DISTRICT DIRECTOR'S REPORT, REGION 9

JANUARY 2023

By now, you've probably heard that I've stepped into the Interim Executive Director position with the ACBL at the request of the Board of Directors, following the resignation of Joe Jones.

I started December 1, and will be travelling to the office frequently for work. It is located just south of Memphis, in Horn Lake, Mississippi. This will continue until a permanent person has been hired and we've had a transition.

I'm enjoying getting to know the employees throughout ACBL and am impressed with their dedication and the talent they bring to the organization.

The challenges we face are significant but I'm confident that we'll meet them by mobilizing the efforts of our employees and volunteers throughout the League. To that I end I met with District Presidents, Unit Presidents, Teachers, and Club Managers during the week of December 12.

I've also been working closely with the National Recorder's office and we've moved about 15 cases forward so far. I want to thank Rebecca Brown for volunteering her time to help in the process as Adjunct National Recorder!

We're off to a good start on the highest priority work:

• Developing options for the Board to dramatically reduce the budget deficit for 2023 from a proposed loss of nearly \$1 million.

- Addressing the membership decline which is currently about 6.5%/yr.
- Improving the reliability of our Information Technology systems and continuing the migration to modern program design and integration.
- Prosecuting online cheating

Phoenix was a great site for the NABC with their spacious and modern Convention Center and convenient hotel options for players. Total attendance was 6677.5 tables which was lower than the budgeted number of 7000 tables.

Betty Starzec was selected as the Honorary Member of the Year for her many years of volunteer activity in bridge serving in a variety of positions at all levels. *Congratulations Betty!*

Here are the highlights from the November 14 special meeting and the Phoenix Board meeting:

- The motion which had been approved earlier to raise masterpoint awards for games above 18 boards was revised to cap it at 1.5 for 27 or more boards and to remove all changes for short games which are 12 to 17 boards.
- The term Local Sectionals was created for sectionals which anticipate less than 25 tables/ session and allowed these tournaments to be run by certified local directors and Tournament Assistants.
- The allocation of NLM regionals was increased from 3/yr. to 5/yr.
- An Ace of Virtual Clubs was created to distinguish between player who play in the Virtual Clubs and those who play face-to-face.

• Management was given an action item to increase the base fee for VACB games be \$4/table and to implement a rebate program that reduces the net amount that VACB operators of face-to-face games end up paying. The program increases revenue for ACBL while most face-to-face clubs that operate VACB games will have the additional fee offset by the rebate.

I want to wish each of you a wonderful year in 2023 and look forward to seeing many of you at our tournaments. Thanks to all of you who volunteer your time to help at every level in ACBL!

ADVISORY COUNCIL REPORT FROM PHOENIX NABC

To say that the Phoenix NABC was eventful in terms of governance would be an understatement.

As most of you have heard, Joe Jones exited as CEO of the ACBL and D16's own Paul Cuneo is

currently serving as interim head until a new CEO is selected.

Here are the highlights from the AC meeting:

The current major challenge is stabilizing membership. Revenues are down \$406K vs budgets. Membership revenue is down 2.9%, and ACBL net assets are 7.9MM, but that the down 1.99MM since the end of 2021.

The number that jumped out at me was membership—down by 6.4% from last year. We gained new members, but are losing existing ones, a figure that must be reversed.

The IT department continues to struggle. The focus here is ongoing support and modernization plans and reduction in unnecessary infrastructure costs. There was a great deal of technical information given that I won't recite here. The major issues are that updates to existing programs and creation of new ones is far too slow and too costly.

A brighter spot is the ACBL's programs to boost F2F bridge. The ACBL advertises beginners' classes on Facebook and transfers prospects from FB to teachers and clubs. The ACBL also has an Online Intro to Bridge—48 courses have been given to more than 1600 students, with 32% already ACBL members.

The even better news is that 91% said they would recommend the course to friends and family. The programs is now adapted for an in-person aid to bridge teachers. Course materials are offered as a free benefit to those teachers earning Best Practices Teacher certification.

ACBL President Joann Glasson also said the Board is working hard on the Boost Program, where they will pay up to \$500 for beginning bridge classes. Clubs and teachers interested can apply directly to Joann, who will serve again as president in 2023.

Usually at this point of the NABC, the Board of Directors has met, approved the 2023 budget, and some of the budget points are discussed by the AC. At the time of our meeting, the budget had not been approved and has since gone though some very major cuts.

After the announcement regarding Joe Jones, Paul agreed to meet with the AC and discuss the challenges. He diagnosed the issues and streamlined it to substantially reduce costs but stated this is far more than a simple budget issue.

