42 teams played in the District finals to see which 4 teams would represent D16 in Flights A. B and C and the Superflight at the national finals in Atlanta. B and C teams first qualified for the district finals in their respective units. The Superflight and A teams were all prequalified. The 4 teams were all prequalified. The 4
Superflight teams played a straight KO. All the other flights played a 2 session Swiss and then the leaders in each flight played a KO. The top 2 teams in each flight, with the first place teams going to the nationals, are listed above.

For Lall, it was the third straight year he has won ; each year with almost an entirely different team. This year 2 of his teammates, Hinze and Kamel, were on the victorious team the 2 previous years when he was second.

The total teams in $\mathrm{A}, \mathrm{B}$ and C were 38, the same a last year. There were 7 Superflight teams last year and 4 this year. The increase last year was due to the fact that the district final was held on an earlier weekend and additional teams, that qualified for lower flights, were able to play in the Superflight and also the lower ones.

Ten years ago the Superflight was held before the other 3 flights and three players, Jim Griffin, Buddy Hanby and Sally Wheeler, played in the Superflight and later played in Flight A as a team with Patty Griffin. That team went on to win the Na fional Flight A that year in Long Beach.

In the very first Grand National Teams 64 teams qualified at the Unit level. Two sets of round robins got you to the KO round. The KO final was 64 boards and the event took 3 and a half days.
This year, because it started with the

KO round of 4 teams in the Super flight, 52 board Kos were played. All the matches were very close considering the length of the matches. In their ang the length of the matches. a first half lead of 40 IMPS but only 4 of that remained going into the final o thard. They scored 180 in 1 NT in one room (an euphemism) but the declarer in the other room got to an aggressive 3 NT . All that was needed aggressive $3 N T$. All that was needed
was for the declarer follow the rabbi's rule, dropping the singleton $K$ of clubs offside to win, but alas, he took a losing finesse. :)

It is always impressive that in all flights the participants seem to really enjoy this competition-win or lose.
District 16 has done very well in all national events for a long time, so best of luck to these teams in Atlanta next month. Of course, luck favors the well prepared.

## NAP Qualifying Games at Clubs are Back

Now's your chance to earn half red/ half black points at $100 \%$ sectional rating at your own local club. During June, July, and August, each club is allowed to hold two NAP games per sanction per month.

This prestigious event is staged in qualifying rounds at the club, unit, and district levels. It culminates in a final held in conjunction with the 2014 Spring NABC in Dallas.

The games are flighted: (Flight eligibility is based on the May 6, 2013 masterpoint cycle: A (Open):

B ( 0 to 2,000 ) and C ( 0 to 500 , NLM)
Pairs who qualify at the District level qualify to attend the NABC in Dallas. In addition, 1st place qualifiers will receive $\$ 700 /$ per person and 2 nd place $\$ 300 /$ per person. In addition, there are no entry fees for the Na tional event once you have qualified. ACBL also awards the District with most tables in play at the club level an additional qualifying spot, so support your clubs when they hold qualifying games. You can earn more points every time!

## District 16 Rocks on the Longest Day!

The Alzheimer Association's theme for its The Longest Day Fundraiser, "Do Something You Love", paired well with the ACBL and many of its members. On June $21^{\text {st }}$, the longest day of the calendar year, bridge clubs all across North America participated by doing what we all love, playing bridge. The ACBL has playing bridge. The ACBL has
listed seven clubs that raised more listed seven clubs that raised more
than $\$ 5,000$ although that total may increase. Two of those participating clubs are in District 16. The Bridge Academy of North Dallas (BAND) from Unit 176 raised over $\$ 50,000$ ran 10 events and 16.5 hours of nonstop bridge and The Bridge Center


Hello again from Abilene, Texas!
We must all enjoy the company of others and the exciting game of bridge to travel and talk about it as much as we do. Many of my closest friendships have resulted from meeting other duplicate bridge players.

Partnership card games date back to at least the early 16 th century. I recently returned from a European cruise where I delighted at the paintings and frescoes I saw of nobles, aristocrats and, appropriately, kings and queens playing cards. How elegant they were!

This sophistication continued into the game of bridge as ladies and gentleman of American and British "High Society" popularized contract bridge in the 1930s. I love the charm of these early bridge players and want to name a few that helped make bridge what it is today.

Ely Culbertson led this thirties' boom. Culbertson, an extravagant showman, lost and gained fortunes several times over. His wife Josephine was a great player as well. One of his most spectacular matches continues to live on.

The Culbertson-Lenz match, dubbed "The Bridge Battle of the Century," took place between December 1931 and January 1932 at two New York City hotels. Sidney Lenz led a group of players opposed to Culbertson's domination of the game, and who called their bidding system the Official System. Culbertson challenged Lenz to a match wagering lenged Lenz to a match wagering
$\$ 5,000$ against his opponent's $\$ 5,000$ against his opponent's
$\$ 1,000$, with the money going to charity regardless of the outcome.

