In spite of there being 5 other conventions in the city at the same time most of the people were able to find a room. The tournament was a success with 13,373 tables in play at the Chicago Hyatt which had a very large and nice playing area that could have held even more. The local volunteers were great with nightly entertainment and food which was plentiful and readily available.

ALL UNITS AND DISTRICTS AND THEIR COMMITTEE MEMBERS: ACBL is now providing all unit and districts and their committee members (D&O) directors and officers insurance. In order to be covered from the inception (July 11, 2006), the one page form must be signed by the President of each Unit and returned to Philadelphia Insurance prior to August 10, 2006. Please fax or mail a copy of the application to Memphis Headquarters. Units that have their own paid up insurance policy are well advised to obtain legal and insurance advice prior to deciding cancellation of their policy.

There is a \$5000 deductible with a \$1,000,000 liability limit. Slander and libel are covered, provided the slander and libel was not made with knowledge that it was false. If anyone has any questions feel free to contact the

insurance agent Bill Parks at wparks@metlife.com. Phone: 610-573-5614 or fax 610.391.7216. MANAGEMENT: Management is in negotiation to sell the ACBL Product Store.

Management is authorized to set fees and conditions when providing mailing list to officials and clubs. The ACBL/ AARP bridge events are off to a good start with 13 tables in play in Chicago. The focus is on the event at the AARP Convention at the end of the year in California.

ACBL COMMITTEES: The Laws, Hall of Fame, Competition & Convention and other such committees have new rules. The incoming President after consultation with the committee Chair appoints committee members subject to approval by the ACBL Board at the Spring NABC. Each committee elects its Chairman from among its members. All committees start the day after the Spring NABC for one year ending at the conclusion of the following spring.

NABC BOARD OF DIRECTORS ACTIONS: Designated Education Foundation and International Fund Days have been eliminated.

The ACBL web site, which lists the all time top master point holders, shall include the names of the deceased players interspersed with the numbered list.

Effective 2007 the NABC Senior KO will start on Friday instead of Sunday. This will eliminate the problem of the final conflicting with the start of the three day Reisinger/North American Swiss.



The Chicago NABC marked a highwater point for District 16. Our players captured *all four major events* played at the summer nationals: the Spingold, the Life Master Pairs, the Wagar Women's KO, and the Grand National Teams Superflight. Although no statistics are kept on such matters, I would hazard a guess that this feat has rarely, if ever, been duplicated. So who are our heroes?

Bob Hamman of Dallas won the Spingold for the umpteenth time! There just aren't enough superlatives in the dictionary to do Bob justice. By winning two NABC events in Chicago (he also won the GNT Superflight, playing with wife, Petra-see related story elsewhere in this issue), Bob came close to capturing the Fishbein Trophy, awarded to the player who wins the most masterpoints at the Summer NABC. His trove of 350 masterpoints was just fifteen shy of the winning total (he was 69 points ahead of third-place!). Congratulations once again on a superb job. Bart Bramley of Dallas won the prestigious Life Master Pairs playing with a first-time partner. A many-time NABC champion, Bart moved to Dallas several years ago from Chicago with his wife, Judy, who's also a national champion. Previously, Bart had won the Life Master Men's Pairs and the Life Master Open Pairs (both 2-day events), but this was his first win the Life Master Pairs (a 3-day event). By the way, if you need another first-time partner.... Mildred Breed of Austin and Shawn Quinn of Richmond followed up their win in the Women's Swiss Teams at the Spring NABC with a victory in the Wagar Women's KO in Chicago. As a result, theirs is the only team to secure a bye to the second stage of the Women's International Team Trials next June. Peggy Sutherlin of Dallas

finished second (she and hubby, John, also won the GNT). Brava one and all!

In the Open Swiss Teams, second place went to Ira Hessel and Greg Hinze of San Antonio and Nagy Kamel of Plano. Second going into the final round, they played the eventual winners, and nearly blitzed them! I kibbitzed Ira and Greg that last round, and they were awesome. Too bad the other team had the event won before the last round had been played! Dan Morse of Houston (playing with former District 16'er Bobby Wolf) finished third. Nice going, guys!

Many District 16 players had topten finishes in national events. Tobi Sokolow, Austin, and John Sutherlin, Dallas, finished fourth in the Mixed Board-A-Match Teams. Tobi was also 5/8 in the Women's KO. Justin and Hemant Lall, Dallas, and Ira Chorush, Houston, were 5/8 in the Spingold. Chris Compton and Bart Bramley were 9/16 in the Spingold. Babu Koneru, San Antonio, was fifth in the Fast Pairs. Sally Wheeler and Buddy Hanby Spingold (0-5000), as did Shaun Chooi and Joe Clark, Dallas, playing on another team.

