A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

The Board of Directors meeting in Austin passed some important motions that we hope will encourage potential bridge participation by younger players in our district.

The first is district participation in funding BridgeWhiz, a free

online course designed to teach children in grades 4 through 12 the essentials of bridge. Robert Todd, President of the ACBL Educational Foundation, explained the program in detail. It is introduced to schools via a marketing company called Peach Jar. The district approved \$4,000 to fund the program for 297 high schools throughout the district. You can find information about BridgeWhiz through the ACBL Educational Foundation site:

To complement this program, the district passed a second motion regarding junior players participating in district sectional and regional tournaments. Currently, the ACBL recommends ½ price entries for junior players (under 26 years). This recommendation has been in place for many years. The district will now reimburse the unit for the ½ entry cost back to the unit. Therefore, if the entry is \$12, the junior entry is \$6. The junior will now play for free and the district will reimburse the unit the \$6 fee.

It is our hope that this will encourage more participation in our sectional and regional tournaments by junior players.

Congratulations to everyone who did well in Providence, especially the Goldman Grand National Teams, Flight A. The District 16 team of Pawel Hanus, Carrollton, Ari Sippola, Richardson, James Zhan and Ying Peng, both of Sugar Land, finished second in the competition.

Also congratulations to Hemant Lall, Dallas, whose team was tied for 3/4 in the Championship Flight. The team also included Finn Kolesnik, Los Angeles/Austin.

Congratulations as well to Kristen Onsgard, District 16 Secretary, who became an ABTA Master Teacher in Providence (see pg 4).

Massive kudos to Paul Cuneo who has produced the monthly district's Intermediate-Novice Newsletter for numerous years. With Paul's many responsibilities for the ACBL as Region 9 director and a trustee for the ACBL Education Foundation, he has decided to step down. Lauri Laufman has graciously agreed to produce this newsletter for our newer players! Many thanks, Lauri!

Patricia Herrera, District Education Chair, will now handle the District Lecture Series. Patricia is very well suited to handle this extremely important responsibility for our district. She has planned to add a third week of lectures each month which will be in Spanish. So, the first week will focus on beginners, second week on intermediates and third week in Spanish. Many thanks, Patricia! Thanks as well to Thomas Rush who has handled this responsibility since its inception.

The ACBL decided that the recent Royal STaCs that were held across the organization were so well received that they are allowing district participation in another Royal STaC this year. Tomi Storey, District STaC Coordinator, has received a sanction for November 14-20. So, plan on attending games at your local clubs to cash in!


The following is the nomination submitted by the San Antonio Bridge League, Unit 172 on his behalf:

He has served as the chair of the Education Committee and has implemented online resources for District teachers and students, including original and solicited instructional materials, supported efforts to increase teacher training throughout the District and to make resources available to them.

He also serves on the Teacher of the Year committee for the District and has volunteered to assist in development of a Policies and Procedures Manual for the District, a job he is well qualified to perform. He also represents Unit 172 for the D-16 Board of Directors.

Ed began playing bridge in high school in 1959, and shortly thereafter joined the local bridge club in Kingsville, Texas. He has been an active member of

Unit 172 for over 50 years, serving on the Board of Directors for many of those years. He has served as Treasurer and President.

For the last decade or more, he has done most of the tournament scheduling and sanction approvals, was instrumental in creating and maintaining our Policies and Procedure Manuals, has hosted numerous Unit games, and has chaired the Regional tournament.









He has done a terrific job as Editor of The Winning Finessed for many years. His service to the Unit has been tireless and exceptional.

He has been actively involved in our Mentor-Mentee program from the beginning. He is always willing to play with new players and is an outstanding bridge teacher, offering his services as guest lecturer at many events. Several years ago, he created a lending library for the Unit, cataloging hundreds of books and was voted Teacher of the Year in 2020 by District 16.

Ed spent most of his career in education and retired as Superintendent of Schools for

the Northside Independent School District. So respected, the District named a middle school in his honor.

On top of all his other talents, Ed is an excellent cook and for decades has offered dinner and bridge for 4 or 8 at his home as a door prize for Unit games.

DISTRICT DIRECTOR'S REPORT, REGION 9

Providence was a great venue for the NABC which had 7,463 tables continuing the increase in NABC table count with each NABC.

The convention center space was great and the hotel connected to a

shopping mall by an overhead bridge. There were lots of restaurants within walking distance.

