Friendly Bridge Club views Solar Eclipse

Thirty-six players congregated in the Friendly Bridge Club – Plano parking lot to look up and see what they could see. The path of totality for the April 8th eclipse cut across District 16's bridge playing communities. In Plano, TX totality was expected at 1:41pm. With a bridge game starting at 10:30am, the timing was almost perfect. We would play 24 boards instead of the usual 27, and head out to the parking lot to view the eclipse. At the start of the game, the weather was a bit questionable with a dense cloud cover. But as the morning progressed, the clouds thinned and as the moon started to cover up a portion of the sun, the skies cleared. The players could see the sky darkening through the windows as they finished up their last rounds. When they finished their bridge game, they quickly went outside to their waiting lawn chairs with their eclipse glasses on, and saw the moon finish its path blocking



out the sun, until there was just a corona ring. A hush fell over the parking lot, as even

Meet Patty Degenhardt

Few people in the McKinney Duplicate Bridge Club know that Patty Degenhardt is an artist. As with most of us, however, her life took several twists and turns before she arrived at that point. Raised in



Staten Island, New York, Patty is the daughter of a minor league baseball player. His first job after baseball was actually in the mailroom at Standard Oil where he rose up the ranks to work in computers and technology. While in the mailroom, however, he and his co-workers learned bridge during their down time. He and his partner developed their own system and were shocked when they played against experienced players and were told they had to announce (i.e., alert) what they were doing.

Patty's mother was a busy homemaker raising six children, the oldest of whom is Patty. Her grandmother was a dress designer and Patty learned that her great-grandmother died when she was very young along with 145 others in the notorious 1911 Triangle Garment Factory fire. Her aunt, P. Buckley Moss, is a well-known artist and it was these family traits of artistic ability and dress design that led to Patty's ultimate career down the road.

Patty entered college at Villanova, but at that time the only major they offered for women was nursing. Deciding that nursing was not for her, Patty transferred to St. John's University and graduated in 1968 majoring in history and elementary education. She worked part-time at a children's home all through college and found that she enjoyed working with kids. She married Harold Degenhardt in 1967, had three children, and became a homemaker as well as a teacher in a special needs school. After she was married, Patty decided she should learn how to play bridge since it was all around her. She enrolled in an evening adult education course and learned the basics of the game. She then played lots of nighttime bridge when her children were young and her husband was working 70 hours a week.

Harold and Patty moved to Dallas in 1975. When her youngest child entered kindergarten, she finally had time to focus on one of her own interests. continued on page 5





The ACBL 5-5-5 Initiative

The ACBL is concerned about the contraction in its membership since the beginning of COVID. Both the ACBL and our Unit are down about 20%. The ACBL returns to our unit a portion of our membership fees to put toward retention and recruitment programs. Under the new 5/5/5 plan a unit may receive up to 15% of the membership fees. The unit will automatically receive 5% - even if we do nothing. Units can earn up to an additional 2.5% for actively contacting lapsing and at-risk members. An additional 2.5% can be earned based on our success rate of the members contacted. The final 5% is earned for successfully recruiting new members into the unit.

Our Unit VP, Bill Higgins, gets a monthly email with the names of members that we should contact. Thanks to our committee of Rosalind Smith, Marcia Messinger, Sarah Warnecke, Sheri Bumgardner, Sue Greims, and David Greims for helping us contact lapsed members. We have had some success with these calls but ultimately, we need to provide programming to attract new members and retain the ones that we have. What can we do to make your playing experience in Unit 176 a better one? We would love to hear from you with suggestions!

She opened an art gallery at Olla Podrida in Dallas and ran it for 11 years until she decided to pursue her own path as an artist. Patty went back to school simultaneously with her youngest child starting college. She enrolled at TWU in Denton and earned her MFA (Master's in Fine Arts). She states that she loved the master's program where she was a graduate teacher of record and had the opportunity to study different mediums. Her TWU degree led to her teaching ceramics and art appreciation at Tarrant College in Fort Worth for 12 years.

As Patty and her husband neared retirement, they talked about finding a place to get out of the hot Texas summers. A neighbor had spoken glowingly of Door County, Wisconsin, so they traveled there to look it over and fell in love with the area and its wonderful summer weather. For the next nineteen years they spent 5 months annually in Door County where Patty discovered it was a fabulous place to be an artist. "I had my own studio building where I could paint, sculpt, and make wooden tables." People came to her studio and soon her work was featured in various galleries outside Wisconsin. She has several pieces in both public and private collections in Wisconsin as well.

Over the last two decades when Patty was not in Door County producing art, she was picking up the game of bridge again. She quickly saw how much the game had changed since she first learned so she enrolled in some classes and learned new conventions. Her teacher was a strict Marty Bergen devotee, but Patty gradually came to believe that she prefers the Barbara Seagram strategies and philosophy. Patty joined the McKinney Duplicate Bridge club four years ago and it was there she was first exposed to sanctioned games. She now plays in that club on a weekly basis.

Patty has been married for 56 years and attributes her fulfilling life as an artist to the moral and financial support of her wonderful husband since she could never have pursued art or sent three kids to college while running an art gallery. She is very proud of her three children for choosing helping professions—law enforcement and teaching. She also has six grandchildren whom she has attempted to teach bridge. So far, though, they have only grasped how to count points and how many points are required to open! They are all in college or grad school, however, and still have plenty of time to learn bridge later.

Other than family and bridge, Patty states that her passions include painting, sculpting, working with wood and metal, dress design and sewing, as well as dabbling in jewelry design. She has her own website at pattydegenhardt.com if you want to check out some of her work. This kind and modest woman has continued the heritage of talented artists within her family.

Grand National Teams by Scott Nason

The GNTs 2024 are coming soon. Once again, we are going to dispense with the Unit qualifying and proceed straight to District Finals. So, get your team together and meet us in Houston or Dallas in the Spring.

There are four levels that will compete in the GNT's District Finals. The four winners of that event (or possibly more – see below) go on to compete at the GNT Finals in Toronto in July. The top flight – the Championship Flight – is open to anyone who is an ACBL member in good standing and who resided in District 16 as of September 1, 2023. In order to play in Flight A, each member of the team must also have had fewer than 6000 Masterpoints as of the August 6, 2023 posting. For Flight B the cutoff is 2500 points. And Flight C is limited to non-life masters with fewer than 500 points. Each team may consist of 4, 5 or 6 players, but each player must be eligible for the flight in which the team is competing.

The District Finals will be split into two venues. The Championship and B Flights will be held in Houston on April 6-7. Flights A and C will be held in Dallas at the Holiday Inn Dallas-Richardson on May 25-26. The winners from each flight will advance to the National GNT Finals in Toronto in July and will be eligible for an expense stipend if they actually play in Toronto. Note also that if Flights B and/or C have eight or more teams, then the top **two** teams will qualify for Nationals. For more information, you may consult the event flyer (below) and the Conditions of Contest, which are posted on the D16 website.

You must supply the names of the players, ACBL numbers and the Flight in which you will compete. Card fees will be \$60 (\$15x4) per team per session.
