Even I took off a couple of days just to enjoy the weather and relax. Buffett Cup Victory: Congratulations to the US for winning the Warren Buffett Cup in Ireland. For more information see www.buffettcup.com. Membership: Membership is up. The ACBL expects to have over 1,000 more paying members this year.
ACBL Elections: George Retek and Al Levy were elected as WBF representatives for 3-year terms. I was elected as 401 k trustee for a 4 -year term.
Honor ary Member of Year for 2007: The popular and loveable Zeke Jabbour was named Honorary Member of the Year for 2007. Zeke writes the Winsome \& Loathsome - Tales of the Trail in the Bridge Bulletin.
Cooperative Advertising: This is an excellent program that will pay for $75 \%$ of your cost for a newspaper, radio or other type of ad for bridge players up to $\$ 1000.00$ to teachers and bridge club owners.Take notice- use this when you are looking for students or new players. Board Education: The Board of Directors will engage in an educational program at the March meeting in St. Louis. The program will last one full day and will be conducted by the Board Consulting Organization. A Board Oversight Committee was formed to receive complaints from the ACBL President, the Board of Directors or the CEO concerning inappropriate behavior of a board member. The committee will be the last three presidents that are not officers of the Board.
Clubs: Clubs are no longer required to run a Charity Game to receive a sanction.
National Committee: A Tournament Disciplinary Committee was formed. The committee is to include two players from each District noted for ethics (not necessary bridge ability) to be on this committee. I will be appointing two from District 16. If you interested and plan to attend the NABC's let me know.
Bylaws: The ACBL now has available sample Bylaws for Districts as well as Units. If anyone is updating their Bylaws, they should get a sample copy from the ACBL.
Possible Sale of Memphis Office: The CEO of the ACBL was authorized to continue negotiations and complete the sale of the headquarter building in Memphis.

Conditions of Contest: The Mini LM pairs will be 6 sessions.
Finance: 2006 is estimated to lose between 150,000 \& 200,000. In 2007 Tournament Director Fees will go up but Sanction fees will be lowered to help offset this increase and the budget shows a surplus of 175,000 . Product Store: The Product Store sale was finalized in September and will allow the ACBL to cut down on overhead in 2007.
www.Bridgeiscool.com: This website for younger bridge players is being improved. Please recommend it to any junior players.
Goodwill and Charity Committees: The ACBL Goodwill and Charity Committees recognize members who work hard or who have worked hard for the good of bridge and promote the best in bridge. The Goodwill Committee promotes being friendly at the tables, volunteering to work at tournaments, being polite to your partner, teammates and your opponents. The District Director is allowed to appoint two people to the Goodwill Committee and two people to the Charity Committee. The Goodwill Committee can also replace players who have passed away. Once appointed these people are members for life. My appointments for 2007 for Goodwill are Martha DeCou from Corpus Christi, Larry Davis and Mildred Breed from Austin. The Charity appointments are: Norm Gautier, The Woodlands and Tom Hughes, Ft. Worth.

## Baker Wins Women's Board-A-Match; Hamman Wins "Player of the Year"; Wold is Second in the North American Swiss

Unlike the Summer NABC in Chicago, the Fall national in Honolulu was not particularly kind to District 16 players. When the dust cleared (perhaps "when the sand settled" is a more appropriate turn of phrase, considering the venue), they had but one win and two seconds to show for their efforts over ten days of tournament play.
The lone winner was Lynn Baker of Austin, who defended her title in the Women's Board-A-Match. Lynn's team led after the first day, and had a "mountain" in the first final session, so they were pretty much assured of victory before the evening session even began. The final margin was almost three boards. By contrast, only one board separated the teams finishing second through fifth. Several of those teams included District 16 players: Shawn Quinn of Richmond was third; Mildred Breed and Tobi Sokolow of Austin finished fourth; and Houstonians Pat Levy and Esta Van Zandt and Dallasite (and Scorecard editor) Donna Compton were fifth. Peggy Sutherlin of Dallas placed seventh. In terms of sheer numbers, the Women's BAM was District 16's high-water mark in Hawaii.
Eddie Wold of Houston was second in the North American Swiss, a threeday event at the tail end of the Fall

