

### Bart Bramley & Bob Hamman Win Senior KO; Shawn Quinn & Nancy Passell Win Women's Pairs; Eddie Wold Wins North American Swiss; Barbara Ferm Second in Women's BAM

The weather in Orlando was wonderful: warm days and cool nights. I spent my two days there relaxing by the pool, but a number of District 16 players spent their time pursuing coveted NABC titles.

Bart Bramley and Bob Hamman of Dallas had an impressive run in Orlando. They won the Senior Knockout Teams, and placed fourth in both the Blue Ribbon Pairs and the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams. I watched them on Vugraph, and they were rocksolid throughout. Winning the Senior KO is old hat for Bart; he won it in 2013 and again in 2014. Even more impressive: the Senior KO win was Bob's 53<sup>rd</sup> victory in an NABC event. 53 wins? That's one win for almost every year he's been playing bridge! Bart has been nominated once again for membership in the ACBL Hall of Fame. I think he made his case in Orlando, don't you? Of course, Bob is already in the Hall of Fame, so he's playing with "house money."

Eddie Wold of Houston won the North American Swiss Teams, his 16<sup>th</sup> NABC triumph. His team crushed the field, winning by a margin of almost a match and a half (29.51 Victory Points). By contrast, the margin of victory last year was a measly 7.38 VPs. Eddie was inducted into the Hall of Fame earlier this year, so it's only fitting that he end the year with a bang. Congratulations, Eddie!

The Women's Pairs was won by Shawn Quinn of Sugar Land and Nancy Passell of Plano. They outdistanced the field by more than two boards, primarily on the basis of a 66% final session. This was Shawn's 23rd NABC win and Nancy's fourth.

Shawn and Nancy also finished fourth in the Women's Board-a-Match Teams along with teammates Ellen Hessel of San Antonio and Peggy Sutherlin of Dallas. Way to go, girls!

Dallas denizen Barbara Ferm came oh -so-close once again, finishing second in the Women's Board-a-Match Teams. This was her fourth secondplace finish in as many nationals. That's a pretty impressive record, if you ask me. It's only a matter of time before she wins one.

People sometimes ask me how I find out a player's NABC wins. I use a nifty link on the ACBL website. Click on "Tournaments," then on "NABC Winners Player Search." If you put in a player's last name, a list of all his/ her wins and seconds appears. It's a great resource for a bridge "journalist" like me, and a fun way to pass the time if you've got nothing better to do.

A number of District 16 players had top-ten finishes in NABC events. Hemant Lall, Plano, finished seventh in the NA Swiss, and ninth in the Open BAM. John Sutherlin, Dallas, and Dan Morse, Houston, finished fifth/eighth in the Senior KO Teams; so did Mike Passell, Plano, and Eddie Wold on another team. Ira Hessel, San Antonio, was sixth in the LM Open Pairs, while Babu Koneru, also San Antonio, was eighth in the Open BAM. Tomi Storey, Frisco, and Scott Nason, Houston were sixth in the 0-5000 Blue Ribbon Pairs. Finally, Michael Heymann, Fort Worth, was sixth in the Mixed Swiss Teams, a relatively new NABC event. Thanks to all of them for doing our district

It may seem like a long way off, but the Spring NABC will be held March 9-19, 2017, in Kansas City, Mo. KC's crown jewel is the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art. ### **Chris Compton Wins Barry Crane Top 500**

Chris Compton has unofficially won the Barry Crane top 500 for 2016. This honor goes to a player who wins the most masterpoints in a calendar year. It is Chris' fourth time to win and his third in a row. He also won in 2011, 2014 and 2015. At the end of the Orlando Nationals Chris had 3275.36 points. Kevin Dwyer had 2956.56 and Eddie Wold 2577.24. Although the totals won't be verified by publication it is clear from December tournaments that neither one can overtake him. The record is held by Jim Barrow of Lake Charles who won 3584.26 in 1999.

### MEMBERSHIP

Membership stands at: 168,352 as at the end of October with 91 fewer members than at the start of year. New members increased by 1.3% however, lapsed members also increased slightly.

### BOARD OF GOVERNORS

Richard Popper, an attorney from Wilmington, DE, was elected chairman of the ACBL Board of Governors for a two year term starting: January, 2017. Congratulations.

#### PRESIDENT OF ACBL FOR 2017

President-Elect: Bob Heller, from District 7 was elected President, and he represents: North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia and East Tennessee. Heller's plans to use his position to focus the Board's energies on task forces for three issues of critical im-

"ACBL exists because of the work of volunteers" says Heller. "This year President Monzingo created a task force to focus on how to recruit more volunteers from the ranks of experienced players. As the average age of our membership has increased, so, too, has the average age of our volunteers. Replacing these volunteers as they retire is difficult, so recruiting from within, and persuading people of the importance of giving back to the game, is serious business. A real crisis has emerged because we have lost a generation of folks who could have been trained to fill these roles.

