Bart Bramley led the District 16 contingent in Shanghai by winning the World Seniors team Championship . Bart's played with Lew Stansby on a team with Rose Meltzer, Roger bates, Grant Baze and Rose Meltzer. Finishing third in the competition was Dan Morse and John Sutherlin on a team that included former District 16 multiple World Champion, Bobby Wolff. Donna Compton served as non-playing captain for the Morse team. Donna is too young to be a player! District 16 had 3 other players who gave a strong run in Shanghai. In the Venice cup, Shawn Quinn's team suffered a narrow loss in the quarter final round . They lost by one IMP to the French team. Bob Hamman and Hemant Lall were on a team that barely missed qualifying for the KO round.

Both the USA teams in the Seniors met in the semifinals. Under conditions of contest they could not both be in the finals. Morse's team went out in front 55-16 in the first set but it was all Bramley after that. Bart's partner was Lew Stansby.

This is Bart's first World Championship. He has finished second in the World Par Contest, 1998. Third in Rosenblum Teams, 1998. Second in TransNational Teams, 2005. Fifth in Bermuda Bowl, 1991 He was captain of US Team in Olympiad Teams, 1996.

# Dewitt Hudson wins the 2007 Jacoby Award

There is no one more deserving of this award than Dewitt. Dewitt H. Hudson, Jr. is a retired Colonel with more than 23 years in the United States Army. He is a Silver Life Master and has been actively involved in contract duplicate bridge since 1970. Col. Hudson is a dedicated teacher who is always willing to help anyone. From his beginner's classes he has introduced many newcomers into the duplicate bridge environment. He sponsored his entire class for their first tournament last spring. Always, he is willing to spend extra time with the learning process. Dewitt has mentored many novice players, among whom are - Travis and Lidy King, Bob Kennemer, Nedra Sims, Junene Johnson, Virginia Reinier, and countless others. Dewitt has given many unpaid hours of encouragement and invaluable information to almost everyone in District 16. He has also been instrumental in organization of new groups within the District.

Since becoming President of District 16, Dewitt has attended 28 tournaments in our District. This is quite a big job and deserves a great deal of praise. At the beginning of his tour as President, District 16 was 21 out of 25 for Membership and Retention. Presently, District 16 ranks as 4th out of 25 for Membership and Retention, with the goal of being ranked #1 a definite possibility for the near future. Dewitt's influence has been widespread, as is reflected by the increased interest toward ACBL membership, especially programs increasing membership in the youth, and also the senior group

# **REPORT FROM BOARD OF GOVERNORS**



What a wonderful tournament. David Birnbaum, Tournament Director and David Cook, District Director, District 10, did much to put on a great NABC. Although the table count of 12,879 was slightly less than the 13,375 count last summer in Chicago, the tournament was a great success. The weather was great and Nashville is such a beautiful city.

#### MEMBERSHIP

At the six-month mark for 2007, membership has a year-to-date in-

crease of 368. Our increase versus June 30, 2006 is 623. Our current paying member total is the highest it has been since 2000. Our active unpaid life member number is now seeing some consistency. Our new member year-to-date numbers are slightly above 2005 and 2006.

#### FREE MORNING LESSONS AND GAME

Marketing surveys showed that the players would appreciate more free lessons. ACBL now offers up to three free lessons per NABC. Each lesson is followed by a shortened duplicate game in which a maximum of fourteen boards are played. The players may ask questions about playing or bidding. They do win masterpoints and get trophies. Presenters for these games are Jerry Helms, Amy Neillissen, Marti Ronemus and Barbara Seagram.

#### ELECTION OF ACBL PRESIDENT

Richard DeMartino, Dan Morse and Shirley Seals had previously declared their candidacy. There were no other declarations of candidacy. Nominations were closed. By secret ballot,
