Breihan Team Wins GNT Flight B; Lynn Baker Second in Women's KO; Ira Hessel, Joe Quinn, Steve Shirey Second in Senior Swiss; Tom Breed and Chris Compton Second in Roth Open Swiss


This summer's NABC in Las Vegas was relatively small compared to previous "Sin City" nationals, but there were still more than 16,000 tables in play over the course of 11 days. As usual, District 16 was wellrepresented, with a number of players in, or in close proximity to, the winners' circle.

The highlight of the tournament for me was serving as the master of ceremonies for the ACBL's Hall of Fame Banquet, where Peggy Sutherlin of Dallas won the 2014 Blackwood Award for her exemplary service to
the ACBL, and Bob Hamman of Dallas won the Sidney H. Lazard, Jr. Sportsmanship Award. Kudos to them both!

For the most part, our Grand National Teams excelled. In fact, our Flight B squad won the whole enchilada! Congrats to Jennifer and Jim Breihan, Daniel Jackson, Mike Doyle, and Bill McCarty. All live in Houston, except for Bill, who hails from San Antonio. In Flight A, Anthony Bianchi and Gary King of Houston, Mitch Towner of Austin, and Rob Whitcher of Cedar Park and Rob Whitcher of Cedar Park
finished $3 / 4$. In the Championship finished $3 / 4$. In the Championship
Flight, Ira Hessel and Greg Hinze of San Antonio, Joe Quinn of Sugar Land, and Steve Shirey of For Worth, finished 5/8. Given the level of competition in these events, all 13 of these players did our district proud.

Showing their mettle, Ira, Steve and Joe teamed with former Austinite Jim Griffin, to finish second in the Senior Swiss Teams. The finish was
close; less than 2 victory points separated the first- and second-place teams. Nice going, guys!
Lynn Baker of Austin won the Women's Knockout Teams by 4 IMPs in regulation, but a controversial appeal involving Lynn's teammates resulted in a 5.5 IMP penalty You do the math: a 1.5 IMP loss Bridgewinners' report on the appeal generated more than 300 comments, most of which disapproved of the ruling. How do you handle that kind of disappointment? As my grandmother used to say, "I have only two words for you: 'Oy' and 'vey'!"

In a field replete with world champi ons, Tom Breed of Kingwood and Chris Compton of Dallas were second in the Roth Open Swiss Teams. Tom is having quite a year, having won the $0-10,000$ Swiss Teams at the spring NABC in Dallas. Chris achieved success at an early age and has sustained it throughout his bridge career. Congratulations on your achievements!

A host of District 16 players played their way to a top 10 finish in national events. In the Spingold, Bob Hamman finished 5/8 after "upsetting" the \#2-seeded Nickell team in the round of 16 (though it's hard of think of any win by Bob as an upset!); Justin Lall, Plano, was 5/8 on another team. In the 0-5000 ("Mini") Spingold, Bill St. Clair, Cypress, and Thomas Trudeau, San Antonio, finished $3 / 4$ on different teams. I'd like to give a special nod to Tom Peters, Grapeland, who was

Bridge has an attribute of waywardness: though logical, it is contradic tory, paradoxical and perverse. There are endless exceptions to rules and confusing exceptions to the exceptions. The exceptions disprove rather than prove any so-called rules. The play that is excellent on one occasion is bad on another. Sometimes the apparently right procedure is wrong, and the wrong right. It is this wayward and puckish character istic, which challenges us, that gives bridge its charm: the fascination of the game lies in its infinite variety It is the bridge teacher who expose us to these endless possibilities; starts to pique our interest, and intro duces us to the joy of the game Being a good bridge teacher doesn't require you to be a great player. It requires you to have a love of the game and a willingness to give back to work to develop that same love in the new participant.

LaS VEGAS NATIONAL TOURNAMENT REPORT

Las Vegas! This is the place that has a magic to it, attracting bridge players from all over the world. In every hallway at the tournament site, at least 20 different languages could be heard as players discussed their bidding or play problems. 16,616 tables were in play, fewer than expected by the tournament committee, which did a great job and furnished snacks and entertainment each night. The host hotel, the Westgate Resort Hotel hotel, the Westgate Resort Hotel (originally the Las Vegas Hitton and 60 Las Vegas Hotel, is now about 60 years old and showing its signs of age. The next Las Vegas National in 2019, will be held at the new Cos mopolitan Casino Hotel.

Membership is holding steady at 168,000 but tournaments are trending down by one percent. There are more tournaments now so this decline is surprising.

All Units are covered by ACBL insurance policies for sanctioned ACBL events and tournaments. Unit meetings are not covered and may need to self-insure. Contact the ACBL or me if you have any questions concerning insurance.

Screens will be used in Flight B events if space is available and whenever they are used for the Championship flight.

