Reported Forty Years Ago

On February 1, 1971, Unit 174 approved planning for the first sectional tournament in Bryan, Texas. The Aggieland Sectional, indeed, came to fruition June 25-27 that vear and was held at the Ramada Inn on Highway 6 in College Station. Room rates were \$10 for Singles, \$14 for Doubles, and \$16 for Twins. The entry fees were set at \$2.50 per person per session. Friday evening

kicked off the tournament

with an 8:30 P.M. starting time for the Masters Pairs (you had to have at least 20 points to qualify) or the Evening Side Game. Saturday at 1:30, the only event was the Open Pairs Qualifying, the first of two sessions. The finals began at 8:00 P.M., but if you didn't qualify (usually meaning that your afternoon score was below average), you could enter the Consolation Pairs. This too was open to those who didn't

play in the afternoon set, essentially being a single session or side event that didn't equate to the prestige of the 2 session gig. The Sunday Swiss Teams was the only event of the day and started at 12:30 P.M. The second session began, can you believe, at 6:00 P. M.!

In the April, 1971 Scorecard issue, Steve Lawrence, the newly elected president of District 16. challenged the players of the district to come forth with new action ideas to stimulate and improve the image of bridge. He stated that a successful one of late was the Swiss Team movement and obviously this one stuck. The summer regional that year would take place in Corpus Christi at the Emerald Beach Holiday Inn and the Coliseum, though not over the 4th of July, but instead at the end of July. There was for the

most part, one main event per day, starting with a KO on Tuesday Evening (8:00 P.M.). which continued mornings at 9:00 A.M. until completed. Wednesday had scheduled the Men's and Women's Pairs, Thursday the Mixed Pairs, Friday the Master Pairs, Saturday the Open Qualifying and finally Sunday, the Swiss Teams. You could always play in a side game each session if you didn't want to or could not enter the main event. Start times at the Corpus Regional were set at 1:30 and 8:00 for Wednesday through Saturday, with the Swiss starting at 11:00 A.M. on Sunday and finishing with a 5:00 P.M. start for the second set. Clearly there's been quite a tournament evolution in the last 40 years as we continually strive to meet the needs and wants of our present and upcoming players!

CEDAR CREEK ELEMENTARY BRIDGE LESSONS

Allow me to introduce you to some new bridge players at Cedar Creek Elementary School in Westlake, Austin, Texas.

Each month in a newsletter to bridge teachers, the ACBL encourages readers to participate in a program to teach bridge to children. Using material from the ACBL, I forwarded information via email to over a dozen schools in the Westlake area. No response! In January, 2011 I devoted a day to visiting these schools in person. Unfortunately, I was not able to get past the volunteer Mothers in the front office.

When I was scheduling bridge lessons with the Adult Education Department in Westlake I asked for help. A young lady in the office was familiar with bridge because she is a Great-Niece of Mike Capelletti.

She was thrilled that I knew of her Great-Uncle and suggested she would intervene and pass on the material to the Director of After-School Activities.

Nothing happened for more than a month and I thought the project had no future. Then I received an email informing me Cedar Creek Elementary School would like to start a Pilot Program to teach children how to play bridge.

The ACBL gives teachers material to

teach children "Mini-Bridge". The game is the same, but the bidding is eliminated. The children in the program were eager and exited to discover the game of bridge and they learned very quickly. The fourth and fifth graders progressed so well, I was able to teach them some of the bidding. They compared this to "estimating" something they were learning in math class!

This group of children will not impact our generation of bridge players, but I am sure some of them will play

bridge in high school or college and join the ACBL. Young children don't consider bridge as something played by "old people" and they learn it is a thought provoking, competitive game. The children go home and ask their parents to play bridge with them. Parents can read the instructions for the "Mini-Bridge" game I send home and they can participate in the game with their children

Can we hope this may lead to some of the parents deciding to learn to play bridge themselves?

Well, we went, we played, we didn't exactly conquer, but two of our teams came in second at the GNTs in Richardson over Memorial Day weekend. The teams including Ira Hessel and Greg Hinze (super-flight) and Marilyn Arnold and Patty Hinze (Flight A) stayed the course until the last round. Great effort on their parts...for which we thank them. Marilyn Arnold came home with 48.38 masterpoints for her victories in all the other events in which she competed.

