

Petra Hamman and Hemant Lall of Dallas won the Mixed Board-a-Match teams by a hefty three-board margin over a multi-national field. They led the event from start to finish. Their victory was no fluke; in addition to wins with many other partners, they won the Mixed BAM in 2005. The committee ruled that it would have been much easier for me to double if I had known the hearts were all on my right. Do you agree?

Mildred Breed of Austin and Shawn Quinn of Sugar Land were runnersup in the Wagar Women's Knockout. Mildred was second last summer, too, playing with a different partner. In an exciting semifinal. 


TORONTO REPORT

The online club results feature on the ACBL website continues to be a valued application for club managers. As of 7-5-2011, 1008 clubs are taking advantage of this feature.

MOBILE MEDIA

The ACBL Mobile "Find a Club" feature is now available in the Apple iTunes app store.

Plans are in development to work with Audrev Grant to develop programs that will reach the social bridge player and convert them into duplicate players.

INTERNATIONAL

The ACBL Board of Directors voted to support a World Bridge Series Championship in North America in 2018.

ALERT CHART

It is no longer required to alert Stayman when NT responder may not have a 4 card major but is simply raising 1NT to 2NT. A courteous disclosure of such before the opening lead, though no longer required, would be appreciated. Puppet Stayman and 2-way Stayman are still alerts.

The definition of natural openers was amended to include 1C opener

on specifically 4-4-3-2 pattern, 4-4 in Majors, 3 diamonds and 2 clubs. The fact that the 1C opener may have only 2 clubs will no longer be alertable.

STRENGTH OF FIELD

A committee is studying using "Strength of Field" for pair events and Swiss Teams (like we do now for bracketed KO's).

After a trail by District 18 the Board authorized having the finals of the GNT's on line if a District desires.

EXTENDED UNIT GAME TEAMS A unit is entitled to hold 3 sectionalrated (black points) extended team events per year. Extended is defined as requiring at least three sessions of 24 boards each to complete.

MISCELLANEOUS CHANGES The reduction factor for 18 board games is changed from 80% to 67% (club games).

The Ace of Clubs race will be changed to The HELEN SHAN-BROM ACE OF CLUBS RACE in honor of Helen winning it 17 of the last 20 years.

A 2 day Swiss Qualifying or Round Robin will be added to the format for the Wagar Women's KO at the Summer Nationals.

There are new rules for small children or pets in the playing area.

Check the ACBL website if interested.

The Club Manager's Handbook has been updated and is available on the ACBL web site.

All Units (Sectional Sponsors) are permitted to run up to two special game sessions at each sectional with the exception of STAC's. They may benefit the ACBL Charity Foundation, The ACBL Educational Foundation, The ACBL International Fund or the ACBL Junior Fund. These Special games may be run as an open game, team game, newcomer game or any other game run at a Sectional. The masterpoint awards will be regionally rated silver points. The sponsor of the sectional will be charged \$1.00 per player.

Free Tournament Email Marketing Ads 287 email blasts have been submitted this year to date.

The Bulletin has added a column focusing on bridge on the internet titled Log on for Bridge.





American Contract Bridge League District 16 Minutes of Meeting of the Board of Directors Held January 29, 2011

A regular meeting of the Board of Directors of District 16 of the American Contract Bridge League was held at the Marriott Houston Westchase Hotel in Houston, Texas at 1:30 p.m. on January 29, 2011.

Board members present (Units represented in parentheses): Ira Hessel (172), Guillermo Poplawsky (173), Bert Onstott (174), Bob Butterfield (176), Steve Shirey (183), Martha De Cou (187), Sally Blewett (201), Larry Davis (207), Jo Smith (224), Gay Roach (225), David Pennington (233) and Johnny Johnson (237).

Committee Chairs and others present: Dan Morse (District representative to the ACBL Board of Directors), Dewitt Hudson and Betty Starzec (District Representatives to the ACBL Board of Governors), Paul Cuneo (Education Committee Chair), James Thurtell (Disciplinary Committee Chair), Jim Bauer (Grand National Teams Committee Chair), Dorsey Shaw (Intermediate/Novice Committee Chair), Melody Euler (North American Pairs Committee Chair), Tom Whitesides (Tournament Coordinator), Ellen Hessel (Scorecard Editor) and Lew Crippen (Unit 205).

In the absence of President Charles Price, First Vice President Dewitt Hudson called the meeting to order.

Election of Officers: The following persons were elected as the District's officers for the next year:

Approval of Minutes: The minutes of the meeting of the Board held September 4, 2010, were approved as presented to the meeting.

District Director: Dan Morse reported that Jay Baum is retiring in 2012 as the Executive Director of the ACBL, and that candidates to replace him are being sought. He also reported that the ACBL has developed a radio ad directed towards newcomers and empty nesters. Units which would like to use this ad would be eligible for 75% reimbursement of advertising costs incurred. The ACBL is now working on a similar television ad. He noted that the new president of the ACBL is working on visiting clubs and has a goal of visiting 50 clubs during the last half of this year.

