

47 teams gathered in Dallas over the Memorial Day weekend to decide which 4 teams, one in each Flight, will represent District 16 at the National Finals this July in Nashville. The top two in each flight were:

Dallas teams continue to do well. The top 2 in Flights Super and A and the other 2 runner-ups were mostly Dallas areas teams. The Bramley team succeeds the all Dallas team of Bob and Petra Hamman and John and Peggy Sutherlin, who won last year, added a couple of Lalls and went on to win the whole event at the Chicago National. The Bramley team dominated the round robin that eliminated 2 of the 6 teams that were in the Superflight.

In the semifinals the Bramley team beat the Morse team (Dan Morse, Ira Hessel, Sally Wheeler and Buddy Hanby) by 14 and they defeated the Kornegy team by 13 in the Finals. The Flight A team had players who represented our district in Flight B the last 2 years. The margin was by 3 IMPS. Never show them any more than you have to! We are expecting to see these stalwarts in the Superflight in 2008. The team they defeated in the finals were the District's defending champions in Flight A, who went on to finish second in Chicago last summer.

There are always lessons to be learned about match strategy. In my qualifier we were down by 19 at the half. We had a push board that I thought we had won because Dan was able to lead a stiff against 4 S. We hoped that it would be played by the other side because our opponents used a weak NT but alas, so do Buddy and Sally. Our team leader. quite adept at major tournaments' made the master stroke of switching tables so the strong NT'ers faced each other. This earned a swing when I opened 1 NT with Kxx AQX Kxxxxx Qx. Dan raised to 3 but in

the other room, where they also opened 1NT, it showed 12-14, so they played it there. I made 9 tricks and in the other room? They went bait 1 in 1NT! Well, it did have something to do with the lead.

I thought the winners played really well against us which makes losing, although disappointing, still very enjoyable. We had several opportunities to win in the semis. First seat VUL vs. VUL what would you bid with S xxx H 10722222 D x C Ax? Well, I chose to pass as did Bart. Both opponents got to 4S but once again the variation in NT found Dan on lead, but this time he held QJ10xx in D's and had no reason not to lead them. The stiff from my side was less kind to our declarer who had K1098xx op Ax. So we lost a game swing. I regretted not bidding at least 2H which would get them to 4S with me on lead. In reflection, they'd have worked the hand out with that auction, so we could blame those 13 IMPS on fate. As a note to future finalists, if you don't send me some hands I may just have to make some up- so please share.

I did get a nice hand from the Flight A match- they believed me about made-up hands. When a match is lost you tend to think of the drastic swings. But close matches are often won by careful decisions in partials. When the margin is only 3 it's refreshing to see the winners appreciating a 5-6 IMP partial swing. I will let Shaun tell it. When I asked Joe for a hand he had Shaun write it up and Shaun actually wrote me a letter describing most of his journey so I published it in its entirety on page 3. Thanks to Joe and Shaun for aiding with the story. (Jim-don't forget that picture of the Hessels and Griffins-I can always edit yours to fit.)

The total amount of teams were 2 more than last year and a slight drop from 2005 when there were 53. The all time high is 69 in 2002. We are always fortunate in Texas to have such an event where we can compete against world class players who make this event truly worthy of playing in regardless of how you finish. Good luck to all the winners in Nashville where you can listen to great music after the game and enjoy the original Googoo bars.

### Hamman Wins USBF and Shawn Quinn is USBWF 2

Congratulations to Bob Hamman and Shawn Quinn who qualified at the recent USBF trials to represent The United States in the upcoming Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup in Shanghai this fall. Although Shawn lives in Krakow, Poland now, we can still consider her as part of District 16 until Poland becomes a

Bob was on the victorious team in the USBF championship in Chicago in June. He played on a team with Nick Nickell, Richard Freeman, Paul Soloway, Jeff Meckstroth, and Eric Rodwell. For five members of that team it will be a return to China where in 1995 they won the Bermuda Bowl in Beijing with Bobby Wolff playing with Bob instead of Soloway. District 16 players were prominent at the trials. 7 of the 25 teams contained members of our District. Two of them met in the semifinals. Bob's team met the team that included Bart Bramley and Sidney Lazard of Dallas playing together on the team captained by Seymon Deutsch.

