
Nason-Dater Win Grand National Pairs, Flight B Heymann Wins Silver Ribbon Pairs

For most District 16 stalwarts who attended the spring NABC in Philadelphia, the tournament was a bust. The weather wasn't great, and the bridge was uninspiring. On the bright side, however, three players rose to the top in national events. As they say on Law and Order, "These are their stories."

Michael Heyman of Fort Worth captured his first NABC title with his win in the Silver Ribbon Pairs. To play in this event, you must be at least 60 years old (get it--Silver Ribbon?)-which, given the aging ACBL membership, doesn't restrict the field all that much! Playing with a first-time partner, Michael racked up 60% and 63% in the finals to win by just over a board. That's quite a feat: 306 pairs competed in the two-day event. Let's hear it for Michael!

Jeff Dater and Scott Nason of Dallas won the Grand National Pairs, Flight B. The GNP is a grassroots event, starting at the club level and culminating at the nationals. Flight B is limited to players with less than 2500 masterpoints. The finish was a nailbiter; their margin of victory was just 1.59 matchpoints. This was their first NABC win, but Jeff had come close before-- he was second in the Red Ribbon Pairs in 2013. Congrats, guys!

Other than the winners noted above, only two District 16 pairs made the

Top 10 in NABC events (!): Mike Passell of Plano and Chris Compton of Dallas were eighth in the Platinum Pairs, while Tobi Sokolow and Louis Sachar of Austin finished ninth in the Mixed Pairs. Th-th-th-that's all,

I am confident we'll do better at the summer NABC, to be held July 26-August 5 at the Atlanta Marriott Marquis. Atlanta may not have the cache of Las Vegas or Washington, but it's a popular site for summer nationals. Check out the restaurant scene in Midtown, a short Uber ride away, tour the Carter Presidential Library, or visit the Martin Luther King, Jr., National Historic Site. Then again, if Atlanta's not your cup of tea, there's always the fall NABC in Honolulu. Ciao (or should I say, "Aloha"?)!

While I know that many of you have been playing bridge for decades, you may not know much about your representative body: the District 16 Board of Directors. Putting aside that possibility that you don't care, intrepid soul that I am, I am about to tell you everything you never knew about the Board (and didn't care!) First, there are 25 Districts in the ACBL. District 16 has 18 Units and is comprised of most of Texas and all of Mexico. The Board meets three times a year, on the Saturday of each of the following Regionals: Houston (January/February); San Antonio or Austin (July); and Dallas (September). We usually meet for breakfast and conclude our meetings in time for the 10 a.m. game.

At our meetings, we receive Unit and Committee reports, ACBL and BOG reports, consider policy changes, initiatives (including education, membership, I/N, etc), tournament issues, and the progress of events (GNTs, NAPs, STaCs). While we seldom have serious controversy, we always have lively discussion! Only Unit representatives are authorized to vote, but that doesn't keep everyone present from voicing opinions (and, indeed, attempting to vote, too!) There is a process in the Bylaws which calls

for weighted voting (votes calculated based on a Unit's membership), but in the five years I've been on the Board, we've only needed to go to counting weighted votes twice.

Other Board members (non-voting) include the Executive Committee (President, 1st and 2nd Vice Presidents, Executive Secretary and Executive Treasurer), who are elected by the Board for two-year terms and are charged with managing the affairs of the District between meetings. (See the Notice regarding Amendment to the Bylaws inside the Scorecard). Also on the Board are the D16 representatives to the ACBL Board of Directors and Board of Governors, Coordinators for the GNTs, STaCs, and NAPs, Chairs of Committees for Education, Awards, Charity, Publicity, I/N, Disciplinary, Appellate, Recorder, Webmaster, Membership, Tournaments, and Scorecard. As I mentioned last issue, the minutes of each meeting are posted on the District website. Hopefully, your Unit representative is reporting to your Unit about what happens at our meetings. Please feel free to attend---though you will have to buy your own breakfast!

The weather was on the chilly side as the temperature rarely made it above 50 degrees, but the people and venue were warm and

made it above 30 degrees, but the people and venue were warm and welcoming. Table count was 10317.5 which was above the estimate of 10,000 tables. The Philadelphia Marriott was a fine venue and tournament co-chairs Joann and Bob Glasson as well as their key volunteers did an excellent job.

Congratulations to Michael Heymann who won the Leventritt Silver Ribbon pairs with his partner Tom Chang from Toronto and to Jeff Dater and Scott Nason who won the NAP Flight B pairs event!!!

The Board continues to focus on improving our processes and relationships and progress was demonstrated by all of the prework done by committees so that we were able to have about ½ of our board time to focus on discussions of important topics.

