Phil Clayton Wins Robot Individual and 0-6000 Blue Ribbon Pairs Bob Hamman Wins Open BAM; Tobi & David Sokolow Win Senior Mixed Pairs

It was feast or famine for District 16 at the fall NABC in San Francisco. Other than the four winners, virtually no one finished in the top ten in NABC events. I can't explain this anomaly; all I can do is recount the

Phil Clayton of Frisco had a fantastic week. First, he won the Robot Individual, held on line the week before the nationals, then followed it up with a win in the 0-6,000 Blue Ribbon Pairs in SF. Phil's average in the Robot Individual was 70.22%. A 70% game is a rarity; averaging 70% over three days-extraordinary! His performance in the mini-Blues was equally consistent: he was ninth after the first day, first after the semifinals, and first again at the bell. Hats off to

Bob Hamman of Dallas won the Open Board-a-Match Teams. Sometimes referred to as "TGBH" (The Great Bob Hamman), he is undeniably one of the best players in the history of the game. By my count, this was his 53rd win in an NABC event, stretching back to 1962. To cap off a stellar tournament, Bob came in third in the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, the premiere team event on the ACBL calendar. There are no superlatives left to describe his accomplishments, so I'll just leave it at

In a thrilling and (for me) unexpected turn of events, Tobi and I won our first national event together, the Senior Mixed Pairs. Tobi played great (as usual) and I played as well as I ever have on the final day. It was my in an unrectri event, and Tobi's twentieth. In addition to teaching me a lot about the game, Tobi has encouraged me to trust my instincts, not "overthink" things, and believe in my game. Thanks, honey, for all your love and

Usually, a bevy of D16 players land

top-ten finishes in NABC events. Not this time! In fact, other than the successes noted above, only Mike Passell of Plano and Houstonite Eddie Wold made the cut-they were tenth in the North American Swiss Teams. Hopefully, our coterie of players will fare better at the spring NABC. Speaking of which....

The spring NABC will be held March 19-29 in Columbus, Ohio, home to the Buckeyes of Ohio State University. (BTW, did you know that the Buckeye is a nut? I kid you not. Who ever heard of a school with a nut as its mascot? But I digress....) Columbus is a first-time NABC venue. In many ways, Columbus is a lot like Austin: a state capital, home to the state's premiere university, and a mecca for creative artists. The host hotels, the Hilton Columbus Downtown, and the Hyatt Regency, are just a few blocks from the "Short North," where galleries and excellent restaurants abound. My favorite haunt in Columbus is the German Village neighborhood, where you can enjoy excellent German food at a number of restaurants and delicatessens. Congratulations to Phil Clayton for winning the Fall 2019 Robot Invitational and to Tobi and David Sokolow who won the Senior Mixed Pairs in San Francisco!!!

Also, congratulations to Melody Euler who received the Jean Molnar Employee of the Year Award which recognizes the field employee who consistently delivers directing expertise, customer service, and Professionalism!!!

The Marriott Marquis proved a delightful venue as host of the fall Attendance was 10373.5 tables which was significantly under the projection of 12,000 tables. Despite that, ACBL will end the year with a gain in excess of \$750,000.

Georgia Heth of District 8 was elected President of the ACBL Board for 2020 defeating me in a very close election. I knew that I was challenging tradition by running for President during my 3rd year on the Board as most members seek election after much more time on the board. The following are highlights from the Board meeting:

> motion to restructure the ACBL Board from 25 District Directors to 13 Regional Directors failed 15 for and 10 against as a 2/3 majority is required since this is a Bylaws change. Despite that vote, I am encouraged that the prospects for passage at our next meeting in Columbus, Ohio, are very good as it looks like 3 votes could swing at that meeting. The purpose of the motion is to improve board

effectiveness and to reduce board costs. If approved in Columbus, a 2nd reading is required in Montreal and if approved by the Board of Governors the transition will begin in 2021.

We approved creation of a taskforce to develop motions to move the board's work on "bridge" to committees that report to management and to move many of the appointments the board makes on an annual basis to either the Board of Governors or to management. The idea is to focus the smaller board on the core activities of a board and to utilize the expertise of ACBL members for operations and honors.

The Strategic Plan work is progressing well. The high-level goals and objectives have been agreed by the Board and the work with management on implementation is beginning. We expect to have plans and a budget in Columbus. Key areas are membership growth, new member participation and retention, and improvements in tournament scheduling.

The ACBL Educational Foundation met in San Francisco as well. The budget for next year was approved and included increased spending on grants and programs including the collegiate program and the military initiative. The Foundation works closely with ACBL to fund bridge education and 2020 will be an exciting year as we work together to increase the number of people playing and enjoying bridge.

I'd like wish each of you a Happy New Year and all the best in 2020!

Sally Wheeler **Grand Life Master**

Congratulations to Sally for becoming Grand Life Master, the highest rank in the ACBL. While Sally has 3 National Championship to qualify she just went over the 10K point total recently. She represented the USA in several world championships and finished fourth in the Venice cup

Sally's parents sent Sally for bridge lessons when she was 13. Her teacher was Paul Hodge (long-time partner of John Gerber, who is, perhaps, better known). In 1975, she began playing regularly with Buddy Hanby, who she had met at Rice a few years earlier. They married two years later.

