The 120 was a sharp rise from last year when only 86 pairs showed up. The highest in the last 25 years was 2011 with 130 tables, 38 in A, 56 in B and 36 in C. The lowest was 2002 when 74 pairs played in Houston. Mostly we have healthy turnouts of 100 to 120 and the low turnouts proved to be an anomaly as the following years rose sharply.

This year any one that qualified in club qualifiers was eligible for the district finals. In past years the there was an additional Unit level.

2020 is also an election year for my position. I have declared my candidacy for re-election to a 3 -year term and will begin campaigning this spring.

# District 16 GNT Coordinator District 16 Finals are coming soon. As I discussed in he last Scorecard, 

 flights that will compete at the Marriott Westchase in Houston, April 3-5, competing for the right to play in the GNT Finals in Montreal, July 15-19. In order to enter the SuperFlight (open to anyone) or in Flight A (open to players with less than 6000 Masterpoints as of the August 6, 2019 posting), the team needs to send me their intent to play, preferably in advance, but no later than 30 minutes before game time on April 4. For Flight B (for players under 2500 points) and Flight C (non-life masters with less than 500 points), players must have pre-qualified at a club or unit qualifying event.Flight B competition begins Friday evening, continuing through the weekend. All other Flights compete on Saturday and Sunday. The winners of this event will advance to the National GNT Finals in Montreal. We are trying a new format for Flight B that will hopefully be more exciting, since two teams will (probably) be selected to play in the NABC in Montreal from that flight. The two session Swiss will cut the field to nine teams, for a two-session round robin Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning. Out of that, the top three teams will compete in the final session on Sunday afternoon to determine first and second place.

## Improving Your Game. Part 5 Final Ramblings

by Ira Hessel
Thanks for all the comments. I will try to address some questions.
Basically, by improving your game ,you increase enjoyment of it. If you spend an entire week at a regional you don't increase the actual ime spent on bridge by too much if you spend a few hours each week working on it. Be patient, nobody has mastered the game in a fewyears.

Learning a complete system and then adding some conventions is best. Actually conventions are always additions to systems that fill in some gaps. Eventually a convention could lose the term "convention" and become part of the system. (BTW system means " isolated part of the universe") And system should have conventions that are coordinated with other conventions. So if you play Namyats -where 4 C and 4 D are artificial to mean 4 of a major, It is best to use 3NT to replace the 4 of a minor opening. There are many other sets of conventions.

There is always debates about what are the best conventions to use. Now sometimes at a tournament, especially nationals, I may play with 4 or 5 different partners. Now each one has an idea of which is the best against NT openings. I have played many and have found the very best one to use is THE ONE YOUR PARTNER IS USING. Seriously, as long as you remember your methods you will do well

Now what makes bridge such a great pastime is that you can't master it in one lifetime. We are always learning. Always new things to look forward to.

1/Reading books especially quiz books on play 2/ Watching matches on Bridge Base online
3/Kibitzing
4/ Review your matchpoint games on ACBL Live
5/ Discussing hands with your partner after a session 6/Asking questions of experts. Many are more than happy to help. I am always happy to help