NABC. This one was a heart-breaker: Mike and Eddie's team was leading the event from the start through the penultimate round, but they fell just a few victory points short when the final scores were tallied. We congratulate them and commiserate with them. The bridge gods owe them one, that's for sure! Bob Hamman's virtual stranglehold on the Reisinger Board-A-Match Teams was broken this year by a relatively-unheralded team playing four-handed. The Reisinger is such a grueling event, it's always surprising when a four-person team prevails. Bob finished third, less than a board-and-ahalf behind. His consolation prize: he won the coveted "Player of the Year" award for the third time. The POY is the winner of the most masterpoints in national events with no upper masterpoint limit in a calendar year. Kudos once again, oh great one!
Several District 16 players finished in the top ten in national events: Mildred Breed was fifth in the LM Women's Pairs. John Sutherlin, Dallas, and Bart Bramley, Dallas, finished sixth in the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams. In the Senior KO, Mike Passell and Bart Bramley were $5 / 8$, while John Sutherlin and Hemant Lall, Dallas, and Ira Chorush, Houston, were $5 / 8$ on another team. In the Blue Ribbon Pairs, Bob Hamman placed sixth and Eddie Wold ended up eighth. Finally, Justin
and Hemant Lall, Dallas, were ninth in the North American Swiss Teams. The Spring 2007 NABC will be held in St. Louis from March 8-18. The tournament will be held at the Adam's Mark Hotel, in the shadow of the famous arch on the banks of the Mississippi River. St. Louis is just an hour-and-a-half flight from DFW and a two-hour flight from Austin or Houston, so it's easily accessible from Texas. As Judy Garland warbled in the picture of the same name, "Meet Me in St. Louis," Louis! A happy, healthy 2007 one and all!

## Austin Board Meeting July 1, 2006

Meeting Called to Order Voting Members present: Eric Snow, 174; Gerrie Owen, 176; Tom Hughes, 183; Carol Schoenhals, 197; Mary Anne Laier, 207; Howard Wilkins, 224; Gay Roach, 225.
Non-Voting Members present: Donna Compton, Scorecard; Sandy Campbell, GNT; Dewitt Hudson, BOG; Dan Morse, D16 Director; Jonathan Ernest, 225.

There is a Quorum
District President Opening Remarks (Dewitt Hudson) I would like to call to order the 2006 Austin Board meeting. Please review the Houston Board Minutes for approval. MOTION: Houston Board Minutes are approved as is. Board Minutes are approved
SECONDED. APPROVED. District Representative Report (Dan Morse) ACBL is instigating monthly reviews of the yearly forecast and revenues. Dr. Chris Shaw tested $5^{\text {th }}$ graders and the tests showed that the ones that were taught bridge did better than those who did not take the bridge course.
I just returned from Verona, IT where the US won the overall trophy for best performance. We have three types of club games: Junior $(24,000)$ Charity $(29,000)$ and International $(1,400)$. We need to balance this over the three types and give more games to the International Charity.

ACBL is looking into insurance that the Units can purchase but there is a glitch in the plan in that the Units are not "controlled" by the ACBL.

The AARP/ACBL venture is looking like a big success. The ground work is being laid at the end of the year tournament in Anaheim. An offer has been made to buy the ACBL Store and privatize the supplies. The BOD will vote on the sale in Chicago.
The Dallas NABCs were a big success. Congrats to Gerrie Owen and her volunteers
Treasurer's Report (Tom Hughes) As of yesterday, we have $\$ 12,680$ in the bank with payments going out to the GNT of $\$ 1,000$ per team for three teams.
Carol Schoenhals: Unit 197 GNT check has not been cashed and we mailed it in February.

