Memphis provided a delightful setting and southern hospitality for the NABC which had 9644 tables and was higher than budget by $7.2 \%$. 2019 continues to see reduced costs and improved operations. Here are the key Board actions from our meeting:

The Code of Disciplinary Regulations was amended to impose a lifetime ban of members who are expelled for premeditated collusive cheating or who resigned their membership to avoid prosecution in NABC+ or equivalent events in the future. Prior regulations allowed for the possibility of readmission after a minimum 5 -year ban provided guilt was admitted and rehabilitation was demonstrated. The possibility for readmission still exists for convictions in lower level events.

In conjunction with this change, the Board directed management to establish a policy for voluntary relinquishment of titles by the teammates of those convicted of collusive cheating. We deferred to the Las Vegas meeting proposed changes that would strip titles from teams won prior to conviction for collusive cheating of members of the team.

A task force with representatives from the Board of Governors and Board of Directors presented a draft of a restructuring proposal. While still very much in the development stages, the initial draft includes two governing bodies - the Executive Board (now the BOD) and the Senate (now the BOG). The
