Eddie Wold and Mike Passell have won the trials to represent the USA in the D'Orsi Senior Bowl. Eddie played with Mike Levine and Mike played with Marc Jacobus. Also on the team are Dennis and Jerry Clerkin. Bob Morris was non playing captain. They defeated a team that included Bart Bramley, Bob Hamman and Hemant Lall in a very competitive final. Bramley, Hamman and Lall then reached the final of the playoff to be USA2 and lost in a close match.

District 16 has had members on the winning teams of the last three Senior World Championships. Wold and Passell won in 2014 on a team captained by Donna Compton and Hamman and Lall won the last 2 years.

Bramley won the Senior World Championship in 2007. Dan Morse, playing with D16 great Bobby Wolff and John Sutherlin won in 2000. District 16 has done very well in Trials and has had many players win World Championships. In addition to those mentioned the list includes, Petra Hammen, Joan Jackson, Nancy Passell, Shawn Quinn, Peggy Sutherlin, Tobi Sokolow and Mildred Breed.

Here's hoping this year will give us a four-peat in the Seniors.

ACBL Chief Executive Officer Robert Hartman calls the event an exciting, bold experiment. "Recognizing that online bridge competition is a key part of the future of our game, the ACBL and BBO are collaborating to stage a four-session game. This event will enable ACBL members all over the world to attend the NABC via their laptop or mobile device."

Steve Lawrence 1924-2017

Stephen (Steve) Jack Lawrence, 1924 previously from El Paso, Texas and Athens, Texas, died May 12, 2017 in Denver, Colorado. He was 92 years old and had been failing from the effects of Alzheimer's disease for several years

He was a platinum LM with 17,129 masterpoints. The scorecard reported that he went over 15000 in 2003. He was second in the 1997 National senior teams..

Steve joined the marines at 16 and served in World War II. as a tech sergeant and navigator. He became fascinated with bridge while watching comrades play during his return by ship to the United States after the war was over. He graduated from the College of Mines and Metallurgy (later known as the University of Texas at El Paso) where he earned degrees in geology, mathematics, and physics. He honed his bridge skills when he started college in 1947 by playing quite a bit of the time in the Student Union building.

He was a member of the ACBL for most of his adult life. He met his wifeto-be Frances Ann Bianchi Cuen his last semester in college and they married in April 1950. They spent the next 10 years in West Texas, Oklahoma, and in South America in Bogota Colombia and Salvador da Bahia, Brazil where he worked as a petroleum geologist. Steve and Frances returned to the United States around 1960 and came back to El Paso, . He retired from the Civil Service in 1984 and enjoyed many years of traveling around the country playing in bridge tournaments and teaching other players.

After Frances died in 1993, Steve lived in Athens, Texas for over 20 years with Sara Granger. He and Sara were active at the bridge club in Athens and traveled to local towns to play bridge and to direct the bridge games there. Steve contributed greatly to bridge in Unit 225 and served as president of District 16 in the 70s. July/August 2017



2017 is turning out to be a very busy time for the ACBL Board. First, congratulations to Bahar Gidwani who has accepted the CEO position replacing Robert Hartman! The CEO Search Committee, led by Jay Whipple, worked diligently with the candidates and recommended Mr. Gidwani to the Board on May 20 in a special meeting. Many thanks to Robert for his service to ACBL and best wishes for his future.

The ACBL Score replacement project is ACBL's highest priority for 2017. The decision to replace it was made in 2011 due to the age of the code, difficulty with support, and problems with modern computer operating systems. At the Kansas City Board meeting there was a request for volunteers to help test the new system. I recruited Bert Onstott and in May we became "Alpha Testers" for the new system by using the new system when we direct or manage a game. The system is stable, functions well, and computes results identical with ACBL Score. We've identified several needed program changes and improvements to the documentation. I'm optimistic about progress thus far. The rollout of the new system is expected in 2018.

President Robert Heller chartered two taskforces at the start of the year and I was assigned to both. The Tournament Task force led by Margo Hennings is looking at the



I apologize for missing you last issue. I spent almost 4 weeks in Europe taking pictures of tulips, windmills, castles on the Rhine and lakes and mountains in Switzerland. I didn't play one hand of bridge! Now it's back to real life and the bridge tables.

As I write this, District 16 STaC Week is taking place. I hope everyone is getting a chance to participate in a sectional event without having to leave your local club. I've seen a couple of results already and top masterpoint payouts have been over 17 silver points! The district event is only one a year, usually in June, but watch out for combined neighboring unit events scattered throughout the year. causes and potential remedies for the decline in attendance at regional tournaments and regional events at NABCs. Early on we identified two groups that account for a large majority of the decline. The first group, NLM (non-life masters), has the greatest decline. When I asked the reasons through the D16 newsletter for newer players and during discussions around the district, the first thing mentioned is the 500 masterpoint with 200 pigmented points as the reason NLMs are not attending as many regionals. Similar input has been collected by other taskforce members around the country. The 2nd group are those players around 2000 masterpoints and we're soliciting input from that group. The Board will have a discussion in Toronto and look at potential solutions.

