

District 16 players did MUCH better at the bridge table at the Las Vegas summer NABC than they did at the spring NABC in Memphis. (Their success at the craps table or poker tables—or lack thereof—is beyond the scope of this article; as I testified in my previous column, "What happens in Vegas stays in Vegas." I'm a man of my word(s)!)

Newly-crowned champions in the Grand National Teams--Flight B are Tom Rush of Houston, Wes Peirce of The Woodlands, Pawel Hanus of Carrollton, Bill McCarty of San Antonio, Subravata Biswas of Katy, and Ari Sippola of Richardson. They won the event in convincing fashion: ahead by 15 at the half, they outscored their District 22 opponents by 38 IMPs in the second half to seal a 145-92 victory. Winning a GNT event is impressive. Scores of teams from the US, Canada and Mexico compete at the unit and district levels to earn a place in the event finals at the summer nationals. Bravo, guys. Keep up the good work!

Several Dallas denizens earned second-place laurels in Vegas: Barbara Ferm in the Mixed Swiss Teams, and Scott Nason and Jeff Dater in the 0-2500 Spingold. Their names will be familiar to readers of this column, and no wonder: this was Barbara's fifth runner-up finish in an NABC in less than four years, while Scott and Jeff won the Grand National Pairs—Flight B last year (Jeff has another second, too). Consistency may be the hobgoblin of small minds, but consistently excellent results are rare indeed. Congrats to all three of you!

A plethora of District 16'ers had top ten finishes in NABC events. Jack LaVigne, Houston, and Barry Schaffer, Frisco, finished third in the Senior Swiss while Greg Hinze, San Antonio, landed in the same spot in the Roth Swiss. Ira Hessel, San Antonio, Dan Morse, Houston, Tom Peters, Grapeland, Ken Schutze, Austin, Nagy Kamel, Plano, and Phil Clayton, Frisco, took 5/8 in the GNT—Championship Flight. In a parallel universe, Hua Yang and Yan Song, Plano, James Zhan, Sugar Land, and Lunhui Lin, Dickinson, were 5/8 in the GNT--Flight A. Tom Rush, Houston, was 5/8 in the 0-2500 Spingold. Tom Peters, Grapeland, Joe Quinn, Sugar Land, Tom Breed, Kingswood, and Ron LaCour, Georgetown, came eighth in the Senior Swiss. And in the Life Master Pairs, Bart Bramley, Dallas, was ninth, as was Michael Heymann, Fort Worth, in the Open Pairs, and Justin Lall, Little Elm, in the Roth Swiss.

The fall NABC will be held November 28-December 8 at the Marriott Marquis in downtown San Francis-I won't regale you with the many reasons to go to the "city by the bay." Come see for yourself why it's one of America's top destinations, and a consistently popular site for an NABC. But even if you can't make it there, you can still win a national championship and a bushel of points by competing in the Robot Individual, held online November 23-25. [Consult the Bulletin or the ACBL website (ACBL.org) for more info.] Either way, here's to a wonderful—and mercifully cooler-autumn. Ciao!

The Summer NABCs are behind us; hope you got lucky in Las Vegas! Several D16'ers were very successful-and lucky, too, one supposes. Congratulations to winners of the Flight B GNTs—Thomas Rush (Houston), Wes Peirce (Woodlands), Ari Sippola (Richardson), Pawel (Carrollton), Biswas (Katy) and Bill McCarty (San Antonio). Also congrats to Barbara Ferm (Dallas) and her team for the 2nd place win in the 0-10,000 Swiss and to Greg Hinze (San Antonio) and his team for 3rd place in the Roth Open Swiss. Big overall masterpoint winners include Bart Bramley (Dallas), Thomas Rush (Houston), Eddie Wold (Houston), Mike Passel (Plano), Venkatrao Koneru (San Antonio) and Ira Hessel (San Antonio).

On July 6, your Board of Directors met during the San Antonio Fourth of July Regional. The following are the salient points from the meeting:

Paul Cuneo updated us about the ACBL happenings (see his report)

The Scorecard digital v. paper two-year trial is underway; approximately 50% of Units opted for digital copies. Until further notice, digital subscriptions are billed at \$1.51 per person/per year; paper subscriptions are billed at the existing rate of \$3.60 per person/per year.

The San Miguel Regional will continue to be hosted by Unit 173 (Mexico City), with net revenue shared on a 60/40 basis with Unit 254 (San Miguel).

Lauri Laufman (Houston) was appointed I/N Chair, replacing Laura Delfeld. Buck Buchanan (Arlington) will chair the Teacher of the Year award committee. There are two D16 vacancies on the ACBL Board of Governors. The President, with the concurrence of the Board, will make appointments to fill these vacancies.

Unit 225 (East Texas) has had great success with teaching bridge to 4th and 5th graders. They report an increase in math skills and have received the school board's endorsement. They have had more students sign up than they can handle! What a great problem!

