The long term viability of bridge depends on our ability to attract new members and keep them engaged. In my last article I noted that D16 is ranked 14 of the 25 ACBL districts in membership attraction. When I mention membership retention to bridge players, the first reaction that I usually get is "We can't do anything about that as our members keep dying."

While this statement is true, it misses the point that we must work harder to attract new members and retain them since we can't do anything about members who become unable to play bridge or who pass away.

ACBL measures membership retention by looking at how many of the new members we recruit are still members after 2 years. That measure shows D16 as dead last in district ranking at 25 .

We have lots of room to improve our retention of new members. Over the last 3 years we have recruited 1917 new members and average retention of $55.1 \%$, which means we lost 862 . If we were average among the districts at $61.6 \%$ we'd have 125 more members now. If we can move to the $75^{\text {th }}$ percentile, we'd be at $64.3 \%$ and have 178 more members. I have been traveling and visiting Unit Boards and clubs and also engaging people in conversation about the best practices for retaining new members. I've compiled an extensive list and it is posted on the D16 website.

The good news is that the members we retain help us by bringing in people they know to classes and events to stimulate more growth and the things we do to improve membership retention can help everyone. There is not enough space to discuss all of the great practices that are in use
around the district, but there are some key principles that stand out:
Create a welcoming, fun, encouraging and pleasant atmosphere

Have people designated at each full service club to contact and encourage new members and oversee their development

Offer a complete program that allows newer members to move at their own pace from classes to supervised play to Easy Bridge to I/N events to Mentor/Mentee events to Open competition

Encourage them to volunteer at the club and especially to play occasionally with an even newer player

Every one of our district's full service clubs should work to implement as many of the best practices as possible. Units, club owners, managers, and members all need to work together on these initiatives. The District Board will be discussing our role at our July 4 meeting in San Antonio. Each of us has a role in helping to improve new member retention. Enforcing Zero Tolerance is only a start to creating the type of environment we need. All of us know someone who won't play duplicate bridge because of a bad experience they or someone they knew had at a club. We can all help to change that reputation by welcoming newer players and getting to know them as people, and ensuring they are treated well when they play. All of us can help with the novice programs in our clubs even if we just bring drinks or a snack. All of us can volunteer to play with a newer player and encourage them in their bridge journey. Together I'm confident that we can turn our membership decline into sustained growth and dramatically improve our district's rank in both membership attraction and retention. Being dead last in new member retention is a call to action!!!

## PETITION BY MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS TO AMEND CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE BYLAWS REGARDING VOTING FOR DIRECTORS MAY 31, 2015

The undersigned, each being a Director of Unit 183 of the American Contract Bridge League, do hereby submit this petition to the membership of the Unit to request that Sections D.4., D.5., and the first sentence of D.6. of Article $V$ of the Bylaws of Unit 183 be deleted and replaced with the language shown in Attachment $A$. Attachment $B$ shows a redlined comparison of the existing and proposed language.

The undersigned state the the intentions of the proposed revisions are as follows:

1. To allow people who don't care about secrecy to avoid the inconvenience of the current two-envelope requirement.
2. To minimize the number of invalid ballots by (a) allowing people to vote for fewer than three candidates, and (b) not disqualifying a ballot that has votes both for a nominated candidate(s) and a write-in candidate(s).
3. To make explicit provision for the use of ballot boxes.
4. To clarify everywhere that if the Vice President can't take an action their replacement can.

## PROPOSED REVISIONS TO SECTION D.4., D.5., AND D.6. OF THE BYLAWS OF ACBL UNIT 183 ARTICLE V UNIT BOARD OF DIRECTORS

## D. Election of Directors

4. Every Unit member in good standing shall be entitled to vote, either in person on the date of the election or by absentee ballot. Each Unit member may cast only one (1) ballot. Each ballot shall be secret unless the member chooses to use a non-secret method. A copy of the latest ACBL membership roster shall be used to determine Unit members in good standing. Any member in good standing may vote absentee or in person. All paper ballots, whether cast in person or by absentee, will be numbered for security reasons when processed.
5. All valid ballots, whether cast in person or by absentee, should contain no more than three (3) votes. Ballots cast for more candidates will not count. A ballot with more than one vote for the same candidate will not count. Write-in candidates shall not be permitted, but if a ballot contains votes both for a nominated candidate(s) and a write-in candidate(s) the votes for the nominated candidate(s) shall count. Ballots voted by proxy will not count.

Five (5) voting methods shall be allowed: (a) absentee voting by mail, (b) absentee voting by delivery to a member of the Election Committee, (c) voting using a ballot box, (d) early electronic voting, and (e) voting in person at the Annual Meeting usually held during the Fall Sectional Tournament. The Unit may use any or all such methods for an election; failure to use all methods does not invalidate the election.

