Going into the last couple of days we knew we were going to qualify barring a total collapse but we wanted to finish as high as possible.

The French, a very strong team, were in top form and along with USA1 and Poland looked like certain qualifiers. The final 2 matches were very good The final 2 matches were very good
for us but disastrous for the other US for us but disastrous for the other US
team as they were nearly blitzed in both and missed qualifying by less than 1 victory point. The French team chose to play in the other bracket from us - so we couldn't play until the finals. We chose to play Ireland in the first match, a good but inexperienced group, and luckily we had a very good match and they conceded after 80 of the scheduled 96 boards
Our semi-final match pitted us against the defending champion Polish team who had beaten us in a very close match in the semi-finals of the previous Bermuda Bowl in Sao Paulo Brazil 4 years ago. Our team was once again in great form and also had the better of the luck and won easily, while France was being beaten by Germany.
Our match against Germany was as close a match throughout as I ever remember being involved in. One of their pairs made some of the most memorable bids and leads I have ever seen and we lost a heartbreaker. Let's see how many of you can win the match for the USA. Here are 4 hands

that yours truly did well on some and very poorly on others. Everyone i Vul, your partner passes and right hand opponent opens 1 diamond. Do you overcall 1 Heart on - Qxx, Q9xxx, Jx, AJx? As much as I like to bid I passed due to my bad suit, my willingness for partner to lead other willingness for partner to lead other
suits and my partner's original pass. We passed throughout as the auction proceeded -1D, 1H, 2C, 2S, 3C, 3D, $4 \mathrm{C}, 4 \mathrm{~S}, 6 \mathrm{D}$. Now what to lead? I de cided that the 4 S cue bid got him to bid the slam so I chose to lead a heart. This was the layout: Dummy

AJ, AJ10x, Kxxx, xxx, Declarer Kxx, void, AQxxx, KQxxx. A spade lead would have allowed declarer to make the contract by finessing and pitching a club on the long spade after pulling trump and then ruffing out the clubs. As it was, declarer drew trumps and led a club to his king which I ducked, then went back dummy to lead another club and went down.

I wish my defense had been as good on this next one - it would have won the gold medal. I had xxx, 6432 AKxx, $\mathbf{x x}$ - not much of a hand but one I now have nightmares about. My partner, Eddie Wold, opened 1 diamond and as we wer playing precision it could have bee as few as 2 diamonds. The auction proceeded pass on my right, 1 Heart by me, 1 Spade overcall, 2 Hearts by partner, 3NT on my right. I passed and my left hand opponent thought for a very long time and finally passed. It's my lead. I knew my righ hand opponent had good diamond since he passed over 1D and then jumped to 3 NT . I was afraid that he might take 6 Spades and 3 hearts with a heart lead and we might have 2 diamonds and some number of club tricks coming so I started with a high diamond - a disaster, as this was the layout - Dummy A109xxx, xx, J,

the partner. At best, this slows the game and creates uncomfortable situations for all at the table; at worst, it's flat-out cheating.

I have hesitated to write about this month's subject for this publication; however, at almost every tournament I have attended this year, I have heard similar complaints and I feel the need to bring these complaints to everyone's attention. Only by working together can we improve this game.
GAMESMANSHIP IN BRIDGE
When we first implemented ZERO Tolerance, we didn't really grasp what it meant. After several players got barred or put on probation, we began to understand it quite well. For several years, it resulted in bridge players becoming more congenial at the tables. Unfortunately, habits die hard and the time has come to revisit what ZERO Tolerance means.

Fundamentally, ZERO Tolerance means being polite, having consideration for others, and bidding and playing in tempo. Bridge is a timed event; perhaps not as speedy as the 100m dash, but timed nonetheless. Like a quarterback, we must be aware of the game clock. And like our fellow card turning poker players, we should show no emotion during the bidding and play.

Bridge is a mental game and many of us need a moment to think. Where the complaints from opponents arise is when a player shifts around, sighs several times, generally "hems and haws" and "huffs and puffs" before throwing up their and puffs" before throwing up their
hands in defeat and finally making a hands in defeat and finally making a
bid or passing. These actions, whether intentional or unintentional,

## Charity Money Available

ACBL District 16 has been issued grants totaling $\$ 30,000.00$ from the ACBL Charity Foundation for 2014. This sum can be divided into no more than five separate grants, each of which must be made to a qualified 501(c)3 organization. Requests for grant allocations must be made by December 31, 2013 in order to be presented at the 2014 Spring Nationals in Dallas.

The good news is this is easily correctable behavior. Partners should fill out an exact card with each other. They should answer all questions about each others bids and leads and discards in detail. If partners know something their opponents don't know; they should explain in detail. Remember "no secrets." For example, the answer to "What are your leads?" isn't "I don't know." Players have an obligation to know that answer.

