

Bob Hamman, a 12 time world champion, was on the winning team in the Open team trials. Bob, playing with Zia Mahmood as his partner, is playing on one of the all time great teams. It also includes Frank Nickell,

Jeff Meckstroth Ralph Katz and Eric Rodwell. Donna Compton will serve as the non playing captain.

In the women's trials three of the final four teams contained district 16 members. Georgiana Gates and Sally Wheeler lost by 6 IMPS in the final. Two former D16 members, Cindy Bernstein and Patricia Norman, were also on the team. A trio of World Champions, Shawn Quinn and Mildred Breed on one team and Tobi Sokolow on another, lost in the semifinals. The one team out of four without a D16 player won.

In the Seniors trials Eddie Wold, John Sutherlin and Mile Passell lost in the finals. Hemant Lall made the

semifinals. In the quarter finals, Dan Morse lost by 6 IMPs to the eventual winners.

Additionally, 2 more district 16 players will play in the World Junior Championships in Tai Cang City, China (near Shanghai) from July 24th to August 4th Taylor Compton, daughter of Chris and Donna, will play in the Rona cup, which is for women under 26. Taylor will be eligible for this cup for many years. Mitch Towner will represent the USA in the Patino cup, for players under 26. Donna Compton will serve as the non-playing captain of the USA 2 team that will compete for the Patino cup.






GNT participation is holding steady; around 50 teams compete at the district level (total of all flights). The number of NAP club qualifying games held in 2011 was the highest of any district as a percentage of our membership. Club level qualifying for NAP has started again for 2012, so be sure to look for your opportunity to qualify through the end of August. Clubs are encouraged to schedule two NAP qualifying games per sanctioned session each



month. The more club NAP tables the district has, the more likely we are to get extra at-large qualifiers to Nationals.

#### Membership & Regionals

On the not so good news side, we are almost halfway through 2012 and the news on the membership front is not good; as of June 1, total district membership is down 37 from a year ago and at 8,904 we are below the 9,000 threshold that gives District 16 another regional. The district normally gets four regionals each year in addition to those held in Mexico. If we have more than 9,000 members, we can choose to hold a fifth regional. Also, any regional that exceeds 3,000 tables three consecutive years becomes a destination regional' and doesn't count as one of the four to which the district is entitled. The Houston Lone Star Regional earned that title this past February, so theoretically the district could hold up to six regionals each year if we stayed above 9,000 members. Having regionals in our district gives our members a chance to earn gold points while minimizing their travel and lodging expenses, so from that perspective it's a good thing.

There are many activities Units can pursue that will bring in new members; they all boil down to doing things to get new players across the threshold of the local club and making them feel welcome. The importance of holding limited point games for newcomers can't be overstressed, and it's essential that everyone be friendly and polite to other players. Helping local teachers and students find each other is also very important. I strongly encourage every unit to pursue goals in these areas. 

# "Can't anybody here play this game?" Casey Stengal

In the recent USBF open championships, to determine the US open representa-tive for the World Championships, the following hand was picked up. S 6 H AKQ D 4 C AKQ98765.

If given the chance partner would show some positive and a long diamond suit. Four world class pairs, all who have represented the USA in world champion-ships, held these cards. I suppose that most players below the rank of Grand Life Master would open with a force and then check for aces. But it was not that sim-ple. Anchored with key card ace asking tools 2 pairs realized that if they bid 4NT they would either get a 5D 0 or 3 response or partner might treat the D king as a key card. So two pairs, including Eric Rodwell and Jeff Meckstroth, settled for 5 C. Partner did have an A and they were a tad dismayed and expected to lose a double digit swing. They won 12 and 13 IMPs. One set of opponents ended in 7C bait one and another-well they played in 4NT off 6 spade tricks. Thus went the best laid plans of mice and men.

Scorecard July-August 2012

"Bridge and marriage Bridge and marriage Go together like ..... "

Complete the thought and it can be like hell on earth occasionally. Many loving couples have faced this perennial challenge, but without restraint and mutual respect you can't have one without the other.

I remember my parents arguing as they'd come back from the bridge club. It never reached the level of flying pots and pans, but it was enough to ruin the evening, maybe even the next 2-3 days. Interestingly, I played with my mother for years without a problem until her passing in 1997. Today I play with my father when he visits and we have a great time. They could play with others just fine, but together as partners it was very difficult.

Blair and Barbara Lapwing from Austin have been kind enough to submit their personal experience.

"Barbara and I like to play bridge together, which is lucky because

we live together. I say "lucky," but our continued cohabitation hinges much more on conscious efforts than luck. Five years ago, with an eye on our pending retirement, we decided to take bridge lessons. We wanted something we could do together and which would be both challenging and

rewarding enough to hold our interest for a good while. Under the tutelage of the illustrious Scott Humphrey, we learned the game (Scott might say "more or less"--Barbara) and quickly succumbed to the lure of the Bridge Center of Austin. One of the first things we discovered about competitive bridge is that partnerships stress mightily under the weight of egotism, ambition, and pride. At those early games, we witnessed--sometimes in alarm, but more often in amusement--the very public clashes between partners. People were being rude to each other; they were unsympathetic over partner's trials; they were unsupportive when partner needed encouragement; they were behaving like complete jerks. We wondered why some of these dysfunctional partnerships persisted. Surely, we thought, these people could find someone else to play bridge with. Especially the married-or-equivalent partners. They, of all people, should manage to be helpful and constructive, not petty and acerbic. Full of our oh-so-righteous certitude that we were above such

caustic conflicts, we privately shook our heads, clucked and snickered, smugly confident we would do right by each other. Yes, we were married and ours was the best possible bridge partnership ever.

