





The Philadelphia NABC was a lot smaller than I expected: only 12,000 tables compared to 14,000 last summer in Toronto.

This was surprising in light of the major population centers within driving distance (e.g., NY, DC). National events had many fewer entries than usual. There was also a dearth of District 16 players; other than the GNT winners and pros from our neck of the woods, there were few residents of Texas or Mexico to be seen at the tournament. As a result, District 16 had little to cheer about when it came to NABC-level events.

The primary exception was the Wagar Women's Knockout Teams (aka the Women's KO), which was dominated by District 16 players: Mildred Breed of Austin and Shawn Quinn of Sugar Land won, Tobi Sokolow of Austin was second, and Peggy Sutherlin of Dallas and Nancy Passell of Plano finished third/fourth. Of course, Mildred and Shawn had each won the Women's KO several times before (separately and together), but this win had to be especially sweet, given their recent history in the event: Mildred was runner-up in 2009, Shawn was runner-up in 2010, and they were runners-up as partners in 2011). Several District 16 players finished in the top-ten in NABC events. In the Life Master Pairs (the premiere pair event at the summer NABC), Sally Wheeler and Buddy Hanby, The Woodlands, finished ninth. In the Senior Swiss, Dan Morse, Houston, and John Sutherlin, Dallas, were fifth, while Barry Schaffer, Frisco, ended up tenth. In the Open Pairs, Ira Hessel, San Antonio, and Joe Quinn, Sugar Land, finished fifth. Finally, in the Roth Open Swiss, John Mohan, Huixquilucan (Mexico), was sixth, Eddie Wold, Houston, placed eighth, and Greg Hinze, San Antonio, and Bart Bramley wound up tenth. Good going, you guys!

The fall NABC will be held in San Francisco from November 22 (Thanksgiving) to December 2. I know I don't have to cajole you into attending. There is a reason Tony Bennett left his heart there! San Francisco is the top tourist site in the country, and one of the most popular venues for NABCs, too. The last NABC to be held there ('07) had 15,000 tables—an incredible turnout for a fall NABC (traditionally the smallest NABC each year). Make

Philadelphia Report

It was hot in Philadelphia, maybe even hotter than Texas but inside the Marriott it was always cool. The Table count was 11,913 a respectable number, but not quite as high as anticipated. The best thing about the location was Reading Terminal right across the street, where there were hundreds of good restaurants open from 8am to 6pm in the converted train station.

The ACBL'S Mission: To promote and sustain the game of bridge and serve the bridge-related interests of our members.

Vision: We will be a growing, thriving organization that actively meets the diverse needs of our members and bridge players.

GOOD NEWS.

The ACBL herby establishes a GRASS ROOTS FUND. The month of December is designated as "GRASS ROOTS FUND MONTH". Clubs may hold special games under the same rules and regulations applicable to the other special fund months (currently benefitting the Charity Foundation, Junior and International Funds). Funds raised shall be returned annually no later than March 31 to the individual District in which these funds were raised, and shall be used by the Dis-

such as the Grand National Teams and the North American Pairs.

September/October 2012

The ACBL shall not charge the Districts any fee for the cost of collecting and disbursing these funds.

The Grass Roots Fund is an additional, eligible beneficiary from regionally rates games at sectionals. (One sectional game can get Regional rating by charging an extra \$1.00 per person to benefit an approved cause).

MEMBERSHIP

For the period January 1 thru June 30 the ACBL has signed up 6,431 new members, an increase of 2.4% over the same 6 months last year. Here in District 16 our membership has decreased slightly which is disappointing as we have generally been in the top 5 Districts for new members.

SPECIAL CLUB GAMES

When a Sectional (excluding STAC's) or higher rated event is being conducted within 25 miles of a club game's playing site, the club is permitted to hold only its regular scheduled club master-point games (no special games). This regulation does not apply to Limited/Restricted Sectionals.

PLAYING DIRECTORS IN STAC GAMES

Playing directors in STAC games and their partners are ineligible to receive overall STAC master-points



Petra Hamman and Hemant Lall Win **Transnational Mixed Teams in Lille, France**



Longtime successful partnership, Petra Hamman and Hemant Lall, won the Transnational Mixed Teams held in Lille, France August 6-23. Hemant and Petra played on the Milner team, captained by Reese Milner, also of the USA. Their teammates were Jacek Pszczola of Poland, Meike Wortel of the Netherlands and Gabriela Oliviera of Italy. The event started with 87 teams and after three days of a Swiss Team format, the top 8 teams that prevailed began a KO phase consisting of 80 board matches. They were behind 150 to 151 after 74 hands in the final but rallied 29-7 on the last 6 boards. Look for more details next issue.