Players must be careful about a s...1...o...o...o...w pass. It gives away too much information and could very likely bar one's partner from the bidding. Opponents should call a director after a slow pass, and the slow passer should understand graciously. It's not personal. It takes out insurance in case the partner makes a questionable call.

We owe it to everyone at the table and each other in this game to not intimidate opponents, not fast play or slow play and to play in tempo. Players who do otherwise risk harming the game.

Those of us who've played for a while must be kind and patient to beginners, those players with $0-50$ points. They too must play by the rules, but it takes time to fully understand and remember all the rules of bridge.

I've never heard of John McEnroe playing bridge, but I've certainly seen a few of his impersonators. Bridge is competitive. Sometimes that friendly competition can turn emotional, leading us to speak and act inappropriately. (In case those of you who know me personally are wondering - yes, I'm looking in the mirror right now.) While this shouldn't happen, if it does, a sincere apology to the opponents usually does the trick. It is the right thing to do.

We all spend much time and money going to tournaments and playing locally as well. At minimum, we should accept nothing less than a civil game every time we play. Let's all dedicate ourselves to bringing the game up to the highest standards possible

says, "I like this suit" is an 8 . It should scream at you if partner plays it, whether following suit or discarding. If you get in the lead and fail to lead the suit of which your partner has discarded an 8, woe be unto your partnership. Other encouraging cards are 6,7 , and 9 , and all in that sequence have been called "come-on" cards by some of us old bridge players. So when we say "high" in terms of standard, it's 69. You should pay attention to other cards you know about, in dummy and your hand, as well as cards you've seen fall, to determine if a 5 or 6 played by partner is meant to discourage or encourage. It may be the highest one partner has in the suit or the only "high" card partner wants to part with, such as when others in the suit are only the J and K . One practice by good partnerships is to know when partners signal what they like by telling you what they don't like, or playing a low card-2, 3, 4, or 5. How can you figure it out if you haven't paid attention to every other card you know about?

So, if your partner discards a $2-5$, it says "Partner, find some other suit to lead if you want to hit me." And then you find the killing switch.

we cannot "talk across the table" or give any hints by our actions (don't slam that card down!) or tone of voice (no heavy sighs), we can certainly communicate with our partners by the card we play-making all 52 cards very important. Entire books have been written on this subject, and we are limited here. But I have noticed players who do not know what constitutes "standard," even though they say that's what they play. So I thought a little review might be in order, because as many experts have told us: "Defense is where the points are!"

We commonly talk about "high, I like it; low, I don't like it." But it's really a bit more precise. The ideal card that

K98x. Declarer had K, AKJ, Q1098xx, J10x. He now had plenty of time to take 9 tricks. Had I led a heart we would have prevailed with perfect defense.
Here's another good hand. Our opponents had this amazing auction (we're passing) 2NT, 3C, 4S! I was on lead once again and held xxx, Kx, Jxx, Axxxx. I had no idea what was going on but didn't like our side's chances on defense with this awful trump holding so I elected to lead the ace of clubs. Dummy was Jxxxx, Jxxx, x, QJx. I now shifted to the king of Hearts which held, a heart to partner's ace and got a ruff for 12 needed partner's ace and got a ruff for 12 needed
imps. Declarer was AKQx, Qxx, AKx, Kxx another amazing bid.
My last hand did not have such a happy ending. I held AK, AQxxx, AJ10xx, x. Partner opened 1S and the auction proceeded (opponents passing) 1S, and the auction proceeded (opponents passing) IS,
$2 \mathrm{H}, 2 \mathrm{~S}$ (promising 6 to me). I was afraid if I bid 3D and partner bid the expected 3NT I would be stuck having never supported spades and I was
way too good to bid only 4 spades so I chose to splinter with 4 clubs. Partner now had to decide whether or not to cooperate with Qxxxxx, x, Kxxx, Ax. He had opened a 9 point hand but he did have controls and a pure holding in clubs. I can't blame him for bidding 4 spades and I didn't think slam would be great. 6 spades wasn't all that good as it requires 3-2 spades and guessing diamonds after a club lead. We would have gotten to 6 diamonds had I bid 2NT forcing over his 2S, a bid I wish I had thought of. Spades broke 3-2 and the diamond Queen was singleton. It turned out we needed to bid 6 Spades and make 7 to win by 1 imp!
How many of you would be world champions by finding the best defense or bidding to 6 spades? I hope not too many, so I won't be out of a job. My thanks to Donna Compton for being a fantastic captain, to my 3 partners during the competition, Carolyn Lynch, Eddie Wold and Marc Jacobus and to our other pair Roger Bates and Garey Hayden who all played great. After the semi-finals last championship and our Silver Medal in the d'Orsi I look forward to winning the Gold for the US at the next World Championship.