A motion was approved to increase the percentage of Gold points awarded at Non-Life Master regionals from 25% to 33%. This takes effect in time for Austin's NLM regional in May. The logic for 33% is that is equivalent to the award when the average masterpoints in a bracket/strat fall to 500 or less in an open regional.

An accompanying motion will allow an Open Sectional to count 65% of the concurrent tables in the NLM regional for its Open events when the tournaments are held in the same location. Just as Austin is doing in May, many tournament organizers prefer

concurrent events to help manage site costs and volunteer load. This motion requires a 2nd vote in Atlanta before it can take effect.

The Board approved a new set of convention charts which will take effect later this year. ACBL plans a major communication effort through the Bridge Bulletin explaining the changes. This work has been done by the Competitions and Conventions Committee over the past few years. A big thanks to all who contributed to the effort especially Chris Compton from D16.

Revisions were made to the STaC conditions of contest to required clubs to use the hands designated for the date/time by the sponsor in order to qualify for overall awards. Clubs that do not comply will be entered into a separate pool with awards reduced to 65%. I felt this penalty was too severe and penalized the players rather than the club or director if an error was made, but I was outvoted on the issue.

An expansion of Regionals at Sea from 4/yr to 8/yr was approved. The increase will be gradual with 5 in 2018. One change is that the District must approve the cruise when either a port of origin or destination fall into district territory. I pushed for this amendment to avoid having cruises overlap our tournaments.

A number of changes to the bylaws were approved on their first reading. These are primarily being made to conform to New York law which has been changed in the past couple of years. These along with Board term limits will have a second vote in Atlanta and those that pass will be presented to the Board of Governors for ratification in Atlanta as well.

"3. If a member of the Executive Committee does not represent his/her Unit, he/she shall nonetheless be entitled to vote at Board meetings. His/her vote shall be equal to the average weighted votes of Directors (as determined pursuant to Article III. Section 5)."

NAPS

Get ready for the new NAP cycle beginning in June! This year each District will have the opportunity to send 3 A pairs, 4 B pairs and 4 C pairs.

During June, July and August, you have the opportunity to earn half red/half black 100% Each club is allowed to hold two NAP games per sanction per month. Although you only need to qualify once to advance to the next level, you can win extra points all summer

This prestigious event is staged in qualifying rounds at the club, unit, and district levels. It culminates in a final held in conjunction with the 2019 Spring NABC in Memphis, TN.

The games are flighted: (Flight eligibility is based on the June 2018 masterpoint cycle which is run May 6, 2018: A (Open): B (0 to 2,500) and C (0 to 500, NLM) Pairs who qualify at the District level are eligible to play in the NABC in Memphis. Last year ACBL paid a stipend of \$700/per person for those who qualified 1st in the District final and \$300/per person to the 2nd place qualifiers who played in the National event. In addition, there are no entry fees for the National event once you have qualified.

District 16 adds additional monies to each of the qualifying pairs. Qualifiers must play in the national event to receive the stipend.

ACBL awards the District with most tables in play at the club level an additional subsidy in flights B & C, so support your clubs when they hold qualifying games. We have won this extra subsidy in flight B several times in recent years, but we need more C tables in play in order to get the additional subsidy in

NAP Schedule is as follows:

Club level: June, July, August Unit level: From September through Decem-

Let me begin this month's article by congratulating Janina Kuzma and Leigh Primerano who qualified for and participated in the North American Pairs (NAP) event at the NABC tournament in Philadelphia. Both said they had a wonderful time and Leigh commented that she now has enough gold points to qualify for Life Masters. Now for the rest of the points.

For this article I contacted Jerry Helms and asked if he would agree to an interview by email. Jerry is a Platinum Life Master with over 25,000 master points and is a wellknown teacher, player and author. You most likely read his column "Ask Jerry" in the monthly Bridge Bulletin magazine or the ACBL Bulletin. You can learn a lot about his priorities by reading his bio on his website where most of the article is devoted to discussing his son. Jerry graciously agreed to answer my questions, so this month will be about his responses.

Jerry said that he began playing bridge in his late teens having been introduced to the game by his brother who had found the game in college. Later when he himself attended college, someone in the dorms asked who knew how to play bridge and Jerry says he blatantly misrepresented his experience. He believes that his background in playing cards of any variety helped ease his entry into playing bridge and would be an advantage to anyone who wants to play the game at a higher level. Although he started at a relatively young age, he thinks that anyone at any age can learn the game and enjoy it.