In the Prestigious open teams Bob Hamman lost a heartbreaker to Sweden by 4 IMPS in the quarterfinals. Sweden went on to win the championship.





S 6 H AKQ D 4 C AKQ98765.

If given the chance partner would show some positive and a long diamond suit. Four world class

pairs, all who have represented the USA in world championships, held these cards. I suppose that most players below the rank of Grand Life Master would open with a force and then check for aces. But it was not that simple. Anchored with key card ace asking tools 2 pairs realized, as their auction went, that if they bid 4NT they would either get a 5D 0 or 3 response or partner might treat the D king as a key card. So two pairs, including Eric Rodwell and Jeff Meckstroth, settled for 5 C. Partner did have an A and they

were a tad dismayed and expected to lose a double digit swing. They won 12 and 13 IMPs. One set of opponents ended in 7C bait one and anotherwell they played in 4NT off 6 spade tricks. Thus went the best laid plans of mice and men.

TOURNAMENT ADVERTISING A total of 259 tournament ad e-mail blasts has been distributed the first 6 months of 2012.






PHILADELPHIA NABC 12 JULY TO 22 JULY 2012

Bridge, in general, seems to attract many interesting people to the game. As I get to know our players better, I am struck by how many mathematicians, accountants, lawyers, and teachers are among our ranks! I shouldn't be surprised because counting cards and possibilities, as well as a background in logic, is exactly what is needed to play a truly successful game of bridge. One such player is Louis Sachar. Louis is most often recognized as being the author of several highly successful books written for young people, the most well known being Holes, which he also did the screenplay for and was a highly successful movie. A recent novel was The Card Turner, which was the story of a young man who became hooked on bridge after he was hired to turn the cards for his blind uncle. As in Holes, it is a story of life transformation. Turns out, this is what Louis likes to do: write about things that make a difference in young people's lives.

Louis, though born in New York, moved to California at age 9. He graduated from UC Berkeley, then Hastings Law School. During his last year of college, he helped out in an elementary school and found it to be a "joyful relief to leave the heavy work of the university for a couple of hours each day, and be with brighteyed enthusiastic kids." After graduation he tried writing a children's book, which became Sideways Stories From Wayside School, and heard from a publisher who offered him a contract for it his first week of law school. He completed law school, and began to practice law, but continued with his writing, which he was eventually able to do full time. In the mid 90s, Louis and his wife chose to move to Austin to raise their daughter. It is then that he met Nancy Joe, who invited him to play in a duplicate game. He was hooked! All other games seemed trivial compared to bridge. He had played bridge with his parents growing up, but this was his first time for duplicate and the game became a part of his routine then and there. Asked about his most memorable game, he says it has to be when he partnered been well received and appreciated. Topics have included signaling, counting, and the very last was by Tom Clark: **Declarer Play: a Field of Vision: Introduction to Squeeze Plays and Rectifying the Count**. We received 10 pages of notes and my head is still spinning. Knowing how effective Tom is in getting the count (points and cards in each suit) has made me try to get to games early so I can arrange to "skip" his table! Tom's lecture was fantastic – and Tom has become a formidable opponent over the years.

Unit 207 sponsored a complimentary 2 game session with lunch at the end of July. It was well attended and apparently everyone had a good time. The membership has expressed appreciation for these events and the Board has determined that it is a good way to give back to the Club.





I hope you have qualified at the club level for the NAP's. The next step will be the Unit qualifiers. As is the unit's custom, the Flight C, Flight B, and Flight A qualifiers will be held on separate days so that players who have qualified at the club for more than one flight will be able to try to qualify again if they have an off day in the first unit qualifying event. (Please note that if you fail to qualify at the unit level for, say, the Flight C event, you may not try to qualify for Flight C in another unit, but you MAY try to qualify for Flight B or even Flight A.) The Flight C qualifier will be September 30 at BAND, followed by the Flight B qualifier on October 7 at Dorsey's and the Flight A qualifier on October 28 at BAND. The finishers in the top 60% of each flight - and any pair with a higher than 50% game - will be eligible to play at the District qualifiers on January 5th and 6th in Austin, with the top three or four pairs at the District competition eligible to play at the March Nationals in St. Louis. This event involves subsidies for travel, and there is no entry fee for the qualifiers at the National level.





the game allowed him to hobnob with the bridge greats of the day, organized it in 1957. Attendees included Charles Goren, Oswald and Jim Jacoby, Helen Sobel and Margaret Wager. The venue was the Windsor Hotel, and the place was packed. Jeane and her husband Cheatham were there of course.

