the finals to victory. Congratulations, Greg, on an impressive victory!
Hua Yang of Plano won the $0-10,000$ IMP Pairs, one step up from his runner -up finish in the $0-10 \mathrm{~K}$ Mixed Swiss this summer. He played steady bridge: third after the qualifying phase, second after the first final, and first when it counted. He also had top ten finishes in two other NABC events (see below)! I have no doubt we will be hearing a lot more from him in the future.

Virgil Massey of Driftwood and Charlene Sands of Pflugerville captured the $0-6,000$ Blue Ribbon Pairs for their first NABC win. As their frequent opponent and sometimes teammate, I can testify that you would be hard-
pressed to find a nicer pair. They had a massive $67.25 \%$ in the first qualifying session and played well enough down the stretch to win by a two-
board margin. You did Austin proud!
For a moment, we had a fourth win. At the close of play in the Blue Ribbon Pairs, the premiere pair event at the fall NABC, Chris Compton of Dallas was the apparent winner. But a controversial appeal (not involving Chris) dropped him to second. What an awful way to end a grueling threeday battle against 205 of the top pairs in the world (or any event, for that matter). Justin Lall of Little Elm finished second in the North American Swiss Teams, a blockbuster three-day event that brings the fall NABC to a close. This year's edition attracted 71 teams. Justin also finished fourth in the LM Open Pairs and seventh in the Open BAM Teams. Nice showing, JLall! Bob Hamman of Dallas finished second in the Senior KO Teams. Bob is one of the all-time greats. Even in his 80's, Bob continues to play at a world class level. To paraphrase Cole Por
ter, "He's the Top!" 'nuff ter, "He's the Top!"' 'nuff said.

A bunch of D16'ers had top-ten finishes in NABC events [note: where there were fewer than ten places overall, only players who made the overalls are listed]. Babu Koneru, San Antonio, finished eighth in the prestigious Reisinger BAM Teams. Tobi Sokolow and Claudette Hartman, Austin, came in fifth in the Women's BAM Teams. Dan Morse, Houston, wound up seventh in the LM Open Pairs. Hua Yang, Yan Song, and Yuanluo Wang, all of Plano, landed seventh in the $0-10 \mathrm{~K}$ Swiss; Ellen and Ira Hessel, San Antonio, were ninth. Yan and Yuanluo also finished eighth in the Women's Pairs. Finally, Hemant Lall, Dallas, was ninth in the NA Swiss.

The spring NABC will be in Memphis March 21-31. Memphis is famously known for Graceland, home of "The King," Elvis Presley, and Beale Street, home of the blues. ## Grand National Teams

GNT Season is underway. Have you qualified? Do you have a Team? Do you know how to qualify? There are 4 levels that compete in the GNTs District Finals, in Houston, April 5-7. The winners of that event go on to compete at the GNT Finals in Las Vegas, July 17-21 Flights B and C Players must Qualify at a Club or Unit Qualifier held now through March 2019. SuperFlight and Flight A advance directly to District 16 Finals.

To be eligible to play in the District 16 Finals, Flight B and C players can qualify at single-session GNT Club games or Unit two-session events. One only needs to qualify one time, but may qualify multiple times. Additionally, a B or C Flight player can qualify at any GNT event in District 16. Players qualify as individuals and are free to switch teammates for the District Finals.

Please note that all members of the Team must be within the masterpoint specifications for the Team to be able to qualify and there is no handicapping or mp averaging permitted in a Qualifier. The Conditions of Conaging permitted in at Qualifier.
test are available at: the District 16 website under Conditions of Contest $>$ GNT. They can also be found at: http://web2.acbl.org/documentLibrary/play/coc/ gnt/16.pdf
So, Flight B and C players, must Qualify at a Club Qualifier by the end of March or a Unit Qualifier. Then, SuperFlight, Flight A, and Qualified B and C players will play at the District GNT Finals the first weekend of April $(5-7)$ at the Marriott Westchase in Houston. Flight B competition begins Friday evening, continuing through the weekend. All other Flights compete on Saturday and Sunday. The winners of this event will advance to the National GNT Finals which are from Wednesday, July 25 through Sunday July 29 at the NABC in Atlanta.

Please check with your local clubs for dates of Club Qualifiers. Finally, please note that many of these Club Games will have people participating with more than 2500 mps . They will earn mps but not be included in the Qualifying calculations.

## LONE STAR <br> REGIONAL 2019 <br> MINI-SOLOWAY <br> EVENT

The Mini-Soloway KO is a foursession two-day event with all teams guaranteed two sessions of play on the first day.

