If your opponent wants a lesson from you about how they should have bid or played the hand, they will ask you for it Don't volunteer lessons, and certainly volunteer lessons, and certainly don't make remarks about or laugh Regardless of how or Regardless of how good a playe you think you are now, I am sure
there are people around that can remember when you made bigger mistakes than your present opponents.
I've been as guilty as the next person. I remember specifically a comment at a Waco sectional during a KO match when I asked my left hand opponent "where were you during the auction" when she made a a terrible lead into my second suit after I had bid a slam. Even after told her she had been playing so very well up until she lost concentration and made that terrible lead I don't think she thought any better of the comment.

Also, as a player it is not your place to make a ruling at the table when something occurs. That is why we have directors. Let them earn their
money . . let them make the rulings money ... let them make the rulings
at the table. There are many nu at the table. There are many nu-
ances to the various laws as well a ances to the various laws as well as revisions that you may not be aware of. You may very well be losing out on a rectification you may have coming.

Bridge is a game that we all enjoy and we should strive to make sure that even the opponents we play against enjoy the experience. The best players in the world try to make it enjoyable for their opponents and so should we.

In addition, there are no entry fees for the National event once you have qualified.

To sweeten the pot, District 16 adds additional monies to each of the qualifying pairs. 1st gets and additional $\$ 100 /$ per person, 2nd gets \$200/per person, and 3rd now gets \$300/per person.

ACBL also awards the District with ACBL abs andes in play at the club level an
most trict additional qualifying spot, so support your clubs when they hold qualifying games. We have won this extra spot in flight B several times in recent years, but we need more $C$ tables in play in order to get the additional spot in C .

was out target. Texans supported the tournament well but I think a few people who could only go to one NABC decided to go to Vegas in the summer.

CONGRALUTATIONS TO PEGGY SUTHERLIN FOR BEING SELECTED FOR THE ACBL HALL OF FAME. She well be inducted in Las Vegas this summer, so plan to attend if possible.

At the end of February ACBL mem-
bership stands at 167,763 , an increase over last February but down slightly year to date. Full membership statistics can be found at Active membership statistics.pdf.

Through the first 2 months of the year, Regional, Sectional, and STaC table count is down slightly, probably because of bad weather and fewer tournaments than last year.
There was a soft launch of the newly redesigned ACBL website during the Dallas NABC: go to the ACBL web-
site, scroll down and click on an exclusive sneak preview to see the exciting new website

The ACBL Score+ program has fallen behind schedule and it is unclear when the final rollout will be. The Grass roots funds games for last year ending January 31, 2014 raised $\$ 158,849$. Our district will receive about $\$ 16,000$, which was the $3^{\text {rd }}$ most of the 25 Districts. This money goes to support our district's NAP and GNT events so we will have
more money for expenses of the winners of these events.
On a trial basis the ACBL is trying new 10 K events at the Nationals The turnout for the mini Vanderbilt was only a disappointing 20 teams. If attendance does not get better some of these events will be canceled. In Vegas this summer there will be a 10 K pairs and a 10 K mixed teams. I encourage players between 2500 and 10000 master points to come and play in these events.
Three new 10 K events are scheduled
for the 2015 fall NABC, pending approval of the ACBL Board at the Vegas meeting. A new Club marketing toolkit will be available for a mid-year roll out.
The Education Foundation is sponsoring 10 unit seminars, (Learn to play bridge in a Day) in 2014. One will be in Houston in September.
Reimbursement requests for the Cooperative advertising Program must now be submitted within 60 days of the ad running instead of 90 days.

School bridge teacher stipend requests must be submitted within four weeks of the last class date and the maximum number is now 8 per year.

Manuals have been produced that guide units and clubs to create their own Facebook page or modify their current Facebook page so that it falls in alignment with the ACBL's page.

Next fall special membership offers will be available to encourage membership as a holiday gift idea.

It was close, but he got in \& spent four years playing oboe in the concert band \& various forms of percussion in the marching band. He also won two Air Force postal chess championships, in the days before postal chess was largely destroyed by computers. He played in three Air Force chess championships, playing on the winning command team once but never making the Air Force team for the Armed Forces championship.

After the Air Force, he moved to North Dakota, got an Elementary Education degree \& taught for several years. During this time he finished $2^{\text {nd }}$ in the North Dakota state chess championship five times \& then gave up the game. This was done not out of frustration, but because job \& family seemed more important than the bottomless pit of chess! The "Class from Hell" convinced him to go back to college in Computer Science. Eventually he got his Ph.D. from Texas, just in time for the market for CS professors to collapse.

While bouncing around on the west coast trying to make a living as a programmer, he met Eleanor.