As a favor Hodge asked Jeane to play with Jim Jacoby's new wife, Judy, in the Friday afternoon Women's Pairs. They won! One of the mementos of the tournament that Jeane treasures is a book by Goren, New Contract Bridge Complete. It bears the inscription, "To Jeane and Cheatham: My Texas visit would not be complete without seeing you. Good luck. Charles H. Goren"

Jeane notes that social customs at bridge tournaments have changed over the years. In the 1950's men always wore suits and ties, and women wore furs, long dresses and jewelry. This custom extended to club play on Saturday nights, when 15 tables were not uncommon. Unlike today's competition there were menand women-only events, with mixed pairs being the nod to women's equality. Helen Sobel, even today considered by some to be the most brilliant player of all time, was formidable to opponents of either sex. Jeane remembers that at the Abilene tournament Sobel imbibed now and then from a flask in her purse.

In its early days the unit played its games at the Windsor Hotel. After using a variety of other venues, the unit built its own building in Rose Park in 1978. Jeane recalls all the regular players over the years. She speaks particularly fondly of Mabel Lilius, the tireless director after whom the building is named. Mabel flawlessly scored every session with pencil and paper while the players eagerly awaited the results.

Jeane McFarland. As one of the most respected and beloved members of Unit 224, Jeane McFarland has lived a life full of colorful adventures and rich experiences, many of them in the world of bridge.

Jeane has played bridge for most of her 88 years, beginning in the era when the game was called "auction". She learned it at the knee of her grandfather in Bonham, Texas. A regular player and valued partner at local clubs, Jeane is often in the winner's circle. As a long-time resident of Abilene, she has been part of the history of bridge in the city.

One of Jeane's most vivid memories is of the city's first tournament. Paul Hodge, an Abilenian whose skill at Jeane married Hood Hart in Abilene in 1943 when she was 19. They agreed that if their first child were a boy, they would become members of the Episcopal Church, where Hood worshipped. If a girl they would join Jeane's family in attending the Presbyterian Church. Richard's eventual arrival settled the issue. Hood was posted to Florence Air Force Base in South Carolina, where Jean was employed to issue all the rations, among other duties. Because there were German prisoners of war who needed to be fed, Jeane was provided with a jeep and a sergeant who carried a machine gun.

Back in Abilene after the war, Jeane was tragically widowed. She worked as secretary for the Episcopal Church, participated in the establishment of Thrift House and St. John's School, and assisted "Parson" Gerhart during the period that the new Episcopal Church of the Heavenly Rest was built. Jeane met Frank Cheatham McFarland at a bridge game on New Year's Eve 1951, and with a little push from "Parson" they married. Amy was born a year later.

Cheatham was a pharmacist, and he and Jeane decided in 1967 to accept an opportunity to move to Laredo to acquire and run one of the first discount pharmacies in Texas, which would be located in a large retail store by the name of Mundens. Jeane worked with Cheatham in the pharmacy, doing everything but bottling pills. They alternated shifts in order to keep the pharmacy open 12 hours a day.

Somehow they found time to play bridge in Laredo and to attend tournaments in Mexico. After winning a sectional in Monterrey, it appeared that they had the choice of leaving for the bus station in time for the trip home or having their pictures taken in order to satisfy the tournament organizers. Jeane was determined to have it both ways, and after a hurried photograph, she ándale-ed the Mexican cabbie right through red lights and stop signs, stepping onto the charter bus just as it was about to pull out of the station. One of the McFarlands' bridge acquaintances in Laredo was Seymon Deutsch, a national bridge champion.

Cheatham and Jean sold the pharmacy and retired to Abilene in 1987. They began to play bridge regularly and became Life Masters in 1994. Cheatham died in 1996. 



Looking forward to seeing you are the tables soon.




