We had one first, one second, and three third-place fin-ishes-not bad, but not stellar either.
What would you say if I told you that your opponents in the finals of a national KO raced out to a 32-0 lead and went on a 24-0 tear at the beginning of the last quarter? "Where's the bar?" Fortunately, that was not how Dallas resident Bart Bramley responded; he and his squad roared back to triumph in the Senior KO Teams, 156-91 When I asked Bart for a hand, he gave me the one that clinched the win. Bart held QJxx Ax Ax ATxxx and heard the bidding go 1C (17+ points) by

on; he reasoned that partner did not have any wasted values in hearts, and he gave extra weight to the spade jack, noting that "the jack of trumps is essential to bidding a grand slam." Partner's hand: AKTx xx KQxx KQx. FYI, the opponents only got to 6 S. Well done, Bart! Unfortunately, the win came at the expense of Mike Passell of Plano, who was on the losing team. It's too bad both players could not have won, but ties are not "in the cards" in a KO!

Our district's three thirds were captured by just two players. Hemant Lall of Dallas was third in the Senior Mixed Pairs, while Austinite Lynn Baker was third in both the Life Master Women's Pairs and the Women's Board-a-Match Teams. Lynn played in only two NABC events and had two thirds--how's that for consistency? The Women's BAM was a veritable "gold mine" for District 16 women: Mildred Breed of Austin and Shawn Quinn of Sugar Land tied for fourth/ fifth; Dallas denizens Peggy Sutherlin, Petra Hamman and Joan Jackson were sixth, along with Nancy Passell of Plano; Tobi Sokolow of Austin finished seventh; and Ellen Hessel and

Donna Swarthout of San Antoni ended up ninth.

Several other District 16'ers had top 10 finishes in NABC events. Hemant Lall and Bob Hamman, Dallas, were $5 / 8$ in the Senior KO, albeit on different teams. Bob finished sixth in the North American Swiss Teams; Eddie North American Swiss Teams; Eddie
Wold, Houston, was seventh Mold, Houston, was seventh. In the Mini-Blue Ribbon Pairs, Dan Suty,
Houston, wound up sixth. Last, but Houston, wound up sixth. Last, but not least, a special shout-out to Babu Koneru, San Antonio, for finishing fourth in the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, arguably the toughest team event on the ACBL calendar. Nice job, one and all.
The spring NABC will be held in Dallas March 20-30, 2014, at the Sheraton Dallas Hotel. This is a great opportunity for novice and intermediate players to experience the excitement of a North American Bridge Championship without venturing too far from home. If you think playing at the club is fun, wait until you see what's it's like to roam the halls with thousands (yes, roam the halls with thousands (yes,
thousands) of bridge players. You had thousands) of bridge players. You had
better show up-I will NOT take no for an answer!

Finally, Tobi and I wish each and every one of you a happy, healthy and fulfilling new year in 2014. We look forward to seeing you in the coming year, at the table or away from it.

Happy New Year from Abilene, Texas!
I write to you one last time as District 16 President. My term of office ends at the Houston Regional, but I will still work to promote duplicate bridge as I always have. It has been an interesting year and I feel honored to have served as President of our busy District 16.

simple in the rules but deliciously complex in doing well."
Dwight Eisenhower - WWII General and $34^{m}$ President of the United States was an excellent bridge player.
Martina Navratilova - Tennis legend and winner of 59 Grand Slam titles has said, "No matter where I go, I can always make new friends at the bridge table."

Along the way the team had to defeat a couple of prominent members of District 16. In the quarterfinal our team had a very exciting match against Bob Hamman's team We were ahead by 39 going to the fourth quarter, but midway through the quarter we were behind by 20 ! Our notrump range is 14-16, so Lew opened with a strong club. The 3 H preempt forced us to start our investigation at a high level. My double showed 8+ HCP without a good long suit, and unwilling or unable to bid notrump, with considerable extras notrump; with considerable extras I was unwilling. Lew's 4H cuebid howed no long suit and the inability to bid notrump. I tossed the ball back with my 5 H cuebid, hoping that he could show spades. I could already place him with nearly all of the non heart high cards, because he hadn' bid notrump and he needed 16 HCP or his opening. Thus, when he ad mitted to having spades, I bid a confident grand slam, expecting him to have exactly the high cards that he in act held. And we had to play in pades; trumps were 3-2, but clubs were 4-1 offside, so Lew had to ruff hem out.

At the other table our Polish counter parts never got close after they started with 1 NT. We gained 11 imps and coasted to the finish.

The players turned up in large numbers, 12565 tables about 1000 more than anticipated.

70\% Games
This is such a special attainment. Some of us who feel good in the high 50 s or anywhere in the 60 s are really envious of those with $70 \%$ or more. It doesn't happen often. I see many scores in the high 60s that are fantas tic. But to edge up over that magical number of 70 is really special. So we

Wow! Something to shoot for, for sure.

## Fundamental Tip

Let's talk a bit about ace-asking, and this is directed to the newer players. Early on you learn Blackwood, to find out how many Aces and Kings your partner holds, when you think you might have a slam. There have been refinements and other conventions, but nowadays it's becoming standard to use Roman Keycard Blackwood. I see many new players not using it and hope they will lose their fear of it. So I'm going to try to goad you into it. If you can learn the artificial bidding of Blackwood, you can learn Keycard. So let's just review it a bit and see if you and your partner will decide to learn it in time for that Lone Star Regional.

With Keycard responses to the Aceasking (now sometimes called control -asking) 4NT, there is one card besides the 4 Aces to find out about, and that is the King of trumps. So there are 5 keycards: 4 Aces and the trump King. So you must have figured out that you need to know what the trump suit is, right? Well, almost.

We'll start there, though, with "3014." With this one, your first response to 4 NT (5C) means that you have Three or Zero Keycards. Your 5D response means that you have One or Four keycards. So that's how we get the " 3014 " moniker. So if you have no Aces but you have the King of your agreed trump suit, your an-
wer is not 5 Clubs; it is 5 Diamonds, because you have one keycard. If you have two Aces and the K of trumps, your response is 5 C , for three keycards, which is the same response if you have none. (Your partner should be able to figure out which it is. And your partner should have two keycards to ask!)

With Keycard, we also get to find out about the important Queen of trumps. The response to 4 NT if you have two keycards but do not have the Q of trumps is 5 H , and if you have two keycards WITH the Q of trumps, you bid 5S. Most new players start with 3014 , but 1430 is a variation that just reverses the meaning of the first two responses, 5C and 5D. The responses for two keycards remains the same.

So when you and partner have agreed on a trump suit, let 4NT be your keyard asking convention. Then 5NT asks for Kings, and when starting out, you can simply respond with number of Kings. Note: If you have NOT agreed on a trump suit but you are playing Roman Keycard, then the responses are in the last suit bid. Sometimes this is critical to know what partner holds in that suit. Ready? Get set, GO!
