Bart Bramley Wins Senior KO Mike Passell Second

In "A Tale of Two Cities," Charles Dickens described the French Revolution as being both the best of times and the worst of times. Well, I'm no Charles Dickens (feel free to disagree!), but I can safely say that the fall NABC in Phoenix fell somewhere in the middle as far as District 16 players were concerned. We had one first, one second, and three third-place finishes—not bad, but not stellar either.

What would you say if I told you that your opponents in the finals of a national KO raced out to a 32-0 lead and went on a 24-0 tear at the beginning of the last quarter? "Where's the bar?" Fortunately, that was not how Dallas resident Bart Bramley responded; he and his squad roared back to triumph in the Senior KO Teams, 156-91. When I asked Bart for a hand, he gave me the one that clinched the win. Bart held QJxx Ax Ax ATxxx and heard the bidding go 1C (17+ points) by partner, 3H by RHO. Bart made a negative double. The bidding proceeded: 4H by partner, 5H by Bart, 5S by partner, 7S by Bart-- cold without a finesse. Bart's evaluation was spoton; he reasoned that partner did not have any wasted values in hearts, and he gave extra weight to the spade jack, noting that "the jack of trumps is essential to bidding a grand slam." Partner's hand: AKTx xx KQxx KQx. FYI, the opponents only got to 6S. Well done, Bart! Unfortunately, the win came at the expense of Mike Passell of Plano, who was on the losing team. It's too bad both players could not have won, but ties are not "in the cards" in a KO!

Our district's three thirds were captured by just two players. Hemant Lall of Dallas was third in the Senior Mixed Pairs, while Austinite Lynn Baker was third in both the Life Master Women's Pairs and the Women's Board-a-Match Teams. Lynn played in only two NABC events and had two thirds--how's that for consistency? The Women's BAM was a veritable "gold mine" for District 16 women: Mildred Breed of Austin and Shawn Quinn of Sugar Land tied for fourth/ fifth; Dallas denizens Peggy Sutherlin, Petra Hamman and Joan Jackson were sixth, along with Nancy Passell of Plano; Tobi Sokolow of Austin finished seventh; and Ellen Hessel and

NEW LIFE MASTERS

The GNT District Finals Will Be In Two Places This Year

The GNT District finals are in two places this year

In an attempt to get more participation in the district GNT finals, we are having them in two separate sectionals this year. The flight 'C' finals (0 - 500, non-life master)and the flight 'A' finals (0 - 6000* a new top limit this year) are going to be held at the Houston election sectional April 4 - 6 at the Marriott Westchase. They will start Friday night at 7 PM. They will carry through as many sessions as needed to crown a winner in each flight.

The flight 'B' (0 - 2500* new top limit this year) and the Super flight (0 - unlimited) finals will be held in Richardson at the civic center May 24 - 25 at the Richardson sectional. They will begin Saturday afternoon at 1:30 and continue until we have a winner in each flight.

The national finals will be held in Las

Vegas this year, July 16 - 20 at the Las Vegas Nationals. The winners from each flight in the district finals will be awarded \$1500 to offset expenses as well as being reimbursed for their entry fees at the national GNT finals.

You may play in a higher flight final without risking your eligibility in your normal flight final. What that means is that if you are a flight 'B' team, you may play in the flight 'A' district finals without risking your chance at the flight 'B' finals. That way you get in some practice, with a chance to win flight 'A' -- or if you are a flight 'C' team and you do not win in Houston, you may take a second bite of the apple at Richardson in the flight 'B' finals.

Get your teams together, get everybody qualified (flight C and B) at some unit qualifying and lets try and win the District finals. We would like to see a lot of participation. It is a fun event and you only have to play against your peers.

TOURNAMENT DIVISION. Regional and Sectional table counts have shown small declines as compared to last year. Through the end of October, total Regional table count decreased by 6% with three fewer Regionals held this year. Average table count declined by 3%

SMOKING POLICY AT NABC. Smoking is not permitted in the playing area during any bridge event at an NABC. This includes electronic smoking devices.

BAZE SENIOR KO, 2013

The Baze Senior KO in Phoenix was won by the Gupta team: Vinita Gupta -Billy Miller, Bart Bramley-Lew Stansby, and Jeff Meckstroth-Eric Rodwell. Along the way the team had to defeat a couple of prominent members of District 16. In the quarterfinal our team had a very exciting match against Bob Hamman's team. We were ahead by 39 going to the fourth quarter, but midway through the quarter we were behind by 20! Then we rallied, and with three boards to play the match was tied when this deal arrived:

We play Precision. Lew's 4C showed specifically a void in hearts. Despite my wastage I could envision a good slam opposite a lot of minimum openers. I probed with 4D, and Lew showed enthusiasm with 4H, so I asked for keycards. When he had all of the missing aces I briefly toyed with trying for seven, but that seemed unlikely when he was limited to 15 HCP, so I settled for the small slam. This looks like an easy slam to reach in any system, but the British player with my cards gave up after finding

