

San Diego is a great place for a national. The weather is perfect, the bayfront setting is breathtaking, and the playing conditions are among the best at an NABC. Several players from District 16 took full advantage and fought their way to the top of the San Diego heap.

Houstonian Eddie Wold and Mike Passell of Plano (does that make him a Planonian?) won the Senior Knockout Teams. Each had a previous win in this event, Mike in 2009 and Eddie in 2010. After comfortable wins in the early rounds, their team won their semifinal by 8 IMPs after trailing by 10 at the three-quarter mark, then vanquished the vaunted Nickell team in the final by 11, after being down by 1 IMP with a quarter to go. Now that is clutch! A round of well-deserved applause, if you please.

Mike's (much!) better half, Nancy, and Petra Hamman of Dallas came in second in the Women's Pairs. Nancy won the event last year (with our own Shawn Quinn). Nancy and Petra peaked at the right time: they averaged 62.15% in the final two sessions, and finished a little more than a board out of first. They couldn't be nicer; Petra even set me up with a partner for the Senior Mixed Pairs. Theirs was a popular win. Keep it up, girls!

Bill St. Clair of Cypress took second place in the 0-10K IMP Pairs. I don't like to play IMP Pairs because it is so random-if your opponents get to a marginal slam that makes, you're game goes down the toilet! So I am in awe of players who do well in that event, like Bill. His score of 61.20 in

Dan Morse, Houston, came in fourth, Bart Bramley, Dallas, ended up sixth, and Nagy Kamel, Plano, landed ninth. Bart also finished seventh in the Reisinger BAM Teams, arguably the most demanding NABC team event. Mark Feldman, Austin, was sixth in the Nail LM Open Pairs. In the 0-10K IMP Pairs, Mary Ann White and Jimmy Reynolds, Laredo, were sixth, while Virgil Massey, Driftwood, and Charlene Sands, Pflugerville, ended up tenth. Bob Hamman, Dallas, tied for seventh in the Open BAM Teams. In the Mini-Blue Ribbon Pairs, Yan Song and Hua Yang, Plano, also finished seventh. Tobi Sokolow and Louis Sachar, Austin, came in ninth in the Senior Mixed Pairs. Finally, Patricia Herrera, Mexico City, ended up tenth in the 0-10K Mixed Swiss Teams. Kudos to all of you for your hard-won honors!

The Spring NABC is March 8-18, 2018, at the Philadelphia Marriott Downtown. Philly is one of the most underrated cities in the US. It has so much to recommend it: noted historical sites, like the Liberty Bell and Independence Hall; great museums, like the Philadelphia Museum of Art and Barnes Collection (get tickets on line); and a flourishing culinary culture, both high- and low-brow (you have to try a Philly Cheese Steak if you've never had one). I have seen more communication to the District presidents and Board of Governors members in the last 6 months than I have seen in the last 2 years. I am very encouraged, particularly with the new programs regarding youth and college bridge.



San Diego Report

San Diego is a beautiful city and the Manchester Grand Hyatt is a great venue for an NABC. The weather was great and the views spectacular. Table count for the NABC was 11747, 253 tables under budget.

Jay Whipple for District 9, Florida, was elected as ACBL Board of Directors President for 2018 to replace Bob Heller from District 7. The Board thanked Bob for his year of service and I am especially appreciative as Bob allowed me to be fully engaged with committee and taskforce work in my first year on the board.

Term Limits for ACBL Board members passed on the first reading. Since a By-laws change is required a second vote will be taken in Philadelphia and if successful, then it needs to be ratified by the Board of Governors. Beginning with terms starting January 1, 2019, Board members will be limited to four 3year terms under this proposal which I co-sponsored.

A Temporary Membership was created to introduce new players to ACBL. It lasts for 30 days and will cost only \$7.99. Temporary memberships will be available from Teachers, Clubs and Tournaments but not online or by phone. Teachers and Clubs will receive an incentive rebate for each temporary membership. The discussion centered around a \$5 rebate. Players may purchase multiple temporary memberships and it will also replace the \$4/session charge at tournaments for non-members and lapsed members. While this initiative has several purposes, it is expected to stimulate membership growth and will enable better tracking of students and players.

A bevy of other District 16'ers captured top-ten finishes in NABC events. Hemant Lall, Plano, finished third in the North American Swiss Teams. In the premiere pair event at the Fall NABC, the Blue Ribbon 169 Players from District 16

The following is a summary of key Board actions taken in San Diego:

NABC Online Event - The Toronto event was a success and the Board approved having three in 2018. They will probably be run prior to the start of each NABC.