Seymon's team led at the half of the 120 board final but Bob's team prevailed 226 to 200. Since the match was shown live on Bridgebase vugraph, we all had the opportunity to watch real time. Bridgebase has really made bridge a spectator sport. As the action unfolded one could follow along as commentators analyzed (or miss-analyzed) the hands. If the action got too slow you could go back with the "movie" function and check out the hands that had already been played, or just pick the hands where the big swings occurred. This hand from an earlier match impressed

N dealt and the bidding proceeded. P 1D 1H 2D 2NT 3NT . The result in the open room (the one with a view) was +660 for EW but in Sidney's room the declarer was set. One wondered how and the hand record revealed the great master at his best. Bart led the S2 against E's 3NT and seeing that four spade tricks were the max Sidney realized that if Bart did not hold the club Ace declarer had an easy make. So Sidney returned the club King. And declarer tried the Q when Sidney continued. Another hand for the scrapbook.

When you lose by 26 over 120 hands. you know you could have won. The following hand was the last. Ahead by 13 going into this (see USBC on page 3)

A visit to the arch in St. Louis was really great. The weather was good. District 8 Co-Chairman Glen Smith, former ACBL President, and Co-Chairman Mike Carman did much to make the tournament a success. The table count was 10,232 and was below expectations. As a result of the low attendance at the Hawaii NABC, ACBL staff had felt that the table count would be donsiderable higher. Dallas NABC had 10,314 tables, 82 more that the St. Louis NABC. The entertainment was super. In fact, several times I had an opportunith to put on my dancing shoes.

NAOP

Qualifying games for the North American Open pairs has begun in Clubs in June and continues into August. Besides earning extra points at the club you begin the qualification of a 4-stage event that culminates at the Spring Nationals. The top 50% of the field qualifies for the local Unit Level games in the fall. The top 50% of that field plays at the District Level in San Antonio in January. The top 3 in each flight qualify for competition at the 2008 Spring NABC in Detroit. You could win a trip to the 2008 Spring NABC in Detroit to play in the National Finals of the event in one of three flights: A, B and C.

The first-place qualifiers will receive \$700 per person and the second-place qualifiers will receive \$300 per person. The third-place qualifiers will be invited to participate in the National Finals. Many Units subsidize the third place finishers. This year San Antonio granted \$300 per person to the third place pair.

### **BOARD OF GOVERNORS REPORT**

### MOTION TO ALLOW HANDI-CAPPING IN A MATCH POINT **GAME**

That a committee be created to establish a system to handicap match point games. This handicap formula will allow players of all skill levels to compete directly with established experts and thereby reduce the demand for events where players are segregated by skill level or masterpoints. The committee will include ACBL Board of Directors, Board of Governors and management appointees, who will have access to ACBL resources as needed to complete this task.

#### EIGHT IS ENOUGH

Bridge players in Nashville developed a plan to increase the participa-

tion at their local Swiss Team games. Normally at most games you will find several strong A teams dominating the field. Nashville has developed a policy that all teams must not exceed eight (8); i.e. A=3, B=2, C=1. Put any combination that you want, not to exceed 8. Nashville states that they are averaging between 15-17 tables. Try it out and let me know if "Eight is Enough" improves participation at your Swiss Team. dhudson076246@hot mail.com

### NAP REIMBURSEMENT

FIXED AMOUNT PRIZE SHALL BE AWARDED IN ALL FLIGHTS AS FOLLOWS: In Districts with three qualifiers, the 1st place qualifiers shall receive \$700 per person and the 2<sup>nd</sup> place qualifiers shall receive \$300 per person. The 3<sup>rd</sup> place qualifiers shall be invited to participate in the national level finals, but shall not receive any prize. In Districts with four qualifiers, the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place qualifiers shall receive \$700 per person and the 3<sup>rd</sup> place qualifiers shall receive \$300 per person. The 4<sup>th</sup> place qualifiers will be invited to participate in the national level finals, but shall not receive any prize. Invited defenders shall receive \$700 per person. No individual may collect two concurrent prizes

The monetary award will be available on site. Qualifiers must play in the national level event until eliminated to receive the award.

