

Bridge News Bulletin for The Texas Regional Conference 2826 Barrel Oak San Antonio, TX 78231 5 of the 18 players the USBF will send to the world championships in Wrocaw, Poland from September 3 to 17. 2 of the 3 captains are also from District 16.

In the Senior trials, just concluded in Denver, Hemant Lall and Bob Hamman were on the winning team.

Earlier in June, Tobi Sokolow and Juanita Chambers were on the winning team in the Women's trials. Hemant's son Justin, who will be eligible to play with his father in the senior trials in 2047, was on the team that won the right to play for the USA in the open teams. Justin beat a team in the finals that included Chip Martel and poor Chip then lost to Justin's father in the Senior finals.

The senior finals were a great watch on Bridge Base Online. Played in six 15-board segments, our guys surged to an early 70-27 lead, lost a huge 64-19 segment and were down 13 going into the final 30 boards. The fifth segment saw a dull 7-7 tie so we were all anticipating a tight dog-fight going into the final 15

team, captained by our own Petra Hamman, won 56-15. Bob played with Mark Lair of Canyon Tx, not quite D16. Hemant played with Reese Milner and their other pair were Jeff Meckstroth and Zia Mahmood. This team, with Michael Rosenberg playing with Zia instead of Meckstroth, won the last Senior world championship. Just when it looked like it was all over Michael had a chance to beat his old team for a big swing. He picked up A72 O875 O A9863. The bidding was spirited and Meckstroth bid diamonds and spades and ended in 6Ds, doubled by Michael on lead. Either Ace might be ruffed so Michael chose a small H after a thought. It was a suit in which his partner doubled a cue bid. Declarer was 5-0-7-1 and threw his club on the H ace.. The spade Ace was the only trick he scored. This was a huge swing as 5D was the contract at the other table. A 25 IMP difference on opening lead.

Tobi and Juanita, both World Champions, will play with Sylvia Shi, Beth Palmer, Lynn Deas and Janice Seaman. They will be captained by David Sokolow who also ably served in that Post when Tobi and Juanita were second last year in the Venice Cup in Chennai, India.

Bob has won one or more World Championships in 5 different decades!

Hemant recently, playing with Reese, won the South American Championships.

Justin became the youngest Grand Life Masters in ACBL history when he won the Grand national Teams with his dad. Does not seem so long ago, when as a 12 year old, he filled in for me ina San Antonio Swiss and barely missed first. He will be playing with Keven Bathurst on a team with John Diamond, Brian Platnick, Geoff Hampson and Eric Greco.

I try to watch all trials and World Championships on BridgeBase Online and it was especially enjoyable to root for so many District 16 players. I will be there cheering in September when they go for it all. Even if they play in the hour of the wolf.

Road to Gold LM by Bette Byrd

Gold Life Master was a journey of 50 years with a break. I grew up with a grandmother (MOM), a mother, Gracie Craig and her best friend playing bridge, in which I did not have any interest at the time. In collage, being bored in the Dorm, I started playing with the girls and my Mom immediately sent me "5 Weeks to Winning Bridge" by Alfred Sheinwold. I read it!

When I moved to Abilene, I began playing duplicate with Mom and her friends in Sweetwater. I was fortunate in that they were all excellent players and I had great opportunities. At an early Abilene Tournament, at the Windsor Hotel, I was playing with Mom and we were playing a man with a dog in his lap. I doubled his contract and we set him one. As we left the table she informed me I had just doubled Oswald Jacoby. We went on to win my first tournament points. There was no stratification then.

I played in Mable Lillius' games in Abilene, and the Sweetwater, Merkel and Albany games when possible.

When I moved to Richardson in the 1970s, the game there was held in a basement of a motel where now 635 and Central Expressway meet. The ceiling was low and the smoke was so bad that I had to stop playing. This is historic as this was before the smoking ban was en-

There was a period of about thirteen years that I did not play. I moved back to Sweetwater in 1985 and when Coleen (Palmer) Grisham started a game there, my then business partner insisted that we play. I told her it was an addictive game and that I should not start again. We

From then on I played at every available game as often as possible.

Marie Hixon, Coleen, Sassy Furlow and I went to Gatlinburg when Ross Perot was running for president. We were just supporting Texas bridge and wore straw hats with blue bonnets, Texas Flags and Lone Stars on them. We were a hit and people kept asking if we were campaigning. That was the start of Coleen and I wearing hats. We have worn hats to tournaments and collected buttons from where we have played for over 25 years.

I made Life Master in Houston playing with a team that we picked up from partnership. Another player needed about 7 points to make her goal. When we got to that many points, she was so excited that she was on the phone in the hall calling everyone she knew instead of playing. We did not win the event, but it was plenty for my Life Master as well. That was a good thing as we were teaching lessons at the time, and told the eight tables of students that we were going to Houston to get my gold points so it would have been embarrassing to come back without them.

Wearing our hats there are very few tournaments we have not played in in Texas and many other states. We have taught together, directed 299 tournaments, and done the Scorecard until I became ill

I had Kidney Failure in 2000 and was on dialysis carrying bags to tournaments and doing dialysis between sessions All the directors were so considerate and would hold a game a few minutes when necessary for me to get back. When I had a transplant in Dallas in 2002, Coleen came and we played the Richardson Tournament 5 days after I was out of the hospital. Tom Whitesides made sure I had a table near the ladies restroom so I could drink my 10 bottles of water.

