Ten Pairs Qualify for NAP Finals in Dallas

This past January, 116 pairs competed in San Antonio for the honor of representing D16 in the National NAP finals in Dallas during the Spring Nationals in March. There were 38 pairs in A, 46 pairs in B, and 32 pairs in C. The total has been relatively steady for the last decade, but A has increased from 26 to around 40 pairs.

The event is a 4-part sequence that begins at qualifying club games, proceeds to a 2-session Unit final. Players then advance to the District final, where all flights played 4 sessions, 2 qualifying and 2 finals. After the final results were tallied, the qualifiers were:





Courtney Coffman and David Morris were finished 3^{rd} last year. Eric Goff – and Neil Cohen were 3^{rd} in 2011 as well. Greg Hinze was 4^{th} in 2011 and second last year with different partners. Kimmel and Hugh have done very well in past years

First place winners in A, 1^{a} & 2nd in B and 1^{a} in C all receive a total of \$800 per player (\$700 from ACBL and \$100 from District 16). Second in A, 3^{ai} in B and 2^{ai} in C receive a total of \$500 per player (\$300 from ACBL and \$200 from District 16). Third in A, 4^{ai} in B and 3^{ai} in C get \$300. In addition to the stipend, there are no session fees for the National Finals.



The GNT District Finals Will Be In Two Places This Year

The GNT District finals are in two places this year

In an attempt to get more participation in the district GNT finals, we are having them in two separate sectionals this year. The flight 'C' finals (0 - 500, non-life master)and the flight 'A' finals (0 - 6000* a new top limit this year) are going to be held at the Houston election sectional April 4 - 6 at the Marriott Westchase. They will start Friday night at 7 PM. They will carry through as many sessions as needed to crown a winner in each flight.

The flight 'B' (0 - 2500* new top limit this year) and the Super flight (0 unlimited) finals will be held in Richardson at the civic center May 24 - 25 at the Richardson sectional. They will begin Saturday afternoon at 1:30 and continue until we have a winner in each flight.

The national finals will be held in Las

Vegas this year, July 16 - 20 at the Las Vegas Nationals. The winners from each flight in the district finals will be awarded \$1500 to offset expenses as well as being reimbursed for their entry fees at the national GNT finals.

You may play in a higher flight final without risking your eligibility in your normal flight final. What that means is that if you are a flight 'B' team, you may play in the flight 'A' district finals without risking your chance at the flight 'B' finals. That way you get in some practice, with a chance to win flight 'A' -- or if you are a flight 'C' team and you do not win in Houston, you may take a second bite of the apple at Richardson in the flight 'B' finals.

Get your teams together, get every-body qualified (flight C and B) at some unit qualifying and lets try and win the District finals. We would like to see a lot of participation. It is a fun event and you only have to play against your peers.



They didn't know, but they were probably in third place going into the last round. Greg was declarer in a 5C contract. Dummy came down: AKxxxx, x,xxx, Kxx. Greg held: x, Axxx,xx, AQ10xxx.

The bidding proceeded (RHO) 1D, Greg 2C, (LHO) pass, Nagy 3S (forcing and natural), pass,Greg 4C, pass, Nagy 5C, all pass. In succession, the A,K, and Q of diamonds were led, the Q ruffed by Greg with the Q of trumps. Next Greg played the AK and another spade. Rightie trumped, but Greg overruffed. Ace and club to the dummy to establish the spades. Next the A of hearts, ruff a heart in dummy to access the spades. They were the only pair in 5C making. Greg notes that timing is everything. It was essential for him to ruff with the Queen the first time since leftie had Jack plus one of clubs! Bottom line: It's never over until it's over! Of course it helps to be as talented as Greg and Nagy!

