## Four District 16 Players to Represent USA in World Championships in China

In May the USBF held trials to qualify 6 teams in 4 categories to represent the USA at the world Championships in China. Teams were qualified in four categories. Open, Women, seniors and mixed.

In the Women's event, Lynn Baker is on the USA1 team and Sally Wheeler, playing with longtime D16 partner Cindy Bernstein, will represent The USA on the USA 2 team.

Dan Morse, playing with Gaylor Kasle, and Bart Bramley, partnered by Kit Woolsey, won the Seniors event and are USA1.

The teams first played round robins to qualify teams for the KO rounds. In the Open event there was only one winner as the All 4 of the teams in the Senior semifinals contained D16 members.

Bob Hamman, Bart Bramley, Babu Koneru and Greg Hinze made it to the quarterfinals before losing close matches. A team that included Hamman and Bramley lost by 7 and those interested could watch the match unfold on BridgeBase. One hand that stood out was cold for 7 in three strains. At 7 tables one had opened a good hand with 55 in the black suits 1S and most got to 7S or 7C with no interference. But Bart's partner opened an artificial club and the opponent got to bid 2 H with KJxxxx and a side Q . Their partner was able to bid 4 H jamming the auction so Bart and Kit missed 7. I was surprised that after the 1 S opening no other N ventured 3 H . Preempts are a 2 edged sword and Bart passed a hand with AQJxxx of hearst, vulnerable, in the seniors that had a better ending. The opponents had to find the Q of spades in a slam contract missing 4 . When there was a preempt they worked out

Qxx in the other hand so Bart's silence earned a slam swing.

Three of the four finalists in the Seniors contained D16 members. The Morse-Bramley team defeated Mike Passell and Eddie Wold in the semifinals and Hemant Lall in the finals. Peggy Sutherlin lost in the USA 2 women's final.

Overall it was a outstanding showing for District 16.

Many of the match segments were shown on Bridge Base online and the championships will be held in Wuhan, China from September 14 to September 28 . Times are 13 hours later than Texas but you can cheer your teams on Bridge Base during the hour of the wolf.

## NAPS Continue in Summer by 马axie Tom

The NAP cycle began in June! This year each District will have the opportunity to send 3 A pairs, 4 B pairs and 4 C pairs to the national final. This prestigious event is staged in qualifying rounds at the club and district levels. It culminates in a final held in conjunction with the 2020 Spring NABC in Columbus, OH.

During June, July and August, you have the opportunity to earn half red half black $81.8 \%$ sectional rated points at your own local club. Each club is allowed to hold two NAP games per sanction per month. Although you only need to qualify once to advance to the district level, you long! This year the district boar long. This year the district board voted to allow everyone who qualifies at the club level to play in the San Antonio District finals award San Antonio. District finals award overalls. Flight C is 250 gold for overalls. Other masterpoints in all
flights are red.
The games are flighted: (Flight eligibility is based on the June 2019 masterpoint cycle which is run May 6 2019: A (Open): B (0 to 2,500 ) and C ( 0 to $500, N L M$ ) Pairs who qualify at the District level are eligible to play in the NABC in Columbus. Last year ACBL paid a stipend of $\$ 700$ per person for those who qualified 1 st in the District final and $\$ 300 /$ per person to the 2nd place qualifiers who played in the National event. In addition, there are no entry fees for the National event once you have qualified.
District 16 adds additional monies to each of the qualifying pairs. Qualifiers must play in the national event to receive the stipend.

ACBL awards the District with most tables in play at the club level an additional subsidy in flights B \& C, so support your clubs when they hold
qualifying games. We have won this extra subsidy in flight $B$ several times in recent years, but we need more C tables in play in order to get the additional subsidy in C.

## George Rosenkranz 1916-2019

Long time District 16 stalwart George Rosenkranz, both an icon of duplicate bridge and steroid synthesis, passed away June 23.
Dr. Rosenkranz won 12 NABCs and was second 15 times. Many of those events he partnered with Eddie Wold.
His wins include the Vanderbilt His wins include the Vanderbilt,
Reisinger and the Blue Ribbon p Reisinger and the Blue Ribbon pairs.
George represented Mexico in 3 Olym piads and the USA in the Bermuda Bowl. He also wrote 12 books on bridge and created the Ronex system and the Rosenkranz double and redou-

Dr. Rosenkranz also pioneered chemistry both industrially and academically in Mexico. He and his company, Syntax, was notable for the synthesis of cortisone, progesterone and the development of the birth control pill.
Eddie Wold writes "This was truly a sad day for me, as I thought my friend, mentor, bridge partner, ski instructor, table tennis opponent, etc. would live forever. I had the great pleasure of meeting and partnering with George in 1977. We were constantly tinkering with our system and learning the game together. We went on to win many nationals and get to the semis of the Bermuda Bowl. George finished playing by winning 2 KOs at the Santa Clara regional playing 4-handed when he was 90 ! He quit to take care of his second child who had cancer. I was lucky enough to be with him at his 100th birthday party. The next day he went to Stanford to present the scientific achievement award named in his honor. He and his equally incredible wife Edith will be remembered as two of the most cherished individuals ever to grace our game.

Col. Dewitt Hudson of Arlington TX passed away on Apr. 7 After retiring from the U.S. Army in 1982 he devoted his time to bridge. devoted his time to bridge with over 3000 masterpoints


Dewitt was president of Dis-
trict for three terms and also served in many other capacities. He was a member of the ACBL Board of Governors for 19 years.

Dewitt was Unit 183 Texas Star recipient in 2006 and received the Oswald and James Jacoby Service Award in 2007 It is District 16's premier service award
Dewitt is survived by wife Elizabeth and sons Tony and Eric.

3/ Reflect. Go over the hand records and see what different actions you could have taken. Consider table dynamics and how to deal with issues that affect your game

4/ Discuss. Many better players will be glad to answer specific questions.

5/ Read
a/ A few books will be recommended. b/ ACBL Bulletin
c/ Bridge world

6/ Watch. Kibitzing the best players can often give insight. Not only on technical issues but when to take pause. Most errors are just playing too quickly.

You can always watch some great bridge on Bridge Base Online. They often have great tournaments.