Membership continues to decline at about 5.8% per year, through June 30. The Board approved \$100,000 to boost beginner bridge classes by purchasing advertising for teachers. The pilot for this project is underway and we'll begin with a few teachers whose classes start mid to later September and then expand in the new year. I'm excited about this project and working with the taskforce that is leading it.

The project is a joint effort by ACBL and the ACBL Educational Foundation and is being led by Robert Todd, President of the foundation.

The Code of Disciplinary Regulations was amended to include the forfeiture of masterpoints and titles for members found guilty of first, degree ethical violations that result in the expulsion or suspension of the offender for two or more years. Furthermore, those members would be permanently ineligible to be awarded the ACBL rank of Grand Life Master and permanently ineligible to be inducted into the ACBL Hall of Fame. Offenders who are Grand Life Masters and/or are members of the ACBL Hall of Fame would be stripped of these distinctions.

Progress on the development of EDGAR continues and we hope to have it online this fall to actively detect cheating in online sanctioned events.

The Board approved a proposed bylaw change to replace the position of Chairman of the Board with Vice President. I have advocated for this change since joining the board in 2017. I believe that it is better to have a Vice President who is learning the duties of the President than a chairman who has served as President to fill, in for the President when needed which is very rare.

There is nothing that requires the Board to elect the Vice President as President. This model is used by a very large majority of corporations, both profit and nonprofit organizations. Titles vary as some prefer President to Chairman, but the concept is the same. As a bylaw change it requires two votes of a 2/3 majority of the board and then goes to the Advisory Council for their approval. The vote was 17 - 3 in favor.

Overall, ACBL financial performance is on track with budget which has a projected loss of \$850,000. This is due to increased spending on Information Technology projects that have been approved but staffing issues prevented progress for the past two years and marketing efforts to rebuild membership.

I continue to be concerned that that face-to-face table counts are not sufficient to allow clubs to play in leased or rented space that is entirely devoted to the club. Online VACB games for most clubs have declined since the first of the year, which makes the situation even more dire for rent-paying clubs. The new initiative to help teachers increase beginner class size may be a big boost for clubs.

The ACBL Educational Foundation meeting was held following the ACBL Board meeting. Robert Todd was elected President and Joel Kramer Vice President. Allison Freeland was elected Treasurer. I had decided to resign from the position of Treasurer after serving for three years as I feel















that I'd contributed what I could to the position. I will continue to serve on the Finance committee and I've joined the Program committee where I will be involved with program evaluation.

Bridge Whiz is gearing up for its 2nd year with a lot of learning and positive changes. We had 429 students "graduate" from the program in its first year and are confident that number will significantly increase in year 2. District 16 has provided funds

to increase contact with more parents in an effort to increase enrollment in the program.

Electronic Data Gathering and Anti, cheating Radar

People cheat at bridge, in person and online. Either way, it's pretty hard to detect, especially when playing electronically. Solutions to the problem have been limited, with no way to determine whether it's actually happening, unless a partnership is potentially reported and then watched for a long, long time. What other ways have there been? Pretty much, none.

There have been no real solutions...until now.

Introducing EDGAR, a software application designed to ferret out partnerships that win by cheating, without pointing a finger at innocent players. Developed by A.J. Stephani, Brian Platnick, and Franco Baseggio, EDGAR uses mathematical probability to find those who do cheat and protect the rest of us.

Most of you have heard of NUMB3RS, a tv series based on actual events. In that, a college mathematics professor helps his FBI agent brother solve crime using mathematical probability to identify how likely an event will occur or how likely it is that something is true or false.

In other words, we can use math to identify recurring patterns and also determine whether something is completely random.

From the Bridgewinners article from April 9th:

"EDGAR" will allow bridge organizations to scan thousands of cases and look for telltale signs of cheating...Instead of identifying single hands that look suspicious in a vacuum, EDGAR will be able to identify whether funny, looking bridge decisions are representative of a larger pattern or constitute a one-off aberration....We believe that players will have confidence in EDGAR's ability to identify cheaters without raising suspicion of innocent players."

ADVISORY COUNCIL REPORT

The meeting was held at the Providence NABC and by Zoom for those unable to attend in person. Unfortunately, our Zoom platform connections continue to have issues and a significant number of online participants were unable to contribute. I want to thank Steve

Moese, the vice, chair of the AC (Advisory Council), for his invaluable assistance in reporting the meeting to those unable to attend.

The highlights of the meeting addressed the stabilization of membership, getting players back to face to face (F2F) play, and improving IT.