At the Awards Day game, hosted magnificently once again by the Karnes City gang, lots of accomplishments were celebrated, including the Horton/Gray Trophy for 2010 (Ed Rawlinson and Donna Swarthout) and the Paul Lewis Award for 2010 (shared by partners Dee Baker and Anyemarie Weaver). Weaver, by the way, was the top MP earner in her class (100-200) for the entire nation!

At the Fiesta Sectional at BCSA in May, there were more than 230 tables in play over a fun-filled weekend---admittedly more fun for some than others! Donna McBride swept the field, winning 31.65 masterpoints, with Diane Olson second MP winner, earning 23.31.

The Turtle Creek Duplicate Bridge Club hosted a well-attended Summer Sectional the first weekend in June. Scott Humphrey directed the tournament and was received with the general acclaim and thanks for a job well done. Congrats to top masterpoint winners, Jerry Harrington (24.60) and Donna Swarthout (21.27), for their successes.

A new tactic was born at the bridge/birthing table one recent Monday night at Turtle Creek. Surely most of us have heard of "Dummy Reversal", where tricks are ruffed in declarer's hand in order to establish the Dummy as the "winning" hand. It seems that Gary Anziani and the usually unflappable Doug Cross were partners when the following oc-

curred: Gary (North) held KQx/10/ KQJxxxx/xx and opened 1D in first seat. East bid 1H and Doug (South) made a negative double. West passed; North bid 2D and South jumped to 3N. RHO dutifully led a Heart and the dummy was revealed. LHO won the first Heart with the King and lay down the Heart Ace. South and RHO followed suit. Cross studied the dummy for some time and called for a small Diamond. Ah, the Dummy blurts out: "a Diamond?" and refused to play. Declarer insisted: "yes, a Diamond!" at which point Dummy commented: "You can't make this hand throwing away your Diamonds" and refused to follow suit. RHO (George Fillis) proclaimed "A Dummy Refusal!", thus recording the first Dummy Refusal play ever! By the way, for those of you working out the hand, after all the laughter subsided, Doug Cross (holding AJxx/Q9xx/10/AKQx), made the right play (belatedly conceded by Dummy Gary (no offense!) by throwing a Diamond, thus preserving communication and made 5N. It seems that LHO ducked with the Diamond Ace twice and in the ensuing confusion, inscrutable Cross stole the 10th trick with the Heart 9 at trick 13! (Thanks to Gary and George for this story!)

Table tidbits (Stuff you'd never guess about the people who sit across the table from you week after week): We all see her as she magnificently manages Turtle Creek and all its tournaments without breaking a sweat. Ever wonder how she does it? Paula Wissman, who started playing bridge in 2003, is an army brat, born at BAMC (we won't say when!) and has lived in many places around the world. She got a full scholarship to join the first class of nurses at Walter Reed Army Institute of Nursing and logged three years of active duty at Walter Reed. I daresay she learned how to handle chaos very well as a nurse...not to mention having to deal with lots of pains in thearmy. She taught at a NJ psychiatric institute (need I say more?) and returned to San Antonio in 1976 to be Director of Nursing at Metropolitan Methodist. After other career moves, Paula retired as clinical faculty at UTHSCSA School of Nursing in 2009. She's been busy with bridge ever since.

Bill Walker is another bridge devotee whose background may surprise you. While Bill looks super-comfortable at the bridge table, that's not his natural habitat; Bill belongs in and around water! Bill spent 42 years coaching swimming teams through NEISD, where he served as Aquatics Director for the district and had two Olympic gold medal winners come out of the program. He was named Texas High School coach of the year twice and received national recognition as well. The fact that amazes me is that he taught more than 74,000 children to swim through his program! And that doesn't even include his own six kids! When I pressed him to name his favorite stroke, he declined; he really liked teaching it better than doing it! If you are ever lucky enough to have Bill explain a bridge point for you, you will understand why he was such a successful teacher and coach.