* Day 1 is run as a 2-Session Swiss/ Round Robin depending on the number of teams entered in this event. *The top 4 teams will advance to the KO phase on Day 2 for the semi-finals and finals.
* The top qualifier will select either the $3^{\text {rd }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ place team as their semifinal opponent for the morning session. Play continues in the afternoon to determine $1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ as well as $3^{\text {rd }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ place.

Our Mini-Soloway KOs will be held On Tuesday-Wednesday (10am and 2:30pm) and Thursday-Friday (10am and 2:30pm)

Conditions of Contest
The field will consist of the top bracket equivalent of the regular Bracketed Swiss Events beginning on Tuesday and Thursday. Thus, any team with a masterpoint (MP) average of 12,000 or higher will fall into this bracket and automatically placed into the Mini Soloway KO.

Teams with a MP average of 12,000 or higher may not play in the Bracketed Swiss on Tuesday or Thursday. Teams with less than a MP average of 12,000 may request to participate in the Mini-Soloway KO if they so wish. The Director-in-Charge may create bracketing for this event if necessary based on MP average.

Teams competing understand that this is a 2 -day 4 -session event. As only the top 4 teams of a Mini-Soloway bracket will move forward to day 2 of this event, all other teams will be eligible to play in the Swiss Team games the $2^{\text {nd }}$ day.

Barbara, a wonderfully entertaining and informative teacher, was in Houston to conduct a seminar hosted by Westside Bridge Academy. The seminar was sold out. She and her husband, Alex Kornel, played in two sessions at the club, as well, coming in first in one of them and placing in the second.


## Education Initiatives in District 16

There's good news to report about education initiatives in District 16. One of those is ACBL's new teacher certification program. The Best Practices Workshop replaces the Teacher Accreditation Program that was in place for many years. The new program emphasizes "how to new program emphather than "what to teach". The Dallas Unit hosted the first BP workshop in District 16 prior to their Labor Day Regional. I was one of 14 participants. It was my view, and I believe, that of my classmates that it was very worthwhile. It will be offered again prior to Houston's Lone Star Regional on Feb. 3-4. Betty Starzec did an outstanding job of teaching the class in Dallas and will be the instructor at Houston also.

Another class typically offered at one or more of the Regionals is the ACBL Director's Course. One of these is planned prior to the San Antonio Regional in July.

Another new initiative is the establishment of a Teaching Materials library on the District website. It includes donated material which can be used by teachers or studied by players of a wide range of abilities who want to improve their game. Just go to the website and click on Teaching Materials to see what is available.

I'd also like to share information about two new initiatives in my home unit (San Antonio) that might be of interest to others. This past year the Unit Board approved the establishment of a lending library. Our unit has one commercial club The club agreed to provide space for the library The Board approved a $\$ 1000$ budget for shelving supplies and book purchases, and Unit mem and book purchases, and Unit members were invited to consider book donations. There were several generous donations, and we now have over 600 volumes in our collection. Usage has been good and feedback favorable. Circumstances will vary in other Units. Some may have no commercial club with daily games, and a few may have several such clubs. Start-up costs can be reduced with donated shelving and fewer

purchased books initially. We didn't pursue monetary donations, but that may work in some Units.

The second local initiative is new for us, but it has been around for years, primarily in larger commercial clubs with strong efforts to recruit new players. That is to schedule an "ask the expert" session after the game. Players can stick around he ask questions about hands just o ask questions about hands just played. Sometimes the expert may encou" in a good teaching situa tion" in one of the hands and introduce the technique involved. We asked one of our Board members to coordinate the program, which consists of recruiting the experts. At this point, the program is scheduled only on Monday afternoons, following the typically largest game of the commercial club. As I was writing this, I recalled a version from 50+ years ago. As a new player at a weekly game of about 9 tables in Kingsville, we had a group of 8 or so who adjourned to the local beer joint to debrief. That model has a lot of merit, but maybe shouldn't be ponsored by bridge Units. Altern sponsored by bridge Units. Last time we looked
at three of the clubs in Unit 172, Boerne, Kerrville and New Braunfels This time let's look at Gonzales and San Antonio.
When the call went out from the Alamo in 1836 for men to come to their aid in fighting off Santa Anna, the only place that responded to the call was the town of Gonzales. The first Wednesday of the month is a celebration of play birthdays in the month when they irnce frey if the bey get a free play if the birhay is in that month. Every Wednesday also fea tures a light lunch
The level of play at the club is average plus plus, as Laurie says. Fiesta offers the Common Game every day and players from the club routinely and consistently show up in the top 20 nationwide. There are lots of les sons available as well as the supervised play for newcomers.
They have an ambassador program at the club so that there is always someone available to play every day even for people who walk in at the last minute with no partner. A mentormentee program sponsored by the Unit Board is also available at the club.
People who play there say that this is unlike other clubs they visit on their travels. The players always seem to make everyone feel very welcome The bright and airy environment of the club also contributes to a conducive atmosphere for playing cards. Rebecca Brown, the President of Unit 172, says that all the clubs have diffi culties with the aging of the bridge playing population, but that the Unit is vital and dynamic. In our last issue we discussed some time honored bridge clichés. This time we'll look at another one. "Go with the odds." What does this really mean. If you have the choice of play A which works $51 \%$ of the time, and play B which works $49 \%$, then, in the long run, you are better off to try A over B . This is really so close a choice, many other factors could affect your decision. This includes all bids and plays made before you have to make a decision.