Betty Ann Kennedy 1930-2016

Betty Ann Kennedy, a five-time world champion and member of the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame, died October 30th. She was 86. Kennedy, who held 16 NABC titles and 14 second-place finishes spanning 50 years, was known for her genteel Southern charm, an attribute that earned her the Sidney H. Lazard Jr. Sportsmanship Award in 2011. Kennedy was beloved outside the bridge world as well. A lifelong resident of Shreveport, LA, she was given the key to the city during the 1980s by Mayor John Hussey and inducted into the local Louisiana Hall of Fame in 1993. She will be missed at the bridge tables.

but about 750 below estimate. I think the reasons for this were the increased fees to play and the cost at the site.

Eddie Wold was honored as the Honorary Member of the Year for 2017. It is one of the ACBL's highest honors, presented to a member who has made significant contributions to the game over a long period.

Congratulations to Nancy Stromer who was elected to the ACBL's Charity Foundation Board.

Bob Heller from Tennessee was elected President for 2017.

Through a series of budget cuts, fee increases and the new BBO relationship, the ACBL will report positive income and cash flow for 2016. The preliminary budget for 2017 shows continued positive income.

The Board approved an increase in Technology funding of \$300,000 in 2017 for the ACBL Score replacement project which we hope will be finished by mid-2018.

The Board adopted a new membership fee structure for 2017 and beyond.

Member rates will stay at \$39/year provided members renew for 3 years. If you renew for 1 year the rate will be \$49/year. New member rates will also have a 3 year option at \$29/year or 1 year for \$39. ACBL spends over \$85,000/year mailing membership renewal notices and the new structure is an opportunity to reduce that cost significantly.

The ACBL Educational Foundation adopted a new set of Bylaws which change the voting membership of the Foundation from the ACBL Board of Directors to the Trustees of the foundation. Also changed was an increase in the maximum number of Trustees from 9 to 24. The changes were recommended by a task force that believes the new structure will enable the foundation to raise significant funds from donors over the next several years.

Thank you, thank you for all the support I have received over the last 24 years.

are approaching. The district finals this year are going to be April 8 and 9<sup>th</sup> in Houston at the Marriott Westchase. The district finals, for all four flights; C non-life master with less than 500 masterpoints, B - 0 - 2500, A - 0 - 6000, and the Super Flight which is unlimited, will be a two day event.

Teams for flights B and C must qualify at a Unit Qualifying game. You may qualify at any unit qualifying game, not just your own unit. Flights A and the Super Flight do not have to qualify at the unit level.

If only one team enters the event, that team will be declared the district champion. If two teams enter they will play a two session final Saturday with the winner being the district champion. If three or four teams enter they will play a round robin, two sessions on Saturday to come to two teams. These two teams will play a two session final on Sunday

with the winner being the district champion. If five or more teams enter the event they will play a Swiss or Round Robin two sessions Saturday to come down to four teas. The four teams will play a one session semi-final and a onesession final on Sunday with the winner being the district champion.

Get your teams together. This is a one of a kind event. You don't have to play anyone not in your flight to win a financially supported trip to the nationals in Kansas City for a chance to win a national title. It is fun, rewarding, and a great step in furthering your bridge

### Tales from Wroclaw: Part II By David Sokolow

Last time I promised you some interesting hands from the world championships. I selected four of my favorites from the final against France. Each illustrates an important attribute of a successful player and/or partnership.

Hand #1: Evaluate Your Hand in Light of

Tobi decided not to check back for a spade fit because she had a balanced 9count with lots of intermediates, and South had opened 1, so she figured to have that suit under control. How right Tobi was! Her longtime partner, Janice Seamon-Molson, made five while the French went down two in 44. Result: 13 IMPs for the good guys. Of course, 4♠ could have been right, so maybe I'm resulting, but Tobi's my wife and can do no wrong (at least in terms of bridge!).

Janice's double denied four spades, so Tobi inferred she had clubs; with five diamonds, Janice would have bid 2. (weak), 3D (mixed raise) or 2♥ (limit raise or better). Once Tobi bid 3C, Janice jumped to game as a two-way shot: as an advanced save against 4H or as a making game.

Tobi pulled two rounds of trump, then took a safety play in diamonds in case there were four on her right: she led to the  $\bigstar$ K, then the  $\bigstar$ A, happy to see the  $\bigstar$ Q fall. At the other table, her teammates played  $3^{\vee}$ , down 3. 620 - 150 = a cool 11 IMPs for USA.

