Phil Clayton Wins 0-10,000 Pairs; Hua Yang and Yan Song Second in **0-10,000 Mixed Swiss**

I had such high hopes for District 16 after the first few days at the Atlanta NABC. We had one win in the bag and lots of players chomping at the bit for another. But not until the final day did a D16 pair rise to the occasion and capture second-place

Phil Clayton of Frisco crushed the competition in the 0-10,000 Pairs: he finished 110 points ahead of the runners-up-the same margin that separated the second- and twelfthplace pairs. Now that's what I call a dominating win! Phil is a recent transplant from California but, to paraphrase a popular bumper sticker, he got here as soon as he could. Phil's name will be familiar to those who frequent Bridgewinners.com; his posts are always interested and laced with humor. Congratulations, Phil, on your inaugural national win as a Texan. Here's to many, many

Hua Yang and Yan Song of Plano finished second in the 0-10,000 Mixed Swiss. In the final, they were never worse than second place. Such consistency is rare, particularly in a nationally-rated event. Please join me in a hearty round of applause!

World Champions Mike and Nancy Passell of Plano had an excellent week in Atlanta. They finished third in the Mixed Board-A-Match Teams, with a score that would have won the event most years. Mike was also third in the Life Master Pairs, the premiere pair event at the summer NABC.

Two District 16 teams advanced to the quarterfinals of the Grand National Teams. In the Championship Flight, Dan Morse of Houston, Tom Peters of Grapeland, Ken Schutze of Austin, San Antonians Babu Koneru and Ira Hessel, and Nagy Kamel of Plano lost to the perennial winners from District 9. In Flight C, our all-Houston squad comprising Jack and Jeanette Dean, Marcia Doyle and Robert Burridge lost to a team representing New England (District 25). A good effort, one and all.

Multiple D16'ers had top-ten finishes in NABC events. Hemant Lall, Dallas, was 5/8 in the Spingold. Rajasekhar Menon, Southlake, wound up fourth in the 0-6,000 LM in the 0-2,500 LM Pairs, followed by Pierce, The Woodlands, in sixth. sixth place in the Red Ribbon Pairs. Carrollton, were 8/9 in the Mixed ico, sat ninth in the Women's Pairs. Last, but not least, Dan Morse landed tenth in the Senior Swiss

Now that we know more about ourselves, it must be clear that we need to nurture our newer players. With that in mind, this column is affectionately aimed at our advancing players.

I was asked to address the I/N group at the Austin Regional. I am no expert... not on slam bidding, defensive carding, nada! But I do understand the challenge of being at the steep end of a learning curve! I remember when my goal was to have more points than I weigh! So, with apologies for repeating myself, here is the gist of what I recommended:

Never confuse a lack of experience for a lack of talent! Be patient with yourself; most players in the open room have been playing for decades and table time really counts!

It is a given that we all make mistakes on virtually every board. We generally fail to recognize all our errors—thank goodness! Use hand records to review your results, focusing on boards where you "dropped a trick" on defense or declarer play or missed the optimum contract. My personal goal is to make better quality errors!

Read bridge books and study either in print or online. There are great learning resources available on the ACBL website, in the ACBL Bridge Bulletin (e.g., the Bidding Box and It's Your Call) and the Bridge World (e.g., the Master Solvers' Club) Bridge Base Online, and the Common

Be your own cheerleader! Engage in positive self-talk before each game and especially after a bad board. Ruminating about a bad board will create successive bad boards. "Box it up' and put it aside for post-mortems once the game is complete.

Be kind to your partner. Criticizing your partner at the table in front of opponents is destructive; shaming will only serve to increase errors.

Play with better players. Most good players understand the value of bringing newer players along and are willing to answer questions and agree to an occasional game. If your Unit offers a Mentor/Mentee program, sign

Play against better players. Even though your results may suffer temporarily, playing in open games against better players is a great way to learn at the table.

Play with partners you enjoy. Sometimes, though, the best of friends do not make the best of partners. Table chemistry is magic; if it doesn't work, spend time together at the dinner table rather than the bridge table.

Please inform your Unit representative and your District Board what we can do to help you improve your

Atlanta and the Marriott Marquis were great hosts for the NABC. Table count was 11.268.5 just over the 11,200 projected in the budget. The playing rooms were spacious and well lit and the temperature was comfortable.

Congratulations to Phil Clayton of Frisco, Tx and his partner Andrew Gumperz for their victory in the 0 -10,000 Pairs event!

The motion I co-sponsored to impose term limits for the Board of Directors passed its 2nd reading and was ratified by the Board of Governors. Effective January 1, 2019, board members will be limited to four three -year terms. Terms started prior to that date are not counted.

Technical changes to the ACBL Bylaws to conform to recent changes in New York law were also passed by the Board and ratified by the Board of Governors.