The procedure for each voting method is:
a. Absentee by Mail: Any voting member may choose this method. The member must contact an Election Committee member by U. S. Mail, email, or telephone to request an official ballot. If the voter is a Unit member in good standing, an official ballot will be sent to the voter at the voter's address of record with a small, unsealed envelope. Upon receipt of the Official Ballot, the voter must cast no more than three (3) votes.

If the voter desires secrecy, he or she shall do the following: (a) seal the ballot inside the small, Unit-provided envelope, and place the small, sealed envelope inside a larger, member-provided envelope addressed to an Election Committee member; and (b) sign the back flap of the outside, larger envelope and write down the voter's ACBL number. A ballot without both the voter's signature and ACBL number will not be counted. The signed envelope must be postmarked at least seven (7) days before the start of in-person voting
If a voter does not desire secrecy, he or she need not use two envelopes. The voter may return the ballot in a single envelope with their signature and ACBL number marked on the ballot. A ballot without both the voter's signature and ACBL number will not be counted. The envelope containing the ballot must be postmarked at least seven (7) days before the start of in-person voting.
b. A voter may hand an absentee ballot to an Election Committee member at least three (3) days before the start of in-person voting. A member desiring secrecy shall place a signed, sealed envelope containing the ballot inside an outer, sealed envelope. The voter must sign the outer envelope and write on it their ACBL number. A member not desiring secrecy shall place the ballot in a single envelope and shall sign the ballot and write their ACBL number on it.
c. The voter may place a completed absentee ballot in a ballot box provided by the Unit. The Unit may place ballot boxes in any or all clubs within the Unit and at such other places as it believes members are likely to vote. A member desiring secrecy shall place a signed, sealed envelope containing the ballot inside an outer, sealed envelope. The voter must sign the outer envelope and write on it their ACBL number. A member not desiring secrecy shall place the ballot in a single envelope and shall sign the ballot and write their ACBL number on it.
All ballots gathered by methods (a), (b) and (c) shall be gathered by members of the the Election Committee. The Unit Vice President (or his/her designee appointed by the President, if applicable) will be present at a pre-arranged time when the signed envelopes and/or ballots are checked off on the ACBL roster of Unit members in good standing and opened. Only after the signed envelopes used by voters desiring secrecy are opened and thrown away, can the Election Committee members and Vice President or his/her designee appointed by the President open the accompanying small, sealed envelopes and count their votes. Election Committee members and the Vice President (or designee) shall not reveal which voters voted for which candidates to any other person.
d. Early Electronic Voting: The technical consultant will provide an online ballot using a secure database thirty (30) days prior to the election. Any Unit member in good standing may utilize early electronic voting and cast not more than three (3) votes per ballot. The member must first register on the website by using his/her ACBL player number and creating a password. This password may be used for other Unit website applications as well. Early Electronic Voting will close five (5) days prior to the holding of the Annual Meeting. When early voting is completed, the technical consultant will prepare a comprehensive, correct list of members who utilized Early Electronic Voting. This list will be presented to the Election Committee. The Election Committee will check off the names on the ACBL roster of those using Early Electronic Voting before in person voting begins. The technical consultant will also deliver the results of Early Electronic Voting in both a digital and written format in a sealed envelope prior to the start of the Fall Tournament or the Annual Meeting if separate from the Fall Tournament. This envelope may be opened only by the Election Committee after the in person voting has closed. The Unit Vice President or his/her designate appointed by the President must be present when the Early Electronic Voting results are revealed and added to the total vote.
e. Voting In Person: Before in-person voting starts, the Election Committee shall check off the names of all voters who have used methods (a), (b), (c) or (d) to ensure that they do not also vote inperson. The remaining roster of eligible voters shall then be used for in-person voters to sign at the time they cast their ballots. Each member must cast no more than three (3) votes per ballot.
6. Upon conclusion of the in-person voting, the Election Committee and the Unit Vice President (or designee) shall tabulate the in person votes.

A ballot with more than one vote Voting for the same candidate will not count. more than once per ballot shall not be allowed. Write-in candidates shall not be permitted, but if a ballot contains votes both for a nominated candidate(s) and a write-in candidate(s) the votes for the nominated candidate(s) shall count. Ballots voted by proxy will not count. Proxy votes shall not be allowed.

FiveThree (53) voting methods shall be allowed: (a) absentee voting by mail, (b) absentee voting by delivery to a member of the Election Committee, (c) absentee early electronic voting, voting using a ballot box, (d) early electronic voting, and (e) or voting in person at the Annual Meeting usually held during the Fall Sectional Tournament. The Unit may use any or all such methods for an election; failure to use all methods does not invalidate the election.