While, all that has gone before, is always a consideration; a bridge player's interest should be directed to choices with a wider range of outchoices with a wider range of out-
comes. These are the most basic: a comes. These are the most basic. a
simple finesse ( $50 \%$ chance of sucsimple finesse ( $50 \%$ chance of suc-
cess); when opponents hold six cards cess); when opponents hold six cards
in one of your suits that they will divide three-three ( $36 \%$ chance); when you are missing five trumps they will divide three-two (68\% chance); and the old stand-by "eight ever, nine never". This means of course, with an eight card suit finesse for the queen, with nine cards play AK to drop the queen. The odds of the drop are $52 \%$, versus $50 \%$ for the finesse.

When you go against any of these odds, or the dozens of others not mentioned, you are in for a bad score. For example, say you are in a four spade contract, with eight spades missing the queen. With queen third
onside, you play AK for the drop. The queen is now a winner. So you score 420 rather than 450 . As every duplicate bridge player knows, one duplicate bridge plan be the difference between a good board and a very bad board.

This has only scratched the surface of a topic you can write a book about. In fact people have written books on the odds at bridge. Of these, one that is considered among the best is Hugh Kelsey and Michael Glauert's "Bridge Odds For Practical Players". It's published in the UK, but is available from Barclay-Barron and Ama-
of information and numerous real life, practical examples. But unless you are into statistics, parts of it will cure insomnia.

To conclude, always remember, every bid or play you make is conditioned by all that has been said and done before.

Llano Estacado Bridge Unit 197 originated in 1958. The Unit included both Plainview and Amarillo, Today, Amarillo is part of another Unit and the Plainview club is no longer in existence. Calver Curry became the first Unit 197 president became the first not finish his term. Frank Poindexter filled in during 1958-59 and was elected to serve a full term in 1959-1960.

Duplicate Bridge in Lubbock has a nomadic history. During the beginning years, Duplicate Bridge players were vagabonds. They frequently changed playing venues, shifting as often as the West Texas winds. Before finally locating in its permanent location on $74^{\text {th }}$ Street, Duplicate Bridge games were played all over town, frequently the Country Clubs.

Unit members wanted a permanent facility and personally committed time and money in helping build the Center. The lot was purchased from TIME-DC, Inc a truck freight com pany, on April 26, 1977. A proposal contract to build the current Bridg Center was submitted by Bridge Center was submitted by Tusha Buildings, Inc, on May 31, 1977 The Bridge Center became a realit and the first Duplicate Bridge game was played at its present locatio October 1, 1977

Unit members enthusiastically contributed their time and money to meet the cost this new obligation. They joined together in fund raising activities such as garage and magazine sales, collected aluminum cans, and held bake sales. Each person contrib uted at least a $\$ 100$ to help reduce the indebtedness. Their efforts showed remarkable success and the bank note was paid in full June 7, 1983, in five and a half years.

The Bridge Center has received many gifts since 1983. There were volun teers who served on different pro jects. When there was a need to pro vide or repair, they gave their time, money and labor. Over the years, examples include: materials for the eaves around the building, various kitchen fixtures such as an electric range, microwave, and an ice machine. When new, more comfortable chairs were needed, everyone contributed at least $\$ 90$ per chair, and some purchased more than one. With so many people possessing generous hearts, thing have always gotten done.
Many players remember Marguerite Marquam helped to keep alive the game she loved, serving many year as a teacher and director. We hono her memory with the annual Margue rite Marquam Memorial Charity Game.