Paul believes we need to do this and still be able serve all members and all clubs. A major part of the plan is the need to build relationships with units and districts.

It is essential that we teach new players and then retain them. As a member of the Advisory Council and as a member of District 16 who has served with Paul for many years, I want to wish him all the best in his efforts to right and rebuild our organization for the better.

I know there will be more news soon and I will report any news to you as I hear it. As always, contact me with any questions or suggestions.

DISTRICT LEVEL NORTH AMERICAN PAIRS

The district-level NAP will be held on January 7th and 8th (Saturday and Sunday), in conjunction with the Austin Winter Sectional tournament at the Holiday Inn Midtown (6700 Middle Fiskville Rd, Austin), near the I-35/US 290E intersection.

Saturday is a two-session qualifying event, followed by a

Sunday two-session final. (If there are 16 or less pairs in any given flight, that flight will have a two-session final on Saturday.)

If you fail to qualify, form a team and stay for the sectional Sunday team game. Come on Thursday or Friday to practice for the NAP at the sectional events.

Anyone qualifying at the club-level may play at the district-level. You do not have to play with a person with whom you qualified at the club-level, but you do have to play with someone from District 16.

There are funds available from the ACBL and District 16 (and, possibly, from your unit) to defray expenses for those (3 to 4 pairs, depending on the flight) qualifying to attend the national-level event (New Orleans in March of 2023). There are no entry fees for the national-level NAP.

Please note that there is extra NAP money for Flights B & C. District 16 placed second in Flight B and C. Players in these two flights will receive an enhanced subsidy of \$700.00 each for first place, \$700.00 each for second place, and \$300.00 each for third place.


The district-level event is flighted, with *separate* events for each of the three flights. (You are playing against players only of your flight.) The masterpoint awards are generous, even if you are not one of the national-level qualifiers. Lots of gold points are available.







GNT 2023 will be coming soon

This national event used to begin in the Units, progress to District Finals, and culminate at the Summer Nationals.

But, as we continue

to rebound from the pandemic, we are going to dispense with the Unit qualifying (again) and proceed straight to District Finals.

Do you have a Team?

There are four levels that will compete in the GNT's District Finals. The four winners of that event (and possibly more – see below) go on to compete at the GNT Finals in Chicago in July 2023.

The top flight – the **Championship Flight** – is open to anyone. In order to play in **Flight A**, each member of the team must have had fewer than 6000 Masterpoints as of the August 6, 2022 posting. For **Flight B** the cutoff is 2500 points. And **Flight C** is limited to non-life masters with fewer than 500 points.

Each team may consist of four, five or six players, but each player must be eligible for the flight in which the team is competing.

Clubs may hold qualifiers, but you do not need to qualify in a Club or Unit Qualifier in order to compete in the District Finals. The District Finals will be split between two venues.

The **Championship and B Flights** will be held in Dallas on **March 24-25**.

Flights A and C will be held in Houston on April 15-16.

The winners from each flight will advance to the National GNT Finals in Chicago in July and will be eligible for an expense stipend if they actually play in Chicago.

Note also that if Flights B and/or C have eight or more teams, then the top two teams will qualify for Nationals.

STAYING CONNECTED KEEPING IN TOUCH WITH YOUR DISTRICT, YOUR UNITS, YOUR CLUBS, & ALL THE MEMBERS

In an almost post-pandemic bridge culture, we are fighting to get back to in-person play at tournaments and at our clubs. So, why is it so important to have an ACBL email connection?

Recently, I was asked by someone to check why a member was not receiving Scorecard. When I did, I found that the ACBL listed the email as Confidential. That means no email communication whatsoever can be sent to this member from the ACBL. ZIP.

Since Scorecard notification is via email to all active ACBL D16 members, in order to receive that notification, they must have a valid or unblocked email listed with the ACBL.

THE SHOCKING TRUTH

I decided to take a look at the district membership list and was shocked to find that **over 700** D16 members either did not have an email on file, had a bad email address listed, or were listed as Confidential.

OVER 700...THAT'S ALMOST 10% OF THE ENTIRE DISTRICT 16 MEMBERSHIP

We know the ACBL uses the email list, but so do our units and clubs. Without email access, bridge news of any sort won't reach members. Units may use the list for game changes, board elections, and all sorts of general club information. That information is important to everyone.

LET'S COMMUNICATE!

Support for the ACBL, our district, our units, and our clubs is imperative to survival of the game we love. That means we need to be able to communicate with everyone, not just some. Email gives us a tool to do that, but obviously, when we can't reach a significant number of our members, we start to lose the battle.

GET THE WORD OUT!