I was convinced we had a beautiful future together, playing bridge until we expired, virtually sparkling with a connubial gleam in gaming nirvana. Yep, we were good to each other . . . right up the point when Barbara, on the drive home after a game said, "You were way out of line all night. I don't respect it. I don't need it. Get a grip or get a new partner." (He's paraphrasing because there is no room for coarseness in this newsletter--Barbara.) My own egotism, ambition, and pride had taken me directly to the same place where I had found so much to ridicule in others. Now I was the ludicrous partner, and

unless I changed my ways, my future in bridge would be Barbara -less. We're both competitive, and we play to win. But a win is hollow and pyrrhic if we lose our partner along the way. Barbara was doing her bit for the partnership, but I was advising, steering, and discounting her skills, all in utter ignorance, considering my very limited experience in the game. Humbled by her warning, I sought a solution and found that the answer was directly in front of me, right there among the

other players. While the bad partnerships tended to attract my attention, I was blind to the beautiful relationships many of the married partners were enjoying. I watched the acts of kindness and forgiveness exchanged between partners and resolved to emulate them (good thinking--Barbara). In the process, Barbara and I came together in restored appreciation for the things we hoped to get when we started taking lessons.

Essentially, bridge is a shared pastime for us, not a no-holdsbarred assault in which total domination is the only acceptable outcome. It's true we have different levels of interest; I play more often than Barbara, but we have the Tuesday game plus a weekly social game to enjoy together. We recognize and respect each other's differences while appreciating our shared love of the game. Perhaps I have exaggerated my faults in a sort of act of contrition (you can never say "I'm sorry" too often--Barbara),

and I certainly do not want to appear righteous or selfaggrandizing, but the key to Barbara's and my future as bridge partners is something we've known all along: we treat people in the way we wish them to treat us. Some call it the Golden Rule, or the Ethic of Reciprocity, or even the Law of One. Verily, I say, "Do unto . . ." (Okay, hold it right there. This is all such a large load of malarkey! Bridge is okay once or twice a week, I suppose, but the main reason I play with him is to keep him interested in the game. I just want him out of the house for a few hours several times a week--Barbara.)"

I am sure there are many married bridge couples that can relate to this experience. Blair and Barbara Lapwing, thank you for sharing your story with us.

# **Instructions for Submitting Photos for Scorecard**

Use a flash to insure adequate lighting.

Choose a background that does not have distractions.

3. For team photos, have the two tallest members sit down, and the two shorter members stand behind them. Ask the ones standing to lean in a little so everyone will be in focus.

4. Center your photos if possible.

5. Have the players write their names, the date, and the event they won on a sheet a paper. Have them write their names as they are positioned in the photo: left, right. For team photos: left rear, right rear, left front, right front.

6. After downloading the photos on the computer

a/ name the photos by the players' last names as they appear in the photo, for example: Hamman Wolff for a

pair; or Meckstroth Rodwell Nickell Freeman using the format left rear, right rear, left front, right front for



Don't forget to mark your calendar so that you have a chance to qualify at the club level for the NAP's. Qualifying events will be held throughout the summer, ending on August 31. Ask the director or manager at your club when the club will have its qualifying events. Then in September and October, if you have qualified at the club level, plan to compete in the Unit Qualifiers. The Flight C qualifier will be September 30, followed by the Flight B qualifier on October 7 and the Flight A qualifier on October 28. The finishers in the top 60% of each flight -and any pair with a higher than 50% gamewill be eligible to play at the District qualifiers in January, with the top three or four pairs at the District competition eligible to play at the March Nationals in St. Louis. This event involves subsidies for travel, and there is no entry fee for the qualifiers at the National level.







Worth repeating, -- from Bob Hamman's autobiography, Dallas Aces coach Joe Musumeci's seven deadly sins: 1-no win declarer play; 2-no win defensive play; 3-unilateral actions; 4-bidding without values; 5impulsive actions: 6-system violations and 7-mechanical errors. In other words and regrettably, the following incomplete list of recent errors included lazy inattention, not counting, taking tricks prematurely, giving it to declarer and lack of awareness of mistakes.

Again, worth repeating, excerpts and paraphrases from ACBL 4/99 bulletin Robert Wolff's advice to Junior squad: Check your ego at the door and leave emotional baggage you have. A disciplined player is always ready to play. A disciplined player doesn't try to win the match all by himself. A disciplined player always plays hard. A disciplined player knows agreed system. Play without emotion. Steeling oneself to overcome adversity by putting a bad result in the past immediately. Be consistent so partner always knows what to expect.


