For bridge players there is a "silver lining" to aging: the ability to play in senior events that start at 10 and 3, leaving players free to enjoy a relaxing dinner and post-prandial entertainment of their choice. A bunch of District 16 players made the most of the NABC senior events held at the fall NABC in Orlando.

Eddie Wold of Houston won the Senior KO Teams. Senior? Are you kidding? He looks like a kid! Eddie has 15 NABC wins dating back to 1977 (and 15 seconds). Dan Morse of Houston and John Sutherlin of Dallas finished second. Bob Hamman of Dallas took 3/4, while Mike Passell of Plano came in 5/8. Eddie capped off a great week by finishing sixth in the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, the premiere team event on the ACBL calendar. Nice going, EW! Morse and Sutherlin also finished second in the inaugural Super Senior Pairs. The SSP is open to players who are at least seventy years of age. Finishing second in a national event is a fine showing. To finish second in two national events in the same week is awesome. Congratulations to two of the stand-up guys in our realm.

As for non-senior events, Tobi Sokolow of Austin was runner-up in the Women's Board-a-Match Teams for the second year in a row. Her squad lost to the same team as last year, but this time by just a quarter of board (last year, it was 1.75 boards). Ouch! Honey, I feel your pain.

The NAP and Grand National Teams have shown increased participation



Orlando Fall NABC

The Orlando National held in November-December had 12,650 tables, down about 900 tables from the estimate. It is possible the Philadelphia World Series caused some of this drop, others think it is the economy and the high cost of going to a National. It certainly was not the hotel or the hospitality as it was great. There is nothing like the free fresh Florida orange juice and free coffee every day. This is the first tournament that had free parking in some time.

All three Nationals in 2010 were down; the ACBL Board will be studying this trend in 2011.

Membership

ACBL membership is holding steady in 2010 after a good increase in 2009. Regional attendance is up slightly as well as attendance at STaCs, but Sectionals are down slightly. Club games were steady with the main increase being in online games.

Rule Changes

Ties in NABC+ Swiss Events. When there is a tie for the last qualifying position of an NABC+ Swiss event, all teams tied will qualify to continue.

Slow Play Regulations.

Slow play, especially habitual slow play, is a violation of law and subject to penalty. Law 81C1 instructs the director of his duty to ensure that slow play not disrupt the game. Law 90AQ and Law90B2 specify procedural penalties to be given in cases of undue slow play.

Stipends for Bridge Teachers in Schools Until now, you receive \$350 for teaching a school bridge class only if you received no other forms of compensation. Now no one shall be denied the teacher stipend from the School Bridge Class program solely because he receives payment from another source, however the amount he/she receives from the School Bridge Class Program when added to his/her compensation from other sources shall not exceed \$500.

Unit or District Charity Games



In general, pairs who are rarely late will be warned while pairs who are habitually tardy and or/pay no attention to time limits

will be penalized.



NASA Astronaut, Gregory Johnson, former Pilot of STS-123 Endeavor, is one of the great ambassadors for bridge. At the 2009 Spring NABC in Houston, Greg presented the ACBL with a playing card, the Ace of Spades, that traveled with him for 6.6 million miles in space. The STS-123 orbited the earth 250 times in 15 days and 18 hours. Each astronaut is allowed to fly up to ten items honoring organizations of their choosing. These items are collected, vacuum packed and documented on the official Space Shuttle manifest. Greg stated that he flew the ace of spaces (from an official ACBL deck of cards) to honor the

ACBL and his love of bridge. Johnson began playing duplicate bridge as a new Air Force pilot in 1988 and became a Life Master in 2002.

During his presentation of the card to Jay Baum, CEO of the ACBL, Greg stated, "It is an interesting coincidence that the 2009 Houston NABC spans the same days, one year later, of my space flight last year. I am honored to be able to present the card to the ACBL during the first weekend of the tournament."

District 16 ACBL Treasurer's Report Calendar Year 2010

District 16.

The Profit & Loss statement shows an excess of revenues compared to expenses of \$15,630.29. This compares favorably to the year-end 2009 total of \$10,489.97. The primary reason for this is the continued profitably of the Puerto Vallarta Regional, the addition of another regional in the District and the profitability of the STAC. Another positive factor is that the Scorecard is running a smaller deficit than had been experienced in prior years. The District GNT subsidy continues to exceed GNT revenues as a result of the Board decision to grant a subsidy to the Super Flight team. The Balance Sheet shows that the District financial position is stable. Money market rates have been extremely low so a portion of the District's excess cash was invested in short term CDs in 2009. These were rolled over in 2010 and will continue to be renewed if no short-term need for the cash arises, or if money markets provide a reasonable alternative.

Note that the reserve established for the next District 16 NABC event is now \$7,360.00