The motion I sponsored to allow Open Sectional events to count tables from a concurrent Non-Life Master Regional passed it's 2nd reading and will take effect immediately.

The Board voted to extend the Zero Tolerance policy to all tournaments which require an ACBL employee to be the Director in Charge. Thus, Open Sectionals that are played at Club facilities will have ZT regulations as the DIC is required to be an ACBL Tournament Director.

Masterpoint awards for the NAP and GNT District finals were increased for all levels of competition. There were a lot of technical cleanup motions relating to bridge were passed.

Most were unanimous.

On Thursday, July 26, the Strategic Review Committee held an all-day workshop to discuss some key topics which have emerged as we are updating the Strategic Plan. In addition to the Board of Directors and the Leadership Team from Headquarters, we invited the ACBL Educational Foundation Board of Trustees and some guests. They were Uday Ivatury, CEO of Bridge Base Online, Sam Marks, a teacher and club owner in the Atlanta area, Steve Moese, Chairman of the Board of Governors Club and Teacher Taskforce, and Betty Starzec of D16, President of the American Bridge Teachers Association. I'll be writing more about this work in future reports

Our search for a new Executive Director is underway as we've published an advertisement in the August edition of the Bridge Bulletin and in the NABC Daily Bulletin in Atlanta. The Search Committee, which I chair, has been re-working the search process and are ready to begin evaluating resumes and conducting interviews.

I was nominated to join the Board of Trustees of the ACBL Educational Foundation, and was elected to serve at their meeting in Atlanta. The Educational Foundation became independent in December, 2016. During the Atlanta meeting Sharon Anderson led an exercise to begin a Strategic Planning process for the Foundation and we'll pursue it over the next several meetings. I'm excited about the opportunity to serve and work as a member of the Foundation's Board.

One thing that I like to do is to have players tell me their stories. This is from Jim La Fountain who recently made Emerald Life Master:

How Trashcans Jigsaw puzzles and Flashlights Can Improve Your Game. By Norman Beck

Congratulations you found bridge. I have good news and bad news. The bad news is that is the hardest game known to man. The good news is that it is the hardest game known to man. When I started in 1978 I would ask 6 life masters a question and get 6 different responses. I knew they could not all be right. I changed the question to who is the best player in Tulsa and to that question I got one response. And that was Byron Greenberg. I 50 something year old guy who owned a nightclub and rumor had it that you could maybe make a bet or he knew someone who could help you out. I went to this club at the age of 19 with a fake ID and a desire to learn the game. My thought was get him to teach me and in two weeks I would be as good as he was. FYI it has been the longest 2 weeks of my life. Myron summed up learning bridge in 23 words.

1-Play all you can play

2 read all you can read.

3 Always play with better players. 4 Learn something every time you play.

New players make a mistake early on in wanting to learn new conventions. Now they don't know why they are learning it, what the convention is for or when they should or should not use it. Nor they know the ramifications when they don't use it. But they learn it and think they are a better player. In Fact they are worse. In they don't know what they don't

know. One reason people do this is that it is easy. Trust me this is

The key to learning bridge is being able to count to 13. We all know how to count to 13 but knowing how and actually doing it are two different things. Playing bridge is like doing pushups it is hard at first but the more you do it the easier it gets. Make no mistake certain conventions you must have. Staymen, Jacoby Transfers, Drury, Blackwood and Negative Dbls. Now I play more than that but if you give me those on most hands I will be just fine. The next time a partner wants to play some new convention say "It sounds great but I am afraid I will forget it lets not" You will be off the hook and it sounds nicer than saying "That is a dumb idea you id-

The best advice I ever got about the game was the Trashcan. The trashcan is what you should use the least but always use it. Let's say your partner opened 1NT and you bid 2H as a transfer and he forgot and passed and you played 2H when you were cold for 7 Spades. You just got a big fat zero or you made a bad bid and went set 1400. You got a really big 0. You know something you can still win. But you can't win if you get 2 or 3 more right in a row That is where the trashcan comes into play. When you get a bad result regardless of the reason throw it away. You can't fix it. You can't take it back or have

overs. It is done and gone. You need to think about board 2. Most people can't do this. Really good players who know better will have a bad game because they can't throw away a bad result.

When I started playing bridge I often felt I was in a dark room with no flashlight and I would stubble around looking for the right contract. You need to have a flashlight with you at all times when playing bridge. You need to turn it on so partner can see. As an example. You let my partner turn on the flashlight with say one no trump 15-17 and I have a very good idea where we should be. The sooner you can turn on the switch the better. Let's say you need a diamond lead and you have A9234 of diamonds and you can afford it signal with the 8 and not the 4. Partner will be able to see the 9 the 4 not so much.