Executive Treasurer: The Executive Treasurer's Report for calendar year 2010 was presented, including the District's Profit and Loss Statement for the calendar year and its Balance Sheet as of December 31, 2010. The Report noted that (i) revenues exceeded expenses by \$15,630 in 2010 (compared to \$10,490 in 2009), primarily as a result of the profitability of the Puerto Vallarta Regional, the addition of another Regional in the District, the profitability of the STaC games and the fact that the Scorecard ran at a smaller deficit than had been experienced in prior years , (ii) the District GNT subsidy continues to exceed GNT revenues as a result of the Board decision to grant a decision to grant a subsidy to the Super Flight team and (iii) the balance sheet shows that the District financial position is stable. The Treasurer's Report was accepted as presented.

Education: Paul Cuneo reported that 21 people attended the Teacher Accreditation Program course at the Houston Regional. He recommended that the District devote some funds to education or teacher appreciation events. After discussion, a motion to spend \$2,500 on such events in the next year, as determined by the Chair of the Education Committee, was approved.

Grand National Teams: Jim Bauer discussed the subsidy to be provided by the District to District GNT team winners. After discussion, a motion to provide a subsidy of \$1,000 to the winning teams of Flights A, B and C and the Super Flight who attend the GNT finals at the Summer NABC was approved. After discussion of the location for the District GNT finals for this year, a motion that those finals be held in conjunction with the Dallas Memorial Day Sectional was approved.

Membership: Bert Onstott distributed a report showing membership by Unit within the District for each month in the last year. It noted that membership has been above 9,000 for the last four months, though (at 9,012 currently) it is down slightly from a year ago. He stated that we all need to keep working to maintain our membership.

Intermediate/Novice: Dorsey Shaw reported that she has gotten feedback from several persons in Texas regarding recruitment and development of novice and intermediate players. They include recruiting players from social bridge clubs and the use of mentor programs to encourage newer players. She stated that she was developing proposals regarding I/N players for submission to the Board.

North American Pairs: Melody Euler reported that she is trying to get feedback on schedules for the NAP games to attempt to maximize the number of boards played. She also sated that participation at the club level in NAP games was up in all flights this year.

Publicity: Sally Blewett suggested that all Units take actions to honor teachers. She also reminded everyone to use co-op advertising (with respect to which the ACBL will pay 75% of the cost) and to take advantage of free advertising in local newspapers' community bulletin boards, etc. She stated that she would submit proposals regarding use of publicity at the next Board meeting.

Mexico: Lew Crippen reported that the Puerto Vallarta Regional made a profit.

Scorecard: Ellen Hessel stated that she and Ira have been working to improve accuracy in the Scorecard. She also noted that the financial results of the Scorecard have improved and that they expect it will be close to breaking even this year.

Unit Reports: Johnny Johnson reported that Unit 237 membership has been steady lately and that its Secional tourna ment would be held December 9-11 this year. Steve Shirey stated that the Fort Worth (Unit 183) Sectional normally held in June would be in Apri this year Martha De Cou stated that the Unit 187 Secional would be held February 18-20 in Rockport. Larry Davis (Unit 207) reported that they got the hotel at which the recent Austin Sectional was held to permit them to bring in boxed lunches for the Swiss Teams on the final day of the tournament by paying the hotel a surcharge. Ira Hessel (Unit 172) reported that, at the recent San Antonio Sectional, they limited games to two sessions per day, at 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. and served a snack in between sessions. There was an increase at the tournament of more than 50%

Dewitt Hudson recognized and commended Unit 174 for the excellent work done in putting on the Houston Regional.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

While attending the San Antonio Regional the first of July, which by the way was extremely well run and attended, I looked around the room and was just impressed with the number of bridge players I had played with and against. We really do become a family of sorts! Anyway, the personal experiences are adding up and it's my pleasure to be part of the bridge family of Central Texas.

As more players join us, I was again struck by how really "clueless" some of the newer players are about the finer etiquette points of the game-as well they should be. Our newer players haven't necessarily been versed in actions that can create an unfair advantage: squirming, taking a long time to make a call, etc. The Director is still called on me at times, but I've been around for awhile and should know the rules. However, I remember when it first happened, and I had no idea that I had done anything wrong. The Director said: "did you take a long time to make your call?" and I said "of course, I couldn't decide what to do!" Ok, I had a harsher than not punishment and I remember it to this day: both who I was playing with and against. So anyway, Directors and more experienced players, when this happens, and I have seen it in our Unit games, as well as at the recent tournament in San Antonio, and there is a breach of what is proper, be it bidding out of turn, or taking too long to make a call, and the director is called, I would like to make a suggestion: Directors: go easy on the newer players. Most of them don't know that they have made a breach and to be harshly chastised creates a feeling of unease and perhaps even resentment. Secondly, more experienced players, when playing against newer players, consider your actions carefully. If a

newer player declares, and there is a

question, perhaps you should call the director, but perhaps just asking "What is you plan of action?" before calling the director is appropriate. Some new players really do get confused and then resentful at the harshness that can result from an incomplete explanation. Obviously, we are playing a more serious duplicate game, but when all is added up, we are still a family of bridge players. We already have too many potentially nice players who have felt slighted or hurt by what they viewed as extreme calls or actions and have chosen not to continue the game. I hate to see this happen. And newer players, if this happens to you, I promise it is not intentional. Sometimes we just get too stuck on the rules to see the big picture.