- Membership is down 5.8% over one year ago. Active F2F club estimates show that only 52% of past F2F clubs are operating now, based on numbers from 2019. To give you an idea on a monthly scale, we have 80,000 players a month at clubs, as opposed to 110.000 in 2019.
- Tournaments are still taking a downturn as well. The Spring NABC in Reno had 6,204 tables, down 11% from a projected budget. At the time of this meeting, profitability in Providence was uncertain. Based on 2019 figures, we are having 37% fewer regionals and YTD, 67% fewer tables. I'm going to start referring to 2019 as 2019 BC (before Covid). We need to find humor somewhere in this situation. ACBL tournament revenue is down 34% and 2022 net assets (that's operations) is down \$250K vs. budget.
- IT has reported improvements in Entry Express (you can now purchase entries for Regionals online prior to the event), improved tournament data, and improved Masterpoint statistics. There are several analytics and visualization projects underway involving Club play, NAP Qualifiers,

- Membership Retention and more. Unfortunately, management is still dealing with high level turnover within IT staff.
- ACBL Intro to Bridge 4 Teachers. 1500+ students. 857 completed. 245 (28%) of those became guest members and 96 (39%) of those became new members.

Let me say that the AC meeting was convened and held immediately after a general membership meeting. There was not a quorum for that, and I will not report on it here as it is not part of the Advisory Council Meeting, but a great portion of the discussion covered the huge schism between vaccination and anti-vaccinations. This continues to be a major issue. At the time I am writing this, the ACBL continues to follow the CDC guidelines for the location of the tournament for masking, and vaccinations are still required.

Other matters under discussion within the Board of Directors were addressed in the AC:

- EDGAR is in online stage 2 testing. This is an online cheating detection program. The tools are being developed by a non, profit in conjunction with people associated with the ACBL.
- Pilot Membership Recruitment Program for Teachers. A proposal was made that ACBL should fund teachers who are effective at creating new ACBL members since marketing is primarily concerned with retaining members Advisory Council will help ACBL find teachers who are most effective.
- Nominations were made for the AC positions ending 12/31/22. Doug Couchman was nominated as AC Chair, Steve Moese, and Vice, chair and Barb Doran as Secretary. Elections will take place at the Fall NABC in Phoenix.

In closing, the formation of a new committee was announced – an ad hoc Committee to identify















how we can stem the loss of people experienced with running tournaments, as well as bringing in knowledgeable volunteers. The AC hopes to aid in a series of workshops about tournament best practices run by current experts. Paul Cuneo D16 and Greg Coles will be part of this committee. All D16's AC representatives - Betty Starzec, Nancy Strohmer, and Tomi Storey, volunteered to serve. We will certainly keep you posted on this and welcome suggestions from you.

As always, your Advisory Council members welcome your thoughts on any topic. I heard from a few you after the last Scorecard and I truly appreciate the feedback.

I hope to have seen you at the Dallas Labor Day Regional and beyond!

> District 16 members may make nominations until November 30, 2022.


To be considered for the award teachers must:


- Have taught bridge for at least 5 years and at least 50 hours in the past year.







PLAY OF THE HAND CHALLENGE PART III

Thomas Rush



So here you are at 4S. Everybody's going to be there, and everybody's going to take 11 tricks, losing the two red aces, for an average.

But what if you hate average boards?

Is there a way you can


possibly take 12 tricks after a club is led by West? Seven spades ,two clubs ,a club ruff ,and a diamond ruff look like the limit.

But what if the opponents don't take all their tricks?

spade 9 (or 8) to dummy's Jack, and note that spades are 1-1. Play a heart toward your Jack. East plays the 9, you contribute the Jack, and West wins the Ace and continues with a club.

You'll win with the Queen and ruff a club. Ruff a heart high, lead the Spade 4 to the 5, and ruff another heart high. If the suit splits 3-3 (as it did at the table) you only need to lead the carefully preserved deuce of Spades to dummy's 3(!), and cash two good hearts pitching your diamond losers.

That's 12 tricks because of careful play and a defensive slip. 12 tricks gets you a 92% board; 11 tricks is only 42%. In a 26-board game, that adds just about 2% to your score, often enough to move you up a few places in the standings.



The moral of this story is two-fold.

First, any five- or six-card suit has the potential to be set up for "extra" tricks.

Second, pay attention to your spot cards – had you not preserved the four and deuce of spades, you'd not have had enough entries to set up hearts and take those pitches!

