Lew Levy Wins 2012 Oswald & James **Jacoby Award**



Unit 174 nominates Lew Levy for the District 16 Jacoby Award. Lew has provided outstanding service to the Unit and to District 16.

Lew was elected to the Unit 174 Board of Directors in 2002 for a three year term. In his first year, Lew was Unit Vice President. In addition to his other duties, Lew was charged with reviewing and improving the Unit's financial system. The result was a total revamp of the Unit's accounting system. In order to implement the new system, Lew took on the additional role of Unit Treasurer. He performed that role for several months until a permanent replacement could be recruited and trained. The resulting system enabled the Unit Board to more effectively manage its financial affairs, and allowed the Unit membership to understand the sources and uses of Unit funds.

During Lew's first year on the Board, the Unit President resigned because of health issues, and Lew became President. He completed the unexpired term, and was elected for a complete term as President the following year. During his term in office many innovations were introduced including sale of event naming rights for Regional and Sectional events, computerization of the Unit's Policies and Procedures, and updating the Unit Membership Directory.

In the year following his service on the Board, Lew served as Chairman of the Unit's Nominating Committee.

In 2006, District President Dewitt Hudson asked Lew to take on the role of Executive Treasurer. Lew accepted the assignment and installed a modified version of the financial system he had developed for Unit 174. The result has been that District Board members are now able to manage their financial affairs with confidence. Lew continues to serve as District 16 Executive Treasurer to this date.

Lew was a member of the committee responsible for the 2009 Houston NABC. His role was to organize the fund-raising activities for the tournament. The Unit achieved its financial goals despite the lack of a major sponsoring underwriter.

Make your plans to play in the NAPS in Austin during the first weekend in January. Melody Euler, the D16 NAP Coordinator, reports that District 16 will have an additional at-large qualifier to Nationals in Flight B for North American Pairs in 2013. We had the best ratio of tables to members in play of any district in the ACBL again this year,

Three pairs from A, four from B and three from flight C will qual-St. Louis nationals in march. The district is adding money to the amount that the ACBL awards. First place qualifiers in A, B and C and second in B will receive \$800/per person, second place in A and C and third in B receive \$500 and third place in A and C and fourth in B get \$300. In addition, there are no entry fees for the National event once you have qualified.

In addition to financial stipends for the top finishers, all the parify to represent District 16 at the ticipants enjoy the best competition available on the district calendar.

Unfortunately, although our total number of tables were third in the Nation (same as last year). It would take us being second to secure the at large spot for Flight A and that is hard to do given the two Districts outperforming us are almost twice our size in membership!

Regional Scheduling

As a result of the Houston Lone Star Regional having had more than 3,000 tables the past three years, the District now gets five regionals each year, instead of the

previous four. In July, the District board approved a new District Regional Schedule to accommodate the new regional and fairly spread regionals out among the Units. The new schedule follows these guidelines:

Houston and Dallas have had the largest table counts and get a regional every year. Houston's will be in late January, and Dallas's will be over Labor Day.

Fort Worth, San Antonio, Austin and Tyler have had comparable table counts and get a regional every other year. San Antonio and Austin will alternate hosting a regional on the 4th of July; Tyler and Fort Worth will alternate a spring date, targeted to be around May 1-15. Abilene, Corpus Christi, and Beaumont fill out the fifth spot, hosting a regional every three years in the fall, targeted to be around October 1-15. This can't be fully implemented until 2016, due to previously sanctioned tournaments. This is the projected rotation: Thanks to Charlie Price for his help in this effort.

Sectional Tournament Scheduling

Complaints about sectionals being scheduled for the overlapping dates, thereby hurting table counts at one or both, were brought to my attention by several of you over the summer. In response, I asked the team of Jo Smith, Scott Humphrey, Charlie Price, Carolyn Pinto, and Tomi Fitzgerald to come up with guidelines for scheduling tournaments that would maximize participation and avoid interference with other tournaments. To support these goals, these guidelines were adopted by the District Board in the meeting held during the Labor Day Regional: Schedules should be current on the District website, and each unit scheduler should look at the schedule to avoid conflicts. Traditional scheduling dates should be observed.

Regional tournaments, NAPs and GNTs should be scheduled at least 3 years ahead.


Sectional tournaments in large units should be scheduled 2-3 years

Each unit should be limited to 4 sectional tournaments per year.

served Unit 172 as president of the Board of Directors as well as creating the Unit 172 and District 16 websites. He also assisted other units with creation of their own websites.



4. Have and show confidence in the partnership.

The amateur golfer can't play a foursome with Nicklaus, the average tennis player could never hope for a match against Navratilova. But even novice bridge players can sit down at a tournament and play against experts and world champions." It is a rite of passage in playing the game of bridge when lesser experienced players have the opportunity to play against players who have developed better defined skills and abilities.

Ask this question of yourself: do I want to improve? All players should have the mentality that moving forward requires taking that first step. There is nothing like winning that first masterpoint. From that point on, for a great number of players, duplicate bridge will be a lifetime partner. And, most everyone wants their partner in life to be enjoyable and ever progressive. It is natural to have doubting tendencies. Every skilled player was once a novice...a novice with the willingness to take the steps necessary to improve. Getting poor results goes with the territory in developing bridge skills.....another rite of passage in bridge....My tip for you in this writing is: if you love duplicate bridge, avoid falling into the vanilla trap. Give your game some flavor and variety. Spice it up. Play some games amongst better competition. Politely ask advice. *Let the good times grow!*