Reconnecting might be a bit harder than it sounds. That's because people on the list of anomalous emails won't be reading this, unless they saw Scorecard posted on a unit website. So, it's up to all of us to get the word out.

Let them know:

- If they have no email address on file with the ACBL, they should consider adding one.
- If they have an invalid (bad) email address, they need to correct it in their ACBL profile.
- If they have a confidential email address, well, they might want to consider changing this status.

It seems to me, other than checking with your friends, the best way to approach the issue is by posting something on unit and club websites and, also, putting a poster up in play locations reminding everyone that it's important for all of us to stay connected.

HOW DIFFICULT IS IT TO CHECK?

It's pretty easy for members to check what's on file with the ACBL:

Log in to the ACBL and click the *MyACBL* tab at the very top right of the page. Your profile will come up and there will be a button that says *Update Information*. When you click it you will see a field that says *Update My Contact Information*. All the fields for your profile come up and email is pretty much the last fields. Check there to see whether you have a correct email on file. To change your status from confidential, go to the *Privacy Settings*. There you will find the options to either add or remove blocks on your email and telephone number.

SO, WHAT'S THAT CHART BELOW?

This is a breakdown by unit of the 3 anomalous email categories. Some numbers may have changed already since I did this, plus the percents are rounded a bit. Still, it will give you an idea of how each unit is doing when it comes to email access.


WHO'S GOT THE QUEEN?

This is a continuation of the play of the hand problem submitted in the September 2022 Scorecard.

On the auction shown, you are in 3NT. You must decide late in the hand which of the two layouts below is the one to play for—

Finesse against the club queen, or Drop the club queen?

WHAT WE KNOW SO FAR:

- 1. East has overcalled with a weak jump overcall, showing six hearts.
- 2. Spades are 3-3
- 3. East led a diamond, and both followed to two rounds of diamonds.
- 4. Both defenders followed to the first round of clubs; West has shown up with a second club.


You've taken six tricks so far – three spades, two diamonds, and the king of clubs – and need three more tricks.

Who has the queen of clubs? Who has the 3 of diamonds?

Here's the position; do you go up with the ace, or finesse?



If West started with Qxx of clubs and you go up with the ace here, you will have to put West in with the queen of clubs and he'll run his diamonds – or, you can lead a heart off dummy; East will win and lead the diamond 3 to West so West can run his diamonds. *Horrid*!

It turns out that you have a no-lose play, and can be sure of making your contract as long as East started with six hearts.

Do you see it?

If East has the queen of clubs, he's out of diamonds (his original shape was 3=6=2=2), and he'll be able to cash the ace of hearts, but then must give you the king of hearts so you can run all your clubs.

Based on this logic, you finesse the club and make your contract when East shows out. Taking ten tricks was enough to win the match.

Nice detective work!

A JOINT EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION AND ACBL

Keeping bridge afloat is tough. It's an aging game and well, we are all part of that scenario. According to statistics from the ACBL, membership numbers have declined by 17% since the beginning of the pandemic. That's nearly 28,000 members.

There are several initiatives to grow our ranks. You've seen advertising for **BridgeWhiz** (see pg 22 for the latest BridgeWhiz ad). This targets kids wanting to learn the game and it is seeing success with the program.

BUT, HOW DO WE GET EVERYBODY ELSE LEARNING AND PLAYING?

Now we have **Boost**. The **Boost** pilot program is for f2f teachers who would like a bit of help finding students for their beginner bridge classes. This benefits the clubs associated with a teacher in the program, because it generates new members for those clubs and, of course, for the ACBL.

SO, WHAT DOES BOOST ACTUALLY DO?

Boost is a digital marketing campaign that uses advertising on Facebook and Instagram to generate leads for potential students through specific teacher course date and location information.

CAN ANY TEACHER PARTICIPATE IN THIS PROGRAM?

No. **Boost** has Participation and Course Criteria that must be met in order to participate in the program. Note also, there are *limited openings for participation*.

PARTICIPATION CRITERIA

Prospective Audience: This means that the market area has to generate enough leads to make the campain worthwhile.

Teacher Experience: How many years teaching, how many beginner classes taught, teacher certifications, and teacher recommendations...all will be considered for participation acceptance.

Teacher Club Connection: Is the teacher partnered with a local club that can offer opportunities for the students to earn Masterpoints?

Recruitment Interest: Is the teacher willing to sign up students as guest members?

COURSE CRITERIA

Level: Must be newcomer or beginner

Class Number & Teacher Hours: at least 6 or more classes with 9 plus hours of instruction. Note this is teaching and does not include supervised play.

Payment for Classes: Must be paid up front and not pay as you go.