Sandy Campbell: There was a problem getting the checks from point A to point B. We have made a plan to fix this situation.
Tom Hughes: Mary Hoger will be assisting me on the Audit which will be presented at the Fort Worth Regional in September.
Secretary's Report (Donna Compton) All is well.

Committee Reports:
Appellate (Scott Humphrey) Scott

Humphrey will no longer be able to serve at the Appellate position because he is going to be a Tournament Director. Jonathan Ernest is hereby appointed to the position of District Appellate Chairman.
Awards (Eric Snow) We have several nominations for the Jacoby Award which will be presented at the Fort Worth Board Meeting. It is not too early to begin thinking about the Texas Star Awards. Last year we had 17 of the 17 units participate and we would like to see that again. The Unit Goodwill - Every unit except one from Mexico selected a volunteer for the inaugural presentation. The bill for the meal was $\$ 1,025$.
Charity (Carol Schoenhals) Nothing new to report regarding ongoing charities. We did make the presentations at the National Good Will reception and it was greatly received by all the charities. Aileen Osofky said it was the best presentation of the award since its inception. We have received some publicity from the charity given to the School Charity. I have not heard from the other four charities but they may have contacted ACBL
Dewitt Hudson: There is a National Charity Rebate and five of our units are eligible for these rebates. Unit 172 San Antonio- \$1548; Unit 174 Houston
\$740; Unit 183 Fort Worth - \$668; Unit 201 Beaumont - \$265; Unit 225 East Texas - \$353. San Antonio Unit 172 Board pays the difference of the extra costs for the charity game and then gets the rebates to cover the outgoing costs. If your unit is on this list, please make sure you contact Kelley McGuire prior to November 2006 for your rebate
GNT (Sandy Campbell) The Condition of Contest needs to be reviewed and updated immediately. The ACBL COC is the ruling document. The D16 COC can expand on the ACBL COC but cannot be in conflict with the ACBL COC.
There is a committee sending in comments at this time and it should be ready for review at the Fort Worth Board Meeting and will be uploaded onto the District Website shortly thereafter
We had 47 teams entered which was down from 53 in 2005. Last year we profited $\$ 2,270$ and this year we will have a profit of approximately \$1,500.00.
We had several units that did not participate and I would like to see these units participate in the future events. Membership \& Education (Donna Compton) The March $31^{\text {st }} 2006$ QUIP report shows that District 16 is $2^{\text {nd }}$ in the overall ranking with $8.23 \%$ increase
in the last 12 months.
Since our last meeting, we had only
five units that had a net loss. At the beginning of last year, the District challenged each unit to increase their membership by $2 \%$. The following five units achieved this goal: Unit 174 Houston - Unit 176 Dallas Unit 207 Austin - Unit 233 Waco Unit 197 Lubbock - Unit 187 Corpus Christi and Unit 353 Wichita Falls. President Dewitt Hudson presented the appreciation plaques to these five units. Unit 207 Austin received a special recognition for highest percentage of membership growth in the last 12 months.
Intermediate/Newcomer Coordinator (Su Doe) All is well. Internet (Steve Bruce) All is well. NAP (John Zilic) All is well. Tournament (Charles Price) All is well.
Disciplinary (Sandy Campbell) All is well.
Scorecard (Donna Compton) Following the May/June issue, there were 47 opt outs for the mailing. This is not going to save the District much money but perhaps we will get more opt outs as time goes on.
I would like to ask all of you to go back to your unit and request that Tournament Schedules and Tournament Pictures be sent into the Scorecard by the deadline. I am spending a lot of time trying to pull the information out of several of our units.
Board of Governors (Dewitt Hudson) ACBL/ABA membership game which was held last Saturday was a big hit. There were 10 tables of black players in the game in which I played in Macon, GA. The feedback is still coming in from the rest of the country. But this is a great start!
Puerto Vallarta Regional (Judy McDonald) All is well.