Our notrump range is 14-16, so Lew opened with a strong club. The 3H preempt forced us to start our investigation at a high level. My double showed 8+ HCP without a good long suit, and unwilling or unable to bid notrump; with considerable extras was unwilling. Lew's 4H cuebid showed no long suit and the inability to bid notrump. I tossed the ball back with my 5H cuebid, hoping that he could show spades. I could already place him with nearly all of the nonheart high cards, because he hadn't bid notrump and he needed 16 HCP for his opening. Thus, when he admitted to having spades, I bid a confident grand slam, expecting him to have exactly the high cards that he in fact held. And we had to play in spades; trumps were 3-2, but clubs were 4-1 offside, so Lew had to ruff

At the other table our Polish counterparts never got close after they started with 1NT. We gained 11 imps and coasted to the finish.




I have recently retired from the practice of Pediatric Medicine.

Absentee Voting Procedure

Any member may vote by Absentee Ballot. To vote absentee, a member must contact the Election Judges by U.S. mail, e-mail, or telephone requesting an Official Ballot. If the Voter is a member in good standing an Official Ballot will be sent to the Voter at the voter's address of record, in a small unsealed envelope. Upon receiving the Official Ballot, the Voter should complete the ballot, seal it inside the small envelope provided, and place the small sealed envelope inside another envelope addressed to the Election Judges. The back flap of the outside envelope must be signed by the Voter. If no signature is provided, the ballot will not be counted. The Absentee Ballot must be postmarked no later than March 21, and must be received by the Election Judges no later than April 2 in order to be counted. This is such a special attainment. Some of us who feel good in the high 50s or anywhere in the 60s are really envious of those with 70% or more. It doesn't happen often. I see many scores in the high 60s that are fantastic. But to edge up over that magical number of 70 is really special. So we

Susan Skiles and Geri McKallip had a huge 75.69% game at Houston Bridge Studio 10/18; Max Levit and Ariel **Leibovitz** posted 70.33% at Houston Bridge Studio 10/19; Anna Marlatt and Terry Currie had a whopping 76.69% at Houston Bridge Studio 10/31; Sally Wheeler and Buddy Hanby had another of their super games with 75.69% at Bridge Club of Houston 11/7; Judith Hoffing and Dan Schomer had a 72.66% game 11/15 at Spring Branch Duplicate Club; Dan Morse and Gary Crystal had a 71.99% at Houston Bridge Studio 11/21; Susan McHan and Julie Brand had a 73.20% at Houston Bridge Studio 11/23. Wow! Something to shoot for, for sure.

Fundamental Tip

Let's talk a bit about **ace-asking**, and this is directed to the newer players. Early on you learn Blackwood, to find out how many Aces and Kings your partner holds, when you think you might have a slam. There have been refinements and other conventions, but nowadays it's becoming standard to use Roman Keycard Blackwood. I see many new players not using it and hope they will lose their fear of it. So I'm going to try to goad you into it. If you can learn the artificial bidding of Blackwood, you can learn Keycard. So let's just review it a bit and see if you and your partner will decide to learn it in time for that Lone Star Regional.

With Keycard responses to the Aceasking (now sometimes called control -asking) 4NT, there is one card besides the 4 Aces to find out about, and that is the King of trumps. So there are **5 keycards**: 4 Aces and the trump King. So you must have figured out that you need to know what the trump suit is, right? Well, almost.

We'll start there, though, with "3014." With this one, your first response to 4NT (5C) means that you have Three or Zero Keycards. Your 5D response means that you have One or Four keycards. So that's how we get the "3014" moniker. So if you have no Aces but you have the King of your agreed trump suit, your an-

swer is not 5 Clubs; it is 5 Diamonds, because you have one keycard. If you have two Aces and the K of trumps, your response is 5C, for three keycards, which is the same response if you have none. (Your partner should be able to figure out which it is. And your partner should have two keycards to ask!)

With Keycard, we also get to find out about the important Queen of trumps. The response to 4NT if you have two keycards but do not have the Q of trumps is 5H, and if you have two keycards WITH the Q of trumps, you bid 5S. Most new players start with 3014, but 1430 is a variation that just reverses the meaning of the first two responses, 5C and 5D. The responses for two keycards remains the same.

So when you and partner have agreed on a trump suit, let 4NT be your keycard asking convention. Then 5NT asks for Kings, and when starting out, you can simply respond with number of Kings. *Note:* If you have NOT agreed on a trump suit but you are playing Roman Keycard, then the responses are in the *last suit bid.* Sometimes this is critical to know what partner holds in that suit. Ready? Get set, GO!