Sally won her first tournament, the Open Pairs at a Houston Sectional, around 1977 at the conference center in The Woodlands, where she would move 17 years later). At the same tournament, Sally met Cindy and Bob Bernstein who then lived in College Station. The Bernsteins became close friends and regular teammates with whom Sally won many events. Sally's first Regional win was the Mixed Pairs at the Austin Regional in 1981



In 1984, the Spring NABC was held in San Antonio. Sally and Cindy decided to try out women's events. They were instant hits, 4th in the NABC+ Womens' Pairs (which I think was the first NABC that Sally ever entered) followed by 2nd in the NABC+ Womens' Knockout. Over the next 10 years or so, Sally and Cindy played frequently in womens' events. They were 4th in the Venice Cup, won a NABC+ Womens' Knockout, and had several other successes. In a rare non-Cindy womens' bridge event, Sally won a NABC+ Womens' Pairs playing with Georgiana



Grand National Teams

GNT 2020 is underway. This national event begins in the Units, progresses to District Finals and culminates at the Summer Nationals. Do you have a Team? Do you know if you need to qualify? Do you know how?

There are four levels that will compete in the GNT's District Finals in Houston, April 3-5. The four winners of that event (and possibly more – see below) go on to compete at the GNT Finals in Montreal, July 15-19. The top flight – SuperFlight – is open to anyone. In order to play in Flight A, each member of the team must




In order to play in Houston in April, Flight B and C players must qualify at a Club or Unit Qualifier, which began a few months ago and will continue through March 2020. SuperFlight and Flight A advance directly to District 16 Finals, with no Unit qualifying required. Flight B and C players can qualify at singlesession GNT Club games or Unit two-session events. One only needs to qualify one time, but may qualify multiple times. Additionally, a B or C Flight player can qualify at any GNT event in District 16; they need not qualify in their home unit. Players qualify as individuals – that is, when a team qualifies, each member of that team will be deemed to have qualified individually – and players are free to switch teammates for the District Finals, as long as every member of the team is eligible, and if required, has qualified.

SuperFlight, Flight A, and qualified B and C players will play at the District GNT Finals the first weekend in April at the Marriott Westchase in Houston. Flight B competition begins Friday evening, continuing through the weekend. All other Flights compete on Saturday and Sunday. The winners of this event will advance to the National GNT Finals in Montreal. Note also that if Flights B and/or C have eight or more teams, then the top two teams will qualify for Nationals.

Please check with your local clubs for dates of Club Qualifiers. Note that these Club games may include players with more than 2500 masterpoints. While those players can earn points, their teams will not be included in the qualifying calculations, which will qualify a minimum of 60% of the eligible field for Flights B and



Improving Your Game. Part 4Kibitzing –Live and Online

We previously discussed the key parts of developing your game. Foremost is playing a system you are comfortable with and, most importantly, is the same as your partner. Relying on the many good books available to grasp fundamentals is a good start. Next, fill out your convention cards together with partner. If you use conventions it is often neglected how to followup. Responses by partner should be clarified to being forcing, invitational, sign off or even lead directing.

In chemistry we always have a laboratory to go along with the course. Concepts become clarified when you see them in action. So it is with bridge.

Traditionally, watching experts has been the best way to learn. Of course, be stoic, watch only one hand and do not ask questions until after the session. After the session many experts are happy to help. Besides observing technique and strategy, an important observation is when the expert takes pause. Always pause when the dummy appears. The expert will make a plan based on the bidding and lead. You should also note when new information is gleaned. The biggest errors made are often not taking into account new information.

In recent years a new medium has enhanced bridge. While many players enjoy playing online on BBO and other sites it can be quite enjoyable to learn and observe the matches shown on viewgraph. Just go to https://www.bridgebase.com/login and click the vugraph button. There is a schedule. They usually have a lot of activity during the team trials, NABC KO events and world championships. Also they have an archive of older events, You can kibitz a match with all the hands showing or just one and the dummy. Not only will you observe great bridge but sometimes complete blunders by world class players. That can be very refreshing. While watching sometimes the action is slow. I usually check the history and go over earlier hands. Actually the most exciting times are when you are waiting for a key play that can swing a huge amount of IMPs. Suddenly the play is made and it can be awesome.

Remember the words of that great chemist Louis Pasteur: "Fortune favors the prepared mind."

Betty has been a newer addition to our bridge family moving here a few years ago. Her most frequent partners included Cathy Valentine and Tom Corlett. Her fellow club members can tell you about her Tesla and her having a charging station installed at her home----or about her strong political feelings about certain politicians that did not remain hidden! They can also tell you how much she loved the game and still loved studying it until her death.

I enjoy watching our newer bridge players and asking how they first got interested in bridge. I love the answer from Michelle Weller:

I doubt that the doors to the Beaumont Bridge Studio opened very often that my parents weren't there to get their master points. Dad was president of that unit for a number of years. A few times in the late 60s when I would visit from where I was living out of state, my father asked me to play with him. I still can't believe he was so gracious as I made stupid plays one after the other. I had dabbled at bridge in college with no lessons and didn't have a clue about duplicate.

Dad was just a few points away from Life Master in August, 1972, when he and Mother played in a tournament in Shreveport. On August 30th, their 32nd wedding anniversary, he was at the bridge table when he suffered a fatal aneurysm. He couldn't have been doing anything he loved more when he passed away. The bridge community supported my mother as she grieved. She eventually became a Life Master.

Fast forward to the bridge classes at the Bridge Studio of Temple. I was hooked and although I probably won't ever make Life Master, I get excited over every masterpoint I earn. I like to think that Mother and Dad are looking over my shoulder and saying 'Bid game. You've got this.'"

Thank you, Michelle, for this special memoir. I hope to hear from others!

My husband and I just returned from our Abilene High School 60th reunion and were so happy to visit the home of our good friend Tiffany Wagstaff who is on the Fort Phantom (Abilene) ACBL Unit Board of Directors! Great connection from the past and hopefully the future.