There shall be no entry fee for the national level of the event.

Management may use its best judgment in making exceptions to any of the above.

SANCTION ONLINE BRIDGE

Online club play topped 237,000 tables in 2006, a 26% annual growth rate since the inception of the Strategic plan.

Currently three online play sites offer ACBL sanctioned club games. They are Bridge Base, OK Bridge and Swan Games. At least two additional online play sites have inquired about sanctioned club play.

OK Bridge is currently running a membership promotion which includes a new or renewal membership in the ACBL. This offer is available to new OK Bridge subscribers only. The entire cost of this program is being absorbed by OK Bridge.

The loss of online club World Winner has not diminished net online tables. Both Bridge Base Online and OK Bridge have shown increases in tables, compensating for the loss of World Winner.

### Gus Plate (1944-2007)

(ed note. We thank Georgiana Gates, one of Gus's dearest friends for this story.)

Gus began his bridge career in West Texas, and moved to Houston in the late 1960s. We began playing bridge soon after he arrived; both of us could be charitably characterized as beginners.

One of my earliest memories of Gus is when we attended an out-of-town sectional. This was a Big Thing for me, and we had a fairly decent game going and then had a few bad boards. Gus said "With these bad boards, I don't think we can win the event". I had never had a partner who thought we had a chance to actually win a tournament - my goal was not to embarrass myself and perhaps win a few masterpoints. It was a defining moment for me.

Gus was married to Linda for 29 years, and she was also a strong player. They had one son, Chris, who did not follow in their bridge footsteps.

Gus was famous for his lack of directional sense. He and I and Linda once went to Austin for a tournament. When we reached IH 35 we had to decide which way to turn. Gus suggested turning north. Linda said "I don't know which way to turn, but if Gus wants to go north, we should go south." And this time Gus was right!

Gus was very successful at the sectional and regional level, especially in partnership with John Zilic. He was the top Unit 174 masterpoint winner at this year's Houston regional, and was almost the top masterpoint winner at the very last tournament he played, the Houston sectional in June, where he won the knockout and was second in the Swiss. He wasn't terribly interested in leaving his beloved Texas to go to NABCs - I'm sorry we didn't get a chance to play in many of them.

He was an extremely pleasant partner and opponent. I often remember having to go out and find him between rounds, because he was outside smoking and visiting with his many bridge friends.

### WHO ARE WE?

Please allow us to introduce ourselves.....we're the Hessels, Ira and Ellen, that is. We're your new editors, and would like you to know a little something about us as we embark on this Scorecard journey. You've probably seen us around the District 16 tournament trail. We hope to meet many of you at future Texas Tournaments and welcome any ideas that you may offer.



### Long Day's Journey into Nashville

Let's cut to the half time in the final match. After 13 first boards, we compared our scores. We were down by 6 imps. So we told each other, we could do it. Anything could happen with the next 13 boards. So we started the next 13 boards, calm, and steady.... Brady Allen and I were sitting North -South. We shuffled and dealt the next 6 boards at our table. The first board, we missed a Non

Vul slam with some misunderstandings in the bidding. hmmm...my face turned white. The second board, we went down 1 in 7NT because of our convoluted bidding sequences..... we did not uncover our 4-4 heart fit, and we thought 7H was cold. We started sweating. But we still looked calm outside, even though we were very frustrated with great mood swing. We tried very hard to focus on the next few boards. They are boring part scores. Then we exchanged boards with the

other table. Our opportunities finally came. For the next two boards I bid 2 vulnerable games out of desperation (one in 4S with 21 points between my partner and I, and one in 3N with 23 points between us) and made my partner play them. And he made them both! God bless America and the veterans! I told my partner we just needed to make another marginal game to make up for those two cold slams that we missed. Then with just 3 boards to go, we doubled a 3S contract and let our opponent make this totally beatable contract—plus 730 for the opponents. End of our Olympic dreams... I mean, our flight-A-GNT-champion dreams. I bid a 5C contract on the next one, and got doubled (our opponents must have seen my desperation when I bid 5C, I guess.) Down 1. Minus 100. Sigh. Our luck was running out. We finished up the last board with a 2S making 2 another partscore contract. We thanked and wished our opponents "good luck in

