As always, the San Francisco NABC attracted a huge turnout, but uncharacteristically, no player from District 16 won an NABC event. Still, there were outstanding performances from several District 16 stalwarts in three team events: the Reisinger Board-AMatch, the Senior KO, and the Women's Board-A-Match.
Bart Bramley of Dallas finished second in the Reisinger. Bart played on a four-person team, which means that each player played every single board. This is particularly impressive given the grueling competition. The Reisinger is the premier team event on the NABC calendar: three days, using board-a-match scoring (where any margin of victory on a board, no matter how small, counts as a win), with a brutal cut. Forty two teams were reduced to twenty for Day \#2, while only ten teams survived to the final! Bart displayed uncanny card sense on deal after deal, but could not catch the victors, who won their last seven boards to prevail. In third place was Bob Hamman of Dallas, playing with former District 16 'er Justin Lall. Babu Koneru of San Antonio was fifth. A terrific showing by all!
Bart and Bob played as partners in the Senior KO, and came oh-so-close to winning the event-- they lost by just three IMPs in the final. John Sutherlin of Dallas and Dan Morse of Houston finished 3/4, while Ira HesHouston finished 3/4, while Ira Hes-
sel of San Antonio and Joe Quinn of Sugar Land ended up 5/8, knocking out the heralded Meltzer team to reach the quarterfinals. Don't mess with Texas!
Austinite Tobi Sokolow finished second in the Women's BAM. Her record in this event of late is formidable: she won last year, and was second in ' 09 and ' 10 . Tobi loves the excitement of BAM, where every excitement of BAM, where every

The ACBL shall remove the Student Membership option. All student members will be upgraded to Junior Membership.

The ACBL and only the ACBL shall be permitted to sponsor regional tournaments at sea.

There are now Masterpoint Removal Sanctions for any member found guilty of a conduct or ethical violation.

The NABC 10K Swiss Teams will be played the first Friday and Saturday of the Spring NABC.

Cell Phones are now allowed in the playing area of NABC+ events, however if they go off or make noise you will be penalized.

## Grand National Teams 2012-2013: Win A Trip To Atlanta

The District 16 competition for the 2012 - 2013 Grand National Teams (GNT) began on September 1, 2012. The Grand National Teams (GNTs) are one of two ACBL "grass roots" events. The North American Pairs is the other grass roots event in which our players can win Red and Gold points without leaving their unit area. GNT competition moves through two levels: (1) unit qualifying games for ' B ' and ' C ' teams and (2) the District 16 Finals which will be held in Dallas, on May $25-27,2013$.

GNT competition is divided into four flights: Championship flight (unlimited masterpoints), Flight A for players with fewer than 5,000 masterpoints, Flight B for players with fewer than 2,000 masterpoints,
and Flight C for Non-Life Masters with fewer than 500 masterpoints. Unlike Open events, the GNT distric final is a peer-based competition You get to take the measure of your play vs. players of like ability. The four flights compete separately at the district finals. Winning teams in each flight receive a subsidy to compete in the Summer Nationals in Atlanta in July 2013.

Flight eligibility was established by ACBL's September masterpoint cy cle produced on August 6, 2012 Masterpoints won after this cycle do not impact flight eligibility for these events.

Flight ' $B$ ' \& ' $C$ ' players qualify for district finals in unit-qualifying games if their team:

Wins one-half or more of their matches in a Swiss Teams (a tie is one-half of a win)
Finishes average or higher in scoring system used to rank teams (VP or win -loss)
Finishes in the top $50 \%$ within a stra tum or flight in the scoring system used

Note to directors: ACBLScore doe not always qualify every team eligible by the above rules. It might be necessary to add manual qualifications before making the results official.

We encourage all our district player to participate in these events. No only is it fun, but you have a chance to win a trip to Atlanta for the nationals and you only have to play people within your own flight.

The last time I saw Jack was at the Houston Regional early this year. Although wheelchair bound he made the trip from Dallas to play with his favorite partner, his wife Janet.

I think Jack epitomized the player who truly enjoyed playing bridge and, despite physical limitations played whenever possible. Jack lamented about the recent trend in bridge reducing the number of boards played from $26-27$ to 24 in pair games. He wrote a letter to the Scorecard strongly expressing his views.

## TAble COUNT

The total table count was: 13,410 $1 / 2$ tables. The last time the ACBL was held in San Francisco was in the Fall of 2007. At that time they had a table count of : 14,858 . With these tallies, San Francisco took the second and third place of all time high attendance of Fall Nationals, with Las Vegas retaining first place with a total table count of 16,818 .

PRESIDENT-ELECT
Donald Mamula of Mill Creek, Washington was elected by the ACBL Board of Directors to be President for 2013. Mamula represents District 19 which covers Alaska, Washington state and British Columbia. In his acceptance speech, Mamula stated the following: "I want the Board of Directors

Sandy Di Martino was elected by the ACBL Board of Directors to Chair this committee for the following three years. She replaced Rose Meltzer

BOARD OF GOVERNORS
Richard Anderson was elected by the Board of Governors to be their President for the next three years. Richard is from Regina, Saskatchewan Canada and is a member of District 18. There was a 'hard-fought battle" between Richard and Chris Compton. The final vote tally was: 54 to 53 votes!! Chris worked extremely hard for this position, by campaigning, making lots of telephone calls, sending letters, and also having outstanding bridge players, sending letters of endorsement to the Board of Governors.

MASTERPOINT REPORTING IN THE BULLETIN

Plan to "come on down!"

Finally, as promised, here's a Fundamental tip, which is "Look to Your Rebid." This one became crystal-clear to me in a learning session with our very famous Eddie Wold It's one of the most in Edde Wold. It's one of the most important considerations especially when deciding what-or whether-to open. If you open a minor and then rebid it, it should be six (some partners insist on penalty of death!). Depending on partnership agreement, if you open with one of a suit and rebid 1NT, you promise 12 to 14 HCP (no less, no more). If you open one of a major and rebid it, you promise six trumps or for sure extra values. If your partner opens one of a suit and you have opening hand, you will probably want to make a jump rebid. So make sure your first bid will let you accurately describe your hand on your rebid. But then, we don't live in a perfect world, so there will be times when you must tell the least lie. But if you make a mental note to just look to your rebid before you approach the bidding box, it might help.

The Absentee Ballot must be postmarked no later than March 22, 2013, and must be received by the Election Judges no later than April 3,2013 , in order to be counted. ## Two Proposed Amendments to Unit 174's By-Laws at the Annual Meeting on April 7, 2013

The first will amend Article VI Section 3 to change the minimum number of candidates for the Board that the nominating committee must generate. Currently it is 6 .
The change is as follows: Said Nominating Committee shall meet prior to the mailing of notices of the annual meeting, and shall prepare a slate of Nominees with between 4 and six candidates. With no incumbent elected directors running for re-election, the minimum would be 6 candidates. The minimum would be reduced by 1 for each incumbent elected director seeking re-election.

The second change is to Article VI Section 9 d concerning annual audit of the Unit's finances. The change would allow either an audit or a financial review with timing at the discretion of the Board. Proposed wording is:

To provide for an audit by a Certified Public Accountant or a review of Unit financial procedures, books and records by a competent independent reviewer. The frequency of the audit or review will be determined by the Board of Directors.