One can't be a good player and not read. The more books the better. Here are books you must

1-Why you lose at bridge

2-Anything by Mike Lawerance

3-Anything by Eddie Kantar

4- Killing Defense by Kelsey

5-The Rodwell Files By Eric Rod-

You learn to count to 13 and read the above mentioned books and understand what they say and you will be hard to beat.

Unit 172 has many top-notch players with over 10,000 master points and years of playing experience. If you play in any events when they play, I'm sure you're used to seeing their names at the top of the winner's column. I asked these players what the average player should focus on to improve their game.

One expert likened learning to play bridge to another game: golf. Trying to learn golf on your own only ingrains bad habits. Better players, even the pros, take lessons. The same is true with bridge. Many different types of playing lessons are available: There are classes for both novice and intermediate players. There are individual playing lessons where you can play with a pro and learn different techniques. Some experts will even come to your home where they will teach you and three of your friends about the game by dealing and playing actual hands. Ask about cost and availability. You may be surprised at how reasonable these lessons are.

Some experts commented that bridge is a partnership game so it is desirable to develop a regular partnership. If one player does not understand what the other is trying to say by their play or bidding, a good game is impossible. Discuss how to bid in certain circumstances; explore how to play various card combinations. If something comes up you don't understand, after the game ask one of the top players where you play for their advice.


There is an old saying in bridge that the road to hell is paved with good conventions. Several experts emphasized that players should limit their use of conventions until they thoroughly understand the basics. Every convention gives up something so you should know what you are giving up and what the advantages and disadvantages are. One expert went so far as to say only top players should have more than 5 or 6 conventions. Another recommended frequently reviewing your convention card with your partner to make sure you remember all your conventions and their responses. Learn one thing at a time, and don't add anything new until you are totally familiar with what you have agreed to play.

Several stressed thoroughly understanding the basics: What is a forcing bid and what is not? What cards do you discard when partner or the opponent is leading? What card do you lead so partner will know what you have in your hand? When is it right to cover an honor with an honor and when is it not right? Several players recommended Eddie Kantar's Defensive Bridge Play which is available in the lending library put together by the Unit 172 board and housed at the Fiesta Bridge Club.

One expert said that their own game did not start to improve until they learned to count, count, and count: Suits, trumps, and points. Add to this the ability to form a picture of the cards in each players hand that comes from counting and your game will improve. One top player recommended Mike Lawrence's How to Read Your Opponent's Cards (also available at the Unit lending library). I want to thank all the players who provided input for this article. I hope that it will prove useful to you in developing your enjoyment of the game. As one expert commented, the learning in bridge never ends.

early 1970's I was playing in a Sectional Tournament in Syracuse, New York. Two gentlemen approached our table and handed my partner and me some single-spaced type-written sheets of paper. They announced, "This is our system." With only a few minutes for review, the best I could do was determine that it seemed every bid, up to and including four clubs, was artificial. This had no small impact on my hiatus from duplicate bridge for over twenty years.

Fortunately, today we don't have to face such foolishness. However, there are still hundreds of bridge

conventions around. But how many of these should you incorporate into your system? As a point of reference, Jan and I play a basic form of Audrey Grant and Eric Rodwell 2/1, which includes over twenty conventions.

William Root recommends thirty-one be played. Many of these are different than Grant's picks. Barbara Seagram and David Bird have presented fifty conventions that you should know. They don't say which ones you should actually play though. Mike Lawrence, in his excellent CD, "Conventions," also stops short of any recommendations.

In search of concise guidance on which ones to play, I went to ACBL. According to ACBL, while they define eighteen conventions on their web site, these are for information only. They make no recommendations

Not one to give up easily, I turned to one of Unit 183's better player, teacher, and theorist, Buck Buchanan. Buck's recommendations for selecting which conventions to play are:

The need comes up frequently.

The bid isn't used for anything else.

The need is critical. It doesn't come up often, but when it does, you need something.

The assignment of a new meaning to a bid expands the bidding menu.

A meaning can be applied flexibly, e.g. such as the cheapest possible bid.

Not too much burden on the memory.

Excellent, Buck. Thank you very much. We can all benefit from these ideas.

I then posed this question to our President Linda Spangler, she said, "Choice of conventions is an interesting topic. I make my choice if it is essential to better find the best contract. I also try to choose the version that is the least complicated. You don't have to play a lot of conventions to play a good game, but you should understand the ones you play."

Sounds good enough for me. Thank you, Linda.

They've done it again. Last year the Granbury Duplicate Bridge Club raised over \$11,000 during "The Longest Day" to fight Alzheimer's disease. This year, using about the same format of games, meals, instruction, dances, etc., they raised no less than \$13,500. Granbury's Mayor Nin Hulett even proclaimed June 21st "The Longest Day." With a population of only 8,000 and two games a week, "Fitz" and the good people down south are to be commended.

On a final note. Recently, Darlene Shirey and Mary Hoger played a seventy plus percent game. Way to go y'all.
