between limit and forcing jump raises. Nothing else other than natural standard bidding and carding is
allowed. No forcing 1NT, no transfers no Blackwood, no splinters, no negative doubles, no upside-down signals, no weak two bids, I mean nothing but Stayman.

I will now pause while those that must take their nitro pills for heart palpitations.
I can hear you now, "But I won't win."
No you probably won't. However what you will discover about yourself and partner is worth more than any club game win. You will be forced to rely on your judgment and understanding of the game to navigate a couple of dozen hands. It will provide you with a better understanding of why you play the conventions and agreements that you do.

Next, sit down and discuss with partner each and every convention and carding agreement that you want to play. If you cannot clearly describe why you play a convention, why it improves your judgment and decision making, then do not put it back on you card until you can.

Painful? Maybe. Valuable? Definitely.
Let me hear from you.
