Encourage new members to attend the parties and hear the stories of people who have achieved the rank of Life Master and higher. There is great power in the personal stories of successful people. The can give us hope, encouragement and can lead to lasting friendships.

The final point that I would like to make is that many experienced players are willing to help new players with their journey. Help comes in many forms - analyzing difficult hands, answering questions, mentoring, playing with new players in tournaments to help them get their pigmented points etc.

I'm convinced that the real pleasure is in the journey, the friends we make, and the memories we create rather than the level we ultimately achieve. All of us need to take time to get to know new players and to encourage them by being friendly, helping them have an enjoyable time, and volunteering to answer their questions.

Now if you bid 7C it is 2140 vs 500 or 800 so it is way right to bid 7C. No happy ending as we went minus 200 and minus 500 vs 6Hx, the action in the other room. Well I am willing to wait 150 thousand hands for it to come up again, I will live to be over 100!

Bob Hamman and Paul Street made a presentation to the Board about how our membership was aging with suggestions to improve our League. This was well received by the Board.

At the end of July membership was 168,208 which was the highest since 1997. The league has embarked on a telephone campaign to win back lapsed members and better understand the reasons for not renewing. The motion to reduce master points in KO's with 5 or 6 members who do not play 100% of the time was defeated on second reading. I expect to see a motion at the Fall Nationals

that would make all members of a

team that received full master points

to pay an entry fee. The ACBL strongly recommends Units and Districts make student discounts available at Sectionals and

Regional's. If an appeals committee finds the same facts and bridge judgment as

the tournament director, it must

make the same ruling, subject to attempting to persuade the Director that another law, or a more correct interpretation of Law, requires a different result.

It was reaffirmed that individuals that abuse their position of trust in the handling of hand records will be expelled from the league.

The ACBL revokes it's election of 12C1(e) in the laws of Duplicate Bridge.

The online clubs received permission to offer an exciting new form of Bridge: Online instant tournaments where one person plays with 3 ro-

In addition to the open Regionals allowed, a district may now hold up to three limited Regionals per year which may be any of the following: Junior Regional, Youth Regional, or Non Life Master Regional with an upper limit of no more than 750

Two strats are now allowed in Regional pair games flight A B, & C. A Distinguished Employee Award was created to be called the Jeff Johnson Award (Jeff was in charge of directors and NABC's for years).

The Technology Committee continues their evaluation of options for the next generation of ACBL-SCORE and will have a recommendation in the fall.

Not Participating

Dear Dan Morse,

Thank you very much for your congratulations and good wishes. I want to share my personal experience of bridge in Houston.

I am playing bridge for more than 40 years in Pakistan and bridge is my passion. I have played several national and international tournaments in Pakistan. When I came to Houston I wanted to play bridge with some good partner so that I can enjoy.

I found Bridge Studio the right place for good standard bridge, so when I went there and asked for partner, first question was asked how many points do you have. Naturally I do not have points as I have not played in US nor on net, so most of the players who have thousand points and above flatly refused to play with me. Though I am sure that my game is far better than those players. Eventually I had to play sometime with beginners who have never heard the term Stayman and also don't know when to trump because they have not learned as yet.. You can imagine my feelings but I had to be polite all the time so that I can make my place in bridge commu-



Fundamental Tip: KISS????? I recently had a serious talk with an extremely good bridge player whose opinion I respect, and I want to share it. I have always espoused mastering the fundamentals before adding complicated stuff to your game. But I

also love all those gadgets and anything that will let The Law of Total Tricks help my partner and me to find the right contract. We all have to admit it: they're just so much FUN when they work, aren't they? But this particular crackerjack player convinced me that a simple card works best. He said that, rather than clutter up your card and your game (and your mind), with all sorts of bidding conventions, it's much better to spend your energy in figuring out where all the cards are-all 52 of them. How can we set them? How can we make one extra trick? No one could argue with that, but I hadn't realized the seriousness of that track. I know players who don't use many gadgets, and they are not successful against those who have a full tool box. But I'm coming to believe that he's right. Even though experts like Larry Cohen tell us that 2/1 is the greatest system ever, and that ten years from now, no one will even remember "Standard American," while other experts swear by Precision or Big Club systems, I think my friend just might be correct, and I'm going to play a simple card whenever I get the opportunity to play with him. But here's the caveat for all the rest of us: Your partner must also be devoting the same amount of energy to the same kind of tactic. You must both be searching for—and finding −all the cards from the time the bidding starts. Layer all the knowledge that you get from every source from the first bid or pass. Guess it's that way with any game plan, isn't it? I know John Zilic plays a simple card, and I don't think anybody will argue that he wins quite consistently. Let me know what you think.

Not only we but the game of bridge will surely miss her. one of my favorite bridge books. However, I only own the 2001 edition. It is a massive book, covering subjects from the standards of bridge, to conventions, to card combinations, to winners of major tournaments, and a listing of who's who in US and world bridge play. In short, it can answer most questions on standards of bridge, acceptable conventions and who has done what in the bridge world. If you can't get a bridge question answered in this book, then you didn't ask the right question! When I bought my book back in about 2007, I was pleasantly impressed that Austin had 4 major players recognized in this venerable publication as Leading Bridge Personalities.

One named played was Tobi Sokolow and for this month's mini interview, I contacted Tobi and asked her to tell me more about herself. She gladly shared and I'm delighted to do a bit of an introduction to Tobi from this perspective. Tobi originally comes from Cleveland, Ohio, and graduated from Ohio State with degrees in sociology and biology. She worked in social services for a time, then took a position as a head hunter. It was during this time, in her early 30s, that she was asked to play bridge and sort of said "why not." She had never been much of a card player, so was delighted to discover how quickly she caught on to the game. As she says, it is not surprising to like something if it is easy for you to grasp. Tobi was hooked and only a couple of years into playing, became a life master in 1978. The rest is history. She now has over 20,000 master points, at least 4 world titles and at least 18 North American championships. When asked about advice for aspiring players, Tobi had this to say: "My best advice for a player wanting to reach the next level of bridge is to practice brain games and teasers. One of the most difficult aspects of the game is staying focused, so when you play at the Club, or a tournament, go off by yourself at least five minutes before the game to help you get in the 'zone.' You chose duplicate bridge because you are serious about the game, so do your socializing after the game is over." Great advice, Tobi, and thank you so much for sharing.