The Fall 2006 NABC will be held in Honolulu. If you've never been, you simply must go! (If you've already been, you know what I'm talking about.) My first national was the 1983 Hawaii NABC, held at the same hotel (the Hilton Hawaiian Village) as the upcoming tournament. What an experience! The extensive grounds feature a long stretch of glorious white, sandy beach; miles of palm-tree shaded walks; and swim-up bars, so you can SWI (swim while intoxicated)! Should you tire of this tropical paradise (figure the odds!), the upscale shops and restaurants of Waikiki beckon just up the street. Aloha!

In the final, they defeated a team featuring three married couples, including the bronze medal winners in the Mixed Pairs at the recent world championships in Verona. I can't imagine a greater thrill than winning a

major national event with one's spouse (unless it's winning with your parent or child). My proverbial "hat" is off to all of you.

It's been quite a summer for Justin. In early August, he also won the World Junior Teams held in Bangkok. That's two-in-a-row for Justin and his compatriots on the premier American junior team. The future of American (and District 16) bridge looks bright.

Spring, were sixth in the Open Pairs. Edith and George Rosenkranz, Mexico City, and Miguel Reygadas, Polenco, finished ninth in the Senior Swiss Teams. Michael Heymann, Fort Worth, ended up 5/8 in the Mini-

Units will no longer have jurisdiction over conduct and ethics violations at the club level. The one exception will be alleged cheating or other serious beaches of ethics.

Modified some regulations in the GNT conditions of contest and decided to strictly enforce regulations concerning residence of players for GNT purpose.

Recommended that the ACBL Charity Foundation and Educational Foundation consider merging. (This decision will be made by the two foundations).


Approved model by laws for units. Interested units may ask for a copy (if only to check the bylaws you have). GOODWILL COMMITTEE: A Goodwill Committee appointment is a lifetime appointment as long as the member is a member in "good standing." If a member loses good standing, the appointment shall be suspended until the member regains good standing. Expulsion from the ACBL, suspension for one year or longer or probation for two years or longer will result in permanent removal from the Goodwill Committee

PATARON MEMBERS: Patron member's dues will no longer automatically have a part of their fee go to the ACBL Charity and Education Foundations. Instead patron members will have the option of donating additional funds to either organization. EVENT REGULATION: A motion to change the Senior age from 55 to 60 was soundly defeated. Blue Ribbon eligibility was changed. When a KO at an NABC runs 7 days or longer the first 16 earn eligibility. In a NABC+ six session event with no upper masterpoint limit 1-15 and all ties are eligible.

We are sorry to say that long time meeting planner Nancy Foy has resigned. We well miss her very much and wish her luck at her new employment.

In many areas of the country Units and clubs charge players under 16 just \$1 to play in order to encourage more young players to come out and play! Tell your units and clubs if you think this is a good idea.



1. The Texas Star Service Awards ("the Awards") shall be presented once annually at the Lone Star Regional Tournament held in Houston in the winter.

2. The Awards shall be presented by the President of District 16. If for any reason that officer is unable to make the Presentations, the Texas Star Service Awards Committee ("the Committee") shall select a person to make the presentation.

4. Identity of the recipients of the Award shall be kept secret until their names are announced by the presenter during the presentation ceremony. All persons involved in the selection process at both the Unit and Committee levels shall take every precaution to insure confidentiality from commencement of the selection process until after presentation of the Awards. The method, screening and selection process shall not be discussed by any person involved except among themselves.

5. Each Unit within District 16 may, but need not, select one person to receive the Award annually. A married couple may be selected. Each person selected shall be a member of the selecting Unit in good standing, resident within District 16. A person who has received the Award in a prior year is not eligible for selection.

6. A recipient of the Award shall be a volunteer who has worked diligently at the Unit level. Receipt of a nominal compensation for burdensome tasks shall not automatically classify a person as a non-volunteer. A unit may ask the Committee to determine the classification of a potential recipient of the Award. The Committee's determination of classification of a potential recipient shall be final.

7. The Committee and its Chair shall be appointed by the President of District 16 at the annual meeting held during the Lone Star Regional Tournament in Houston at the beginning of each calendar year. The President may appoint the Jacoby Award Committee and its Chair to form the Texas Star Awards Committee ex officio. The Committee shall receive the selection from the Units annually, and arrange for a suitable commemorative pin for each recipient of this Award.

8. The Chair of the Committee shall notify each Unit each September of the opportunity to name a recipient of the Award. Such notification may be by letter or by publishing the notice in the Scorecard. The notice to the Units should outline the qualifications which the Unit should keep in mind in making its selection and should stress the need for confidentiality. Selections by the Unit must be received by the Committee by January 1 of each year. 9. The Committee shall maintain a record of all recipients of the Award.

I want to cover a few tips on topics of which that I see intermediate players often fail to take full advantage. These are not necessarily connected by any theme other than the fact that I chose to include them on this list. Some are bidding, some are play of the hand, and some are defense. They are not presented in any particular order.