This year, D16 was awarded the right to send a second team in Flight B. The Board voted to give the second qualifying GNT Flight B team a \$1600 subsidy plus entry fees on a par with the first team.

NLM Regionals will not be subject to the NABC surcharge assessed on Saturdays at open regionals.

The District will reimburse up to 40% of the ACBL costs incurred for any Unit hosting either a full or refresher director's course to the extent that the course revenue is insufficient to cover the expenses.

In support of the Fall 2021 NABC to be held in Austin, the District has scheduled a series of fundraising games (extra points!) beginning November 17-23, 2019.

"Aces and Knaves" a film promoting bridge, will be shown at the Houston 2020 Lone Star Regional The District agreed to pay \$250 to help defray the cost of the showing.

The Cosmopolitan Hotel in Las Vegas provided a great venue for the NABC which had 13,622 tables; very close to the 13,500 estimate. Congratulations to the Flight B GNT winners:

Suvabrata Biwas, Pawel Hanus, Bill McCarty, Wes Peirce, Thomas Rush and Ari Sippola!!!

The ACBL Board decided to vacate all 1st and 2nd place finishes in NABC+ events for either pairs or teams where members have been convicted of collusive cheating after August 22, 2015 which is the date that Boye Brogelund went public with his allegations of cheating.

After spirited discussion it was decided the titles would remain vacated rather than advancing pairs or teams to the vacated positions.

The Board also passed a motion eliminating the Temporary Membership program and establishing a free Guest Membership program. The Temporary Membership program had not achieved its objectives and the predominant use was by individuals who attend tournaments to use a temporary membership to reduce their costs of tournament play. The Guest Membership allows people to have digital access to the Bridge Bulletin and to accumulate masterpoints in sanctioned play. Since it's free, we hope to see an increase in enrollment by teachers and higher conversion of students to full membership in the long run. The program is effective January 1, 2020

The Board approved a motion to designate the month of February for special games at clubs to benefit the ACBL Educational Foundation. This action will help the Foundation continue to expand programs which are jointly sponsored with ACBL such as the Collegiate program which is growing


The Board Restructuring proposal was reviewed and the we agreed to have more work on bridge issues done by committees staffed by members recommended by the Board of Governors. The Governance Committee of which I'm a member will be developing motions for San Francisco. This is a first step towards restructuring the work of the Board.

A presentation by MBA students from Arkansas State University was made on strategic issues for ACBL. During the Board discussion which followed, the Board committed to developing a Strategic Plan and commissioned four teams of Board and Staff to work on Membership Growth, Tournaments, Membership Participation focusing on our newer members and Social Bridge between now and San Francisco. The teams will report to the Strategic Initiatives Committee, which I chair.

The ACBL Educational Foundation Board also met in Las Vegas. New officers are Joel Kramer President, Robert Todd Vice President, Paul Cuneo Treasurer and Jane Champion Secretary. The Foundation is actively partnering with ACBL and the American Bridge Teachers Association (ABTA) to grow the number of people playing bridge and help ACBL grow membership. The Foundation is contributing \$35,000 for a new website being built by ACBL to interest people in learning bridge and working with ABTA to create education networks in communities so that interested people will be contacted by teachers and have opportunities to enroll in lessons to learn bridge.

Robert Todd reported on a survey the Ed Foundation commissioned through Survey Monkey of people 45 and over with some college education. There are about 70 million people in that category in the U.S. Of those, the survey found that about 15 million said they knew how to play bridge. Of those, 5 million have played in the past year with 2 million actively playing at least monthly. Of those who do not play, 20% or about 14 million say they would be interested in learning to play. Clearly the challenge will be to identify these people and help them find teachers. The new website should be a big help and we'll also be working on expanding out social media presence.

I hope each of you have a great fall season at the tables and look forward to talking with you as I visit tournaments and



Saga of a Success by Gay Roach Wondering how to get new people interested in playing bridge? Here is an overwhelming success story.

In 2016 Sandy Hilliard and Charles Ford from Canton, Texas, went to the elementary schools and talked them into letting them teach bridge to kids in the 3rd & 4th & 5th grades after school one day a week for an hour and a half. There was a problem with children who rode the bus and also interference with other after-school activities, but in spite of that, there were 12 students the 1st year.

The school and the parents noticed improvement in math scores for the kids. One mother was emotional when her son got his first 100 ever on a math test. So Sandy and Charles were welcomed back for the 2nd year. They had over 100 kids sign up. They were unable to handle that many, so they winnowed them down to about 38 students.

This past school year 150 kids signed up!!! Again they had to cut that number to 32 students you've got to get them young!

Double Dummy Day

John McAllister

Think about who introduced you to bridge and what it took to get you to your first duplicate game. Is there anyone in your life with whom you would like to share the game?

My name is John McAllister and my love for bridge brought me to my first NABC in Memphis in the spring of 2012. One evening, my partner invited me to a brainstorming session on "How do we get more young people interested in learning bridge?" Having just left my career in hedge fund marketing, I thought that I might be able to

1/ Prepare.