Janice opened 2♥, showing at least 5-5 in the majors when vulnerable and 0-10 Tobi bounced to 4♥, shutting French out of their club partial. At the other table, West opened 1♦, silencing North. When South declined to act, Tobi's teammates played 2♣, making on the nose for a 12-IMP pickup. This gadget has generated huge results for Tobi and Janice over the years.

This hand generated a swing in the bronze medal playoff, too: China made 3♥ with the North-South cards, and 2♣ East-West, for 6 IMPs. China ultimately prevailed against Scotland, 117-67.

This hand features Tobi's teammate, Beth Palmer, at the helm. East doubled the final contract and led the ♦6. Beth trumped in hand. Assuming East had hearts for her double, Beth tabled the \(\formall^2\) J, covered, and won in dummy. She lost a club finesse, and roughed the diamond return. Then she finessed the ♥9, pulled the last trump, and claimed. At the other table, with no double, declarer went down one. We won 18 IMPs, all because East's double provided declarer with a roadmap. Remember: if your opponents are in a marginal contract, don't tell them how to play it! As the judge I clerked for was fond of saying, "Nothing is sometimes a good thing to do and ALWAYS a good thing to say.

I hope you found this article instructive and entertaining. Next time you play, see if you can use it to your advantage. Who knows? Next year, I may be chronicling *your* success at the world championships. Stranger things have happened in the bridge world, believe me! By the way, can I be the captain of your team





### Absentee Voting Procedure

The back flap of the outside envelope must be signed by the voter. If no signature is provided, the ballot will not be counted. The Absentee Ballot must be postmarked no later than March 29 and must be received by the Election Judges no later than April 5 to be counted. ### A VOTE ON A POSSIBLE BY LAW CHANGE WILL BE HELD AT THE ANNUAL MEETING DURING THE APRIL ELECTION SECTIONAL OF UNIT 174 - MUST BE PRESENT ON SUNDAY TO VOTE.

#### Change Article VI Unit Board of Directors, Section 3 to:

The Board of Directors, within a reasonable time prior to the annual membership meeting, shall select a Nominating Committee composed of five (5) persons. Said Nominating Committee shall meet prior to the mailing of notices of the annual meeting, and shall prepare a slate of Nominees equal to the vacancies to be filled. Incumbent elected Directors shall be automatically renominated for a second term of office at the expiration of the first term to which they were elected, unless the Board of Directors shall be informed, either in writing or orally at the Board Meeting when the Nominating Committee is selected, that such Director chooses not to be so nominated. Said slate is to be placed in nomination at the annual meeting of membership to fill the vacancies existing on the Board of Directors.

The names of the persons nominated by the Nominating Committee shall be make known to the members in the notice of the annual meeting.

Additional nominations for Directors may be made by the membership, but such nominations must be submitted in writing, signed by at least fifty (50) members in good standing, to the Secretary to the Unit, by mail, not more than 10 days after giving notice as provided in the preceding paragraph. Change Article IX Standing Committees, Section 1 to:

This committee shall be composed of five (5) members in good standing, appointed by the Board of Directors, within a reasonable time prior to the annual meeting of the members: its duty shall be to prepare a slate of Nominees for election to the Board of Directors for the open board positions of the Unit. Nominees for regular elections will be submitted at the Annual Meeting at the Election Sectional.

Fundamental Tip: I have a couple of tips for you this report. The first is about opening 1NT with 15-17 HCP. Some use "a good 14 to 17." Close enough. Here's something I hear at the tables, repeatedly: "I had 16 points, but I had two doubletons." Well, that doesn't stop me anymore, and it shouldn't stop you, either. Eddie Wold convinced me on a cruise a few years ago (hands down, the best thing I ever did for my bridge -playing life!) that the odds favor your getting to the right contract if you open 1NT with hands that contain a fairly balanced 15-17 HCP, even if you have a 5-card major suit or two doubletons. Now in the December 2016 Bridge Bulletin, page 56, Marty Bergen begins his excellent column with "Opening 1NT with two doubletons is neither illegal nor unwise." Now how much more support could you possibly need? Read the article and learn the nuances, and you will increase your chances of getting to the correct contract.

Here's the other tip. Do you know what a "Devil's Coup" is? Daniel **Jackson**, one of our Unit 174 Board members, does, and he saw it recently while coaching a client pair, in looking at a copy of hand records from a session he had not played. He immediately recognized it, saying, "That's a hand for a Devil's Coup!" Daniel then wrote an article about it and sent it for publication on the Internet. You can learn all about it at http:// bridgewinners.com/article/print/ constructing-a-devils-coup/. And now you know what a "Devil's Coup" is and how to construct it.