They played the match as "rubber bridge," with 150 rubbers being played. Culbertson played 88 of these with his wife while partnering with Theodore Lightner, Waldemar von Zedtwitz, Howard Schenken or Michael Gottlieb in the remainder. Lenz played with Oswald Jacoby for the first 103 rubbers, but Jacoby resigned following a heated difference of opinion over a defensive

play. Jacoby explained that only 12 players would understand his defense and obviously Mr. Lenz was not one of those 12! (Rest assured, partnership disagreements are not uniquely new to the game!)

Oswald Jacoby's psychic bids and his competitive bidding generally kept the Lenz team in the match; but Lenz himself could not tolerate Jacoby's style. Culbertson's team won by a landslide.

Then in the 1940s, 1950s, and early 1960s, Charles Goren contributed significantly to the development and popularity of the game. The story goes that Mr. Goren immersed himself in the study of bridge after a girlfriend laughed at his ineptitude. (I'm not condoning mockery, but apparently it worked in this case.)

Mr. Goren played with Helen Sobel and many others. He liked to play bridge with women, criticizing only their lack of stamina

When I started playing in 1969, the partnership of Bob Hamman and Bobby Wolff dominated the game. Like the others before them, they both contributed to the advancement of duplicate bridge. Several years later, another pair surfaced that was all the "talk" - Jeff Meckstroth-Eric Rodwell. They hit the bridge world with a winning game and brought a popular resurgence to duplicate bridge.

Duplicate Bridge is a wonderful game handed down to us by the great minds and teams that came before us. It's an honor to be a part of ACBL and that legacy.

As you continue to encourage friends and family to play duplicate bridge, ask yourself who will be among the future names and teams going down in the history books They may be playing at your table tonight.

Please check the tournament schedule today and make plans to attend some Texas tournaments this year. We have four regional tournaments left in 2013 and many fun sectionals.

## REPORTED IN THE SCORECARD..

40 YEARS AGO - July 1973
The Houston Commercial Bridge League completed its $17^{\text {th }}$ year May $17^{7 \mathrm{t}}, 1973$, with an open pairs event featuring cold cuts, potato salad, keg beer, etc. Trophies went to first and second place winners. The League, which is chartered by the ACBL has 8 members: IBM, Exxon-Baytown, Exxon-Houston, Prudential Insurance Company, Shell Oil Company, Foley's, Chevron and Kellogg.
Some winners at the May Austin sectional were: Men's Pairs, Steve Bruce - Grahm Bruce, Master's Pairs, Eddie Wold - Terry Riely, Novice Pairs, Kerr Godfrey - Jim Musumeci. These winners were reported again in a July 1993 Score-

I graduated in 1955 and was drafted into the Army Reserve and then had a 2 year tour of duty. My parents, where I lived, was only about 2 blocks from the Trinity campus and Seymon, living at the Dorm (I was living at home) had dinner at my living at home) had dinner at my home almost every night and con with the Army.

Before I left and after my return (I was sent back to Ft. Sam Houston in San Antonio) about 8 months later we played duplicate bridge together and spent much time with bridge. In late December, 1958 I married and 2 weeks later in Laredo so did Seymon. I was a groomsman at his wedding on January 3rd, 1959 and then in the next couple of years other responsibilities led us away from contact.

Finally sometime in 1979 I visited Seymon's store in downtown Laredo, since he had taken over Joe Brand's (his father-in-law) store and was now the CEO. He then rekindled his interest in bridge and although not having much free time (he had 3 girls and a boy and a very close family) started to go to Naclose family) started to go to Na
tionals and play, sometime with me, but also with others.

His record was somewhat unique, winning two World Championships, the World Team Olympiad in 1988 (Venice Italy) and 1994 (Rosenblum) the only person ever to win those both of those 2 events. I win those both of those 2 events. I
was on his WTO team which to this day is the only time the USA has ever won that event. He also finished 2nd with me in 1992 losing in the finals to France. Some of the bridge we played as partner's was nothing short of a hoot and I could keep you laughing by recalling a number of the hands.

He was always a winner in whatever
he did, and was a generous and wonderful friend to a number of people. Laredo idolized him (I went to a number of parties given in his honor in Laredo) and he got to know Omar Sharif through my association with Omar and he visited Seymon and won the whole town over. Seymon also had a beautiful house in Aspen and when I was President of the WBF he arranged for me to have a management meeting at the Little Nell hotel (gorgeous place) in downtown Aspen.