We all play for enjoyment and many do not want to make the game seem like work. But if you just prepare 1 hour for every 8 hours you play the game it will be very much more enjoyable. You start by having a complete convention card. Now it should be a system and any added conventions should just fill spots that are not covered naturally and really most things are. Don't worry about playing the absolute best defense against a No trump opener - the best one is invariably the one your partner is playing.

Go over some card play problems. Really there are many fine books but the best problems are often fundamentals ones that you have gotten wrong int the past.

Take an old hand record and go over the bidding with your partner.

Generally it was hotter in Vegas than back home in North Texas and the lower humidity didn't help much. I saw many D16 players, maybe more than I have seen in the last few years. Congratulations to all who did well in Vegas!

We had a very long BOG meeting on the first Sunday in Vegas, as there were many issues before the Board of Directors (BOD). I'm sure Paul Cuneo will delve into those in his report. The big issue, the restructuring of the BOD, did not muster the 2/3 vote required and failed. It was close; 16 BOD members voted in favor but the rules require 17 votes so the motion failed. That generated three separate motions at the BOG meeting; all in an effort to move forward with some restructuring. The first motion was for the BOD to

ly; we will have to see what the BOD will do in San Francisco. The second motion was that ACBL President, Russ Jones, appoint a committee to look into restructuring and it passed as well (we already had a similar committee and its recommendations just failed). The third motion was for the BOG to create its own such committee but after a discussion, where President Jones answered that he will appoint some BOG members to the new restructuring committee, the motion failed. The bottom line is the BOG is still trying to move ACBL forward with some organizational restructuring, but so far progress is slow.

There were many more issues diswas no motion.

There was a motion to allow Section-

reconsider its vote and it passed easitions. The principal reason for the member pays dues; motion was that most new and senior players don't want to drive far and prefer to play locally, whereas flight A players are willing to drive far for a stronger competition. After a long discussion the motion failed.

> There was a motion to amend the ACBL bylaws to make it a "duty" of BOG members to collect data and communications from their districts and to report back to their districts. Changes to the bylaws require a 2/3 vote and the motion passed. Watch for this proposed change to be printed in the Bulletin to allow members to comment before a second vote is

There was a motion that all events in NABC, including non-NABC events, that start at the same time utilize the same hands; that motion passed. There was a motion to create a Growth Fund, similar to the International Fund, Education Fund, and Junior Fund. This would allow for special games to raise money for a fund to pay those teachers and directors who recruit new members. The idea was to pay the original recruiter a royalty for life as long as the new

failed. There was a discussion about setting a digital ads campaign on FaceBook to increase membership. One BOG member opined that Bridge and ACBL should stay away from FaceBook because, among other things, it is a platform used for defrauding seniors. This comment generated applause. Another motion that failed was to make the BOG "more serious" by removing proxies and by other means.

Lastly - the BOD raised the Super Senior age to 75 (from 70) starting Jan 1, 2020. So – if you are 70 to 74 years of age and planned to play in a Super Senior game, you should plan to come to the coming NABC or to wait a few years. The BOG did not make comments about the Super Senior age change. The BOD also raised the Senior age from 60 to 65 and unlike the last raise (from 55 to 60), which was done in such a matter that nobody who was already eligible ceased to be eligible, they jumped by two years as of Jan 1, 2020. I think that was in an effort to catch up with the WBF which raised the age from 60 to 65 with the correct steps two years ago. Yours truly jumped up to

that motion talk about this move, but I was told I was out of order. I stood again and proposed to amend the process so that no eligible senior ceased being eligible; however, because I agreed with the new age moving up to 65, I had to make a new business proposal. When I stood up to propose this "new business" I was told that "new business" had to be in writing. By the time I finally proposed the motion to grandfather all currently eligible ACBL Senior players regardless of the new senior age, the members were giggling and applauding. My motion passed easily and I hope the BOD will fix this before the coming NABC. In the next few months I will try to gin up support for the notion that we don't need more reduction in senior game table count. I also posted on YouTube a short segment of the meeting where we were all laughing about how I had to tangle with the rules until my motion passed. I recently read an article by Eddie Kantar on Bridge Tips. Here are some simple things to consider before you play. Never forget you are playing with a partner and consider what things may look like from your partner's point of view. You cannot defend properly unless you remember the bidding and know what system the opponents are playing. You must

watch the cards, especially the small cards. You cannot defend properly unless you count. Remember, the person who hesitates during the bidding is likely to have a problem hand. Keep the hesitation in mind. How many tricks are needed to defeat the contract? Your opening lead may be the trick that leads to the defeat of the contract. Many contracts can be beaten after one defensive error, but seldom after two. The speed of the declarer's play is often a clue to the difficulty of making the contract. If you can see the winning defense, take charge. Take your time before playing third hand to the first trick. It is often times the most important play you will make in the entire hand. Thank you, Eddie Kantar, for all the bridge information that you have compiled for the benefit of others.