Note: Yes, taking 12 tricks requires the opponents to defend poorly. I'll note that a slim chance is better than no chance – and that in games up through at least flight B, you are often going to find sloppy defenders. When it can't cost, why not try a plan that might work, instead of not giving yourself that chance

At no cost to you, you can win the club trick with the Ace when East plays the King. Now lead the











THIS ISSUE'S CHALLENGE

FROM THE RECENT AWESOME AUGUST HOUSTON SECTIONAL

This is a hand from a Bracket Two Team Game where I was playing on a team with three students



You had a decision to make over your partner's 3C bid, and decided that 3NT might be easier than 5C. Seeing three hearts in dummy, you realize you made a very good decision; the Ace of Hearts followed by a heart ruff and the Ace of Spades would doom the 11 trick contract.

The Diamond Ten is led, and you have chances in 3NT. You can develop two spade tricks for sure, a heart trick, two diamonds, and four or five clubs – nine or more tricks – *IF you guess the lie of the club suit.*

Are clubs Qxx opposite x, or are they split 2-2?

(This wouldn't be a fun problem if the Queen were singleton!)


You start with the assumption that hearts are 6-1, and that West didn't lead a heart because he has good diamonds and a singleton heart.

In order to get the best read on things, you start by winning the Diamond lead on the board, as East follows with the 8. A low Spade to the Queen finds low cards played, and a low spade back to the King draws the Ace from East. East then continues his partner's diamond attack by leading the Jack. You win the Ace in hand per force, and play the Jack of Spades while both opponents follow. On the Spade seven, you pitch dummy's Heart 3.

Having run out of delaying tactics, you scratch your chin in learned fashion (to impress the galley of spectators) pause for a moment, and place the Club King on the table.







You see the Three and Seven of Clubs from the opponents. Out of delaying tactics, you place the Five of Clubs on the table, and West follows with the 6.

It's decision time. Do you finesse, or play for the drop? Did East start with Qx of clubs, or with a singleton? How do you decide which layout to play for? Is one play superior to the other?



WELCOME TO PROVIDENCE IN JULY

Ken Monzingo



COOL, COOL

For those who traveled the 1700-1800 miles from Texas to Providence, Rhode Island for the Summer NABC they enjoyed balmy 80-90 degrees summer cool. Great getaway weather for visiting this charming city

(102-109 degrees mid-July in Fort Worth).

The last Providence NABC was the chilling blast Fall 2014 National. It was more than a blast and as cold as some winters I spent in Anchorage. Walking two blocks to dinner, the winter wind and

freezing rain blew in my face so hard it iced my lungs and made a bird bath bowl out of my umbrella. Year 2022's Summer NABC was quite an upgrade.

GROWTH AND CHANGE

In the late 60s, touring with a magic show at State Fairs and Home Shows, I spent a 7-day gig in Providence. I remember restaurants serving a special of two, one-pound lobsters dinner for \$5.00. I treated the entire troop for less than what I'd pay for one meal today at a gourmet sea food house.

Things change and so does food. Providence now has a population of 191,000, which makes it just a bit larger than Brownsville, but less than Amarillo.



















With a surprising 43% being Latino or Hispanic the local cuisine takes on a new flavor.

HISTORY

Providence, on scenic Narragansett Bay, is one of the oldest cities in the United States, founded in 1636 by Roger Williams, a Reformed Baptist theologian and exile from the Massachusetts Bay Colony. He named the area in honor of "God's Divine Providence."

National Memorials, parks and a 15-foot statue of Williams remain.

Steeped in the birth of our Democracy, in 1772 the 7000 residents of Providence were among the first to spill English blood leading up to the 1775-1783 American Revolutionary War by boarding and burning Britain's HMS Gaspee, marking the initial violent uprising against the Crown's authority in fledgling America.










SAN ANTONIO UNIT 172 EVERETTE LEWIS














I will not name all of the new rankers or leaders in the Mini-McKenney races, all of which can be found elsewhere.

The following is based on recollections of local players with some info from the web. Bridge is rooted in a game called Whist in the 17th century and popular with the English nobility. Four players were dealt 13 cards each.

With no auction to determine the trump suit, the objective was to take as many "tricks" as possible. In 1742, Edmond Hoyle wrote a book on the rules of Whist. Whist changed into Auction bridge where one had to announce how many tricks were declared.

The first duplicate game was played in 1857 thanks to Henry Jones Cavendish. However, it was slow to become as popular as Auction Bridge.

In 1925 Harold Vanderbilt modified the scoring method and rebranded Contract Bridge. Ely Culbertson promoted bridge in the 20s-30s and established the Bridge World magazine. In 1936, Charles Goren wrote his first book called Point Count in Bridge.