His life was somewhat a storybook one, but well deserved by him who every day was visited by both the police chief and mayor in Laredo who would come by for coffee and discuss local corruption. Seymon's father had a beautiful jewelry and perfume store in Nuevo Laredo which eventually after his father's death, Seymon's brother Russell took over and made much money before retiring some number of years ago when the Mexican Drug Cartels became dangerous. His wife Linda was beautiful, but didn't play bridge, and once the queen of the fiesta done annually in Laredo

To quote and apologize to Shakespeare, "This was the noblest Texan of them all, he only in a general honest thought and common good to all was one of them (conspirators to the death of Julius Caesar). His life was gentle and the elements so mixed in him that nature could stand up and say to all the world, This was a Man!".

He had a ranch to which he devoted much time and was a wonderful father and grandfather. His favorite event was the Cavendish in which he played many times, much with me, but then later with the younger up and coming players like Kranyak whose team just won the Open Trials.

Tuesdays will never be the same for me. My Tuesday partner is gone. Bill Scarpero, 93 years old (though only 16 at heart!) passed away on June 5 , missing only a couple of weeks at the table. Bill died with just a few points shy of being a Gold Life Master. Ok, so he couldn't see, couldn't hear and didn't get around very well, but the guy could still play bridge! A more generous-spirited partner cannot be found! The man exuded graciousness at the table and had the distinct honor of being the only person I know about whom not one negative remark was made (not counting those who were impatient with his increasingly slow play). Bill will be missed by his many friends in the community, all of whom are secretly sure that each was his best partner, a belief which Bill convincingly allowed us to harbor. Well, I know I wasn't his best partner; sometimes we did very well, but as often as not we had very mediocre games. We always had fun, though. One of the many life lessons I learned from Bill is that you are never too old to be mischievous and have fun! After his RHO opened 2C, Bill bid 3D (non vul against vul), 3S by LHO then 5D by me, 5 S by Opener. When the dummy came down, I saw the Ace and King of diamonds and I was looking at the Queen in my hand! I looked at Bill, who giggled and shrugged. We set the contract, Bill's aggressive insertion having confused the issue for our opponents. Bill simply delighted in the fun of the game! Ask any of his partners: though Bill was very competitive, he was always kind and encouraging at the table to his partners and ready to admit his own "goofs." On the day he died, I told him that I consider him the "King of No Trump." There was
nothing he enjoyed more than making a difficult 3NT contract. He taught me not to run my long suit in dummy, cannibalizing my own hand, before I had made a careful analysis of what I could afford to pitch. I told him that at the Bill Scarpero Memorial Game (June 24, Fiesta Bridge Club), we would give a prize for the player who was most successful 3NT declarer. But who can win the prize for being a gentleman who enriched all who knew him and who were lucky enough to call him friend? Bill wrote his autobiography, a scant 100 pages, barely a page for every year pages, barely a page for every year
he lived. By my reckoning, Bill made he lived. By my reckoning, Bill made life and at the table. No matter what I can say about him, I know I will leave important things unsaid. Such is the nature of our friendship, which will continue to nourish me in the days to come. Death ends a life, not the relationship. We should all be as lucky as Bill, ending his life surrounded by his beloved families, both biological and bridge, talking about bridge hands until the last day!

In the meantime, the new Fiesta Bridge Club opened its doors in time to host its first sectional (April 25-28) to a near record crowd. Everyone had fun and was patient as the ryone had fun and was patient as the
"kinks" were worked out for the new space. Top masterpoint winners were: Ed Rawlinson (25.95) and Gary Anziani (24.67) with 245 tables in play. Tom Marsh directed the whole shebang by himself and brilliantly, I might add! Laurie brilliantly, I might add! Laurie
Levin provided great hospitality and Levin provided great hospitality and
welcome to all the lucky players in attendance.

The Unit hosted its Awards Day at the Fiesta Bridge Club on May 18. With 21 tables in play, Judy Lewis and Kim Carpenter took first with a $65 \%$ game, followed by Robert Martin and Betty Jo Bettersworth. On June 1, BCSA hosted the 1-35 Cup finals, the annual competition which pits San Antonio players against Austin contenders. San Antonio won Flights B, C, 299er
and lost in a tie-breaker in A, but brought home both trophies. Congratulations to our teams!

Mitch says "their help en-
abled me to attend my first Junior World Championship in 2010 which snowballed into even more opportunities." Major tournament wins include Junior World Championships: 2010: Taiwan; 2011: Croatia; and 2012: Shanghai. His words for aspiring players: "If you ever have the opportunity to play with a player that is better than you, do it! Play against the tougher competition.......when you do play, try to learn something, regardless of the competition. Look at the hand records and discuss ways to avoid problems you may have made."

Mitch is exactly what the world of bridge needs as an ambassador for our game. It is great having him in Austin and we wish him every positive opportunity and success in his bridge pursuits and at the University of Texas.
