## Rosemary Kelley Earns Platinum Life Master <br>

Rosemary played "kitchen bridge" for the next several years, not starting duplicate until she was 28 , playing evenings and Saturdays at the Alamo Bridge Club in San Antonio. She really doesn't think she learned much about the game until she met and married Paul Kelley in 1989. They met many wonderful folks as they travelled to Sectionals, Regionals and Nationals throughout the country. She has served as District 16 President, served on Unit Boards in San Antonio and Austin, chaired numerous Sectionals and Regionals, and organized bridge cruises for several groups. Together with Beth and Paul Tobias, Paul and Rosemary were the founders of the Bridge Center of Austin, still going strong today. Rosemary has won numerous Ace of Clubs and Mini McKinney certificates, but is proudest of her Charity Committee appointment, Texas Spirit Award and Oswald and Jim Jacoby Award

## The Longest Day

The ACBL raised nearly $\$ 1.2$ million for The Longest Day in 2018 bringing the cumulative total to over $\$ 4.7$ million over six years.

Expanding the event from a single day to a week allowed many more clubs to participate, particularly smaller ones that hold only one or two games a week in places where they might not have access to their space on a given designated day. While the number of ACBL groups that made direct donations remained about the same at 260 , the tota number of participating clubs rose dramatically to nearly 500 .

The ACBL is not just the top group in fundraising for The Longest Day, but contributes more to the Alzheimer's Association than the next nine groups combined.

Through the years District 16 has had many clubs contribute. This year the Granbury Bridge Club was $15^{\text {th }}$ in the entire ACBL and raised $\$ 14,331$ to lead the district! The Westside Bridge Club in Houston finished 20th with $\$ 12,117$. Other clubs in Houston raised over $\$ 4000$ more. Beaumont, which always does a great job, was $22^{\text {nd }}$ in the ACBL with $\$ 10,220$.

The Granbury club averages 6 tables a week and to be $15^{\text {th }}$ in the country is an amazing achievement.

## LONE STAR REGIONAL <br> EVENTS INCLUDE MINI-SOLOWAY

The Mini-Soloway KOs are fast becoing a avorite event at regional tournaments throughout the ACBL. Houston's Lone Star Regional will have two-day MiniSoloway events on Tuesday-Wednesday and Thursday-Friday. The Mini-Soloway will replace Bracket 1 of the Bracketed Swiss events beginning on Tuesday and Thursday. The Bracketed Swiss event will be for teams in Bracket 2 and lower Teams with an average of 12,000 masterpoints or higher will automatically be placed in the Mini-Soloway.

Here's how it works:
The first day is run as a 2 -session Swiss/Round Robin guaranteeing play for the entire day
The top 4 teams qualify for semifinals the second day.
The top qualifier chooses from $3^{\text {rd }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ place team as semifinal opponent.
$2^{\text {nd }}$ day play continues for $1^{\text {st }}$ place through $4^{\text {th }}$ place
If a team does not qualify to play on the $2^{\text {nd }}$ day, a regular Bracketed Swiss is available to play the next day
Teams can play up if they desire Teams who qualify for Bracket 1 that do not want to play in the Mini-Soloway cannot play in the Bracketed Swiss Event.

Why have a Mini-Soloway KO?
All members of the team win equal masterpoints in the overalls You are guaranteed two sessions of play on the first day. Increased MP awards for winning a 2-day event.
Teams are essentially playing a KO with no unlucky first round draws.

Houston is always looking to enhance your bridge playing experience. At the moment the Mini-Soloway is just for the top bracket, but can be done for the lower brackets as well. Houston looks forward future of the Mini-Soloway in Houston.

## For this month's arti-

cle I would like to focus on the clubs in Unit 172. There are a few by-invitation-only games, namely at Dominion CC, San Antonio CC, Oak Hills CC, and a Friday bridge game with Jacque Fisher, but this and the next article will review the open clubs. I am going to start with the Texas hill country towns of Boerne, Kerrville and New Braunfels. Next time we'll look at Gonzales and San Antonio.

In the 1800s, German intellectuals fled their country and moved to the Texas hill country and founded group of towns known as the Latin Colonies because the philosophical discussions they had in the various towns were conducted in Latin. One of those towns was originally called Tusculum after the Roman town where the Roman statesman Cicero lived. The name of the town was later changed to Boerne.

Boerne currently has a thriving bridge club hosted by Carol Ramberg in the Rainbow Senior Center at Kronkosky Place. They meet on the second and fourth Thursdays of each month 1:00 pm and host about 10 tables aged when they started two years Each session includes a lunch buffe Each session inclus a lunch buffet and beverages. They have quite few Life Masters that regularly play at the club, but the skill level of the players is equally distributed among A's, B's and C's. Carol can usually find a partner for anyone who calls her in advance of the play date. Most people who play there comment on how friendly the atmosphere is and how spacious the rooms are where they play.