Anyone who joined ACBL prior to Jan 1, 2010 and whose membership lapsed prior to that date will retain the 300 masterpoint requirement for Life Master. If the member is reinstated prior to July 1, 2018, there will be no additional charge other than paying current dues. For those who reinstated after July 1, 2018 an additional \$50 fee will apply. To be reinstated with inclusion of masterpoints won while the membership was lapsed, a person must buy a three-year membership at the time of Uniform Electronic Device Policy for NABCs and Regionals - Requires regional tournaments to have the policy used at NABCs. The District 16 Board already adopted the same policy, but expect more rigorous enforcement at our regionals.

Beginning in 2019, the fall NABC will feature the Soloway KO event.

Limited Sectionals may now include players with up to 750 masterpoints which is increased from 500.

A change was made for Open Swiss events to award higher masterpoints by being credited for flighted Gold Rush events whether the Gold Rush is a pairs or Swiss event. Open Pairs events already enjoy this benefit and the change was made to have equity between Swiss and Pairs.

Unit Championships - These are currently sanctioned by day and session, morning afternoon or evening. The Board approved a change to allow every club to participate in a Unit Championship provided they hold a sanction for the day of the event and the Unit is NOT conducting a Unit Wide Championship where multiple clubs compete and overalls are awarded across the clubs.

10 Big Ideas - Continued development of Advertise, Promote Sponsor and Improve Teaching Effectiveness were agreed. Specific funding proposals for these ideas are expected in Philadelphia. More study will be done on Integrate Social Bridge, Simplify Masterpoints and Strength Based Ratings. Another round of Big Ideas is expected early in 2018.

Both the Club and Tournament Taskforces made reports. Study will continue around the issues including the Life Master masterpoint requirements.

Qualifying for Flights B and C for the Grand National Teams 2018 by BJ Sanders

This Season, District 16 has made a major change in how one can Qualify for Flights B* and C** to play in the District Finals for the Grand National Teams (GNTs.) Historically, B and C teams played at a Unit-Sponsored Qualifying two-session event in the late Winter/early Spring timeframe. Those Teams then competed at the District level in the Spring and the winners of that event went on to compete in the Finals at the Summer Nationals in July/August.

Starting this GNT Season, to be eligible to play in the District 16 Finals, Flight B and C players can now qualify at single-session GNT Club games or Unit two-session events. One only needs to qualify one time, but may qualify multiple times. Additionally, a B or C Flight player can qualify at any GNT event in District 16. Players qualify as individuals and are free to switch teammates for the District Finals. Please note that all members of the Team must be within the masterpoint specifications for the Team to be able to qualify and there is no handicapping or mp averaging permitted in a Qualifier. The Conditions of Contest are available on the District 16 website under Conditions of Contest>GNT.

So, Flight B and C players, must Qualify at a Club Qualifier by the end of March or a Unit Qualifier. Then, SuperFlight, Flight A, and Qualified B and C players will play at the District GNT Finals the first weekend of May $(4^{th} - 6^{th})$ at the Marriott Westchase in Houston. Flight B competition begins Friday evening, continuing through the weekend. All other Flights compete on Saturday and Sunday. The winners of this event will advance to the National GNT Finals which are from Wednesday, July 25 through Sunday July 29 at the NABC in Atlanta.

Finally, please note that many of these Club Games will have people participating with more than 2500 mps. They will earn mps but not be included in the Qualifying calculations.



Taking pictures for Unit 207 is fun! Seeing all the happy faces at Regionals and Sectionals is great.

Here are some tips and tricks that I have learned since I started:

- The best camera is the one you have! I use an iphone to photograph the photos. Whatever camera you have will work.
- Find a suitable spot to take the pictures. You don't want a background that is too busy or an area that will distract from the participants.
- Try to find an area with good lighting to show everyone's face. Everyone looks better in good light.
- . When taking pictures of teams, have the two tallest people sit down and have the other two stand behind them.
- . Try to get the participants to smile or even laugh!
- After taking the photo ask participants to look at the picture to be sure that they are pleased. Make sure that their eyes are open, collars down, happy faces.
- Be sure to write down everyone's name so that they can be identified properly when the photo is printed in the Scorecard! •

- With the information above, each photo is renamed so the scorecard editors can correctly identify the players and the event they won. For example:


