A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT Betty Starzec



NOVEMBER 2022

With the Thanksgiving and December holidays fast approaching, it is difficult to believe how quickly this year has gone by.

Trying to get back to pre-Covid levels has been

difficult and we still have a long way to go. Our unit officials and club owners are trying their best. You need to support them at clubs and tournaments to continue the recovery.

For those of you interested in numbers, our district is #5 in the ACBL's active membership, with a decline of 5.61% as indicated by their figures from 9/30/2022 (the ACBL's quarterly report). The best unit had a drop of 3.31% and the worst had 8.82%. The average age of ACBL members is 73.93 with District 16 at 74.27. Our district ranks 17th out of 25 districts in age of members.

You may recall that the district invested \$4,000 to supplement the BridgeWhiz program for our local high schools. BridgeWhiz contacted 236 schools and we have 425 registered for a specific course as of the date I am writing this post, with an additional 126 registered who have not yet chosen a class time.

Per the information from Al Bender, the Program Coordinator, successful programs typically get 1 person per school, so this is a very positive sign. Of course, we will wait to see what the attrition rate will be as the course progresses. District 16 has the second highest number of students attending, with only California having more.

The Houston unit is hosting the ACBL's **Best Practices Teacher Certification** during the Lone Star Regional in January. If you are thinking about giving back to the game, if your area needs new teachers or, if you want to upgrade your teaching credentials, this is the time for you to step up. The cost for the program will only be \$50, which covers refreshments. The district is paying for the actual cost of the course. Remember this course is \$125 at an NABC. In addition, participants receive a startup kit, compliments of the ACBL Educational Foundation, worth more than \$150, along with a one year membership in the American Bridge Teachers' Association. This is an exceptional opportunity, so please consider it!!

Kudos to Patricia Herrera with the successful restart of District 16's lecture series. Patricia has now scheduled a lecture each month in Spanish. We hope once again that our beginning and intermediate players will take advantage of both the English and Spanish lectures. These lectures take sincere commitment and time to develop and present to our membership.

Kudos as well to Nancy Strohmer for sending out Robly eblasts regarding these lectures and John Magyari for updating our website with all the pertinent information.

DISTRICT DIRECTOR'S REPORT, REGION 9

NOVEMBER 2022

Preparations are underway for the Phoenix NABC which begins on November 24, and the Board meeting which precedes it.

The Board had two special meetings since

Providence, that were primarily to consider the site for the 2026 Summer NABC, which will be in Minneapolis.

In addition, steps are being taken to help smaller sectional tournaments with a proposal I made to allow these tournaments to be run by a local Tournament Assistant. This will reduce the cost for directing staff for the sponsors. I expect that final regulations will be approved in Phoenix with implementation in 2023.

EDGAR, ACBL's anti-cheating software program is in the final stages of development, but results from its analysis are being used by ACBL to prosecute some of those accused of online ethical violations.

I have been working with the taskforce which was formed in Providence to help boost membership by running ads for beginner bridge lessons. The pilot is well underway and we have assisted 30 teachers during the fall pilot phase and generated over 1200 leads for teachers to contact. About 100 of them have registered for classes this fall and nearly 150 have shown interest in future classes, most of which will begin in early 2023.

It has been a learning exercise for everyone involved but this program offers the best chance we have to increase new members. A big "Thank You!" to all of the participating teachers and clubs.

The ACBL Educational Foundation continues to enjoy success with its Bridge Whiz program for students. Over 2200 students have enrolled for classes this fall, including over 400 from Texas thanks to extra funding from District 16.

I'm very thankful that Covid is not in the news nearly as much and most of us have been able to return to normal activities including bridge and travel.

I want to wish each of you a very joyous holiday season as you celebrate with family and friends!

DISTRICT LEVEL NORTH AMERICAN PAIRS Larry Davis



The district-level NAP will be held on January 7th and 8th (Saturday and Sunday), in conjunction with the Austin Winter Sectional tournament at the Holiday Inn Midtown (6700 Middle Fiskville Rd, Austin), near the

I-35/US 290E intersection.

Saturday is a two-session qualifying event, followed by a Sunday two-session final. (If there are 16 or less pairs in any given flight, that flight will have a two-session final on Saturday.)

If you fail to qualify, form a team and stay for the sectional Sunday team game. Come on Thursday or Friday to practice for the NAP at the sectional events.

Anyone qualifying at the club-level may play at the district-level. You do not have to play with a person with whom you qualified at the club-level, but you do have to play with someone from District 16.

There are funds available from the ACBL and District 16 (and, possibly, from your unit) to defray expenses for those (3 to 4 pairs, depending on the flight) qualifying to attend the national-level event (New Orleans in March of 2023). There are no entry fees for the national-level NAP.


Please note that there is extra NAP money for Flights B & C. District 16 placed second in Flight B and C. Players in these two flights will receive an enhanced subsidy of \$700.00 each for first place, \$700.00 each for second place, and \$300.00 each for third place. The district-level event is flighted, with *separate* events for each of the three flights. (You are playing against players only of your flight.) The masterpoint awards are generous, even if you are not one of the national-level qualifiers. Lots of gold points are available.

GRAND NATIONAL TEAMS

GNT 2023 will be coming soon. This national event used to begin in the Units, progress to District Finals, and culminate at the Summer Nationals.

But, as we continue to rebound from the pandemic, we are going to dispense with the Unit

qualifying (again) and proceed straight to District Finals.

Do you have a Team? Do you know if you need to qualify? Do you know how?

There are four levels that will compete in the GNT's District Finals. The four winners of that event (and possibly more – see below) go on to compete at the GNT Finals in Chicago in July 2023.

• The top flight – the **Championship Flight** – is open to anyone.

Masterpoint Guidelines for Playing in each flight

- 1. Flight A: Each member of the team must have had less than 6000 Masterpoints as of the August 6, 2022 posting.
- 2. Flight B: The cutoff is 2500 points.
- 3. Flight C: This flight is limited to non-life masters with less than 500 points.
- Each team may consist of four, five, or six players,

but each player must be eligible for the flight in which the team is competing.

• Clubs may hold qualifiers, but you do not need to qualify in a Club or Unit Qualifier in order to compete in the District Finals.

We are currently working on the timing and venues for the District Finals. They will either be held in Dallas in March or in Houston in April, or a combination of the two, with the final assignments currently being worked out.

The winners of each event will advance to the National GNT Finals in Chicago.

• Note also that if Flights B and/or C have eight or more teams, then the top **two** teams will qualify for Nationals.





The talk of the tournament was 8-year-old Kyo Chen who played with his father, Hua Chen. Below is a summary of the story shared by Mr. Chen.

"I started to teach Kyo and his 12-year-old brother Ryo Bridge in July. The original motivation was to train their logical reasoning process, which is needed in both math and chess (both boys play chess, Ryo at professional level, Kyo was TX state champion of his grade).

We met bridge teacher Sam Khayatt in mid-August and she introduced us to F2F tournaments in the greater Houston area and online virtual club games.

Kyo started to play robot tournaments on BBO. The first week he barely got 30%, the second week he improved to 40%, and soon he was able to reach 50% performance consistently.

We had our debut F2F tournament at the Arabia Shriners 199er FLM tournament at the end of August, where we got second place. This result largely boosted his confidence. Kyo started to talk to his friends and teachers at school about bridge. and we started to practice bidding and playing regularly after school.

The Oct 6-9 499er/NLM tournament was our first serious tournament. We were able to play all 7 sessions in a field of equal strength. The actual F2F tournament experiences we gained over the last four days were invaluable. We greatly appreciate BCOH for organizing these NLM F2F tournaments! Kyo and I are looking forward to more Bridge tournaments!"

Bridge Center of Austin

Before 2005, bridge games in Austin were scattered around various locations, and Unit 207 membership was declining.

Then, after attending a Donna Compton seminar on unit growth, Beth Tobias and Rosemary Kelley decided to develop the Bridge Center of Austin (BCA)— a central place to play bridge that would bring the Austin bridge community together.



They spoke to directors of existing games about having their games at a new facility and began to recruit players willing to contribute funds to the cause.

The BCA opened on September 17, 2005. Some existing games moved to the BCA, new games were scheduled, beginning and intermediate bridge classes started, and programs for growth and player retention were implemented. Even some Unit events could be held in the same location as the regular games. There was now a telephone book entry under "Bridge." After three years, the BCA outgrew the first location and with the support of additional players moved to the current site on Middle Fiskville Road. Today all Unit games and most sectionals are held at the BCA. The BCA continues to be a major source for new players through educational programs and a comprehensive set of limited games.

The BCA's goal in 2005 was to provide the best possible environment for promoting bridge in Austin. Today, seventeen years later, that is still the BCA's goal.


He and his wife Darlene direct 5 weekly games at the Fort Worth studio, as well as a few bridge cruises each year.



THE MOST BEAUTIFUL GAME IN THE WORLD

As we all know, Bridge is the most beautiful game in the world. It is probably also the ultimate social sport.

We can play with friends against other friends, or we can play against strangers, but no matter who we play against or how or where we play, we play to compete.

Competition is a fun way of socializing and getting to know ourselves better. It pushes us to constantly improve and keeps us motivated to become better.

Having said that, is important to understand that Bridge tournaments are a serious matter and should be treated as such. They require a different behavior

than kitchen-table bridge games and classes.

Bridge tournaments come in many forms, from duplicate club games to sectional, regional, and national events, and always our attitude should be *ultra-professional*.

HERE ARE A FEW POINTERS ABOUT WHAT TO EXPECT AND HOW TO BEHAVE DURING A TOURNAMENT:

- Know that people play in tournaments to compete more than to be social
- If you know that you prefer a more social bridge atmosphere than a competing one, tournaments might not be your thing
- Behave like you would expect a professional athlete to behave
- Always be nice. Saying hello and goodbye must be the norm
- A tournament is not the time to be super chatty while the game is in play
- Concentration is key, so respect the fact that not all people like to talk
- The is no room for nastiness or unpleasant remarks
- Be on time. At the beginning of the game and during breaks
- Remember the importance of calling the director
- You need to know what would be considered unethical behavior. For example, if you make a long hesitation during the bidding, and then pass, you have just conveyed information to your partner
- Know that it is not your role to act as a director even if you believe you know the ruling. Call the director, because that is their job and they are a friend of the table



- Knowing the scoring system is a must
- Different movements are used at tournaments so make sure that you follow the directors' instructions
- Maintain the pace of play. If you fall behind, catch up as quickly as you can
- Never ever take advantage of the fact that many players will be intimidated by you
- Never ever call someone a cheater. If you suspect unethical behavior, talk to the director about it in private and file a proper complaint
- Zero tolerance is in place at all tournaments
- It is your responsibility to check your scores
- Don't be loud as others are trying to concentrate
- Bridge tournaments can be the most exciting experience you can have for a very long time, so don't be afraid of joining them and...
- Last but not least HAVE FUN!!

Remember that we are all learning together.

THE LAW IS THE LAW NOTES ON THE LAWS OF DUPLICATE BRIDGE FOR NEWER PLAYERS & ANYONE ELSE WHO MIGHT BE INTERESTED

We live in a world of restrictions and within our gaming community, the ACBL, we have rules to follow, just like we do in our countries, our cities, our neighborhoods, and our families. They are guidelines that help us coexist.

Why do we need them?

Well, you're a bridge player. What do you think would happen if there were no rules to follow at duplicate? It would be quite an interesting scenario. I honestly believe there wouldn't be a game without rules to follow. I also believe that most of us have no idea what all the rules are.

Do we need to know?

Well, yes and no. Yes, we need to know what we can and can't do when we compete. No, we don't necessarily need to memorize all of them or carry a booklet around so that we know exactly what happens for every instance rule understanding might be necessary. We do have directors who help us thru those times.

A FEW DETAILS ON THE RULES

The ACBL has multiple documents with rules for different parts of the game. Here are 3 of them.

Document 1: The Laws of Duplicate Bridge

The Laws were drafted by the World Bridge Federation (WBF) with input from the ACBL. There are 93 Laws in a 157 page document (no wonder we don't remember everything). From the Introduction... "*The Laws are designed to define correct procedure and to provide an adequate remedy for when something goes wrong. They are not designed to punish irregularities, but rather to rectify situations where non-offenders may otherwise be damaged.*"