Duplicate bridge started in San Angelo in the 1940's. L.T. Barber started the club and he was the director. Play occurred at the





















St. Angelus Hotel. The San Angelo Duplicate Bridge Club membership list in 1953 numbered 122. Phone numbers were 4 or 5 digits.

The hotel was torn down in 1964 and then duplicate bridge moved to a rental space within the Fort Concho Historic Site.

Sue Barber assumed the duties of Director when her husband L.T. died. Sue was honored in 1985 by the American Contract Bridge League, District 16.

The Oswald Jacoby service award plaque says "for her outstanding contribution to the promotion of bridge."

In 1991 the current unit location on Locust Street was purchased. The unit building was named the Sue Barber Bridge Center to honor her many contributions to duplicate bridge upon her retirement.

LARRY DAVIS

Larry Davis is one of the cornerstones of bridge in Austin, and has been for many years.

Larry currently manages and directs four games in Austin: Tuesdays (12PM) at the South Austin Senior Activity Center; Thursdays (12PM) in Westlake at the Austin Ridge Bible Church on Bee Cave Road; and Tuesday and












Steve Luning (Regional Master), Sandy Reynolds (Life Master), and Mark Craig (Gold Life Master).

Thursday evenings at his house. Larry frequently directs at Unit events.

When I asked Larry about his bridge background he said it goes back to his junior year of high school in Corpus Christi, when a senior boy taught three junior boys to play. They didn't have summer jobs and played a lot of bridge, basic bidding (Stayman and Blackwood), but they learned to play the cards fairly well.

Larry looked for bridge clubs, "... in the yellow pages (remember those) and found a listing. I and another junior showed up and were told that the fee was \$1.25 (in 1969).

We did not have any money, but the director (wisely) let us play anyway. That was my first duplicate experience. No bidding boxes and no stratification. We enjoyed it and returned the next week with money (for both games)."

Larry played some in college, where the director was a very prim and proper older woman who ran the game, "With an iron hand (in velvet gloves). If you were even a little bit late and would create a half-table, you went home. If you filled out the movement, she let you play but you got severely chastised (in a ladylike manner)."

After five years in the US Navy, Larry came to Austin for

graduate school. He took about a year from bridge, then started playing at the "old" bridge studio on Palo Duro. He made Life Master in 1990 (after 21 years of on-and-off again playing with no stratification, few tournaments, fewer special games and lower masterpoint awards).

Larry's first game to manage and direct was in

South Austin, at the persistent request of another bridge player.

Then he took over the game at the Lamar Senior Center from Bob Chambers. That game was "kicked out" of the Senior Center because it was the only night activity and required two people to staff the center.

Larry said, "The rent I paid them was not remotely enough to cover their costs. The game moved to the club house at Mesa Village Condominiums, where I lived at one time. It continued for a while because another bridge player (who bought my condo) could sponsor it. When she moved. I had to move the game and asked the wife if we could have it temporarily at our house until I could find another location. Miracle of miracles, she said that I could have it permanently at the house."

Then there's the Thursday night game at Larry's house,







which was started at the request of Esther Ellis (and others) to have a "gentle" game for newer players.

When the bridge center on Palo Duro closed and before the BCA opened (several years later), Larry ran all of the open duplicate bridge games in the Austin area. Unit events were held on Saturdays at the Northwest Recreation Center.

There were also games at the Dell Jewish Community Center, the Jewish Temple on Shoal Creek and the Presbyterian Church in Allandale. Larry did not personally direct all of those games, he was the club manager.

Larry said, "Kevin Perkins and Scott Humphrey, new directors at the time, ran several games. Most of my games are now small after the pandemic, 2-4 tables."

In addition to making bridge available all over Austin, Larry has served on the Unit 207 Board on two different occasions, one term he was the Vice President. Then, he ran a few sectionals and numerous regionals. Larry was the Unit 207 District Representative for many years, and served as the District 16 President for one year.

He said, "Fortunately, nothing happened during that one year." Shortly after, Larry was honored with the District Jacoby Award, only the third person from Unit 207 to receive that special award.

Currently Larry coordinates District NAP activities and is the unit business manager. As business manager, he proposes dates to the Unit Board for unit events (such as, the City Championship) and tournaments. After getting Board approval, he schedules the events with the ACBL.

Larry also negotiates contracts with hotels for sectionals and regionals—he's gets amazing rates and perks!