I went from playing 4 card majors in the 1960s to now playing 2/1, Bergan raises, inverted minors and Meck-

When at a Las Vegas National, Coleen was ill one day and I picked up a partner. He gave me a card to play and I memorized it and played it, winning the afternoon session. Going back to the room, Coleen looked at it and said "you played 2/1 with him and you won't play it with me". I had to convert. Mark Lair, whom Coleen is friends with, told us to change to odd/even discards and wrote it on a napkin. That improved our defense which has probably given us more top boards than any other

Bridge is a hobby that you never outgrow, and can play even with a handicap. We are all fortunate to have the







Fundamental Tip: Marty Bergen had an excellent article in the February 2016 Bulletin titled"Gerber: the other ace-asking bid." He called it a convention that should only be used on "rare occasions" and noted that "many non-experts can't wait to jump to 4 Clubs to ask for aces." I strongly recommend that you read that article, and you'll find the hand in the middle column of special interest. Most of us need lots of help in our slam bidding, don't we? He ends the article with three items of sage advice that apply to all areas of our bridge playing, so I'd like to share them with you. (1) "Bidding on instinct is not the right way to go." (2) "Being careful is a good thing (especially when the topic is slam bidding)." (3) "Thinking and being careful is an even better thing." Right on!





Steve Robinson's poll of the top experts via Bridge People (web) on how to play team games against better players.

Point 1 Go in with a Positive Attitude.

Rose Metzer- Sit down and don't do anything foolish. Play your best. Jill Meyers- Act with confidence. Learn regardless of outcome.

Point 2 Don't Be Intimidated.

Chip Martel-Don't go off your normal game. George Jacobs and Kit Woolsey- No one on the other team can or will avoid making mistakes. Collect all these mistakes. Bergen- Be willing to take slightly abnormal actions.

David Berkowitz- Don't change the way you bid or play. No talking and certainly no post-mortems.

Steve Bloom- Play your best and try to learn from the stars. Grant Baze-Knock out matches are lost, not won. Never be afraid. Bridge is a game of mistakes. To paraphrase Bob Hamman, the very best play poorly and the rest of us are awful. Zeke Jabbour- Make them beat your best game. Forget stealing. Forget heroics. Don't try to win it. Try not to lose it. Don't be distracted. Pollack- Stay focused. Hang in There. Show no fear. Kantar and Bob Hamman - Play hard with the assumption that if you play to the best of your abilities, the problem becomes the opponents problem.

Kit Woolsey- Simply play their normal best game- don't try to do anything unusual. Bart Bramley-Act like you have done it before even if you haven't. Show them you know how to play; nothing unnerves experienced players more than to see their unknown opponents refusing to roll over. Don't kowtow to the opposition. Don't discuss bad boards with partner or the opponents. Don't mope after a bad result. Being a tough opponent is something that everyone can do. It is a psychological skill, not a technical skill, and you can practice it every time you play.

Point 3 If you get a Bad Result, Forget it and Play the next hand. Larry Cohen- When you get your inevitable bad boards you have to shrug it off and dig in for the next Don't argue with partner, don't get discouraged, just clear your mind and focus on the next deal. Mel Colchamiro - At the table -No Talking. Move on, play the next one. Ralph Katz - Don't let your first mistake turn into two or three mistakes. If you lose let it be because the other team played great.

Point 4 Enjoy the Experience.

David Bird - Play your normal game and enjoy the experience. Do not allow yourself to be rushed.

Point 5 Learn from the Experience Karen Allison - Relax and enjoy. Bobby Wolff - Above all, be loose. Don't be too impressed with the other team's credentials. Steve Beatty – If you are trying to improve: Make your normal bids, declarer plays and defensive plays. After the match review your bids and plays to theirs and, if you do not know why they made certain different decisions, ask them in a courteous manner to explain their logic.

Point 6 Play your Style of Bridge.

Fred Hamilton – Play normal game and let style and system do the work. Mike Becker - Play your own game do what you do best. Don't play methods you are unfamiliar with and don't take anti-percentage actions.

Point 7 If the opponents play quickly, slow down. Don't let them tempo you. Take about four seconds for every play.

Kerry Sanborn- Don't get caught up in the opponent's tempo and gamesmanship. Take some slight risks.

Point 8 Look for opportunities to create swings.

Sue Picus – Hang tough- don't let a bad board or two affect your judgement. When a board is over it is over. Don't let them steal – double when you think they are going down. Joe Kivel - To win, take reasonable but alternative lines of play. Don't go

crazy. Don't panic. Marinesa Letizia – Bid all close vulnerable games. Eddie Kantar – Don't be afraid to bid your close games and don't be afraid to double if you think they are steal-Jeff Rubens - Decide in advance whether to treat it as a valuable learning experience (play one's best on every deal and analyze the results) or an attempt to maximize the chance of winning(liven up the proceedings within reason). Curtis Cheek - Psychological: Believe you can win. Before every hand tell yourself: Intensity and Focus. Strategic: Don't overextend yourself. Tactics: Try to conceal the nature of your hand and overbid slightly when you can. Use aggressive game bidding and conservative slam bidding.

Conclusion Steve Robinison - Sit down, play your best game and have a good attitude.

These bits of great advice have application across all types of games and conditions. I hope these excerpts put it in words to guide us on our quest to be an accurate bidder, a measured defender, a reliable declarer and a harmonious partner.


It is with deep sadness I have to report the passing of four of our Bridge Family. Dottie Pirkle's