Unit Reports
Unit 224 Howard Wilkins: I would like to thank the District Board for not allowing the individual counties to leave our unit.
Unit 183 Tom Hughes: Mildred Breed and Shawn Quinn came in and presented a seminar for the Intermediate players. We did lose some money but it was well worth the investment. If you want information on how to organize and promote an intermediate/newcomer seminar in your area, please contact Unit 183 Education Liaison.
Unit 225 Gay Roach: Our tournament is coming up in July and we welcome you all to join us. We have scheduled a Unit Growth Seminar for the fall.

After discovery of a heart fit partner tries Blackwood to make sure your side is not missing two aces and then bids slam. After some thought, LHO leads the 7 of hearts. A trump lead. You may
play what you wish from dummy. RHO follows with the six of hearts. Once again you have nine top tricks. What is your best shot for twelve tricks? How would you estimate your chances?


Disappointed by partner's trump support (three cards would have been better!) you must give it your best shot. Plenty of tricks are available as long as you do not lose two trump tricks. You must always lose to the trump ace, so you need to avoid also losing a trick to the trump queen. What is your plan to play trumps? Opening lead is the jack of spades.

We really have to talk with partner about blasting into these slams. Notice how partner never has to play them! The opening lead is the five of diamonds. Do you win the ace or let it ride hoping to win the queen? What twelve tricks will you take?

With the trump lead and with RHO following suit, the trump suit is dividing as expected (2-1). You have seven heart tricks and two aces. Several options are available for additional tricks. Repeated finesses in spades will yield one trick as long as LHO has either the spade queen or the spade king (or both). The repeated finesse will be successful about $75 \%$ of the time. Two more additional tricks could be gained by trumping losing diamonds in the dummy. The trump lead removed one heart from the short hand but that still leaves two trumps. After trumping diamonds you can finish pulling trump. That is a pretty good line of play but
there is a better one. There is the $100 \%$ guaranteed line of play. Win the opening lead in dummy. Cash another heart to finish pulling trump. Lead the king of clubs and discard a spade from your hand. After they win the club ace you will have all the extra tricks you need from the club suit. As a side note, if RHO holds and covers with the club ace, you can trump and make all thirteen tricks!

Three sure spade tricks, five sure diamond tricks, and two sure club tricks. The only problem on this slam is not losing to the trump queen as you will have to lose to the trump ace. What are the possible distributions of the trump suit? There are only sixteen possibilities. You always have two losers with nine of the possibilities. Seven ways give you some chance. A low heart (not the ten or jack) to the king will win in five of those seven ways and lose in two of the seven

Do not even think about playing a small diamond from dummy. Win the ace of diamonds, cash the top two trumps, and cash the top two spades discarding the last diamond from your hand. Cash the club ace and then lose a club trick. Your two extra tricks can come from trumping two losing clubs in the dummy. You always have to lose one club on this hand. You must stop pulling trumps if they divide 3-0 (someone will show out on the first round). If you do not you will not have enough trumps in dummy. If cash two rounds the opponents will play a third round when they get on lead with the club trick and you will end up a trick short.

Author and teacher Marty Bergen says "Points Schmoints." Here's an example of making a small slam in NT with only 30 HCP . At the recent sectional tournament in Dallas, North (Steve Shuman) had a rebid problem over South's (Marvin Migdol) 1S. 2H was a slight overbid (shows about 17 points in a reverse), but he was too strong for 1 NT .
South, looking at 15 HCP and a nice spade suit, decided to stretch for a notrump slam upon learning that North had 2 Aces. The favorable club lead went low - long hesitation - then the

CJ and South won the CA. At trick 2 South led the HK and then the H10, letting it ride. (West might have set the contract by covering the H10.) Next came the H7 to the HJ and South cashed the HA.
Then South led a low club to his C10 and the C5 to dummy, taking 5 club tricks in all. That's 9 tricks. Needing 3 more tricks South led a low diamond toward the DQ. East stepped up with the DQ and switched to a spade but it was too late. South took his SA and overtook the diamond in dummy, making 6 for a top.