Course Schedule: Must already be on the calendar with actual location, dates, & times







THE LAW IS THE LAW

NOTES ON THE LAWS OF DUPLICATE BRIDGE FOR NEWER PLAYERS & ANYONE ELSE WHO MIGHT BE INTERESTED

CLAIMS—TIME SAVERS OR TIME WASTERS?

The Claim is a highly effective tool that can help us stay within the amount of time given to play a particular set of boards...at least, it's supposed to

Not including the TOC and index, Claims are referenced about 35 times in *The Laws of Duplicate Bridge*. It has to be somewhat important when something is referenced that many times. Of the 93 Laws, three, 68, 69, and 70, are specifically dedicated to Claims.

Now, I'm not going to get into to all those rules. You can read through the full text here:

LAWS OF DUPLICATE BRIDGE

What I want to share are 4 of several claim scenarios (yes, there are others) that can cause play delays.

- 1. Declarer claims, stating "I've got the rest." then flashes the hand before putting it back in the board. *Oh Please, Call the Director!* The laws are not being followed & when the director comes to your table, you have to go through everything...& *that takes time!*
- 2. Declarer claims, facing the hand, then realizes there's a problem. "OOPS" they say "I guess I'm not claiming." *Oh Please!! Call the Director!* Once a claim is made, play ceases. It's not going to start just because someone says OOPS. When the hand is faced for all to see, rules are partially followed, but OOPS?? Not so much. When the director comes to your table, you have to go through the entire OOPS issue...& *that takes time!*
- 3. Declarer claims, facing the hand & outlining the play. Yes, rules have been followed, but heck, there's a trump out & they don't know it. Should you say let's play it because a trump is out? *Oh No! Call the Director.* Remember, play has ceased, so to tell declarer there's a trump outstanding & then start play again, could change the outcome of the hand. Say nothing until the director gets to your table, explain everything...& *that takes time!*
- 4. Declarer claims & shows the hand with no play explanation. You ask nicely for one, but declarer just repeats that it's good & still doesn't explain anything. *What?? Call the director.* The rules are not being followed. Everyone needs to agree that the claim is valid & it's declarer's responsibility to explain clearly. When the director comes to your table, you will need to go through the entire scenario...& *that takes time!*

Are there morals to this story? **OH YES!**

- 1. A Bad Claim is the Enemy in a timed event, so be careful when making one
- 2. Director Calls can take tme away from successful on-time round completion
- 3. Penalties can possibly be given when bad claims are made, affecting the final outcome of the hand
- 4. If things do go belly up and unfortunately, they sometimes do, you only have one course of action— *Call the Director & Do Take the Time to Do It Right!!*



THE MOST BEAUTIFUL GAME IN THE WORLD By Patricia Herrera



Bridge never ceases to amaze me. It is the most beautiful game in the world and the ultimate social sport.

A complex and logic sport, we can always learn more and improve our game in many different ways: by playing, reading, taking lessons, watching videos, kibitzing stars and so on.

Having said this, sometimes very little attention is given to **sportsmanship**. The Merriam-Webster dictionary's definition of sportsmanship is the following:


conduct (such as fairness, respect for one's opponent, and graciousness in winning or losing) becoming to one participating in a sport.

Sadly, **sportsmanship** is not always the rule at bridge competitions, from online and duplicate games to national tournaments and world series. The same goes for bridge etiquette.

Here are a few pointers that may help us improve our bridge etiquette and sportsmanship:

- Give your best effort. Even when partner is playing poorly or has a negative attitude
- Have a positive attitude
- Greet opponents before and after the game
- Support teammates. Never criticize them
- Treat others with respect
- Never bully
- Cards should not be taken out of the board before all players are at the table
- Same goes for shuffling
- Be on time on each round. There is no excuse
- Also, play on time
- No, you don't own the table so don't arrange others pencils, score sheets, bidding boxes, etc.
- Do not SNAP your cards down on the table or the bridgemates or anything
- North, must present the result when scoring to East-West for their acceptance
- Do not look at your opponent's or partner's cards after the hand has been played without their permission. NEVER





- Lead and THEN write the contract on your score sheet
- Put the dummy down as soon as you can
- Accept rulings
- Opponents are entitled to know ALL your partnership agreements. Never try to hide information nor give incomplete answers
- Have a complete convention card at hand that can be read by your opponents at all time
- Never gloat
- You are entitled to not like everybody but speaking poorly about other players or people in the room doesn't make playing enjoyable nor is a sign of good sportsmanship. Avoid it at all costs
- Be aware that gossip and politics are Bridge worst enemy and drive many newcomers away. Make sure you are not toxic

Hope you have a fantastic 2023 filled with joy, health, love and bridge.