## ACBLScore

The ACBL has made the decision to discontinue the Score Project. A working group of board members, internal staff and outside experts determined that efforts to develop a completely new system fell short of what should be required. The ACBL is now mov-

## How Do You Get Your Unit to Grow?

Hello. My name is Carolyn Pinto and I am the District 16 Novice/ Intermediate Chairperson and Unit 183 Education Coordinator. I have been teaching bridge for more than 15 years and I have had the pleasure of being the Tournament Chairperson for Unit 183 for a few years. A significant increase in membership has occurred in Unit 183 over the last couple of years. Unit growth is not an accident. Some of the reasons for growth are as follows:

Marketing Tools - We all know that it takes time to learn duknow that it takes time to learn du-
plicate bridge. Therefore, we need plicate bridge. Therefore, we need
to attract and retain new members. Some tools that have worked in our unit are:
a. Easy Bridge - Seminars on at least a yearly basis. If you don't hook them on their first visit, you need to entice them to come back. The second visit might do the trick. If not the second, perhaps the third will work. Remember, the first 4 lessons are free and this encourages people to at least check it out. Make them want to come back.

2. Education Tools - There is more than one way to learn how to play duplicate bridge.

Basic Classes - Yes! This is still a good way to learn. I have learned the less time you spend writing on the "white board," the better. Getting the cards in their hands gets your students involved. When you are getting ready to learn a card game, you should be playing with cards. Most people are tactile. We prefer to learn by doing
b. Visual Aids - In this day and fime, the computer software and programs that you can use to demonstrate bridge conventions and concepts are phenonomial. I encourage the use of all the current tools to encourage a fun way of learning. Seeing reinforces what we hear.

Supervised Games - The students love this concept. They get to play and get help from you while they are playing. They have so many questions when they are first learning. No, you can't answer all their questions at one game; therefore, each person gets to ask two questions in the 2.5 hour playing session. Remember, they are also earning master points. Most of us like to be rewarded. That first master point is a significant enticement. We like our achievement to be measured.
Mini-lessons - If you offer a mini-lesson prior to your game you will frequently get people to come to your game. I am talking about a 5-20 minute lesson just before game-time. If they are attending a lesson, they are interested and making a commitment. Keep the lesson short and relatively simple in the
beginning.
Do not be discouraged if one tool worked and another did not. You can't do this once in a blue moon; you have to continue to have these ools to increase your membership. Use various techniques as people learn differently.

On another note, retention is so important. Don't let them get away once you get them interested in this wonderful game. Make sure someone in your unit monitors the "In and Out Report" you receive from he ACBL and have someone call nd encourage these players to coninue to play. Your morn hairper is the ideal cold hairperson is the ideal candidat for this task

Help your players at tournaments Always have someone available who will help new players with the little things. Directors are so busy trying to get the game started to nurture new players. Step up, help new players find their tables, have someone in your club stay after the ame and help them read the results after they are posted on the wall Remember how you felt at your first tournament? Many of us were overwhelmed.

I love this game, I enjoy teaching, I value my partnerships, and I still get a thrill out of winning. Frankly, I enjoy playing well more than wining. I hear the same thing from many of my bridge friends.

Fundamental Tip: In our quest for Masterpoints, the best avenue is to go to as many tournaments as you can. New players, jump in, because all tournaments have games where you won't have to play against the bridge giants but can instead play in groups with your same number of MPs. And if you're a bit more brave, put a team together and play in a low bracket against your peers. In the Knockout Team games, the loser of each match is eliminated and the winner goes on for three more sessions to win the event, but if you win two matches, you are in the "good money." Bracketed Knockout Teams is a KO even in which teams are divided into groups based on their masterpoint holdings. The top group is Bracket 1, and the numbers go higher as the team MPs go lower. Again, once you lose, you're out, but 2 wins puts you in the ranking. At the Regional, that means GOLD! Compact Knockout Teams is a shorter version of Bracket KOs (and for the life of me, I don't know anybody who likes Compact KOs! Do you?) Swiss Teams, and especially Bracketed Swiss Teams, is a really fun way to get team experience. You're not eliminated for los ing; you just keep playing and try to ing; you just keep playing and try to eted Swiss, both sessions are with the same group of teams. In all team events, teams can be four, five, or six players, with four playing at a time, and all players must play at least half the match. If you can get team experience at your local club, your tournament play will be even better.

In the January 2010 Bridge Bulletin Frank Stewart addressed the "nonsystem bidding issue" of discipline. And here are six comments without the examples.
"Discipline in the bidding is taking the action you know is best when a tiny voice in your head is urging you to take a flyer."
"Discipline is having a reason to bid and being willing to pass when no bid is just right."
"Discipline is acknowledging that you have a partner and letting pard use judgement."
"A disciplined player doesn't try to make final decisions too soon."
"Instead of guessing...involve your partner."
