## Ten Pairs Qualify for NAP Finals in Dallas

This past January, 116 pairs competed in San Antonio for the honor of representing D16 in the National NAP finals in Dallas during the Spring Nationals in March. There were 38 pairs in A, 46 pairs in B, and 32 pairs in C. The total has been relatively steady for the last decade, but A has increased from 26 to around 40 pairs.

The event is a 4-part sequence that begins at qualifying club games, proceeds to a 2 -session Unit final. Players then advance to the District final, where all flights played 4 sessions, 2 qualifying and 2 finals. After the final results were tallied
the qualifiers were:

Courtney Coffman and David Morris were finished $3^{\text {rd }}$ last year. Eric Goff and Neil Cohen were $3^{\text {rd }}$ in 2011 as well. Greg Hinze was $4^{\text {th }}$ in 2011 and second last year with different partners. Kimmel and Hugh have done very well in past years

First place winners in A, 1* \& 2nd in $B$ and $1^{*}$ in C all receive a total of $\$ 800$ per player ( $\$ 700$ from ACBL and $\$ 100$ from District 16). Second in A, $3^{\text {rd }}$ in B and $2^{\text {mid }}$ in C receive a total of $\$ 500$ per player ( $\$ 300$ from ACBL and $\$ 200$ from District 16). Third in $\mathrm{A}, 4^{\text {th }}$ in B and $3^{\text {rid }}$ in C get $\$ 300$. In addition to the stipend, there are no session fees for the National Finals.

The top flight draws a very strong filed and is easily stronger than any other pair event at regionals or sectionals. Many of the participants have

Spotlight on World Champions: W are fortunate to have FIVE World Ce fors in the Ho HiVE W Morse, Eddie Wold Shawn Quin Robin Klar, wd Mildred Breed, Robin Klar, and Mildred Breed thought our readers might enjoy some of their comments about this highest level of competition.

Robin Klar said it was dreamlike and she sometimes felt like a spectator, but the best part was meeting and playing with Joan Jackson. Klar had only returned to bridge in 1997 and was in Reno, playing in the Vander-
bilt against Bob Hamman and Bobby Wolff. The next week Petra Hamman called to ask Robin to play on her women's team and to come to Dallas to practice with Joan. "Joan I and learned a new system, worked hard, and practiced a lot, wanting to play our best for each other. That's why it worked for us," Klar says. Since they were both learning a new system, there were no preconceived ideas or previous understandings to get in the way, she adds. Klar summarizes: "There is nothing like representing your country; nothing compares to that experience. The life lesson that I learned from Joan about commitment and team work was the thrill."

Mildred Breed's first trip to the World Championships was in 1997, in Hammamet, Tunisia. "It was very stressful for me," she says, "partly because it was my first Championship and partly because of the location. Police with rifles slung over their shoulders on every block of our drive from the airport to the hotel was a sight I wasn't accustomed to." Once
they got into the compound, she says she settled into more familiar surroundings, but "the bridge seemed to go on forever. I fell into bed exhausted every night. However, I must admit, when we won the Gold, I was full of energy."
From Eddie Wold: "My first world championship was in New Orleans, so it felt just like a really big nationals. I was playing with Hamman and Wolff, two of my lifetime idols, and I felt very confident that we were going to win. We did extremely well, finishing third. I then went to world ishing third. I then went to world championships in Stockholm and lost in semis to my same idols, Wolff and Hamman. I was playing with some new kids on the block named Meckstroth and Rodwell. Our whole team got very sick. It might have been the stress or just some bug, since we were all staying together in a house in the city. When I finally won my first world championship in Paris, (moved from Bali after 9/11), I was extremely happy to have accomplished one of my life goals. We returned to Bali last year and after 13 very intense and
grueling days, we finally came up a hair short for me to win my second silver medal. World championships are much more intense and stressful than nationals, which are already extremely stressful, because you are often in a foreign country, in a different time zone, and dealing with the food and conditions can often make matters much worse than normal."

And Dan Morse, our great goodwill ambassador, reminds us that we have three national tournaments every year, when some countries don't have any! Players come from around the world to our tournam around the world to our tournaments, and he urges all our players to get involved the national leve. He has enjoyed getting to know different cultures through World competition, and adds Bridge is like a world language, and playing bridge anywhere is jus great!" What a great summation.