#1 - Stretch to overcall at the one level with a reasonable suit and little else. You should consider the one level almost free bidding space. Although it may be right for the opponents to double you for penalties upon occasion, it is rarely possible to do so. Most doubles at the one level are conventional and even if they manage to do so it takes enormous fortitude for the partner to leave in a one level double. The reason you need to stretch to bid at the one level is quite simple. Help partner with the opening lead and/or subsequent defense. You should overcall with a five-card suit headed by two of the top three honors and nothing else (AKxxx, AQxxx, or KQxxx). You should even consider very strong four-card suits (AKQx, AKJx, AQJx).

#2 - Do not make a penalty double when holding support for partner that you have not shown. When you hold three or four card support for partner, his or her judgment is skewed when you hold support. Partner will over estimate the potential for defensive tricks and will leave in the double when it should be pulled.



suit takes up bidding space. You should learn to maximize the preemptive value of your overcall and be aggressive when it is highly preemptive. Understand that I am not speaking of jump overcalls. I am referring to simple overcalls. I would look for reasons to bid 2C after a 1D opening because it eats up a lot of bidding space (the opponents can no longer bid 1H, 1S, or 1NT). I would be much more solid when deciding to bid 2C after a 1S opening because it eats up very little bidding space (the opponents can no longer bid only 1NT).

#4 - Force your self to make a plan for the play. Pause at the right time. Take 30 to 60 seconds at a minimum before playing from the dummy to trick one. Make sure you have collected all the facts from the bidding (or lack there of) and the opening lead. Make a mental note of the factors that are required to make the contract. If possible, try to have a Plan A and a fall back Plan B. If the contract looks like it is not in any danger then look for all the suit distributions that could go wrong to put it in danger.

#5 - When you have one critical suit, do not rush into things. If I have seen it once I have seen it a thousand times. Declarer is in a contract that needs a guess in a key suit (say choosing between drop and finesse or which way to take a two-way finesse). Too many times I have watched as declarer tackles the suit at trick two or three. Put it off until as late in the hand as possible. First, the defenders make discard or lead the suit and take away your problem. Second, later in the hand you may know more about the unseen hands that lets you guess with a higher probability.

#6 - Lift your head and look at dummy. At least consider that setting up the dummy is easier than setting up your hand as declarer. I have watched many times late in the hand as declarer studied his cards intently when every card in the dummy was good! As declarer you have to play both hands. Limiting yourself to one hand only is reducing your chances of success.

#7 - Choose your opening lead by process of elimination. Picking the correct card from any suit is almost 100% mechanical. Opening lead is about picking which of the four suits to attack. Start by eliminating any suits that are clearly not right. From the remaining suits, rank them in order of risk. Which has the highest and which has the least cost of being wrong?

#8 - Keep track of how many trump are left in declarer's hand. If there are eight cards left to play and declarer has six trumps left (and your side has none) then you need to focus on what possibilities exist for the two tricks you might have a chance to win. Holding on to Jxxx in a side suit might not be of any value.

#9 - In the end game do not win the trick if you know that declarer will make the hand if you do. For example, you are down to the last three tricks. Declarer leads and you can when the trick, but if you do you will have no choice but to give declarer the rest of the tricks with your return. The answer? Do not win the trick! This is not a guarantee of success but it is right in the long run,

#10 - Do not lead trump when you want to get or give a ruff. That sounds painfully clear, but it needed to be said. The reverse is true as well. If partner leads a trump, then it is safe to assume that partner holds no shortness, ability, or desire to ruff.

#11 - Keep guarding the side suits by holding the same length as declarer. Dummy holds four hearts and you hold four hearts. Do not throw a heart unless declarer throws one first. This applies to declarer's hand as well. You may know from the bidding the suspected length in a key suit.

#12 - Make things easy on partner. The situation may not be as clear to partner as it is to you. If you can take over the defense and do the right thing then do not leave things to chance. Overtake the tricks, cash winners, and make discards absolutely clear and obvious.

Work to apply these twelve concepts and it will improve your game.

Steve opened the bidding with a Diamond and his partner eventually bid 3NT after some competitive bidding. The opponents were vul and when they got to 6 Clubs Steve could stand it no more. There were no bidding cards but Steve's call of "Double" was unmistakable for meaning. Partner, after some hesitation, pulled it to 6 Diamonds. "7 NT," Steve bellowed. "That will serve to remind you not to pull my obvious penalty double!" I'm afraid that Steve and p didn't make it.

THE RABBI'S RULE: Being Jewish, some friends ask me to explain "The Rabbi's Rule." "When the king is (offside) singleton, play the ace!" There are times you can work out if an opponent has a singleton king. In some cases you might only make your contract if you guess right. So you guess right.

PLAYING YOUR CARDS RIGHT: Brainy card games like contract bridge, raise the production of a key blood cell involved in repelling illness. 
YOU PLAY WEAK TWOS, DON'T