On February 8, teams in flights B and C competed for the right to go to Richardson in May for district finals of the Grand National Teams. Six B teams and seven C teams came out for a day of good bridge and great hospitality provided by Kathy Sinkin-Amor, Debbie Schweiss and Stephen Hoffman. Three B teams qualified, topped by the Levin, Levin, Hernandez, Villastrigo team. Six C teams qualified, topped by the team of Schweiss, Miller, Collier and Baron. Congrats to all! Spotlight on World Champions: We are fortunate to have FIVE World Champions in the Houston Area: Dan Morse, Eddie Wold, Shawn Quinn, Robin Klar, and Mildred Breed, who is currently of moving here. I thought our readers might enjoy some of their comments about this highest level of competition.

Robin Klar said it was dreamlike, and she sometimes felt like a spectator, but the best part was meeting and playing with Joan Jackson. Klar had only returned to bridge in 1997 and was in Reno, playing in the Vander-

"It was very stressful for me," she says, "partly because it was my first Championship and partly because of the location. Police with rifles slung over their shoulders on every block of our drive from the airport to the hotel was a sight I wasn't accustomed to." Once

they got into the compound, she says she settled into more familiar surroundings, but "the bridge seemed to go on forever. I fell into bed exhausted every night. However, I must admit, when we won the Gold, I was full of energy."

From Eddie Wold: "My first world championship was in New Orleans, so it felt just like a really big nationals. I was playing with Hamman and Wolff, two of my lifetime idols, and I felt very confident that we were going to win. We did extremely well, finishing third. I then went to world championships in Stockholm and lost in semis to my same idols, Wolff and Hamman. I was playing with some new kids on the block named Meckstroth and Rodwell. Our whole team got very sick. It might have been the stress or just some bug, since we were all staying together in a house in the city. When I finally won my first world championship in Paris, (moved from Bali after 9/11), I was extremely happy to have accomplished one of my life goals. We returned to Bali last year and after 13 very intense and

grueling days, we finally came up a hair short for me to win my second silver medal. World championships are much more intense and stressful than nationals, which are already extremely stressful, because you are often in a foreign country, in a different time zone, and dealing with the food and conditions can often make matters much worse than normal."

And Dan Morse, our great goodwill ambassador, reminds us that we have three national tournaments every year, when some countries don't have any! Players come from around the world to our tournaments, and he urges all our players to get involved at the *national* level. He has enjoyed getting to know different cultures through World competition, and adds, "Bridge is like a world language, and playing bridge anywhere is just great!" What a great summation.

Finally, this is a reminder not to forget about the GNT. As in the past, the GNT will have four flights, Champion Flight, Flight A, Flight B and Flight C. The upper limits for Flight A and Flight B have been changed a little so that the limit for Flight A has been raised to 6000 masterpoints and the Flight B limit is now 2500 masterpoints. The Champion Flight continues to be unlimited and Flight C continues to be limited to non-Life Masters with fewer than 500 masterpoints. For the purposes of the GNT, we will use the number of masterpoints that the player had recorded in the September 2013 Bulletin. This year the district has split the District Finals between 2 sectionals. District Finals for Flights A and C will be held in Houston April 4 through 6; District Finals for the SuperFlight and Flight B will be held at the Memorial Day sectional here in Dallas. Because of this change in schedule, the Unit qualifying events for Flights B and C will have already been held by the time you receive this issue of the Scorecard. There are no Unit qualifying events for the Champion Flight and Flight A teams. Captains of teams wanting to compete in these flights should contact Jim Thurtell to reserve a spot at the District Qualifiers. This year's Summer Nationals, where the National Finals will be held, are in Las Vegas, a most popular venue for tournaments.







Yes, you'll likely lose badly - but if you pay attention to what you did poorly on a hand, and what the "shark" did well, you will improve. And feel free to ask for advice from the expert as well. Most will be happy to explain how you might have done better on a hand." She also added: "Never forget that bridge is a game. You are supposed to be enjoying yourself. Of course you want to win - we wouldn't play this game if we weren't competitive - but don't lose your perspective or your temper."