Obviously, Larry has experienced (and helped make) bridge history in the Austin area. Here's some of what he recalls:

"The bridge population in Austin is definitely older than it was in 1980. Then, there were many players in their 30's and 40's. The most well-attended club events were in the evenings. Day games had mostly women players.

"People often played three times per day at tournaments. Two-session events were afternoon and evening. Regionals had midnight events (you snooze, you lose), which were well attended. People sometimes played four events in one day.

Now, only national tournaments have midnight events. There was no bracketed Swiss—knockouts were the main team events. Boards were duplicated by hand by the players at the start of the game.

Match-pointing was done by hand by directors and tallying all of the results was also done by hand. Part of the directors' exam (not done on a computer) was knowing how to matchpoint a traveler, including if an A+, A or A- had been awarded or if there was a fouled board. Directors got to be quite good at mentally adding up lots of numbers.

There was a tie for a place if the difference was less than one-half. (Now a difference .01 is enough.) Results were not often finalized until 30-45 minutes after the event was over.

Saturday nights at regionals often had live entertainment – a dance band. People dressed up on Saturdays."

Larry is part of the glue that keeps bridge together in Austin. He's a great resource for knowing how things work (or not), including how to get the optimum points in his games; he's a fine negotiator; he has a great passion for the game, and he's an excellent player.
























In Memoriam







The Royal STaC operates like a normal STaC, but you now have the opportunity for multi-color point awards. Results from all clubs participating in the district will be combined for higher overall awards.

STRATS: Strats for the Royal STaC in all open or invitational games are OPEN/2500/750 by average of both players or whole team. Hand Records are required. You MUST download the hands provided on the ACBL website – Common game hands may not be used. Any game that does not use the ROYAL STaC hand records will not be combined for higher overall awards

DIRECTORS: Non, playing directors are encouraged for all ROYAL STaC games. A non, playing director is REQUIRED at any club not using electronic scoring when more than 18 tables are participating and at any club using electronic scoring when more than 24 tables are participating.

ACBL LIVE: Upload to LIVE for **CLUBS is REQUIRED** for **ALL** games Playing Directors may win session awards only; they are not eligible for overall awards.

FACE-TO-FACE REQUIRED: ALL face-to-face sessions at clubs in District 16 are eligible to be part of the Royal STaC. Check with your local club director to ensure that they are participating and what games they plan to run.

THE MOST BEAUTIFUL GAME IN THE WORLD

As we all know, bridge is the most beautiful game in the world.

Now that we know how to play bridge, we want to improve and get better. What does it take to become better at bridge? How do we keep learning?

Like any other sport, we need patience and discipline to be able to improve. Beyond that, there are a few things you may want to consider:

- PLAYING AND/OR LEARNING: Understand that you can't play and learn all the time. You must decide whether you are playing to compete, when to have fun (and compete) and when you are playing to learn
- **CONVENTIONS** = **BETTER BRIDGE?** No. Knowing more conventions doesn't equal better bridge
- PLAY TO LEARN? Learning goes beyond just playing
- TOURNAMENT PLAY VS LEARNING PLAY: If you are playing in a tournament, learning can't be your main goal. You can choose to go over certain hands after the competition is over but not in between matches and NEVER while playing. The goal is to win, and while doing that you may discover certain things that you need to learn more about after the tournament is over
- LEARNING AND PLAYING FOR FUN: If you are playing for fun, there are many interesting learning opportunities. Some people, when they are in a relaxed setting with no pressure, tend to understand and assimilate certain concepts better
- TRYING NEW STUFF: Online or at your local club are the places to try new agreements or conventions with your partner. But be aware that you may get a shameful score. Be OK with it. Remember that you are playing to learn
- **READING TO LEARN:** If you are an ACBL member, you will get the monthly Bulletin and by large and far it will your best reading source. There are articles aimed at beginner, intermediate and advanced players. You can read it on paper or online. *A no-brainer!*
- MORE READING TO LEARN: Read even more. Books are essential if you want to get better. The trick here is to choose wisely. Ask your most experienced bridge friends and most likely they will be able to recommend you something GOOD. I personally love Mike Lawrence's *How to Read Your Opponent's Cards*
- **INTERNET RESOURCES:** Go online. This is a great strategy for when you want to learn something about a specific convention or ruling, for example. Remember to look not only for articles but also videos
- FOCUS AND CONCENTRATION: Work on improving focus and concentration. These skills can be advanced in many ways that go beyond playing bridge. Same goes for your memory skills