At the same time the Freethinkers from Germany were establishing the Latin colonies, German farmers were settling in other parts of the hill country. Among these settlements was the town of Kerrville. The bridge club there is in the capable hands of Rich there is in the capable hands of Rich weekly session at the YO Ranch Hotel at 1:00 on Mondays and Fridays.

They average about 4 to 5 tables with gusts up to 7. There used to be as many as 10 to 13 , but Kerrville is primarily a retirement community and primarily a retirement community and age takes its toll. While they don't do anything beyond hosting the game, they have a reasonably competitive game. Some of the players there regularly place high at tournaments, while some are Rubber bridge players trying their hand at something new. To generate interest in the community at large, Richard sometimes teaches bridge at a course held at the local high school, and he teaches on an individual basis as well. If you're ever interested in attending there, Richard can generally always arrange for a partner for anyone who calls him in advance.

All of the German settlers to the hill country, after arriving at the port of Indianola, made their way to the town of New Braunfels from where they dispersed to the various communities across Texas. New Braunfels has a long-standing bridge club run by Catherine JoAn McGaffic. Games are every Tuesday and Thursday at 12:30 at the Unitarian Church (which has handicapped access). Every $5^{\text {th }}$ Tuesday they have a special game at 9:30 and then the regular game at 12:30. They have prizes available at the $5^{\text {th }}$ Tuesday games. Catherine (who also goes by JoAn) says they always have plenty of snacks available (which she mostly makes herself) so that players rarely need lunch. They have a very good level of play with lots of C's B's and A's and all with lod ond are good plays whe ment by all. Catherine, in an attempt to generate interest in the bridge club, is a member of the Chamber newcomer's club where she tells people about the availability of bridge in the community. Catherine says the club has a great atmosphere-everyone gets along very well. She can generally arrange a partner for anyone who calls in advance.

The lexicon of bridge is filled with numerous sayings concerning both bids and play. These are basic truths that all players learn in their earliest days of mastering bridge. As novices days of mastering bridge. As novice we hear we should question if the perience we should question if the are really true and of any value to us Sometimes they are, and sometimes they aren't. We should certainly know the difference.
This month we'll look at two of these old saws. Which are: "the queen lays over the jack" and "always go
with the field." one of the oldest. It goes back to the days of Whist, before there was contract bridge. It is quite fresh in my mind because a few weeks ago I went down in a four heart contract by guessing wrong on a two way club finesse. My opponent gratuitously noted that if I led the jack of clubs from the board, four hearts would have made. It's bad enough when your partner offers free advice when you blow a cold contract, but even worse when an opponent does. Where does this old idea that the queen lays over jack come from, anyway?

In the days of rubber bridge declarer would play a jack, frequently

LHO would cover with the queen. fifty one other cards. An ace might as When the trick was finished it would well lay over a duce, as a queen lay go onto a pile, the two piles would be combined given a inadequate shuffle, and dealt for the next hand. Frequently, queens would end up on top of jacks of the same suit. How often this happened, no one knew.

With the advent of duplicate bridge each player's thirteen cards stayed together until after the play. Then they were combined, still given an inadequate shuffle, dealt out into piles of thirteen cards each, and put back into the boards. Queens and jacks might live together in the same deck for years and never meet. Dealing machines have changed things even more. With trillions of hand combinations possible, the location of any one card is independent of the
fifty one other cards. An ace might as
well lay over a duce, as a a oueen lay over the jack of the same suit.

From the forgoing we can safely say this old saying is no longer valid and deserves to go on the trash heap to be forgotten. But still, if I had played the jack of clubs instead of the ten, four hearts would have made.
"Always go with the field." What does this mean? What is "the field". It is not every north-south pair bidding four spades and being plus 420 . All pairs having the same results on a board happens less often than grand slams. I am going to define a field as having over half of the pairs on a board reaching the same contract. This means on a nine table game, if five pairs have the same result, that is

the field. How offen does this happen on every hand? sometimes hardly ever?

To answer that I analyzed results from over 350 boards produced by the Fort Worth dealing machine

There will be a field, or consensus contract, on about $50 \%$ of all hands played. In other words half of the time there will a field for you to chase. Is this worth the effort? When you go with the field, you will have an average or better score $60 \%$ of the time. A score like that will put you close to winning consistently. But what happens when you don't go with the field, or as it is sometimes called, play for a top or bottom. Roughly $30 \%$ of the time you will score average or better; $70 \%$ you will finish
below average. This is not a winning proposition.
We can all agree that "going with the field" is good bridge. The real ques tion is . . . How do you go with the field? Next time we'll take a look at that.
