No one from our district came in first, second or even third in an unrestricted national pair or team event. I'm not sure this has happened in all the time I've been writing this column (more than a decade, but I've lost track)!

There was good news, however, in several restricted events. Danie Jackson of Spring and Bill McCarty of San Antonio won the North American Open Pairs Flight B. To make it to the NAOP finals, you must firs qualify at the club, unit, and regional levels. Then you get to compete against the top pairs from other 24 districts (74 pairs played in St. Louis). Daniel and Bill won the regional contest in January then averaged $57 \%$ over four sessions in St. Louis. Nice going you two--you did us proud!

In the Red Ribbon Pairs, Jeff Dater of Dallas and Rich Brandenburg of Coppell finished second. To say they did it by the skin of their teeth is an understatement. Less than one MP separated second and fifth place, so there wasn't a fraction of a MP to spare! The good news: they finished 35 MPs behind first, so they left noth ing on the table. I expect we'll be reading about their accomplishments again in the near future.

If one is "the loneliest num ber" (according to Three Dog Night), four was a popular number for topflight District 16 players in STL. Ir Hessel of San Antonio was fourth twice, in the IMP Pairs and Silver Ribbon Pairs (less than one MP out of third!). Steve Shirey of Fort Worth was Ira's partner in the IMP Pairs Houston resident John Zilic and Nagy Kamel of Plano were fourth in the Open Pairs. And in the Women's Swiss, Tobi Sokolow of Austin wasyou guessed it-- our fourth (event) fourth.

A plethora of other District 16 players had top 10 finishes in NABC events. In the NAOP Flight A, Greg Hinze of San Antonio and Hemant Lall of Dallas finished ninth. Greg also made it to the quarterfinals in the Vanderbilt, a particularly impressive accomplishment playing on a 4-person team. In the Silver Ribbon Pairs, Sally Wheeler, The Woodlands, was tenth In the Platinum Pairs, Bart Bramley Dallas, ended up eighth. Georgiana Gates, Houston, and Carolyne Fox, Marvel, were ninth in the Women's Pairs. In the Women's Swiss, Lynn Baker, Austin, was sixth; Nancy Pas-

Heinlein) when you intuit your partner's interior landscape, intimately and completely sharing the same line of thinking. In other words, when you really "get each other." Doesn't happen that often or easily, does it? But when it does, even for one game, it's sweet!

New York. And many of us will say New York. And many of us will say
"amen" to Warren Buffet's description of the game: "such a sensational game that I wouldn't mind being in jail if I had three cellmates who were decent players and who were willing to keep the game going 24 hours a day." Wahoo!

## Fundamental Tip

"In Tempo" means to bid and play in an even tempo-not hurried, not painfully slowly, and not with any extra body language. Just "feel" a tempo and move in rhythm to it. Ideally, you would take the same amount of time to think for a bit, approach the bidding box, pull your card(s), lay it(them) in front of you, card(s), lay it(them) in front of you,
and the next person is up to bat, so to and the next person is up to bat, so to
speak. Now, it's not possible to do it all the time like a robot, but it should be a goal.

The same theory should apply to your play, especially when defend-
ing. Use a calm, deliberate, easy manner of playing your card. That means you need to decide what you are probably going to play in each suit when the dummy comes down so that you do not play too quickly or take too long to decide.