When I asked how the average player can learn more and improve their game, he gave an insightful response which I quote here fully: "Just like many other sporting endeavors, playing with and against the strongest competition that your ego will allow, is the best way to get better in a hurry. For some, this is almost impossible because the complexities of the game prevent anyone from being

'good' quickly. Their rationale, 'I am a smart person. I am not mastering this game quickly. There's nothing wrong with me, so there must be something wrong with this game.' In short, some are not willing to go through the learning pains required."

I can't tell you how many times I have heard players at the club say that they dread playing against the best players. They should instead be excited to be able to play against such wonderful talent where they can learn more about the game. Playing against and learning from these players would be like playing football with Tom Brady or tennis with Serena Williams. No one in these other activities ever has a chance to play regularly with top rated players as we do in bridge.

When I asked Jerry what he does to maintain his interest in playing after reaching 25,000 master points, he responded that he loves playing the game, especially at the highest levels. Although he enjoys teaching, it is the play of the game that keeps him enthusiastic about the game.

As for teaching, he believes that an individual can be a good teacher but at best only a good player, but, at the same time, someone can be a great player but a terrible teacher. He works on his teaching and his play independently so that he can maintain his excellence in both.

I have more than reached my limit for the Scorecard so I will have to continue this next month. I hope you enjoyed hearing from Jerry as much as I did.

Author A.A. Milne is best known for his series of children's books featuring his nine year old son, Christopher Robin, and Christopher's best friend, Winnie the Pooh. In case you aren't aware, Pooh is a stuffed bear with only a bit of fluff for a brain. In "The House at Pooh Corners", Christopher Robin explains a great new idea to Pooh: "Planning is what you do before you do something, so that when you do it, it's not all mixed up."

The late Edgar Kaplan turned this idea into a bridge axiom when he said, "An average plan, well executed, will almost always beat a brilliant plan which is misplayed." Kaplan's longtime partner and system codeveloper, Alfred Sheinwold was even blunter when he said, "Players who never stop to think before they play to trick one are the salt of the earth . . . they always lose."

Just about everyone can learn to plan better and win more often. The best way for most to accomplish this is taking advanced lessons from a competent teacher. Each club in Unit 183 has one or more teachers available. I'll mention here only the local teachers.

Don Troy was a bridge player and World War II hero (a Flying Tiger). He died on March 18, 2018. The following column was written by Stewart Doreen, a novice bridge player and the editor of the Midland newspaper, the Midland Reporter-Telegram. The article was published on March 25, 2018.

There Was A Lot to Learn from Don

I am fortunate to meet some remarkable people at the Allison Bridge Center, but I have never met anyone like Don Troy.

Donald Wesley Troy was a 95-yearold marvel of a man, who, sadly, died last week. I write sadly but Don is probably smiling. In a 2011 interview with the renowned Ed Todd, Don told Mr. Ed that after his wife of more than 60 years died in 2009 that he cried for her "every day." My guess is that Don is again feeling lucky to be with Mary Troy.

I met Don at the bridge center on a typical Thursday when the good players (like Don) played with the players who weren't as good (like me). He usually played with Belle Harris, a masterful player, and when it was my turn at their table the sharks smelled blood in the water. It was a given that Don and Belle would come out on top, but that didn't matter. I was in observation mode. I would watch Don act like he was 95 years young. One hand, he would play the board like a maestro, the next he would sheepishly raise a bid to a place he knew would make Belle have to work that much harder. Occasionally, you'd hear a more-spirited Don pro-

vide some emotion during a hand that didn't go as he expected. Whatever the case, he was mentally sharp and a pleasure to be around.

But to know and appreciate Don Troy was to understand he was of the heralded "Greatest Generation." He didn't talk the talk of what his generation did for our country--and therefore for people like myself. He walked the

He fought in World War II and Korea. Ed Todd's article indicated that Don flew 260 combat missions, 171 in the China-Burma-India theater and 89 in Korea, "without a scratch" to

airplane. He also earned more than a dozen medals and awards, including the Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Medals, and the Bronze Star for heroism or meritorious service in combat. Respect goes out to a man with that type of record. People like Don know what real service is. They lived it. We didn't use the word as a cliché to describe something less significant.

Upon hearing of Don's passing, I immediately thought of the opportunity lost. I had always told myself I needed to sit down with Don for an interview to talk about the life he experienced. I wanted to know more

about the man who said "I have been lucky my entire life" referring to his life as a World War II and Korean War aviator, a post-war engineer, and a man who married exceedingly well.

I will be among the many who will miss Don at the bridge table. I can't speak for the others, but seeing Don there just made it feel like a better game. Maybe he reminded me of my grandmother who played well into her 90s and could teach someone half her age a lesson or two about "getting to game" or winning big.

It probably had more to do with Don being a hero and a person who fully experienced and appreciated life. Don, I hope you and the love of your life are together again. You will be missed.