The procedure for each voting method is:
a. Absentee by Mail: Any voting member may choose this method. The member must contact an Election Committee member by U. S. Mail, emE-Mail, or telephone to request an official ballot. If the voter

A member desiring secrecy shall place a signed, sealed envelope containing the ballot inside an outer, sealed envelope. The voter must sign the outer envelope and write on it their ACBL number. A member not desiring secrecy shall place the ballot in a single envelope and shall sign the ballot and write their ACBL number on it.

All ballots gathered by methods (a), (b) and (c) shall be gathered by absentee ballots members of the in sealed, signed envelopes will be collected by the Election Committee. The Unit Vice President (or his/her designatee appointed by the President, if applicable) will be present at a pre-arranged time when the signed envelopes and/or ballots are checked off on the ACBL roster of Unit members in good standing and opened. Only after the signed envelopes used by voters desiring secrecy are opened and thrown away, can the Election Committee members and Vice President or his/her designate designee appointed by the President open the accompanying small, sealed envelopes and count their votes. Absentee results will be kept secret.Election Committee members and the Vice-President (or designee) shall not reveal which voters voted for which candidates to any other person.
db. Early Electronic Voting: The technical consultant will provide an online ballot using a secure database thirty (30) days prior to the election. Any Unit member in good standing may utilize early elecronic voting and cast not more than three (3) votes per ballot. The member must first register on the website by using his/her ACBL player number and creating a password. This password may be used for other Unit website applications as well. Early Electronic Voting will close five (5) days prior to the holding of the Annual Meeting. When early voting is completed, the technical consultant will prepare a comprehensive, correct list of members who utilized Early Electronic Voting. This list will be presented to the Election Committee. The Election Committee will check off the names on the ACBL roster of those using Early Electronic Voting before in person voting begins. The technical consultant will also deliver the results of Early Electronic Voting in both a digital and written format in a sealed envelope prior to the start of the Fall Tournament or the Annual Meeting if separate from the Fall Tournament. This envelope may be opened only by the Election Committee after the in person voting has closed. The Unit Vice President or his/her designate appointed by the President must be present when the Early Electronic Voting results are revealed and added to the total vote.
ec. Voting In Person: Before in-person voting starts, tThe Election Committee shall is responsible for checking off the names of all voters who have used methods (a), (b), (c) or (d) to ensure that they do not also vote in person. Absentee and Early Electronic voters on the ACBL roster prior to the start of in person voting. Theis remaining modified ACBL roster of eligible votersUnit members in good stand ing shall then be used for in person voters to sign at the time they cast their ballots. Each member must cast exactlyno more than three (3) votes per ballot.
6. Upon conclusion of the in person voting, the Election Committee and the Unit Vice President (or designee) shall tabulate the in person votes.

Fundamental Tip: "Playing Up." It's common knowledge that bridge players get better by "playing up." That has different meanings, whether it's moving into open games from a more comfortable novice game, or play with you and help you get better That might mean paying a profe sional fee mean paying a profes sonal fee (or at the very least, their hard enough and playing often enough to be noticed by a good player who might want to help you and take credit for your expected improvement. Or it might just mean playing in the many mentor games our excellent Unit 174 clubs run regularly, for both day and night games. If your or tunate enough to get to play with really good B player (on to with realry good B play ( an A player), they will generally play your card. They want you to feel comfortable and not intimidated, so that you can concentrate more on
each hand. Our mentor games allow time at the end of each game for the mentor to give pointers to the mentee based on the hand records. One thing you can do that will make a big difference and save much time is to bring TWO copies of the convention card you most like to play when you come to the mentor game. Your mentor can quickly look through it and know what you feel comfortable with and will be able to help you much more than having to take the time to fill out a convention card from ground zero. It's not a rule, but I think it should be expected. Wouldn't it be a very nice, thoughtful thing to do? Think about it.

The finishers in the top $60 \%$ of each flight - and any pair with a higher than $50 \%$ game - will be eligible to play at the District qualifiers in January, with the top three or four pairs at the District competition eligible to play at the Spring Nationals in New Orleans. This event involves subsidies for travel, and there is no entry fee for the qualifiers at the National level.

Also, although our unit will not be having any sectionals or regionals over the summer, don't forget the Arlington Heart of the Metroplex Sectional in Grapevine from July 24 to 26 and the last Fort Worth Labor Day Regional from September 1 to 7. (Starting in 2016, Dallas will no longer share the Labor Day Regional with Fort Worth.)