The Club Taskforce led by Kevin Lane is looking at how ACBL can better support the Clubs and their associated teachers to increase growth and promote healthy clubs. We've met with club managers and teachers and are currently soliciting input from them by a survey.

In Kansas City, the Board began a process designed to help us improve our processes and be a better partner with our CEO and staff. We will continue that work in Toronto and we're looking forward to spending time on this topic with Mr. Gidwani.

Good news on the financial front as net income is \$100,000 higher than budge through April even though Kansas City table count came in lower than expected.

Over 200 Texans and a few "furiners" participated and vied for script prizes awarded to the first and second place winners. Despite the torrential rain storms and reported crowding of tables, the tournament was declared a success! Tommy Splittberger won the Masters Pairs along with partner Joe Vanham. Joe Quinn and Tom Allan won the Saturday Open Pairs. The Sunday Swiss Team champions were Gail Watkins, Gary Oleson, Kent Jones and Kerr Godfrey. Sadly some of these folks are no longer with us in the real physical sense, and others have just seemingly disappeared from the game, hopefully to return sometime. 



The members of the team are **Dennis** Clerkin, Jerry Clerkin, Mike Levine, Mike Passell, Marc Jacobus, and Bob Morris (unofficial NonPlaying Captain). Bob Morris was specially commended for assisting Eddie's partner, Mike Levine. Mike suffers from severe macular degeneration, and Bob helped him with arranging his cards, whispering behind the screens about what cards were played and displayed. The USBF Website said the team should have been named "Morris, NPC" for the "wonderful job he did as their unofficial NPC"! So now it's on to Lyon, France, for a win there!

Many of us know that Eddie was responsible for exposing those cheating German doctors. That was also from the D'Orsi Senior Bowl competition (whichUK's The Telegraph calls "the most important event in the bridge calendar." It was in Bali, at the 2014 world championships. Eddie describes it at bridgewinners.com/article/ print/diagnosis-foul-play/. If you want to see what those cheating doctors look like, in case you run across them anywhere, check out www.telegraph.co.uk/news/ worldnews/europe/ germany/10732102/Dirtydealings-bridge-world-champions -caught-cheating.html. The WBF found that the doctors coughed if they had fewer than two cards in a certain suit, and that the number of times they coughed indicated the suit of the shortage. It also found that the pair had a separate coded coughing system to indicate the suit to be led when defending.

And speaking of Eddie Wold:

Bridge Pro Alan Truscott wrote this headline in his New York Times column on June 25, 1982: "Bridge: Like Any Real Champion, Eddie Wold Always Tries" and gave this definition: "Among the qualities that make up a true champion are concentration and intensity: a willingness to put forth maximum effort at all times. ' If you play against Eddie these days, 35 years later, you'll know those words still ring true. Surely, being able to decipher that cheating system while in the throes of trying to play championship bridge yourself is truly the mark of a champion. We are so proud of you, Eddie, and send you, Bob, and your team the absolutely best wishes for success in Lyon.

Westside Bridge Academy was #15 on the "Top 50 Clubs" list in the May 2017 Bulletin, with 8.929 tables in 2016. Congratulations!







with the administration of the Shumioa School but in 2007 she determined to get back in to the interpretation of the artwork and Kim agreed to help her..

Together Kim & Carolyn incorporated a lot of new scientific techniques for recording rock art, & with the White Shaman site they eventually produced the most accurate rendition ever done of any rock art panel in the world. In November, 2016, UT press published The White Shaman Mural: An Enduring Creation Narrative in the Rock Art of the Lower Pecos, which was their analysis of the 2,000 year old panel that is probably the most widely known of all the large west Texas murals.

Their book introduces several new approaches for interpreting rock art. Over eight years of intensive work, including identifying artistic puns, they figured out the language that the artists spoke (Corachol-Aztecan) which was the parent language to Nahuatl, the language of the Aztecs.

From there, Kim & Carolyn identified myths recorded in the fifteenth century among the Aztecs that can be identified in the rock art. Their book shows the reasoning behind the sequencing of the application of the paint & the meaning of the colors. On December 21, 2012 (the winter solstice) Kim & Carolyn recorded how the shadow thrown on the panel by the setting sun spectacularly decapitates the moon goddess figure in the panel in what was almost certainly the same story that was recorded by early Spanish ethnographers among the Aztecs.

Kim Cox is not only an avid archeologist, & successful lawyer, but a very accomplished bridge player. He also enjoys hiking the Colorado Rockies as vacation time. The Corpus Christi Club enjoys his company.