Nashville", and awaited the agony and embarrassment of explaining to our teammates why we screwed up so royally. Out of politeness, our opponents said, "You never know what happened at the other table". But they were fully aware that they had a good round, and were feeling enthusiastic with the results that they were about to bring back to their home table. Our teammates returned. With gloomy faces, we told them quietly, "We lost". They looked at us coolly, and said, "Let's check the results". We started to compare our scores. Our opponents bid and made the small slam that we missed. Our hearts sank. Then, good news! They also went down one in the grand slam (they were in 7H, which we thought was cold), but it went down because of a 4-1 break in the trump suit). Then we tied the next few boards. However, we got +11 twice for the two marginal games that we bid out of desperation. And our partners also made +730 in the 3S

doubled hand! Then we lost 5 imps for the board that I bid 5C (doubled!). Close. Very close....and it all hinged on the last board. The board that we made 2S. Alas! Our opponent went down 2 in 2S. And a +7 imps swing. We tallied up the scores, and we won by 3 imps! The 2S making 2 contract saved the day! Here is the 2S hand:

I am sitting North. My hand:

S AQTxx

H KQx  $\mathbf{D}$  JX

C KQx

My left hand opponent (East) opened 1H, S passed, West bid 1N (forcing). I doubled. Passed to my partner, and he bid 2D. Passed to me, and I rebid 2S. All passed. I got a low club lead from East. Dummy tabled his hand:

**S** 876

H Jxx

D xxxx

C xxx What a charming hand. West won with his Ace, and then returned a high heart. My King of H was captured by the Ace. East led a H back, and dummy's J held the trick. I lead a low spade off the board, and West showed up with the 9 of spades. To finesse or not to finesse? Should I put in the ten, or the Q of spades? A quick check and I realized that I had already lost 2 tricks, and I had no place to put the two losing diamonds. I could only afford to lose 1 spade trick. I decided to lay down my Ace of spades. After that, I laid down my O of Spades. East covered with the K of spades, and West's Jack of spades dropped! I won the H return, drew the last trump, and gave up two losing diamonds and claimed 8 tricks. I did not ask what happened at the other table, but I guess the declarer must have finessed the trumps. And the rest is history. Shaun Chooi

In order to be consistent, the directors had to adjust the Board to a 25 top. Doubling Bart's score would leave him with only a 24. Bart, a true puzzle expert, worked out that in order to achieve an equitable result, that the directors simply duplicated the scores. So Bart and Sidney failed to qualify for the finals because they tied for top on a hand with-----themselves.

In the 120 board final the Nickel team ran to a 189-111 lead after 75 boards but Ekeblad ran off a 60-10 set in the next 15 boards. But Bob's team won 72-54 over the last 30 to win by 271-225.

Shawn's team lost in the semifinals but won a playoff to determine who would play the loser of the final to decide the second US team. There she played a team that included our own Sally Wheeler of Houston playing with former College Station resident Cindy Bernstein. Playing with Georgiana Gates and Pat Griffin these two lost a tough match 2 years ago to determine the number 2 US women's team. There opponents then included Kathleen Sulgrove who was now captain of their team.

At the halfway point of the 96 board playoff match Shawn's team led 115 – 31, but with Sally and Cindy in (they had a 6 woman team) the Sulgrove team rallied 76 –16 in the 4the set of 16 boards. The action settled after that and Shawn had her ticket to represent the USA in Shanghai this fall.

Both of our representatives are multiple World Champions. For a long, long time Bob was the World's number one ranked player. Shawn has often been ranked as the number one woman's player in the world. We can all watch them compete online at Bridgebase.

### **Scorecards Online**

All Scorecards from 2004 on are available at the District 16 web site. The Scorecard will be posted 1-2 weeks before mail delivery depending on the time of year.

The Scorecards are converted to Adobe Acrobat format and you can view them on your. Computer. The advantages include being able to search or read the issues at increased size. Excellent for archiving. We will try to have yearly indexes as well.






